### Notice to Consulting Firms

#### Background and Purpose of Project

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is seeking a consultant to provide construction inspection services for project 106 KA 5874-01. The project is mill, overlay, and paved shoulders on K-14 and K-96 in Reno and Sedgwick Counties. K-14 in Reno County from the junction of K-14/K-96 west to the east junction of US-50/K-14/K-96. K-96 in Reno County from the junction of K-14/K-96 east to the Reno/Sedgwick County line. K-96 in Sedgwick County from the Sedgwick/Reno County line east about 15.3 miles to about RP 278.8 west of Maize Road.

#### Schedule/Deadlines

Request for Proposals (RFPs) are due on or before 12:00 p.m. (CST) January 8, 2021, to be delivered via email to



[kdot.designcontracts@ks.gov](mailto:kdot.designcontracts@ks.gov). Evaluation and ranking of submissions will occur on or about January 22, 2021, after which time all firms that submitted will be notified of the ranking. Negotiations with the most highly ranked firm to commence on or about February 17, 2021. An agreement should be in place on or about March 3, 2021. Project will be built in 2021. The contractor is expected to start the project around the middle of June 2021, this date could move based on contractor's schedule.

### Scope of Services to be Performed

The project manager/inspectors must be capable inspecting the whole project, which includes HMA roadway, HMA plant, pavement marking, traffic control, CMS or AASHTOWare data entry, all project records, all project paperwork, and final paperwork, etc. Project records and paperwork including but not limited to: diary, pay quantities, certifications, sample identifications, change orders, pay estimates, monitoring subcontractor payments, and monitoring contractor's payrolls, etc. Records and paperwork must be submitted accurately and timely. Anticipated staffing needs: provide project management and all inspectors as needed to ensure inspection and material testing for this project are done correctly. The number of required inspectors will fluctuate throughout the project depending on the contractor's schedule and how they pursue the work. Submit the name and information of the project manager and HMA plant inspector. Construction is anticipated to be completed in 95-working days and cleanup days. Provide all the equipment necessary to inspect and test materials.

### Instructions for Proposal

No costs shall be contained in the RFP. The RFP must not exceed four (4) pages total (including any cover letter, index, etc.) and 2MB to address the pertinent topics. RFPs submitted will consist of the technical proposal and a completed and signed Special Attachment No. 7 ("Certificate of Final Indirect Costs"), a completed and signed Special Attachment No. 8 ("Tax Clearance Certificate"), and a signed Special Attachment No. 10 ("Policy Regarding Sexual Harassment"). Completed Special Attachments do not count against the four-page technical proposal submission. All these forms are attached to the original email announcement.

RFPs shall indicate the consultant's ability to meet the project inspection needs described above. RFPs shall describe any processes or procedures, including best practices, that will be used to perform tasks and to produce the desired results described above under "Scope of Services to be Performed." The RFP shall also include items such as:

- Project manager and HMA plant inspector
- History of providing inspection services on similar projects
- Availability of staff
- Familiarity with KDOT standards and specifications
- Any subconsultant and their role in performing the services on the project
- Names, certifications, and experience of all inspectors that will be assigned to the project
- Anticipated time to close out project paperwork

### Evaluation Factors

Letters of Interest (LOIs) will be evaluated based on the factors listed below, evenly weighted, to rank the most qualified firm in order of preference as first, second, third, etc. Evaluation factors include:

1. How the consultant plans to meet the fluctuating inspection needs of the project;
2. Employee names (project manager and HMA plant inspector), certifications, and qualifications proposed for services;
3. Past performance history on similar projects (list project numbers) for KDOT;
4. Anticipated time to close out project paperwork;
5. Proximity of inspectors to project;
6. Types of direct expenses anticipated (lodging, mileage, etc.).

The highest ranked firm will be asked to enter into negotiations with KDOT for an agreement. In the event KDOT cannot reach agreement with the highest ranked firm, it will terminate negotiations with such firm and commence negotiations with the next highest ranked firm, and so on, until either agreement is reached for a satisfactory scope of services for a fair and reasonable price, or KDOT decides to pursue other alternatives.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) received an application from Occidental Chemical Corporation (Operator/Owner) requesting the renewal of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) hazardous waste permit for the facility located at 6200 S. #### Executive Order No. 20-70

#### Provisions Related to Drivers' License and Identification Cards During the State of Disaster Emergency

**WHEREAS**, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of residents of the State of Kansas is this Administration's top priority;

**WHEREAS**, Kansas is facing a crisis – the pandemic and public health emergency of COVID-19— resulting in illness, quarantines, school closures, and business disruptions resulting in lost wages and financial hardship to Kansas citizens;

**WHEREAS**, the United States Departments of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning January 27, 2020, with now more than 17,790,000 cases of the illness and more than 316,800 deaths as a result of the illness across the United States;

**WHEREAS**, a State of Disaster Emergency was proclaimed for the State of Kansas on March 12, 2020, and the State Finance Council has extended the state of disaster emergency to January 10, 2020;

**WHEREAS**, as of this date, there have been over 204,600 reported positive cases of COVID-19 in Kansas, spread among all 105 counties and 2,448 deaths as a result of the illness;

**WHEREAS**, on July 8, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-55, paragraph 3 of which extended the "terms of drivers' licenses and identification cards for all Kansas residents with State driver's licenses and identification cards that expire or will expire between March 12, 2020, and September 15, 2020, and who are not able to renew at a State driver's license examination office due to the State's COVID-19 response";

**WHEREAS**, on September 10, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-64, extending Executive Order 20-55 through January 26, 2021, until the state of disaster emergency relating to COVID-19 expires, or until the order is rescinded, whichever is earlier;

**WHEREAS**, on July 29, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-60, which lifted the statutory prohibition on those over 50 years old renewing driver's licenses online and allowed those up to age 64 to renew online;

**WHEREAS**, to protect Kansans, and especially those who may be members of a vulnerable population, it continues to be necessary to make it as safe as possible for Kansans to renew their driver's licenses and identification cards, and to extend deadlines for Kansas residents and entities to renew their driver's licenses and identification cards to avoid unnecessary exposure to COVID-19;

**WHEREAS**, as of December 2, 2020, a total of 111,300 licenses and identification cards are scheduled for renewal before January 26, 2021, and under current operating conditions the average number of renewals per month has been 29,000;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including the authority granted me by K.S.A. 48-924 and K.S.A. 48-925(b), (c)(1), and (c)(11), in order to address the effects of the spread of COVID-19, I hereby direct and order the following:

1. The Division of Vehicles shall extend the terms of drivers' licenses and identification cards for all Kansas residents with State driver's licenses and identification cards that expired or will expire from March 12, 2020, through June 30, 2021, and who are not able to renew at a State driver's license examination office due to the State's COVID-19 response.
2. All driver's license and identification card renewals extended by this Executive Order must be completed by June 30, 2021, or normal late fees will be assessed.
3. The provision in K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-240(j)(2)(B) prohibiting applicants 50 years of age or older, from utilizing the electronic online driver's license renewal application is suspended through June 30, 2021, for the limited purpose of allowing drivers 50 years of age or older to use the electronic online renewal system.
4. Any contrary provisions in Executive Orders 20-55, 20-60, 20-64, and 20-66 are superseded by this order.
5. Other than as provided in paragraphs 1-4 above, this order does not alter other laws, regulations, or rules relating to the requirements in K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-240 for an applicant to renew their driver's license.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order 20-70. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency extended by House Bill 2016 enacted during the June 2020 special session relating to COVID-19—and later extended by the State Finance Council—expires, whichever is earlier.

### Notice of 2020 Update to Guidelines for Evaluating Proposed Governmental Actions to Identify Potential Takings of Private Property

The Private Property Protection Act, K.S.A. 77-701 *et seq.*, requires the Attorney General to compile and annually update guidelines to be used by state agencies in determining whether proposed governmental actions may constitute a taking of private property. These guidelines are to be based on cases decided by the United States Supreme Court and the Kansas Supreme Court.<sup>1</sup> Governmental action is defined as legislation, regulations or directives, or agency guidelines and procedures for the issuing of licenses or permits.<sup>2</sup> The Act expressly excludes other types of governmental action, such as the formal exercise of eminent domain.<sup>3</sup>

Under the criteria of the Act, there are no cases to include in the 2020 update to the Attorney General's Guidelines.<sup>4</sup>

**Synopsis:** The cap on mortgage recording fees found in K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 28-115(j) applies to initial mortgages as well as second mortgages or successive subordinate lien mortgages. Further, the cap applies to the mortgage on the primary or main residence inhabited by the mortgagor, regardless of whether the mortgagor had a previously qualifying mortgage. Any increase above that level, however, is subject to approval by the electorate, unless the increase falls within the provisions of subsection (b) of K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 79-2925c. **Opinion 2020-6**

**Re: Militia, Defense and Public Safety – Emergency Preparedness for Disasters – Disasters; Responsibilities of Governor; State of Disaster Emergency; Powers of Governor During State of Disaster Emergency; Orders and Proclamations; Penalty for Violation of Act or**

**Rules and Regulations, Orders or Proclamations Thereunder May 20, 2020**

**Synopsis:** A state of disaster emergency declaration may be ratified by concurrent resolution of the Legislature pursuant to K.S.A. 48-924.

A second or subsequent successive disaster emergency declaration arising from the same ongoing disaster is legally suspect, but whether a new state of emergency arises from a disaster will depend on the facts.

Constitutional concerns with K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-925(b) include the language that purports to authorize the legislature, by concurrent resolution, to ratify a governor's emergency order to keep it in effect after the period of disaster emergency expires; the language that purports to authorize the Legislature, by concurrent resolution, to revoke emergency orders of the governor at any time; and the broad delegation of legislative power in that subsection and also K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-925(c)(11). Under a severability analysis, any of these issues could be grounds to invalidate the broader legislative enactment if the provisions are inextricably bound with each other.

Criminal prosecutions under K.S.A. 48-939 are proper only if the conduct prohibited by an executive order was committed knowingly and willfully, during a properly declared state of disaster emergency, and the executive order was lawful because it had proper statutory authority and does not violate any constitutional or statutory provision. Constitutional concerns regarding an emergency order include the due process void-for-vagueness doctrine and whether the order impermissibly burdens constitutional rights. Constitutional concerns regarding the statute relied upon as authority for an executive order include whether it is an unlawful delegation of legislative power. **Synopsis:** Because Executive Order 20-59 is a statewide order relating to public health, boards of county commissioners have statutory authority under L. 2020 Special Session, Ch. 1, § 33 to issue an order relating to public

health that is less stringent than the provisions of Executive Order 20-59, if the required statutory findings are made. Boards of county commissioners, acting as a county board of health, also have authority under L. 2020 Special Session, Ch. 1, §§ 37 and 38, to review, amend, or revoke any orders issued by a local health officer as a result of an executive order of the governor. In addition, local public schools also may obtain such flexibility from their local school boards, which ordinarily have statutory and constitutional authority to adopt local policies governing matters such as wearing masks, social distancing, washing hands, and temperature taking in local schools, and Executive Order 20-59 has not displaced that preexisting local authority. The county treasurer is statutorily required to remove from the tax rolls all taxes, assessments, charges, penalties and interest that are due and payable on property at the time the property is acquired by the board of trustees of the land bank. The county treasurer is similarly required to remove from the tax rolls any special assessments on such property that are abated. Any special assessments that are deferred or reamortized by a municipality must be corrected on the tax rolls by the county treasurer as of the effective date of the ordinance or resolution providing for such deferral or reamortization. **Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages – Licensure and Sale of Liquor by the Drink – Persons and Entities Ineligible for Licensure; Licensure of Nonresidents December 10, 2020**

**Synopsis:** The Kansas statutes imposing residency requirements on persons seeking a license to sell liquor as

a retailer or to sell liquor by the drink, K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 41-311 and 41-2623, facially discriminate against nonresidents. It is unlikely that the State could advance a legitimate local purpose for the requirements. Thus, the residency requirements in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 41-311 and K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 41-2623 would likely be found unconstitutional under the dormant Commerce Clause of the U.S. Constitution and are therefore unenforceable. **Synopsis:** A “meeting” of the Legislature has constitutional significance that does not attach to any other body in State government. Article 2, § 8 of the Kansas Constitution requires the Legislature to meet in the state capital city but not within the Capitol Building. To “meet,” Legislators must “come together,” which requires simultaneous physical presence within one room. At a minimum, a quorum of the Senators or Representatives must be together in a room to constitute a meeting of that house and to vote on final action on a bill. A quorum is only established when a majority of the members of the Senate or of the House, respectively, are present in the same room. Bills passed by a procedure inconsistent with requirements of the Kansas Constitution may be subject to challenge in court and will be invalidated if found constitutionally infirm. **82-4-3a. Hours of service.** (a)(1) With the following exceptions, 49 C.F.R. Part 395, as in effect on October 1, 2019 and as amended by 85 fed. reg. 33451-33452 (2020), excluding appendix A to subpart B, is hereby adopted by reference:

(A) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.1:

(i) 49 C.F.R. 395.1(a)(2) shall be deleted.

(ii) In paragraph (b)(1), the phrase "Except as provided in paragraph (h)(3) of this section," shall be deleted.

(iii) In paragraph (g)(1)(ii)(C), the phrase "— or, for calculation of the 20-hour period in § 395.1(h)(1)(ii) for drivers in Alaska, all on-duty time—" shall be deleted.

(iv) In paragraph (g)(2), the phrase "393.76 of this subchapter" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 393.76 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3i."

(v) In paragraph (g)(3), the phrase "393.76 of this subchapter" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 393.76 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3i."

(vi) 49 C.F.R. 395.1(h) shall be deleted.

(vii) 49 C.F.R. 395.1(i) shall be deleted.

(viii) In paragraph (k), the phrase "each State" shall be deleted and replaced with "the state of Kansas." The following shall be added after subparagraph (3): "(4) 'Planting and harvesting periods' means the time periods for planting, growing, and harvesting that occur between January 1 and December 31."

(ix) In paragraph (q), the phrase "49 CFR 397.5" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 397.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82- 4-3k."

(x) In paragraph (s), the phrase "49 CFR 390.5" shall be



deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f."

(xi) In paragraph (x), the phrase "49 CFR 390.38(b)" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 390.38(b) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f."

(ii) In paragraph (4)(i) of the definition of "on duty time," the phrase "§ 397.5 of this subchapter" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 397.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3k."

(iii) In paragraph (7) of the definition of "on duty time," the phrase "part 382 of this subchapter" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. Part 382 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c."

(iv) The definition of "signal employee" shall be deleted and replaced with the following: "'Signal employee' means an individual who is engaged in installing, repairing or maintaining signal systems."

(v) The definition of "sleeper berth" shall be deleted and replaced by the following: "'Sleeper berth' means a berth conforming to the requirements of 49 C.F.R. 393.76, as adopted in K.A.R. 82-4-3i."

(vi) In the definition of "transportation of construction material and equipment," the following text shall be deleted: ", except that a State, upon notice to the Administrator, may establish a different air mile radius limitation for purposes of this definition if such limitation is between 50 and 75 air miles and applies only to movements that take place entirely within the State. This paragraph does not apply to the transportation of material found by the Secretary to be hazardous under 49 U.S.C. 5103 in a quantity requiring placarding under regulations issued to carry out such section."

(C) The following changes shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.8:

(i) In paragraph (a)(1), the phrase "§ 390.5 of this subchapter" shall be deleted and replaced with "49 C.F.R. 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f."

(ii) All references to "December 18, 2017" shall be replaced with "January 3, 2018."

(D) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.11:

(i) In paragraph (a), "December 18, 2017" shall be replaced by "January 3, 2018."

(ii) Paragraphs (h)(1), (h)(2), and (h)(3) shall be deleted and replaced with the following: "A carrier utilizing an FMCSA authorized supporting document self-compliance system will be deemed to comply with K.A.R. 82-4-3a."

(E) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.13:

(i) In paragraph (a), the phrase "every special agent of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (as defined in appendix B to this subchapter)" shall be deleted and replaced by "any authorized representative of the commission, and any member of the Kansas highway patrol or any other

law enforcement officer in the state who is certified in the inspection of motor carriers based on the motor carrier safety assistance program standards."

(ii) 49 C.F.R. 395.13(c)(2) shall be deleted and replaced by the following: "Within fifteen days following the date any driver is placed out of service, the motor carrier that employed the driver shall personally deliver or place in the U.S. mail to the state director of transportation and to the federal motor carrier safety administration a signed certification in a form acceptable to the commission. Any signed certification acceptable to the commission shall include the following information:

"(i) All violations have been corrected;

"(ii) action has been taken to ensure compliance with 49 C.F.R. 395.1, 49 C.F.R. 395.2, 49 C.F.R. 395.3, 49 C.F.R. 395.5, 49 C.F.R. 395.8, 49 C.F.R. 395.13, and 49 C.F.R. 395.15, each as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a; and

"(iii) the motor carrier understands that false certification can result in appropriate enforcement action."

(iii) 49 C.F.R. 395.13(d)(4) shall be deleted and replaced with the following: "49 C.F.R. 395.13 does not alter the hazardous materials requirements prescribed in 49 C.F.R. 397.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3k pertaining to attendance and surveillance of commercial motor vehicles."

(F) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.15:

(i) In paragraph (a), "December 18, 2017" shall be replaced with "January 3, 2018."

(ii) The last sentence in 49 C.F.R. 395.15(b)(3) shall be deleted.

(iii) In paragraphs (j)(1) and (j)(2), the term "FMCSA" shall be deleted and replaced by "commission."

(2) As used in this regulation, each reference to a portion of 49 C.F.R. Part 395 shall mean that portion as adopted by reference in this regulation.

(b) Whenever the federal regulations adopted in this regulation refer to portions of the federal regulations or other operating standards that are not already adopted by reference in article 4 of the commission's regulations, the references shall not be applicable to this regulation unless otherwise specifically adopted.

(c) No wrecker or tow truck, as defined by K.S.A. 66-1329 and amendments thereto, with a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less that is operating in intrastate
