Notice of Intent to Lease Real Property

Public notice is hereby given that Wichita State University (WSU) intends to directly lease, and indirectly sublease through its affiliate corporation Wichita State Innovation Alliance, Inc., subject to all required state approvals, an approximate ground area consisting of 150,000 square feet or less with the potential for expansion for parking, for the private development of one or more partnership buildings. This private development shall be located west of Oliver, between 17th and 18th streets, on the Wichita State University main campus. The university is interested in leasing such ground to any individual, organization, or entity whose presence on campus would advance the university’s applied learning vision or its mission as an educational, cultural, and economic driver for Kansas and the greater public good, and specifically an emphasis on supporting and growing advanced laboratories for research, testing, and innovation in data infrastructure/storage, video surveillance storage, IOT, security, analytics, visualization/modeling, and machine learning/AI. The university intends to lease such ground for any period of time up to sixty-five years, but extended terms and renewal options would be considered. Interested tenants must be willing to be a good fit with the university’s educational mission and identify anticipated benefits to the university, its students, and the WSU community (i.e. applied learning, joint research, faculty start-up, WSU curriculum or program support, etc.), and must agree to the essential ground lease terms and restrictive covenants. Interested tenants will be evaluated on: proposal terms, demonstrated benefit to WSU, design concepts, financial stability, and proposed use. Rental rate shall be assessed per leased or leasable square foot of the building but is negotiable based on term of lease and benefit to the university. The university will consider serious offers and inquiries with detailed proposal terms from any financially qualified individual, group, organization, or company and such offers will

be considered until a selection is made or this notice is withdrawn. The text of the Medicaid State Plan identified on Page 39 and Page 42, and Page 1 and Page 2 of Attachment 1 to Attachment 4.19-A will be amended to codify existing requirements regarding allowable costs. These pages will be amended to state the following:

Allowable costs are determined in accordance with the Principles of Reimbursement as outlined in the Provider Reimbursement Manual CMS Publication 15-1 and OMB Super Circular 2 CFR §200 Uniform Guidance for Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements.

Quality Class I Operating Permit Renewal**

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Southern Star Central Gas Pipeline, Inc. – Welda Compressor Station has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards, and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping, and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Southern Star Central Gas Pipeline, Inc., 4700 Hwy. 56, Owensboro, KY 42301 owns and operates a natural gas compressor station located at Section 34, Township 21S, Range 19E in Anderson County, Kansas.

order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received no later than 12:00 p.m. Monday, July 29, 2019.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Courtney Stallman, KDHE BOA, 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366, no later than 12:00 p.m. Monday, July 29, 2019 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. Requests for accommodation to participate in the hearing should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the Kansas Dental Board, Landon State Office Building, 900 SW Jackson, Room 455-S, Topeka, KS 66612-1231, phone 785-296-6400 (or TYY 1-800-766-3777). Handicapped parking is located on the west and north sides of the building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

The regulations are proposed for adoption as permanent regulations. A summary of the proposed regulations is as follows:

K.A.R. 71-5-11. The effect of this regulation requires that during the administration of parenteral conscious sedation or deep sedation or general anesthesia there must be continuous monitoring for the presence of exhaled carbon dioxide using a capnograph, unless doing so would be precluded or invalidated by the nature of the patient, procedure or equipment.

Summary of Economic Impact Statement. This amendment is not expected to have any economic impact on governmental agencies or units. It will require Level II and Level III sedation permit holders to own a capnograph monitoring device with a cost of approximately \$2,000.00. It is anticipated that most all Level III permit holders already own such a device. It is anticipated that the economic impact, if any, on the general public will be extremely minimal.

K.A.R. 71-8-8. This regulation provides that if a patient, parent or guardian has provided consent to a nursing home or school to access a patient’s dental records, the operator of a mobile dental facility or portable dental operation shall provide the nursing home or school the information sheet required by K.A.R. 71-8-8.

Summary of Economic Impact Statement. This amendment is not expected to have any economic impact on governmental agencies or units, persons subject to the proposed amendment or the general public.
