Kansas Consolidated Plan**

The Kansas Housing Resources Corporation (KHRC) will conduct a public hearing from 10:30 a.m. to noon Wednesday, August 5, in the KHRC main conference room, 611 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 300, Topeka, on housing needs and issues for citizens to have input into the development of the 2016 Kansas Consolidated Plan. The Consolidated Plan is the state's policy framework for federal community development and housing programs.

Resources available in 2016 are approximately \$13,594,339 from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), \$4,041,268 from HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), \$1,569,275 from the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and \$392,882 from Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) programs.

Office of the Governor**Notice of Available Grant Funding**

Grant funds are available from the Federal Victim Assistance of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Grant Program for the funding period of October 1, 2015, through September 30, 2016, to eligible applicants. Applicants should be aware that Kansas has received a substantial increase to the VOCA grant program and it is anticipated that as much as \$17 million may be made available for FY 2016 VOCA subgrant awards. The purpose of this grant program is to fund public agencies and nonprofit, community and faith-based organizations that provide direct assistance to crime victims. For the purpose of these grant program guidelines, direct services are defined as those efforts that (1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims; (2) assist primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after a victimization; (3) assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and (4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety such as boarding up broken windows and replacing or repairing locks. A crime victim is a person who has suffered physical, sexual, financial or emotional harm as a result of the commission of a crime.

The Governor's Grants Program will host a workshop for organizations interested in applying for these VOCA funds. The workshop will take place at 10 a.m. Friday, July 31, at the Kansas Highway Patrol Training Center in Salina. Attendance is not required to apply. Due to lim-

ited space, organizations are asked to select not more than one staff member to attend. Please see the solicitation for registration instructions.

All grant applications must be submitted via the Governor's Grant Portal by 11:59 p.m. August 25, 2015. **Article 6.—GOOD TIME CREDITS AND

123-6-105. Good time credit rate for offenses committed before July 1, 2014.
