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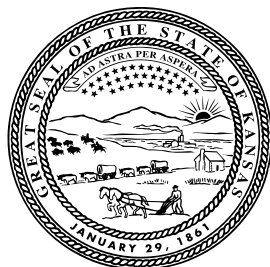

Request for Proposals

Background and Purpose of Project

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is seeking a consultant to provide construction inspection services for Project 54-88 KA-2385-03. The project is located on U.S. 54 in Seward County, Kansas from 0.11 miles southwest of U.S. 54/R Park Road intersection, northeast to 0.56 miles northeast of U.S. 54/Panhandle Road/Davies Road intersection.

Schedule/Deadlines

Request for Proposals (RFPs) are due on or before 12:00 p.m. (CST) December 2, 2019, to be delivered via email to kdot.designcontracts@ks.gov. Evaluation and ranking of submissions will occur on or about December 16, 2019, after which time all firms that submitted will be notified of the ranking. Negotiations with the most highly ranked firm to commence on or about December 30, 2019. An agreement should be in place on or about January 30, 2020. The contractor should start around March 2020.

Scope of Services to be Performed

KDOT will provide the project manager. The primary inspector provided is expected to work with and mentor the new KDOT project manager. They will assist with staffing needs to cover all construction operations. The inspector(s) must be capable and possess the required certifications to inspect any work on the project, which includes grading, PCCP, PCCP patching, concrete work, traffic control, bridges, pipes, subgrade, base, seeding, erosion control, SWPPP inspections, CMS or AASHTOWare data entry, and final paperwork, etc. Anticipated staffing needs: KDOT may need additional full time or intermittent inspectors estimated at two, that will fluctuate throughout the project depending on the project needs. Construction has a calendar completion date of June 24, 2022. Construction is expected to span 2020, 2021, and part of the 2022 construction seasons. There may not be a need for inspection over the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 winters.

Instructions for Proposal

No costs shall be contained in the RFP. The RFP must not exceed four (4) pages total (including any cover letter, index, etc.) and 2MB to address the pertinent topics. RFPs submitted will consist of the Letter of Interest and a completed and signed Special Attachment No. 7 ("Certificate of Final Indirect Costs"), a completed and signed Special Attachment No. 8 ("Tax Clearance Certificate"), and a signed Special Attachment No. 10 ("Policy Regarding Sexual Harassment"). Completed Special Attachments do not count against the four-page technical proposal submission. All these forms are attached to the original email announcement.

RFPs shall indicate the consultant's ability to meet the project inspection needs described above. RFPs shall describe any processes or procedures, including best practices, that will be used to perform tasks and to produce the desired results described above under "Scope of Services to be Performed." The RFP shall also include items such as:

- Main project manager mentor
- Two additional inspectors
- History of providing inspection services on similar projects
- Availability of staff
- Familiarity with KDOT Standards and Specifications
- Any subconsultant and their role in performing the services on the project
- Names, certifications, and experience of all inspectors that will be assigned to the project

Evaluation Factors

Letters of Interest will be evaluated based on the factors listed below, evenly weighted, to rank the most qualified firm in order of preference as first, second, third, etc. Evaluation factors include:

1. How the consultant plans to meet the fluctuating inspection needs of the project;
2. Employee names (1 full-time project manager mentor, 2 additional inspectors), certifications and qualifications proposed for services;
3. Proximity of inspectors to project;
4. Past performance history on similar projects (list project numbers) for KDOT;
5. Types of direct expenses anticipated (lodging, mileage, etc.);
6. Computer, nuclear gauge and mentoring experience in assisting a new engineer for KDOT.

The highest ranked firm will be asked to enter into negotiations with KDOT for an agreement. In the event KDOT cannot reach agreement with the highest ranked firm, it will terminate negotiations with such firm and commence negotiations with the next highest ranked firm, and so on, until either agreement is reached for a satisfactory scope of services for a fair and reasonable price, or KDOT decides to pursue other alternatives.

Each bidder will be responsible for ensuring that it has received any and all addenda issued by city in accordance with IB-10 of the instructions to bidders. Contractors should read and be fully familiar with all contract documents including addenda before submitting a bid. In submitting a bid, the bidder warrants that it has read the contract documents and is fully familiar therewith and that it has visited the site of the work to fully inform itself as to all existing conditions and limitations and shall include in its bid a sum to cover the cost of all items of the work as specified in the contract documents.

No oral telegraphic, telephonic proposals, or alterations will be considered. Facsimile transmissions will not be accepted.

The following items must be included in the sealed envelope with the bid:

- a. Bid form;
- b. 5% bid security—bid bond, cashier’s check or certified check (see below); and
- c. Acknowledgment of addenda issued by the city.

Each bidder shall file with its bid a bid bond, a cashier’s check, or a certified check drawn on an acceptable bank, made payable to City of Lenexa, Kansas, in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total bid, which shall be retained by City of Lenexa, Kansas until a contract for the project has been executed. Bid bonds will be returned to the bidders, with the exception of the best and lowest and second best and second lowest responsible bidders, within twenty-one (21) days after their bids are rejected. The bid deposit of the lowest and the second lowest responsible bidders will be returned when the performance bond, maintenance bond, and statutory bond, each in an amount equal to 100% of the contract amount; required insurance certificates and other required documents shall have been furnished and the contract documents have been executed by the successful bidder.

In the event the low bidder is unable to execute the contract, for whatever reason, within the time provided in the Notice of Award, the city may annul the Notice of Award and the bid deposit may be forfeited and the city shall exercise its legal prerogatives, including, but not limited to, enforcement of its rights as to the bid security or specific performance.

The city reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids and to waive any technicalities or irregularities therein. Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written request of the bidder received in the office of City Clerk, prior to the time and date for bid opening.

From and after the release of this notice, any party intending to bid on the above referenced project, including their officers, employees, agents, or contractors are specifically prohibited from communicating with any elected or appointed official of the city, directly or indirectly, with regard to the award of the contract for the project listed above, except as specifically authorized by the instructions to bidders. Any such unauthorized communication may result in the automatic disqualification of such bidder.

All bidders agree that rejection shall create no liability on the part of the city because of such rejection, and the filing of any bid in response to this notice shall constitute an agreement of the bidder to these conditions.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 1.—EXAMINATIONS

74-1-3. Retaking the examination and granting of credits. (a) Each testing candidate shall be deemed to have passed the examination if the candidate obtains credit for passing each of the four test sections. Credit for passing a test section shall be valid from the date of the examination regardless of the date on which the testing candidate receives actual notice of the passing grade.

(b) A testing candidate may take the test sections individually and in any order. Credit for passing any test section shall be valid for 18 months from the date of testing regardless of the number of sections taken or the scores on any failed sections.

(c) Each testing candidate shall pass all four test sections within a rolling 18-month period that begins on the date the first test section passed is taken. If all four test sections are not passed within this 18-month period, credit for any test section passed outside the 18-month period shall expire.

(d) A testing candidate shall not retake a failed test section until the candidate has received the score for the most recent attempt of that test section.

(e) Each testing candidate shall retain credit for any test section passed in another state if the credit would have been given if the testing candidate had taken the examination in Kansas.

(f) Despite the provisions of subsections (a), (b), and (c), the period of time in which to pass all test sections of the examination may be extended by the board upon a showing that the credit was lost by reason of circumstances beyond the testing candidate's control. Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 7.—MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

68-7-15. Prepackaging or repackaging of oral drugs. All prepackaging or repackaging of oral drugs, whether in a unit-dose container or multiple-dose container, shall meet the requirements of this regulation.

(a) Packaging in advance of immediate need shall be done by a pharmacist or under the pharmacist's direct supervision.

(b) Packaging shall be limited to the drugs dispensed from or supplied by the pharmacy or in accordance with a shared services agreement.

(c) All containers used for packaging and the storage conditions shall be maintained according to the manufacturer's recommendations to preserve the stability of the drug. The expiration date shall be the manufacturer's expiration date, the expiration date for the type of packaging material used, or not more than 12 months from the date of packaging, whichever is earlier.

(d) An electronic or a written record shall be established for lot numbers for recall purposes.

(e) If an area apart or separated from the prescription drug area is used for prepackaging or repackaging, the area shall be enclosed and locked when a pharmacist is not in attendance in that area.

(f) In lieu of separately dispensing a drug and an ingestible event marker approved by the food and drug administration to monitor whether a patient is taking the drug as prescribed, any pharmacist may use an ingestible event medication adherence package pursuant to a valid prescription order or after obtaining the consent of the practitioner, caregiver, or patient.

(g) For purposes of this regulation, "ingestible event medication adherence package" shall mean an ingestible unit-dose package designed to ensure medication adherence that contains drugs from a manufacturer's original container and an ingestible event marker, as defined by 21 C.F.R. 880.6305, dated April 1, 2016 and hereby adopted by reference.

(h) In addition to meeting the requirements of this regulation, all repackaging of sterile preparations shall meet the requirements of K.A.R. 68-13-4. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1630; implementing K.S.A. 65-1634; effective May 1, 1978; amended Dec. 15, 2017; amended Nov. 29, 2019.)

Article 19.—CONTINUOUS QUALITY ASSURANCE PROGRAMS

68-19-1. Minimum program requirements. Each pharmacy's continuous quality improvement program shall meet the following minimum requirements:

(a) Meet at least once each quarter of each calendar year;

(b) have the pharmacy's pharmacist-in-charge in attendance at each meeting; and

(c) perform the following during each meeting:

(1) Review all incident reports generated for each reportable event associated with that pharmacy since the last quarterly meeting;

(2) for each incident report reviewed, establish the steps taken or to be taken to prevent a recurrence of the incident;

(3) review each board newsletter published since the last quarterly meeting; and

(4) create a report of the meeting, including at least the following information:

(A) A list of the persons in attendance;

(B) a list of the incident reports and newsletters reviewed; and

(C) a description of the steps taken or to be taken to prevent recurrence of each incident reviewed. (Authorized

by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1695; effective April 10, 2009; amended Nov. 29, 2019.)

Article 21.—PRESCRIPTION MONITORING PROGRAM

68-21-6. Reciprocal agreements with other states or government entities to share information. (a) Reciprocal agreements with one or more of the following entities within the United States may be entered into by the board to share program data if the entity's prescription monitoring program is compatible with the program:

- (1) A state, commonwealth, district, or territory;
(2) a military or veteran health system;
(3) an Indian health system or service; or
(4) a city, county, municipality, or township.

(b) In determining the compatibility of the entity's prescription monitoring program, the following may be considered by the board:

- (1) The safeguards for privacy of patient records and the entity's success in protecting patient privacy;
(2) the persons authorized by the entity to view the data collected by the program;
(3) the schedules of controlled substances monitored by the entity;
(4) the data required by the entity to be submitted on each prescription; and
(5) the costs and benefits to the board of mutually sharing data with the entity.

(c) Any reciprocal agreement may be reviewed annually by the board to determine its continued compatibility with the program. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1692; implementing K.S.A. 65-1685; effective Oct. 15, 2010; amended Nov. 29, 2019.)
