Background and Purpose of Project

The Kansas Turnpike Authority (KTA) is seeking a consultant to provide construction inspection services for project 7517, Turner Diagonal Design Build. The project is located on I-70 in Wyandotte County, Kansas.

Schedule/Deadlines

Request for Proposals (RFPs) are due on or before 12:00 p.m. (CST) November 21, 2019, to be delivered via email to rfleming@ksturnpike.com. Evaluation and ranking of submissions will occur on or about November 27, 2019, after which time all firms that submitted will be notified of the ranking. Negotiations with the most highly ranked firm to commence on or about December 2, 2019. An agreement should be in place on or about December 12, 2019. The contractor should start construction on the project sometime around January 3, 2020.

Scope of Services to be Performed

The needed inspectors must be capable and possess the required certifications to inspect any work on the project, which includes all inspection and material testing of items such as subgrade, base, aggregate base, cement treat-

ed base, concrete, HMA Paving/HMA Plant operations, PCCP Paving/Plant operations, geotechnical, retaining walls, traffic signals, pavement marking, joint use paths, ITS, traffic control, erosion control, building construction (structure, HVAC, plumbing, electrical), final paperwork, etc. Anticipated staffing needs: provide inspection project management and all inspectors as needed to ensure inspection and material testing for this project are done correctly. The number of required inspectors will fluctuate throughout the project depending on the project needs. One full-time inspection project manager and one full-time inspector will be required along with additional inspectors that can be supplemented as needed. Substantial completion is anticipated to be November 30, 2020; seeding, sodding, and striping May 2, 2021; with final acceptance 90 days after issuance of last notice of completion. The design-builder will not be restricted on work hours. Provide all the equipment necessary to inspect and test materials.

Instructions for Proposal

No costs shall be contained in the RFP. The RFP must not exceed four (4) pages total (including any cover letter, index, etc.) and 2MB to address the pertinent topics. RFPs submitted will consist of the letter of interest and a completed and signed Special Attachment No. 7 ("Certificate of Final Indirect Costs"), a completed and signed Special Attachment No. 8 ("Tax Clearance Certificate"), and a signed Special Attachment No. 10 ("Policy Regarding Sexual Harassment"). Completed Special Attachments do not count against the four-page technical proposal submission. RFPs shall indicate the consultant's ability to meet the project inspection needs described above. RFPs shall describe any processes or procedures, including best practices, that will be used to perform tasks and to produce the desired results described above under "Scope of Services to be Performed." The RFP shall also include items such as:

- Identify the full-time inspection project manager/engineer in charge and the one full time inspector, also verify that up to six intermittent inspectors are available for the project.
- History of providing inspection services on similar projects.
- Availability of staff.
- Familiarity with KDOT Standards and Specifications
- Any subconsultant and their role in performing the Services on the Project
- Names, certifications, and experience of all inspectors that will be assigned to the project.

Evaluation Factors

RFPs will be evaluated based on the factors listed below, evenly weighted, to rank the most qualified firm in order of preference as first, second, third, etc. Evaluation factors include:

1. How the consultant plans to meet the fluctuating inspection need of the project;
2. Employee names (two full-time and six intermittent inspectors), certifications and qualifications proposed for services;
3. Proximity of inspectors to project;
4. Past performance history on similar projects, list project numbers;

5. Types of direct expenses anticipated (lodging, mileage, etc.);
6. Anticipated time to close out project paperwork.

The highest ranked firm will be asked to enter into negotiations with KTA for an agreement. In the event KTA cannot reach agreement with the ranked firm, it will terminate negotiations with such firm and commence negotiations with the next highest ranked firm, and so on, until either agreement is reached for a satisfactory scope of services for a fair and reasonable price, or KTA decides to pursue other alternatives.

Facility Description: The proposed action is to reissue six existing Class III Injection Well permits for the wells listed above. Injection of fresh water and unsaturated brine is to be made into the Hutchinson Salt member of the Wellington formation. Mining shall not extend into the upper 40 feet of the salt deposit. The maximum operational injection pressure is not to exceed 165 pounds per square inch at the wellhead. The Wellington formation consists of inter-bedded salt and shale deposits with minor amounts of gypsum. The upper portion of the formation is primarily clayey shale with small amounts of gypsum present. The lower portion, which is known as the Hutchinson Salt member, is mainly salt with inter-bedded shale deposits. The salt deposits are first encountered about 480 feet below ground surface and extend to a depth of about 820 feet. All construction, monitoring, and operation of these wells shall meet the requirements that apply to Class III Injection wells under the Kansas UIC Regulations, K.A.R. 28-46-1 through 28-46-45 and other requirements of KDHE.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, Public Water Supply Section, will conduct a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. Thursday, January 16, 2020, in the Azure Conference Room, fourth floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 SW Jackson, Topeka, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed amended regulations K.A.R. 28-15-52 and 28-15-53 regarding the public water supply loan fund.

A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulations

K.A.R. 28-15-52. Interest rate. Revises language to allow the loan interest rate calculation to vary according to the length of the loan repayment period.

K.A.R. 28-15-53. Repayment of loans. Deletes the requirement that loan repayments must begin within two years of the first loan disbursement. Revises language to allow municipalities to choose loan repayment terms for up to 40 years under certain conditions.

Economic Impact

Cost to the agency: The proposed regulations will not result in increased costs to the agency.

Cost to the public and regulated community: These proposed regulations provide flexibility to municipalities and other public water supply systems. This is a voluntary loan program and municipalities and other public water supply systems are not obligated to finance water infrastructure projects through the Kansas Public Water Supply Loan Fund. The annual cost of debt service for municipalities obtaining a 30-year loan or 40-year loan would be less when compared to a 20-year loan, which is the current maximum loan repayment term. However, the overall debt service cost measured for the life of the loan would be greater for a 30-year loan or 40-year loan compared to a 20-year loan. Under these changes to the regulations, municipalities and public water supply systems that use this loan program can choose which loan repayment term length they would like to utilize based on their economic needs.

Cost to other governmental agencies or units: The proposed regulations only affect municipalities and other public water supply systems as described in the previous paragraph. To the extent that a governmental agency or unit operates a public water supply system, it should reference that information.

A detailed economic impact is provided in the economic impact statement that is available from the agency contact person or at the KDHE Public Water Supply Section Regulations website, as listed below.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to 5:00 p.m. on the day of the hearing to William J. During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulations as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. It is requested that each individual giving oral comments also provide a written copy for the record. In order to give each individual an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary for the hearing officer to request that each presenter limit an oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.
