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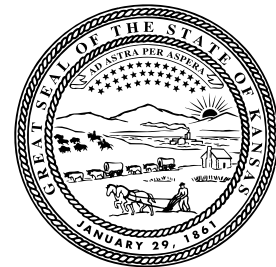

The proposed action is to reissue an existing State/NPDES permit for an existing facility. This is a hazardous waste storage and processing facility receiving hazardous waste to be shipped off site. The waste is received in various forms that typically have value as an alternative fuel. The hazardous waste storage and processing areas are located within secondary containment structures. Stormwater accumulations from the secondary containment structures are collected in water storage tanks and tested prior to release to an earthen stormwater retention pond through a carbon filter system or are used for cleaning water for tankers and rail cars and then combined with fuel for shipment off-site. Stormwater runoff associated with industrial activity including the stormwater accumulations in the secondary containment water storage tanks are managed by Best Management Practices (BMPs) to minimize or eliminate the discharge of pollutants prior to the stormwater retention pond. The stormwater retention pond typically contains all stormwater from the site but has the potential to overflow during high stormwater flow conditions into a dry drainage ditch in the drainage of Clear Creek, in the Verdigris River Basin. Domestic wastewater from the facility is discharged to an earthen wastewater treatment lagoon. The proposed permit contains limits for Total Organic Carbon, pH, High Range Hydrocarbons, Mid-Range Hydrocarbons, Low Range Hydrocarbons, and Oil and Grease; as well as monitoring for Total Suspended Solids.

The proposed action is to reissue an existing State/NPDES permit for an existing facility. The existing facility is a three-cell aerated wastewater stabilization lagoon system with a minimum of 120 days detention time. The facility receives domestic wastewater from residential and commercial areas. The detention time at design flow is 148 days. The proposed permit contains limits for Biochemical Oxygen Demand, Total Suspended Solids, and Ammonia; as well as monitoring for pH, E. coli, Total Phosphorus, Nitrates + Nitrites, Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen, and Total Nitrogen. This NPDES discharging lagoon wastewater treatment facility has been reviewed for eligibility for the MDV for ammonia and has been determined to be eligible. Eligibility was determined through analysis of the facility's highest attainable criteria (HAC) for ammonia and an Economic Eligibility Determination (EED) that assessed the impact of the cost of a new mechanical facility to the community's rate payers. The ammonia effluent limit was determined on January 13, 2023, by calculating the 99th percentile ammonia value from the facility's discharge monitoring reports resulting in an ammonia limit of 7.1 mg/L for this facility. The EED was completed on January 17, 2023. Since the population of the permittee is over 2,000, monthly ammonia monitoring and limits will be required.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the draft documents and/or permit applications must submit their comments in writing to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) if they wish to have the comments or objections considered in the decision-making process. All written comments regarding the draft doc-

uments, application or registration notices received on or before April 29, 2023, will be considered in the formulation of the final determination regarding this public notice. Please refer to the appropriate Kansas document number (KS-AG-23-067/075, KS-Q-23-044/045) and name of the applicant/permittee when preparing comments.

All comments received will be responded to at the time the Secretary of Health and Environment issues a determination regarding final agency action on each draft document/application. A request for public hearing must be submitted in writing and shall state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised during the hearing.

Each bidder shall submit with its bid a PDF copy of the original bid bond in an amount of not less than five percent (5%) of the total bid, or the bidder may choose to provide a bid bond authorization code provided to them by Surety2000, which the bidder shall keep in effect until the city gives written notice that it may be released. If the bidder provides a PDF copy of a bid bond, the original must be provided to the city after the bid opening and by the end of business of the second business day after the bid opening. The bid security shall be retained by the City of Overland Park until a contract for the project has been executed. Bid bonds will be returned or written notice of release will be given to the unsuccessful bidders, with the exception of the second qualifying bidder, at such time as their bids are rejected. In the event the successful bidder is unable to execute the contract, for whatever reason, the city may exercise its legal prerogatives, including, but not limited to, enforcement of its rights as to the bid security.

The city reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids and to waive any technicalities or irregularities therein. Bids may be modified or withdrawn through the QuestCDN site, prior to the time and date for bid opening; provided, however, that no bidder may withdraw its bid for a period of thirty (30) days from the date set for the opening thereof. All bidders agree that rejection shall create no liability on the part of the city because of such

rejection. It is understood by all bidders that an unsuccessful bidder has no cause of action against the city for bid preparation costs. The filing of any bid in response to this invitation shall constitute an agreement of the bidder to these conditions.

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:00 p.m. June 6, 2023, in Room 9E, 900-N, Landon State Office Building, 900 SW Jackson, Topeka, Kansas, to receive comments concerning the amendment to K.A.R. 129-6-35 that clarifies who can apply for a deceased Medicaid applicant in Kansas. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is the Kansas Medicaid agency. The Division of Health Care Finance administers the Kansas Medicaid programs.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the proposed regulation as stated in K.S.A. 77-421(a)(3). All interested parties may submit written comments before the hearing to Dorothy Noblit, KDHE, Division of Health Care Finance, Room 900-N, Landon State Office Building, 900 SW Jackson, Topeka, KS, 66612-1220, or by email at dorothy.noblit@ks.gov. The Division of Health Care Finance will give all interested parties a reasonable opportunity to present their views at the hearing, but it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. A summary of the regulation and the economic impacts follows:

Proposed Amended Regulation

K.A.R. 129-6-35. Application process. This proposed regulation clarifies who may file an application for Kansas Medicaid benefits when the applicant is deceased. This clarification will align Kansas regulatory language with federal Medicaid regulations concerning an authorized representative for a decedent and who may file a Medicaid application that has to be accepted by a state Medicaid program.

Federal Mandate

The proposed regulation follows federal Medicaid regulation, but it is not mandated by federal law.

Economic Impact

The Division of Health Care Finance, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, did not foresee an economic impact on applicants for Medicaid services. While speculative, there may be a reduction in administrative litigation costs for the agency by clarifying who could apply for a deceased applicant.
