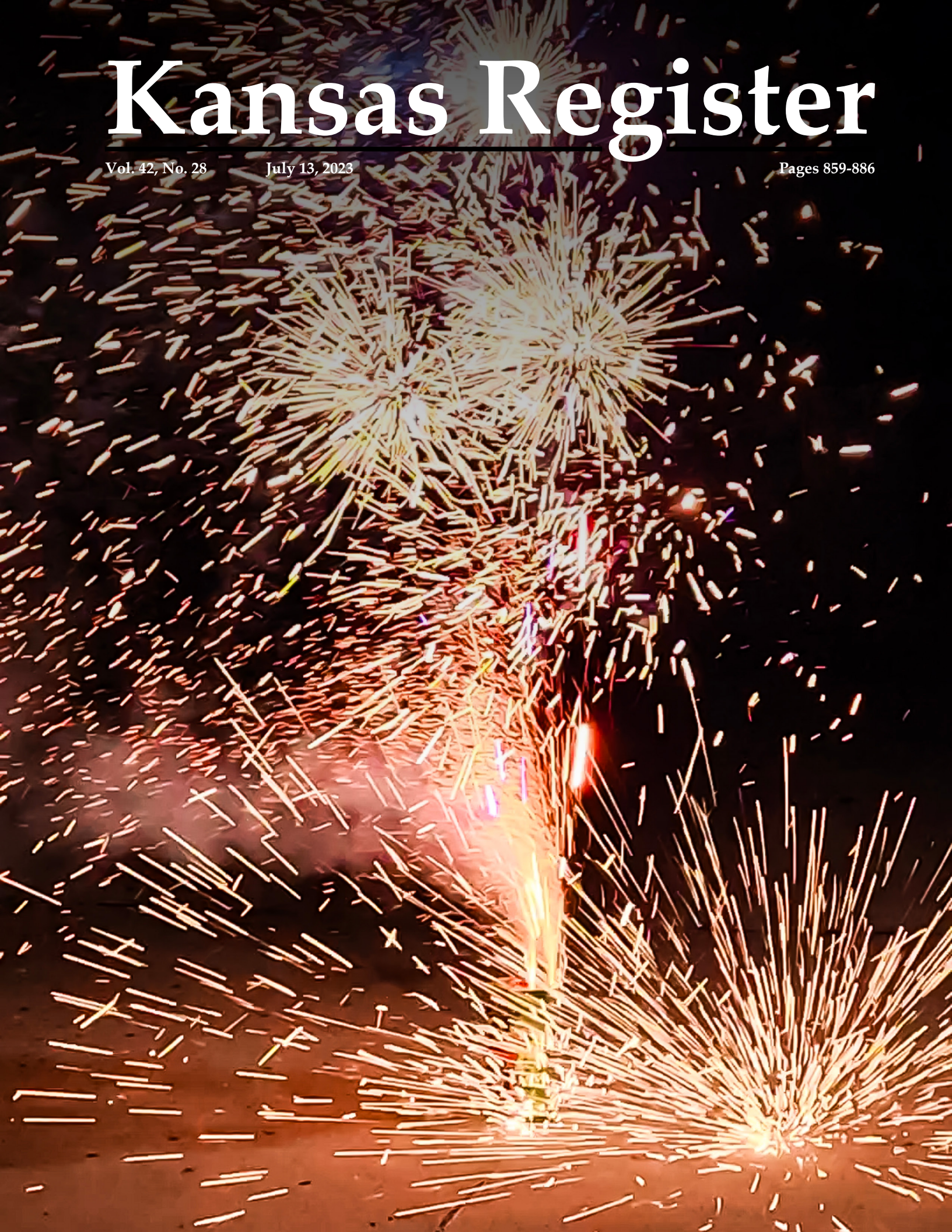

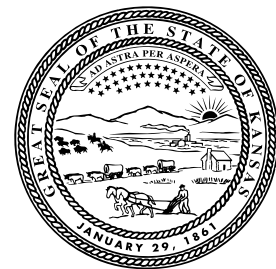

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is announcing a call for projects to be submitted to the state's Rail Service Improvement Program. An estimated \$10 million in funding is available to award projects that enhance safety, promote economic efficiency, and sustainability to the state's rail network.

This Call for Projects opens July 13, 2023, and closes September 1, 2023. Awards are expected to be announced in the spring of 2024. Applicants are required to provide a 30% match of total project cost. There are no minimum or maximum project award amounts. Qualified entities include any Surface Transportation board certified Class II or Class III railroad, as defined in

49 C.F.R. § 1201.1-1(a), a port authority established in accordance with Kansas laws, any entity meeting the rules and regulations established by K.S.A. 75-5050, or any owner or lessee industry track, as defined in 49 C.F.R. § 218.93, located on or adjacent to a Class II or Class III railroad in the state of Kansas.

With this amendment, MDs holding a Reentry Active license will renew with the MD renewal cycle (May 15-July 31); and DOs holding a Reentry Active license will renew with the DO renewal cycle (August 15-October 31).

The agency does not employ an economist. In the lay opinion of the agency staff, the technical amendment alone would not have an economic effect; the regulation as a whole, will have a positive economic effect on affected businesses because the regulation provides implementation of an available license type for physicians to reenter the practice of medicine.

The Board of Healing Arts is comprised of eight physicians (5-MD; 3-DO), three chiropractors, one podiatrist, and three public members. This amended regulation was developed during publicly noticed open meetings of the Board, and the Board is following all notice and open meeting hearing requirements associated with promulgating the amended regulation.

K.A.R. 28-35-604. Requirements for radon mitigation technician. Updates the requirements for radon mitigation technicians that apply to any individual or organization that wishes to become certified by the state of Kansas for radon mitigation activities. Adopts by reference the latest revisions of professional documents that apply to Kansas radon mitigation technicians. Applies the professional documents adopted in K.A.R. 28-35-603 to Kansas radon mitigation technicians.

K.A.R. 28-35-605. Continuing education. Specifies continuing education requirements for radon measurement technicians and radon mitigation technicians that must be completed annually.

Economic Impact

Cost to the agency: The proposed regulations will not result in increased costs to the agency.

Cost to the public and regulated community: The new safety requirement in the standard that mandates the use of an active radon system monitor will add additional cost to each new radon mitigation system installation of approximately \$25 for each system. The additional cost is a fraction of the overall system cost of approximately \$1,200 to \$1,500. It is expected that this additional cost will be passed to members of the public.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: There will be no costs related to the proposed regulations that are reasonably expected to be incurred by other governmental agencies or units.
