Public notice is hereby given that Wichita State University (WSU), directly or through its affiliate corporation Wichita State Innovation Alliance, Inc., intends to

lease, subject to all required state approvals, approximately 100,000 to 165,000 square feet of real property located on the Wichita State University main campus for the private development and operation of a partnership building or buildings. The university is interested in leasing such ground to any individual, organization, or entity whose presence on campus would advance the university’s applied learning vision or its mission as an educational, cultural, and economic driver for Kansas and the greater public good. The university intends to lease such space for any period of time up to sixty years, but extended terms and renewal options would be considered. Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Forte Products has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Forte Products, 4801 Main St., Ste. 205, Kansas City, MO 64112, owns and operates plastics and fiberglass manufacturing facility located at 1127 North Liberty, Cherryvale, Montgomery County, Kansas.

66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received no later than noon Tuesday, November 13, 2018.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Lester Pordesimo, KDHE, BOA, 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366, no later than noon Tuesday, November 13, 2018 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. The work consists of the following:

This project includes construction of roadway improvements to add dedicated left turn and right turn lanes onto K-7/Parker Street. Construction will include 2" milling and asphaltic surface overlay of the existing pavement, along with areas of full depth pavement widening from Loula Street to Old 56 Highway and on Dennis Avenue. The project includes construction of new curbed center medians with brick paver and sod treatment in the median center area. The medians will include median underdrains and pavement removal within the new median footprint. Along the outside of the roadway the project will include areas of existing pavement, curb and gutter, and sidewalk removal and reconstruction. New ADA curb ramps, abutting retaining walls in certain locations, commercial driveways, and pavement marking and signing are also included. Underground work includes water main relocations and storm sewer removal and replacement of sections of existing pipes, inlets, and junction boxes. Electrical work includes complete replacement of the traffic signals at four intersections including Dennis Avenue, Virginia Lane, Elm Street and Loula Street, and replacement of fiber optic interconnect, and installation of new city owned street lighting.

Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, December 11, 2018, in the 1st floor meeting room 124 of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Dr., Manhattan, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Dr., Manhattan, KS 66502, or by email at ronda.hutton@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

Due to the passage of HB 2477 by the 2018 Kansas Legislature, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Animal Facilities Inspection Program ("AFI Program") is proposing amendments to K.A.R. 9-18-6; 9-18-9; and 9-18-28. The primary changes made to the Pet Animal Act by HB 2477 include increasing the fee caps for licensed facilities, adding fees for no-contact inspections, removing the ability to provide notice prior to inspections, and removing the fees for the licensure of pet animal foster homes. In addition to these changes, the AFI Program has also decided to propose amendments that more clearly outline the routine inspection policy.

K.A.R. 9-18-6 – This regulation contains the fee schedule for all licenses and other fees associated with the AFI Program. The proposed amendments to this regulation include increased fees as allowed by HB 2477, several changes in licensure categories, and the addition and removal of fees mandated based on the changes to licensure categories.

K.A.R. 9-18-9 – This regulation contains the requirements for inspection of premises by the AFI Program. The proposed amendments outline the AFI Program's routine inspection schedule and makes it mandatory that no notice be given prior to any routine or complaint inspections.

K.A.R. 9-18-28 – This regulation contains all the requirements that apply to pet animal foster homes. The proposed amendments remove any requirements that are related to the licensure of pet animal foster homes, clarify that the entity utilizing the pet animal foster homes is responsible for the welfare of any animals placed in a pet animal foster home, and adds requirements for pregnant or nursing animals housed at a pet animal foster home.

Economic Impact Statement:

The proposed regulations are not mandated by feder-

al law. Some entities licensed under the Pet Animal Act may also be licensed under federal regulations, but in such cases, the regulations are nearly identical or are less stringent than federal requirements. Our approach is also similar to that of contiguous states.

The proposed regulations may enhance business activities and growth by providing assurances to the public and consumers that the animals housed at licensed facilities receive proper care. The AFI program can better ensure that animals housed at licensed facilities are properly cared for and that the operators of those facilities are held responsible for the health and welfare of animals in their care with additional funding. Licensed businesses will also have greater certainty about the routine inspection process and can plan accordingly.

It is possible that some business activities may be reduced because of the increased cost of licensure, but it is not possible to predict if the proposed fee increases will cause any existing licensees to discontinue operations or prevent new applications.

There will be a direct economic impact on those facilities licensed under the Pet Animal Act. The proposed fee increases are reflected below.

Contact the Department of Agriculture and request the Economic Impact Statement for a detailed document showing the impact of increased fees to each facility required to be licensed under the Kansas Pet Animal Act.

All entities required to be licensed under the Pet Animal Act, including animal breeders, hobby breeders, retail breeders, distributors, research facilities, pet shops, animal shelters, and boarding and training facilities will be directly affected by the proposed rules and regulations.

The AFI Program will be able to maintain a third inspector on staff, which will help ensure the health, safety, and welfare of animals housed in licensed facilities.

Licensed facilities will have a greater certainty regarding the routine inspection process. The Division of Animal Health will no longer have to allocate State General Fund dollars out of proportion from other program areas to support the AFI Program.

The AFI Program considered reducing the number of inspectors to match the current funding levels of the AFI Program. Proposals to reduce inspectors from three to two were considered and proposed to the legislature. However, the ability to fund a third inspector was provided through the increased fees allowed by HB 2477 and an increase in state general funds provided to the program.

The estimated total annual implementation and compliance cost reasonably expected to be incurred by or passed along to businesses, local governments, or members of the public is \$93,820. Data is based on the current amount of money collected for each license issued and the increased compliance costs are based on the same number licenses issued with the proposed increase in fees.

The only anticipated impact on the revenue of cities, counties or school districts would be to cities or counties that currently operate animal shelters, which would be subject to the increased fees. To determine the anticipated impact, a letter and copy of the proposed regulations were sent to the League of Kansas Municipalities, Kansas Association of Counties and the Kansas Association of School Boards.

Since 2012, the Kansas Pet Animal Advisory Board has been heavily involved regarding the statute changes in HB 2477. Within these statute changes were fee cap increases for businesses required to be licensed under the Pet Animal Act.

The Kansas Pet Animal Advisory Board is a ten-member board, which represents each sector of the pet animal facilities required to be licensed. At least 24 meetings have occurred with this advisory board since the beginning of the process to increase fees. These fee proposals were voted on and passed by the Kansas Pet Animal Advisory board. In addition, all meetings held with the Kansas Pet Animal Advisory Board were open to the public and licensees to attend and comment.

Input was also received during legislative hearings on HB 2477 from multiple industry sources.

The proposed regulations are not expected to have an environmental impact.

These regulations are proposed for permanent revision. A summary of the proposed changes follows:

K.A.R. 109-5-1. Continuing education; requested changes are to redefine how continuing education credit shall be awarded, to add a course issued by another state's emergency medical services regulatory or accrediting body as an acceptable certificate of attendance or completion, and to add programs or courses approved by another state's emergency medical service regulatory or accrediting body as presumptively approved.

These changes will result in some Kansas certificate holders not having to complete a retroactive approval process to obtain credit for training completed in other states. There are no anticipated costs to the agency, nor any affect to businesses.

K.A.R. 109-8-1. Examination; is revised to change from a vendor contracted skills exam to a psychomotor skills exam approved by the board.

There are no anticipated costs to the agency, nor any affect to businesses.

K.A.R. 109-8-2. Scheduling examinations for certification; is revised to change from a vendor contracted skills exam to a psychomotor skills exam approved by the

board and clean up the reexamination process for candidates unsuccessful on their initial attempt.

There are no anticipated costs to the agency, nor any affect to businesses.

K.A.R. 109-11-6a. Paramedic course approval; is revised to remove an incorrect reference to K.S.A. 65-6119, all remaining changes either incorporate language that mimic requirements of the committee on accreditation of educational programs for emergency medical services professions or remove requirements that are redundant due to the monitoring of the accrediting body.

There are no anticipated costs to the agency. It is anticipated that the seven educational institutions within the State and any educational institutions seeking emergency medical services program accreditation may realize savings associated with these changes due to current redundant requirements which require vastly different reporting.

K.A.R. 115-2-7. This new permanent regulation establishes the backcountry access pass. The proposed regulation would create a backcountry pass to limit and protect sensitive areas within Little Jerusalem State Park.

Economic Impact Summary: The economic effect on potential park users could be \$730,000 annually, if 20 people were allowed to access the backcountry areas twice daily and all slots were filled, all of which would accrue to the park fee fund. Otherwise, no other economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public is anticipated.

K.A.R. 115-7-1. This permanent regulation establishes legal equipment and methods of take for fishing. The proposed amendments would not allow bowfishing for catfish on rivers and streams due to increased concerns about unlawful activity.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any significant economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public.

K.A.R. 115-7-4. This permanent regulation establishes processing and possession requirements for fish. The proposed amendments to the regulation would align Kansas with Oklahoma with regard to paddlefish roe possession, in an attempt to curtail unlawful activity.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any significant economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public.

K.A.R. 115-7-10. This permanent regulation establishes special provisions for fishing. The proposed amendments would update the aquatic nuisance species reference document.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any significant economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public.

K.A.R. 115-18-8. This permanent regulation establishes requirements for retrieval and possession of game animals, sport fish and migratory game birds. The proposed amendments would clean up cross-references to other regulations.

The “prize symbols” and “captions” for this game are as follows:

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 20 play spots within the “CALL LETTERS” play area, in each of six play spots within each “BONUS WORD” play area, in two play spots in the “BONUS WORD PRIZE” area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 014.

(e) The price of instant tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$20.00 each.

(f) The “Extreme Crossword” game is a two-sided crossword game with six separate play areas. 111-7-81. Determination of winners. (a) "Keno" tickets may be sold every day of the year between 4:00 a.m. and 2:52 a.m. with validation allowed until 3:00 a.m.

(b) The selection of winning numbers shall take place as nearly as possible, at four-minute intervals. The first drawing will be at 4:04 a.m. with subsequent drawings every four minutes thereafter with the last drawing at 2:52 a.m. If a drawing cannot be held at the scheduled drawing time, the delayed drawing will take place at the next scheduled drawing time. Ticket sales for each drawing will end momentarily immediately prior to the scheduled drawing and then resume for the next draw-

ing without delay. Keno wagering will not be inhibited between games. Each game is identified by a 6-digit consecutive game number that is assigned by the central system and the game number(s) for the drawing(s) for which the ticket was purchased will appear on the ticket. In the event a drawing does not occur at the drawing time scheduled, sales for that drawing will remain closed. Sales for the following drawing will remain open until four minutes after the results of the delayed drawing have been posted by the system. Winning game number selections for any games remaining on a player's ticket at the end of daily sales shall take place the next day.

(c) Winning number combinations shall be generated every four minutes through the use of a computer-driven random number generator located at lottery headquarters. The 20 numbers randomly generated for each drawing shall include one randomly generated number which is designated as the bulls-eye. The generator shall be statistically analyzed, tested, and certified by an independent qualified statistician for integrity. Periodic checks shall be made to ensure the security and integrity of the system at least quarterly.

(d) The Kansas lottery director of security shall establish the procedures for the operation and security of the random number generator, including the specification of those individuals who shall have access to the system. A security officer shall accompany anyone needing access to the secured area containing the generator for any reason.

(e) All Keno prizes, including bulls-eye prizes, shall be the prizes set forth in subsection (a) of K.A.R. 111-7-80 and 111-7-80a except when the prize in any game from a 5 spot game through a 10 spot game exceeds \$599 where total prizes for that game and prize category for a single draw exceeds \$1,500,000. If that occurs, each valid winner's share for the game and prize category shall be calculated as a pari-mutuel prize from a prize pool of \$1,500,000. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710, and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-8-5-94, July 15, 1994; amended, T-111-12-18-95, Dec. 14, 1995; amended, T-111-6-27-96, June 21, 1996; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996; amended, T-111-7-19-99, June 17, 1999; amended, T-111-3-31-00, March 17, 2000; amended, T-111-3-10-06, Dec. 13, 2005; amended, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-268. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery may conduct an on-line draw, Keno-style game known as "Racetrax." Tickets for the game may be sold every day of the year between 4:00 a.m. and 2:50 a.m. the next morning with validation allowed until 3:00 a.m. The rules for the "Racetrax" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et. seq.* and 111-7-268 through 111-7-275. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-269. Definitions. Unless the context of the word(s) clearly indicates otherwise, the following definitions shall apply to the game of "Racetrax":

(a) "Bet type" means one of the following thirteen (13) wagers that can be made by a player that the horse or

horses selected will finish the race as follows:

(1) "Win" means the horse selected is wagered to finish in first place;

(2) "Show" means one of the horse or horses selected is wagered to finish in first, second or third place;

(3) "Win/show" means one of the horse or horses selected is wagered to finish in first, second or third place, and if the horse finishes in first place the player wins both the win and show wager prizes, but if the horse finishes in second or third place the player only wins the show wager prize;

(4) "Exacta" means a wager choosing two horses that will finish in first and second places in the exact order selected;

(5) "Exacta box" means a wager choosing at least two horses that will finish in first and second places in any order;

(6) "Exacta wheel" means choosing three or more horses, of which two will finish in first and second places in exact order;

(7) "Quinella" means a wager selecting two or more horses to finish in first and second places in any order;

(8) "Trifecta" means a wager choosing three horses to finish in first, second and third places in exact order.

(9) "Trifecta box" means a wager choosing at least three horses that will finish in first, second and third places in any order.

(10) "Trifecta wheel" means a wager choosing four or more horses, of which three will finish in first, second and third places in exact order.

(11) "Superfecta" means a wager choosing four horses that will finish in first, second, third and fourth place in the exact order selected;

(12) "Superfecta box" means a wager choosing at least four horses that will finish in first, second, third and fourth places in any order.

(13) "Superfecta wheel" means a wager choosing five or more horses, of which four will finish in first, second, third and fourth places in exact order.

(b) "Consecutive draw ticket" or "multi-draw ticket" means a ticket purchased for 2, 3, 4, 5, 10 or 20 consecutive drawings.

(c) "Exchange ticket" means the ticket issued by an on-line terminal to replace a consecutive draw ticket that is validated before the last game on the ticket.

(d) "Game boards" or "boards" means that area of the play slip which contains 12 numbers from 1 to 12 for horse selection for each bet type.

(e) "Play slip" means the form provided by the Lottery used in marking a player's game play selections.

(f) "Quick pick" means the method by which a player allows the Lottery terminal to randomly make game play selections.

(g) "Racetrax bonus" means an optional wager that qualifies a player selecting the Racetrax bonus to have a chance to have their prize multiplied by three, four, five or ten times, which is in addition to the prize for the Racetrax game described in K.A.R. 111-7-270. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-270. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(continued)

(a) "Racetrax" is an animated game displayed on television monitors that simulates a horse race with twelve (12) horses numbered consecutively from "1" through and including "12." For each race, a player may select from the twelve (12) horses based upon the bet type chosen by the player. The outcome of each race is based upon fixed probabilities of winning and losing pursuant to the payable randomly selected for that race. After the random selection of a payable for the race with four (4) horses finishing 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th, prizes are awarded based on the finishing order of horses matched by a player for the bet type played for that race.

(b) To play, a player may only use a play slip, or ask the retailer for a quick pick wager for the Win, Show, Win/Show, Exacta, Quinella, Trifecta and Superfecta bet types. The quick pick option is not available for box or wheel bets via the play slip. Players may purchase quick pick box bets through the terminal.

(c) If using a play slip, the player shall do the following:

(1) First, the player must select the number of horse(s) corresponding with the bet type of the player's choice, as defined in K.A.R. 111-7-269;

(2) Second, the player must mark the number of dollars to be wagered per game in increments of \$0.10, \$0.50, \$1, \$2, \$3, \$4, \$5, \$10 or \$20 per bet combination;

(3) Third, the player shall indicate the number of consecutive races to be played of one, two, three, four, five, 10 or 20;

(4) Fourth, the player may then select the option of playing the Racetrax bonus. If selected, the Racetrax bonus option will multiply the cost of the wager by two times. The Racetrax bonus multiplier, if any, is randomly determined before each race and shall offer either no multiplier or, three (3), four (4), five (5) or ten (10) times the amount of all winning wagers; and,

(5) Fifth, the player shall present the completed play slip to the retailer. The cost of the ticket shall equal the amount wagered per race times the number of possible outcomes time the number of consecutive races selected by the player.

(d) The minimum wager shall be \$1.00 per race. The maximum wager per race is \$120 if the Racetrax bonus is not played. The maximum wager per race when the Racetrax bonus is played is \$240. Any play slip with a wager greater than \$120 without bonus or \$240 with bonus shall be rejected.

(e) Maximum liability for any Racetrax game is the amount wagered by a player in that specific game. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-271. Prize payment. (a) Prizes must be claimed within one year from the date of the drawing for which the ticket was purchased.

(b) At the conclusion of the prize claim period, all unclaimed prizes shall remain in the lottery's prize payment fund to be used for the payment of other prizes. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-272. Prize Pool; Reserve Pool. (a) The prize pool in the lottery prize payment fund for all prize categories for the Racetrax game shall consist of fifty per cent

(50%) of sales for each draw.

(b) Any moneys remaining in the prize pool following each draw, except unclaimed prizes, shall be placed in a prize reserve pool for subsequent Racetrax game drawings. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-273. Prize Structure and Probability of Winning. (a) The following table sets forth the probability of winning a prize based on bet type and horse number per \$1.00 wagered:

(b)(1) Win, show, quinella, exacta and trifecta bet types: The maximum prize liability is \$1,000,000 per race. The maximum prize liability is \$1,575,000 when there are bonus winners.

(2) There is a \$315,000 maximum prize liability per race on any one Racetrax ticket when Racetrax bonus is not selected, or when the Racetrax bonus is selected and no multiplier occurs on the bonus wheel. The maximum prize per race is \$1,575,000 on any one Racetrax ticket when the Racetrax bonus is selected and a multiplier occurs on the bonus wheel. When the liability per race per bet type exceeds these stated levels, the prizes shall be calculated on a pari-mutuel basis.

(c) Superfecta bet type: The maximum prize liability is \$650,248 per race. The maximum prize liability is \$1,950,744 is when there are bonus winners.

The maximum prize is \$650,248 per race on any one ticket without bonus and \$1,950,744 with bonus. When the maximum liability per race per bet type exceeds these stated levels, the prizes shall be calculated on a pari-mutuel basis. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-274. Claiming prizes; procedure and time period. (a) Prior to the payment of any prize, each ticket shall be validated by the retailer or lottery pursuant to this article.

(b) The procedure for payment of a "Racetrax" prize on any single game ticket is as follows:

(1) The holder of a ticket purchased in Kansas may present the ticket to any Racetrax retailer. Upon validation of the ticket, the retailer shall immediately make payment of a prize of \$599 or less to the holder. If the retailer cannot validate the ticket, or if the prize is \$600 or more, the claimant shall fill out a claim form provided by the retailer and personally present or mail the completed form together with the ticket to the Kansas lottery. If the ticket is validated and a completed claim form is received, then payment shall be made either directly to the claimant if personally present at lottery headquarters or by mail.

(2) The claimant may bring the ticket to the Kansas lottery headquarters office during the hours that the office is open to the public for business. Upon validation of the ticket, and completion of a claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(3) The claimant may mail the ticket with a completed claim form to the Kansas lottery headquarters office in Topeka, Kansas. Claim forms may be obtained from any Kansas lottery retailer, the Kansas lottery office, or online

at the Kansas lottery's official website. Upon validation of the ticket and receipt of a completed claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant. If any evidence of alteration, mutilation, tear or other ambiguity appears on the ticket, the retailer shall not make direct payment of a prize. The claimant shall submit a claim form with the ticket to the Kansas lottery headquarters. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-7-275. Description; Racetrax Bonus option. (a) In addition to the Racetrax game described in K.A.R. 111-7-270, a player may choose the Racetrax bonus option, which allows the player selecting the option the possibility of winning an additional prize. A player wins on the Racetrax Bonus option if the bonus wheel selects a specific multiplier of three, four, five or 10 times for the player's ticket for the drawing for which the ticket was purchased,

(b) To play the Racetrax bonus option, the player must play the Racetrax game and mark the Racetrax bonus option on the play slip.

(c) The amount of the Racetrax bonus wager must be marked on the play slip and it must equal the amount of the Racetrax wager, which will double the total wager.

(d) The minimum wager when selecting the Racetrax bonus option shall be \$2 per game and the maximum wager shall be \$40 per game. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

Article 9.—PULL-TAB GAMES

111-9-219. "Treasure Hunt" pull tab ticket lottery game number 795. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a pull tab lottery game entitled "Treasure Hunt." The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-8-1 *et seq.* and K.A.R. 111-9-219.

(b) The price of pull tab tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$1.00 each.

(c) Approximately 2,400,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game which shall be packaged in packs of 300 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 299. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

Symbol of a treasure chest

Symbol of a map

Symbol of a parrot

Symbol of a pirate

Symbol of two swords

Symbol of a ship

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of four tabs on the back of each ticket. On the front of each ticket shall appear a legend of all winning combinations using the play symbols for this game along with the corresponding prize amount for each combination, as follows: three symbols of a ship equal \$1.00; three symbols of two swords equal \$5.00; three symbols of a pi-

(continued)

rate equal \$10.00; three symbols of a parrot equal \$25.00; three symbols of a map equal \$100.00; three symbols of a treasure chest equal \$1,000.00.

(f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (e) above. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.

(g) The number and value of prizes in this game and winning combinations shall be as follows: (See corresponding play symbol values in subsection (e) above.)

Article 19.—SPECIFIC PLAYER LOYALTY CLUB RULES

111-19-46. Survival Bike Giveaway. (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a drawing entitled “Survival Bike Giveaway” awarding a total of 10 prizes. Entries into the drawings will be accepted beginning at 12:01 a.m. on September 1, 2018. Entries into the drawing will close at noon on November 30, 2018. The drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed but before noon on December 6, 2018, at which time the winners will be announced.

(b) A player shall enter the drawing through the Kansas lottery PlayOn program at www.kslottery.com. The player shall follow the hyperlink specifically developed for the purpose of accessing the “Survival Bike Giveaway” and shall redeem 272 PlayOn points for one entry into the drawing.

(c) In the drawing, the first 10 winners will each receive a Motoped Survival Bike, number 1 through 10. The next five entrants, number 11 through 15, shall be used as alternate winners in the order drawn, if needed. Prize package is not exchangeable for cash. Motoped Survival Bikes awarded are extra prizes from a previous drawing and are no longer made by the manufacturer. Any prize winner must pick up the prize at lottery headquarters,

128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas, between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Each prize package is valued at approximately \$1,715.00.

(d) A player may enter the drawing as many times as their points allow, but may win only one prize package.

The winner must return his or her completed claim form, and the claim form must be received by the Kansas lottery within 14 calendar days following the date of the drawing. Failing to return the completed claim form in the allotted time may, if in the opinion of the Executive Director it is warranted, result in the prize being awarded to an alternate winner. In the event an alternate winner is awarded a prize, that alternate winner must return his or her completed claim form and the claim form must be received by the Kansas lottery within 14 calendar days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail or another alternate will be selected until all alternates are exhausted.

(f) Only registered PlayOn members may enter the “Survival Bike Giveaway” drawing. PlayOn members must enter themselves into the drawings according to the terms and conditions of PlayOn. Entries shall not be accepted which are submitted by any method other than through PlayOn.

(g) By entering the promotion, entrant agrees to PlayOn terms and conditions.

(h) Prizes are awarded as is with no guarantee or warranty.

(i) The Lottery shall have no liability for any prizes awarded, and players accept all prizes in awarded condition and waive any claims of liability against the State and/or the Lottery.

(j) Rules applicable to this promotion are contained in K.A.R. 111-19-46 and K.A.R. 111-18-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

Article 301.—SPECIFIC LOTTRY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES

111-301-68. Definitions. The following definitions when pertaining to the game of “Free Bet Blackjack” shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) “Blackjack” shall mean an ace and any card having a point value of 10 dealt as the initial two cards to a player or a dealer, except that this shall not include an ace and a ten-point value card dealt to a player who has split pairs.

(b) “Burn” or “burning” a card shall mean to remove a card from play.

(c) “Bust” shall mean the sum of the cards in the player’s hand exceeds a total of 21.

(d) “Dealer” shall mean the person responsible for dealing the cards.

(e) “Discard rack” shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed after each round of decisions is rendered in a game.

(f) "Free bet lammer" or "lammer" shall mean a token or medallion having no monetary game play value that the dealer places on a player's area of the table game layout for the purpose of visually keeping track of all free double down and/or free split wagers made during a game by a player, until the wager has been resolved, at which time the dealer shall remove the lammer(s) from the player's area of the table gaming layout.

(g) "Hard total" shall mean the total point count of a hand which contains no aces or which contains one or more aces that are each counted as having one point in value.

(h) "Hit" shall mean the player shall receive one or more additional cards for that hand, which may be dealt face up.

(i) "Hole card" shall mean the second card dealt to the dealer, which card is dealt face down.

(j) "Initial blackjack wager" shall mean the first wager made by a player, which wager pertains to the blackjack portion of the game and which wager must be made in order for the player to participate in that game.

(k) "Primary wager" shall mean any of the following wagers: initial blackjack; split; free split; double down; and, free double down.

(l) "Push" or "tie" shall mean the player does not lose or win the hand played.

(m) "Shoe" or "dealing shoe" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed to be held for dealing to the players and dealer.

(n) "Soft total" shall mean the total point count of a hand containing an ace when the ace is counted as having 11 points in value.

(o) "Stand" shall mean the player shall receive no more cards for that hand.

(p) "Up card" shall mean the first card dealt to the dealer, which is turned face up. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-14-18, March 14, 2018; amended, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-301-70. Game operations. The following game operations shall apply the game of "Free Bet Blackjack":

(a) The following procedures for shuffling shall be implemented:

(1) The cards will be shuffled at various times including, but not limited to, the following circumstances:

- (A) New decks are put into play;
- (B) After the completion of the hand in which the cut card appeared;
- (C) The decks have been dropped or otherwise mishandled; and,
- (D) When instructed to do so by a table games supervisor or higher-ranking casino official.

(2) The cards may be shuffled manually or a shuffling machine may be used to shuffle the cards.

(b) The following procedures for card cutting shall be implemented:

(1) Upon completion of the shuffle, the dealer will offer the decks to a player to cut. In the event all players at the table fail or refuse to perform the cut, the dealer or table games supervisor will cut the cards;

(2) The cut will be performed by inserting the cut card

not less than approximately one deck from either end of the stack of cards; and,

(3) Once the deck has been cut, the dealer will insert the cut card approximately one and one-half decks from the back of the six-deck or eight-deck shoe unless otherwise instructed by the table games supervisor or higher-ranking casino official.

(c) The following procedures for dealing and taking cards shall be implemented:

(1) Cards are distributed to the players, one at a time and face up, from left to right. The dealer distributes one card to the dealer face down before continuing. The dealer deals a second card to each player, one at a time face up, from left to right and deals a second card to the dealer face down, turns the first card face up, and places the second card directly under the dealer's first card;

(2) Beginning with the first player position to the left of the dealer, each player will indicate whether they wish to stand or hit. Cards will continue being distributed to each player, one at a time face up, until the player indicates his or her desire to stand or the player busts, whichever comes first;

(3) After all of the players have stood or busted, the dealer's second card will be turned face up and the dealer will announce the total point value of the dealer's two cards. If any player's hand is still in action, the dealer will hit if the dealer holds cards with a total point value of 16 or less or a soft 17. The dealer will stand on a hard 17 or higher total point value; and,

(4) If a player has a losing hand, the dealer will remove the player's chips and pick up the cards for placement into the discard rack.

(d) The following procedures for burning cards shall be implemented:

(1) A dealer will burn a card after completion of the shuffle; and,

(2) A dealer will burn a card upon the dealer entering a game.

(e) All remaining winning and losing wagers will be paid and collected in turn beginning with the first player to the dealer's right and working toward the left. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-14-18, March 14, 2018; amended, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-301-71. Wagers and payout odds. (a) Minimum and maximum wagers will be posted on a sign at each table.

(b) Maximum table payouts, if any, will be posted at each table and will not be less than the maximum wager times the maximum odds.

(c) If a player has been permitted to wager less than the table minimum, the dealer will take or pay the amount actually wagered. If a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the excess will be returned to the player and the dealer will pay the correct odds on the posted maximum amount. The player will be informed of the table minimum or maximum for subsequent wagers.

(d) A player may play two hands at double the table minimum per hand not to exceed the table maximum per

(continued)

wager. A player may play three hands at five times the table minimum, per hand, not to exceed the table maximum per wager. Exceptions to this rule are permitted if approved by the pit manager, casino shift manager, or higher-ranking casino official.

(e) The following describes a list of permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win, loss, or tie:

(1) Primary wagers:

(A) An initial blackjack wager must be made by the player prior to the first card of the game dealt to the player;

(B) Notwithstanding the minimum and maximum wagers, an optional additional wager may be made as a tip for the dealer provided the tip wager is made at the same time as the underlying wager;

(C) A primary wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21;

(D) Except as provided in subsection (E), below, a primary wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is lower than the total point value of the dealer's cards;

(E) A primary wager will tie if the point value of the dealer's hand totals 22 or if the total point value of the player's cards is equivalent to the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding 21. A hand containing a blackjack beats a hand with a total point value of 21 that uses three or more cards; and,

(F) When a player's hand consists of a blackjack, the winning hand will be paid out at a rate of 3 to 2. All winning primary wagers, except hands consisting of a blackjack, will be paid out at the rate of 1 to 1.

(2) Insurance wager:

(A) An insurance wager is an optional one-time wager in an amount up to one-half of the initial blackjack wager that may be made by a player when the dealer's up card is an ace. An insurance wager must be made prior to the dealer looking at the hole card;

(C) An insurance wager will win at the rate of 2 to 1 if the dealer has a blackjack;

and,

(D) An insurance wager will lose if the dealer does not have a blackjack.

(3) Double Down wager: A double down wager is an optional additional wager made by the player up to the amount of the player's initial blackjack wager on the condition only one additional card will be dealt to the player. This wager can be made on any hand consisting of two cards including after splitting, except that the wager may not be made after splitting aces;

(4) Free Double Down wager: A free double down wager is an additional optional free wager that may be made by the player on the condition only one additional card will be dealt to the player. This free wager can be made on any hard total hand consisting of two (2) cards totaling 9, 10, or 11 points, including after splitting, with the exception of splitting aces. All free double down wagers shall be made without making an additional wager.

(5) Split wager: A split wager is an optional additional wager made when a player's initial two cards are of the same face value. A split wager must be equal in value to the initial blackjack wager. A player may make a split

wager up to three (3) times for a total of four (4) hands. A player may also double down after making a split wager with the exception of after splitting aces. A player will only receive one additional card after splitting aces.

(6) Free Split wager: A free split wager is an additional optional wager that may be made when a player's initial two (2) cards are of the same face value. Players may free split any pair except a pair where both cards have the value 10 (two 10's, two jacks, two queens, or two kings). All free split wagers shall be made without making an additional wager;

(7) Pot of gold wager:

(A) If a pot of gold wager is offered on the game, the optional wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the game being dealt to the player, in an area designated on the table game layout for the pot of gold wager. The player must make an initial blackjack wager in order to place a pot of gold wager;

(B) If a player has made the pot of gold wager, each time in a game the player makes a free double down wager and/or a free split wager, the dealer shall place one free bet lammer on that player's playing area on the table game layout;

(C) A pot of gold wager wins if during the game in which that wager is made the player collects at least one "free bet lammer";

(D) A pot of gold wager loses if during the game in which the wager is made the player does not collect at least one (1) free bet lammer;

(E) Winning pot of gold wagers will be paid out as follows:

(i) 7 Free Bet lammers collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 100 to 1;

(ii) 6 Free Bet lammers collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 100 to 1;

(iii) 5 Free Bet lammers collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 100 to 1;

(iv) 4 Free Bet lammers collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 50 to 1;

(v) 3 Free Bet lammers collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 30 to 1;

(vi) 2 Free Bet lammers collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 12 to 1; and,

(vii) 1 Free Bet lammer collected during a game will be paid at a rate of 3 to 1.

(8) Push 22 Bonus Wager:

(A) If an optional push 22 bonus wager is offered on the game, the optional wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the game being dealt to the player, in an area designated on the table game layout for the push 22 bonus. The player must make an initial blackjack wager in order to place the push 22 bonus wager;

(B) A push 22 bonus wager will win if the total point value of the dealer's cards is twenty-two (22) and will lose if the value of the dealer's cards is anything other than twenty-two (22);

(C) Winning push 22 bonus wagers will be paid out as follows:

(i) When the dealer's cards are all the same suit, the push 22 bonus wager will be paid at a rate of 50:1.

(ii) When the dealer's cards are all the same color but not the same suit, the push 22 bonus wager will be paid

at a rate of 20:1.

(iii) When all of the dealer's cards are not the same color or the same suit, the push 22 bonus wager will be paid at a rate of 7:1

(f) Each dealer tip wager shall win or lose and be resolved in the same manner as the player's wager. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-14-18, March 14, 2018; amended, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

Article 501.—SOUTH CENTRAL GAMING ZONE

111-501-143. Play. (a) The game of High Card Flush is played with a standard 52-card deck of playing cards.

(b) All ante wagers, flush bonus wagers and straight flush bonus wagers shall be placed prior to the first card being dealt in a round of play.

(c) A shuffling machine may be used in the game of High Card Flush. When a shuffling machine is used, the machine will deal seven (7) cards at a time. Beginning with the first player to the left of the dealer and continuing clockwise in order around the table, the dealer shall deal each player and the dealer seven (7) cards one stack at a time face down. In the event a shuffling machine is not used and the dealer manually shuffles the cards, beginning with the first player to the left of the dealer who has placed an ante wager and continuing clockwise in order around the table, the dealer shall deal each player who has placed an ante wager and the dealer seven (7) cards face down. Each player shall be dealt all seven (7) cards before the next player or dealer is dealt his or her seven (7) cards.

(d) After all cards have been dealt, each player may examine his or her cards. Each player who places a wager shall be responsible for his or her own hand and no person other than the dealer and the player to whom the cards were dealt may touch the cards of that player.

(e) After examination of his or her cards, each player who has placed an ante wager shall have the option to either forfeit the ante wager and end his or her participation against the dealer's hand or make a raise wager. A raise wager must be equal to the amount of the player's ante wager unless the player's hand consists of five (5) or more cards of the same suit. If the player's hand consists of five (5) cards of the same suit, the player may make a raise wager up to two (2) times the amount of the player's ante wager. If the player's hand consists of six (6) or seven (7) cards of the same suit, the player may make a raise wager up to three (3) times the amount of the player's ante wager. If a player has placed an ante wager along with a flush bonus wager and/or straight flush bonus wager but does not make a raise wager, the player shall forfeit the ante wager.

(f) After each player has either placed a raise wager on the designated area of the table or forfeited his or her wager and hand, the dealer shall collect all forfeited wagers and associated cards, placing them in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine. The dealer shall then reveal the dealer's cards and place the cards so as to form the highest possible ranking hand available for the dealer's cards.

(g) The dealer shall then settle the wagers remaining on the table by performing the procedure in subsection (h) below. All cards collected during the procedure shall be placed in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine.

(h) Starting with the player farthest to the dealer's right and continuing counterclockwise around the table the dealer shall:

(1) Reveal the cards of each remaining player, one player at a time;

(2) Determine the highest ranking hand of each remaining player;

(3) Collect all losing wagers;

(4) Pay each winning wager in accordance with the payout odds listed below; and,

(5) Collect all player cards and place them in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine.

(i) All cards collected by the dealer shall be picked up in order and placed in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine in such a way that they can be readily arranged to reconstruct each hand in the event of a question or dispute.

(j) There are three winning payout types, as follows:

(1) A player in competition against the dealer shall be paid at odds of one to one on both the ante wager and the raise wager if the player's hand is ranked higher than the dealer's hand, except that to win both wagers the dealer's hand must contain at least a three card flush containing a 9 or higher ranking card and the player's hand must be ranked higher than the dealer's hand. If the dealer does not hold a hand with at least a three card flush containing a 9 or higher ranking card, the player's ante wager shall automatically be paid at odds of one to one and the player's raise wager shall be returned to the player as a draw (tie).

(2) A player placing a flush bonus wager shall be paid at the following odds:

Four card flush	1 to 1
Five card flush	10 to 1
Six card flush	100 to 1
Seven card flush	300 to 1

(3) A player placing a straight flush bonus wager shall be paid at the following odds:

Three card straight flush	7 to 1
Four card straight flush	60 to 1
Five card straight flush	100 to 1
Six card straight flush	1000 to 1
Seven card straight flush	8000 to 1

(4) Notwithstanding the payout odds, the maximum aggregate payout limit for any bonus hand shall be \$25,000, exclusive of the ante or the raise wager. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-05-17, Oct. 11, 2017; amended, T-111-3-7-18, Jan. 17, 2018; amended, T-111-5-18-18, April 11, 2018; amended, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-501-144. Name of game; rules and regulations.

The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game
(continued)

at the Kansas Star Casino in Mulvane, Kansas, entitled "Craps No More."

The rules and regulations for the game of "Craps No More" are contained in K.A.R. 111-501-144 through 111-501-148, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-501-145. General definitions. The following general definitions shall apply to the craps no more game. Bet definitions are contained in KAR 111-501-147:

(a) "Come-out point" means a total of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 thrown by the shooter on a come-out roll.

(b) "Come-out roll" means the first roll of the dice at the opening of the game and first roll of the dice after a decision with respect to a pass bet that has been affected.

(c) "Come point" means a total of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 thrown by the shooter on the next roll of the dice following placement of a come bet.

(d) "Seven out" means a total of seven thrown by the shooter subsequent to his/her establishment of a come-out point.

(e) "Seven winner" means a total of seven thrown by the shooter prior to his/her establishment of a come-out point.

(f) "Total" means the sum of the pips, dots or spots shown on the high or uppermost sides of the two dice on any given roll.

(g) "Roll" means the throw of the dice by the shooter.

(h) "Shooter" means the player who throws or rolls the dice.

(i) "Craps crew" means the dealers assigned to a single craps game.

(j) "Natural" means the total shown on the dice is seven or eleven when thrown on a come-out roll.

(k) "Check" or "chip" means a non-metal representative of value which is commonly used for betting purposes on the layouts of the games, instead of money. Each check or chip color shall have a different assigned value.

(l) "Boxperson" means an employee authorized to supervise a craps game only.

(m) "Ace" means a single die showing one spot up.

(n) "Aces - craps, two" means one die showing one spot up and the other die showing another one spot up.

(o) "Deuce" means a die with two spots up.

(p) "Ace-deuce-craps, three" means one die showing one spot up and the other die showing two spots up.

(q) "Sixes - Craps, twelve" means one die showing six spots up and the other die showing six spots up.

(r) "Craps" means when the shooter rolls one of the craps numbers, 2, 3, or 12.

(s) "Easy way" means to roll any number 4, 6, 8, or 10 in any way but the hardway.

(t) "One-roll bet" means a bet which is decided on the next roll of the dice. For example: field, any seven, craps two, craps three, craps twelve, eleven, horn bets, horn high bets and any craps.

(u) "Vigorish" or "juice" means the commission collected on some bets, such as buy bets or lay bets.

(v) "Proposition bets" means the center bets or one roll bets, as follows: any seven, craps (two, three or twelve), eleven, horn bets, horn highs and any craps. Further-

more, hardway bets are also proposition bets, even though those bets are not a one roll bet.

(w) "Stick" means the instrument used to move, present or gather dice.

(x) "Bowl" means the container in which the dice shall be stored during a live game directly in front of the stickperson.

(y) "Wager" or "bet" means the amount and type of gamble a player makes on a dice game.

(z) "Dealer" means the casino employee responsible for paying winning wagers, collecting losing wagers, and placing wagers on a dice game.

(aa) "Stickperson" means the casino employee responsible for the dice, pace of the game, and proposition area. The stickperson is also one of the dealers.

(bb) "Craps bank" means the chips located in front of the boxperson.

(cc) "Button" means a circular shaped chip bearing words on one or both sides that has no monetary value in the game of craps no more but is only used to visually signify various actions as otherwise provided in the rules of the game.

(dd) "Come odds" means wagers taken on come bets after the point is established that the shooter will roll the established number again before rolling a 2, 3 or 12. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-501-146. Table characteristics. (a) A craps no more table is oblong and surrounded by a vertical wall. The inside of the vertical wall is covered with a rubber-like material. A mirror is placed opposite the boxperson's position to allow the boxperson and table games supervisors or above to verify payoffs, change, and wagers.

(b) A table layout approved by the Kansas lottery will be used. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-501-147. Rules of the game and bet definitions. (a) Control of the dice at a craps no more table is the responsibility of the stickperson at the table.

(b) The first player to accept the dice when offered shall become the shooter who shall select and retain two of the dice offered. Prior to selecting the dice, the shooter shall make a pass or don't pass bet after which the shooter shall throw the two selected dice so that they leave the shooter's hand simultaneously and in a manner calculated to cause them to strike the end of the table farthest from the shooter. It shall be the option of the shooter, after any roll, either to pass the dice or remain the shooter except that the shooter shall pass the dice upon throwing a losing total of 7 (this does not apply to the come out roll). The table games supervisor may order the shooter to pass the dice to another player if the shooter unreasonably delays the game, repeatedly makes invalid rolls or violates applicable rules and regulations pertaining to the game of craps no more.

(c) If a shooter, after making the come out point, elects not to place a pass or don't pass bet, and other wagers remain on the table with respect to come and/or don't

come numbers, the craps no more stickperson shall offer the dice to the player immediately to the left of the previous shooter.

(d) The stickperson, boxperson, table games supervisor or a higher-ranking casino employee shall have the authority to invalidate a roll of the dice by calling "no roll" for any of the following reasons:

(1) If the wrong player picks up the dice and throws or rolls them.

(2) If the dice do not hit the end of the table opposite the shooter.

(3) The dice do not leave the shooter's hand simultaneously.

(4) Either or both of the dice come to rest on the chips constituting the craps bank.

(5) Either or both of the dice come to rest in the dice bowl in front of the stickperson or on one of the rails surrounding the table.

(6) Either or both of the dice go off the table.

(7) Whenever one die comes to rest on top of the other.

(8) The shooter does not have a pass bet.

(9) Either or both of the dice do not move with forward motion.

(10) If the shooter removes either one or both dice from the view of the boxperson or table games supervisor or higher-ranking casino official.

(11) If the shooter attempts to deface or actually defaces the dice, no matter if done purposely or unintentionally.

(e) Whenever new dice are put into the game or existing dice are returned to the game, they shall be inspected by the boxperson before being put into the dice bowl.

(f) Permissible wagers shall be as follows:

(1) "Pass bet" shall mean a wager placed on the pass line of the layout immediately prior to the come-out roll.

(A) The "pass bet" shall win if, on the come-out roll a total of 7 is thrown, or a total of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a total of 7 appears.

(B) The "pass bet" shall lose if, on the come-out roll a total of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is thrown again.

(2) "Come bet" shall mean a wager placed on the come line of the layout at any time after the come-out roll.

(A) The "come bet" shall win if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 7 is thrown, or a total of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.

(B) The "come bet" shall lose if after the come out roll and a point is established a total of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is thrown again.

(3) "Place bet to win" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time on any of the numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 which shall win if the number on which wager was placed is thrown before a 7 and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before such number. All place bets shall be active on any roll, except the come-out roll, unless called "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of such player's wager.

(4) "Buy bets" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, on the 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12. A buy bet shall win if the particular number is thrown before a 7 is

thrown and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before that number is thrown. In addition to the payout odds set forth in these rules for place bets on 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12, the player may also be offered the option of receiving true odds on these bets in return for the player paying at the time of making the bet an amount not to exceed five percent of such wager.

(5) "Four the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 4 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 2 appearing on each die), before a 4 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown.

(6) "Six the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 6 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 3 appearing on each die) before 6 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown.

(7) "Eight the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 8 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 4 appearing on each die) before 8 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown.

(8) "Ten the hardway" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 10 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 5 appearing on each die) before 10 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown.

(9) "Field bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if any of the totals of 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bets and shall lose if a total of 5, 6, 7, or 8 is thrown on such a roll.

(10) "Any seven" or "big red" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 7 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such a bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(11) "Eleven" or "yo" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 11 is thrown on the next roll and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(12) "Horn bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2, 3, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(13) "Horn high bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if any one of the totals 2, 3, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose, if any other total is thrown. A horn high bet will be placed in units of five, with four units wagered as a horn bet and an additional unit wagered on one of the totals 2, 3, 11, or 12.

(14) "World bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if any one of the totals 2, 3, 7, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown. A world bet shall be placed on the lower line of the any seven wager area in units of five with one unit wagered on each of the totals 2, 3, 7, 11, or 12.

(15) "Hop bet" means a one-roll wager that may be made at any time on a specific combination designated

(continued)

by the player which will win if the combination is thrown on a roll immediately following placement of such bet and will lose if any other combination is thrown.

(16) "Big six" or "big 6" means a wager placed in the area of the layout marked "big six" or "big 6," which shall win if a total of 6 is thrown before a 7 and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before a 6.

(17) "Big eight" or "big 8" means a wager placed on the area of the layout marked "big eight" or "big 8" and shall win if a total of eight is thrown before a 7, and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before an 8.

(18) "Split bet" means a one-roll wager that is placed on the line appearing on the table game layout between two proposition bets. One half of the split bet is being bet on each of the two proposition bets that appear on each side of the line. Both bets will be left up and a net payoff is made to the player.

(19) "Craps-eleven" or "C and E" means a one-roll split bet on any craps and eleven.

(20) "High-low" means a one-roll split bet aces (2) and twelve (12).

(21) "Put bets" are bets that are made directly on any number at any time, including the point, after the come-out roll has already been made. Put bets are allowed full odds as well.

(22) "Craps two" means a single roll wager that the sum of the dice on the next roll will be 2.

(23) "Craps three" means a single roll wager that the sum of the dice on the next roll will be 3.

(24) "Craps twelve" means a single roll wager that the sum of the dice on the next roll will be 12.

(25) "Any craps" means a single roll wager that the sum of the dice on the next roll will be 2, 3 or 12.

(26) "All small" is an optional wager that may be offered on selected craps tables that is placed before the point is established by a new shooter. The wager will win if a 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 are all rolled by the shooter before a 7 is rolled. The numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 may be rolled in any order, the same number may be rolled more than once, and rolling the numbers 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 are irrelevant to the wager. The wager will lose if a 7 is rolled before a 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 are all rolled by the shooter.

(27) "All tall" is an optional wager that may be offered on selected craps tables that is placed before the point is established by a new shooter. The wager will win if an 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter before a 7 is rolled. The numbers 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 may be rolled in any order, the same number may be rolled more than once, and rolling the numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6 are irrelevant to the wager. The wager will lose if a 7 is rolled before an 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter.

(28) "Make 'em all" is an optional wager that may be offered on selected craps tables that is placed before the point is established by a new shooter. The wager will win if a 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter before a 7 is rolled. The numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 may be rolled in any order and the same number may be rolled more than once. The wager will lose if a 7 is rolled before a 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-21-18, July 11, 2018.)

111-501-148. Making and removal of wagers. (a)

All wagers at craps no more shall be made by placing gaming chips on the appropriate areas of the craps no more layout.

(b) Wagers shall be made before the dice are thrown.

(c) Wagers may be made by a player or may be made by verbal confirmation of a desired bet communicated to the dealer by the player with subsequent placement of said bet on the appropriate portion of the layout by the dealer.

(d) A wager made on any bet may be removed or reduced at any time prior to a roll that decided the outcome of such wager except that a pass bet and a come bet shall not be removed or reduced after a come-out point or some point is established with respect to such bet. Pass and come bets are always active.

(e) All place bets, come odds and hardways shall be inactive on any come-out roll unless requested "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of the wager. All other wagers shall be considered active unless a player requests to have his bets inactive. The dealer through placement of an "off" button must confirm this.

(f) Minimum and maximum table limits will be posted.

(g) If a player wagers less than the table minimum bet and the dealer does not notice it, the dealer shall take or pay the amount actually bet and instruct the player of the minimum amount that must be wagered on subsequent bets.

(h) If in error a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the dealer shall remove the excess and return it to the player, pay the bet at the correct odds, and inform the player of the permissible amount that can be wagered on subsequent bets.

(i) In the event of a dealer placing a bet for a player, chips shall not be taken from the player's hands or from the rack in front of the player. All chips for the bet shall be set down on the layout by the player and the dealer shall clarify the purpose of the chips before picking them up.

(k) A horn bet shall be paid as if it were four separate wagers on 2,3,11, and 12.

(l) All charges for vigorish that are less than one dollar amounts, will be rounded down to the nearest dollar figure.

(m) Players may take odds on their pass and come bets as follows:

(1) On a pass line point/come bet of 2 and 12, odds can be taken up to 1 times the pass line bet.

(2) On a pass line point/come bet of 3 and 11, odds can be taken up to 2 times the pass line bet.

(3) On a pass line point/come bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to 3 times the pass line bet.

(4) On a pass line point/come bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to 4 times the pass line bet.

(5) On a pass line point/come bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to 5 times the pass line bet.

(n) Players may take odds on their put bets. Put bets are made the same way as pass line and come bets, except that put bets are placed directly on the number without going through the pass or come, as follows:

(1) On a put bet of 2 and 12, odds can be taken up to 1 times the pass line bet.

(2) On a put bet of 3 and 11, odds can be taken up to 2 times the pass line bet.

(3) On a put bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to three times the pass line bet.

(4) On a put bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to four times the pass line bet.

(5) On a put bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to five times the pass line bet.

(o) Players may make an optional wager on either the All Small, All Tall or Make 'em All bonus bet. The payout odds on winning "All small," "All Tall," and "Make 'em All" wagers are as follows:

(1) All small 34 to 1

(2) All tall 34 to 1

(3) Make 'em all 175 to 1
