Executive Order 11-48

WHEREAS, the Director of the Kansas Water Office has informed me, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2608, of the drought conditions within the state; and

WHEREAS, there is every indication that the present drought conditions will not abate in the near future; and

WHEREAS, these drought conditions may become more severe; and

WHEREAS, the affected areas and severity have changed; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Emergency management Act (K.S.A. 48-924 et seq.) states that the Governor shall be responsible for meeting the dangers to the state and its people from disasters, including drought.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby:

1. Declare a Drought Watch, Drought Warning or Drought Emergency for the counties below replacing Executive Order 11-37;
2. And authorize and direct all agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor to implement the appropriate Watch, Warning or Emergency level drought response actions assigned to them in the Operations Plan of the Governor's Drought Response Team.

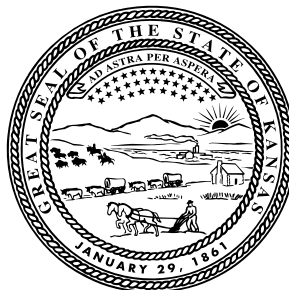

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Wednesday, February 1, in Room 108 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the manager of technician services, Board of Emergency Medical Services, Room 1031, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Ann Stevenson at (785) 296-7296. Handicapped parking is located in front of and to the north of the Landon State Office Building.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 109-5-1c. Emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator,

emergency medical technician-intermediate who is also certified as an emergency medical technician-defibrillator and advanced emergency medical technician; continuing education. This regulation is a new regulation. The regulation is being proposed to support changes to K.S.A. 65-6111, K.S.A. 65-6120 and K.S.A. 65-6123.

K.A.R. 109-5-3. Continuing education approval for long-term providers. This regulatory revision is to facilitate the annual submission of letters from the training program manager and training program medical director assuring and certifying all continuing education courses are in compliance with Kansas statutes and regulations. These changes also will assure that the training program manager and training program medical director are aware of their responsibility and that board staff has been advised of changes to these positions.

K.A.R. 109-7-1. Schedule of fees. This regulatory revision is necessary to incorporate language for the new scope of practice changes.

K.A.R. 109-8-2, Scheduling examinations for certification, is a new regulation. This regulation requires the provider of initial courses to ensure the provision of examinations for those successfully completing the course, outlines how to apply for cognitive examination, outlines how to apply to the examination vendor for BLS psychomotor skills examinations, and outlines the requirements and how ALS courses are to apply for psychomotor skills examinations. This regulation also addresses the process for how an individual can apply for reexamination of cognitive or psychomotor skills.

K.A.R. 109-10-1c. Approved advanced emergency medical technician education standards. This regulation is a new regulation necessary to support the changes to K.S.A. 65-6111 and K.S.A. 65-6120.

K.A.R. 109-10-2, Long-term accreditation of training programs conducting initial courses of instruction, is a revision to the current regulation. This regulatory revision is necessary to require the annual submission of letters from the training program manager and training program medical director assuring and certifying all initial courses are in compliance with Kansas statutes and regulations. These changes also will assure that the training program manager and training program medical director are aware of their responsibility and that board staff has been advised of changes to these positions.

K.A.R. 109-11-4a, Advanced emergency medical technician course approval, is a new regulation that is comprised of language contained in K.A.R. 109-11-4 for the old scope of practice certification level with the language necessary to implement the new scope of practice.

K.A.R. 109-13-1, Training officers, is a revision of the current regulation. These changes are necessary to incorporate the new levels of certification associated with the scope of practice changes.

Request for Applications for FTA Program Funding

The Kansas Department of Transportation, Office of Public Transportation is now accepting applications for the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) programs:

- U.S.C. 49-5310 — Specialized Transportation for the Elderly and Disabled
- U.S.C. 49-5311 — General Public Transportation in Nonurbanized Areas
- U.S.C. 49-5311 (f) — Intercity Public Transportation in Nonurbanized Areas
- U.S.C. 49-5316 — Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC)
- U.S.C. 49-5317 — New Freedom

The application is to cover applicant agencies' needs for state fiscal year 2013 (July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013). The application is required annually from all KDOT-funded 5310, 5311, 5316 and 5317 transit provider agencies including those not requesting capital and/or operating expenses.

The **5311(f)** Intercity Public Transportation application is to cover applicant agencies' needs for January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

The application is available on the KDOT Public Transportation website at <http://www.ksdot.org/burTransPlan/pubtrans/index.asp>.

The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5310 program is to provide funds to support private nonprofit corporations and authorized governments to provide transportation services to meet the special needs of the elderly and persons with disabilities. Federal funding under this program is available for capital expenditures only. State funding is available for operating expenses up to maximum of \$4,000.

The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5311 program is to provide funds to support rural and nonurbanized (cities less than 50,000 population) public transportation projects. The goal of the U.S.C. 49-5311 program is to provide services to the general public on an equal opportunity basis. Funds can be used for either operating or capital expenses.

The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5311(f) program is to support the connection between nonurbanized areas and the larger regional or national system of intercity bus and to support services to meet the intercity travel needs of residents in nonurbanized areas.

The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5316 Job Access & Reverse Commute (JARC) program is to improve access to transportation services to employment and employment-related activities for welfare recipients and eligible low income individuals and to transport residents of urbanized and nonurbanized areas to suburban employment opportunities.

The U.S.C. 49-5317 New Freedom formula grant program aims to provide additional tools to overcome existing barriers facing Americans with disabilities and seeks to reduce the barriers to transportation services and expand the transportation mobility options available to

people with disabilities beyond the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.

The state funding for urban and rural public transportation for the state fiscal year 2013 is budgeted at \$6 million. With the challenging financial situation facing the state of Kansas, it is possible that state fund availability could be reduced, which may increase the requirement for local match.

Applications for the 5310, 5311, 5316 and 5317 funds must be local units of government, Indian tribes, or private nonprofit organizations registered with the Kansas Secretary of State to do business in Kansas. In addition, all applicants must be an active member in good standing of their Coordinated Transit District (CTD) in order to receive funding. Those agencies applying for funds in the metropolitan areas of Kansas City, Wichita, Lawrence and Topeka need to contact their respective Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to ensure that their application request is included in the MPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

When downloading the applications from the Internet, potential applicants will need the appropriate application form, application instructions and vehicle cost estimates. The CTD and KDOT contact lists also are available on the website. Any potential applicants that do not have Internet access can request an application by contacting the KDOT Public Transit Office.

The application must indicate whether the request is for replacement vehicles, an expansion of services currently provided, a new start application, or if the application is for the funding of only operating assistance. "New Start" is defined as any proposed service that was not previously in existence. "Expansion" is defined as adding transit service to areas not already receiving services (for example: providing services to new locations or adding evening and weekend service.)

KDOT has developed selection criteria to be used by the Kansas Coordinated Transit District Council (KCTDC) in evaluating the capital request applications. The applications will be ranked by the KCTDC in February 2012. After the application ranking by the KCTDC, KDOT staff will use the selection criteria in its evaluation of the applications. It should be noted that all items on the application must be completed. Points will be deducted in the ranking process for missing or incomplete information.

All applications must be received by 3 p.m. Friday, January 27, at the KDOT Office of Public Transportation, 2nd Floor (Planning), Eisenhower State Office Building, 700 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66603-3745. Applications received after the deadline will not be accepted.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health, Bureau of Local and Rural Health, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Thursday, February 9, in the Flint Hills Conference Room, third floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amended regulations K.A.R. 28-54-1, 28-54-2, 28-54-3, 28-54-4 and 28-54-5 concerning designation of hospitals as trauma centers. A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of the Regulations:

28-54-1. Defines the terms used in the trauma center regulations and updates the regulation to include the definition of level IV trauma center and references to level IV trauma center in existing definitions as necessary.

28-54-2. Specifies the requirements by which a hospital is designated as a level I, level II or level III trauma center and updates the regulation to include the requirements for designation of a hospital as a level IV trauma center.

28-54-3. Establishes the application process by which a hospital can apply for designation as a level I, level II or level III trauma center and updates the regulation to include the application process for a level IV trauma center.

28-54-4. Establishes the process by which a hospital can request a change of designation to a level I, level II or level III trauma center and updates the regulation to include the application process for change to designation to a level IV trauma center.

28-54-5. Specifies the period of time for which a certificate of designation as a trauma center is valid, provides for the process of renewal of a certificate of designation as a level I, level II or level III trauma center and updates the regulation to include renewal of a certificate of designation as a level IV trauma center.

Economic Impact:

Cost to individuals: The goal of a trauma center as part of a larger trauma system is to improve efficiency, decrease health care costs, improve patient outcomes, and

reduce death and disability. Designation of trauma centers would ultimately decrease health care costs for consumers and the state of Kansas through efficiency of service and evidence-based standards of care. When hospitals serve as designated trauma centers, federal guidelines allow hospitals to bill insurance carriers, commercial and public, for providing trauma team services as part of a trauma system.

Cost to the agency: As part of the implementation process, KDHE will incur expenses related to processing of applications. If a site survey is conducted, the agency will incur expenses for the on-site survey process. Current staff within the trauma program will be utilized to process and review level IV applications. The Advisory Committee on Trauma can be utilized as a resource to assist with on-site surveys. The Trauma Fee Fund will be utilized to pay travel and honorarium expenses related to non-KDHE survey team members if needed.

Cost to other governmental agencies or units: Having designated trauma centers in Kansas will help in emergency preparedness situations, which will benefit other agencies. When an emergency response is needed, knowing the trauma care resources within a region or state will help in triaging patients to the closest appropriate facility, saving time, resources and transportation expenses. There is no known increase in costs to other governmental agencies or units.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. Notice Concerning Kansas/Federal Water Pollution Control Permits and Applications

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57 through 63, 28-18-1 through 15, 28-18a-1 through 32, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, various draft water pollution control documents (permits, notices to revoke and reissue, notices to terminate) have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The proposed actions concerning the draft documents are based on staff review, applying the appropriate standards, regulations and effluent limitations of the state of Kansas and the Environmental Protection Agency. Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 16.—FLEX ACCOUNT

5-16-1. Definitions. As used in this article, in the Kansas water appropriation act, and by the chief engineer in the administration of the Kansas water appropriation act, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings specified in this regulation. (a) "Base amount" and "BA" mean the quantity of water deposited in a flex account.

(b) "Base average usage factor" and "BAUF" mean the percentage of the "base average usage," as this term is defined in K.S.A. 82a-736 and amendments thereto, that is multiplied by five as a part of the calculations specified in K.A.R. 5-16-5 to determine the quantity of water that may be deposited into a flex account. The BAUF shall not exceed the maximum of 90% established by K.S.A. 82a-736, and amendments thereto.

(c) "Base water right" means a vested or certified water right or rights for which the owner applies to the chief engineer to establish a flex account pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-736, and amendments thereto.

(d) "BAU" means the "base average usage" as defined in K.S.A. 82a-736, and amendments thereto.

(e) "Good standing," only as that term is used in K.S.A. 82a-736 and amendments thereto, in reference to base water rights, means a base water right that meets the following conditions:

(1) Has been lawfully exercised within the period specified in K.A.R. 5-16-5;

(2) has had all required water use reports filed and any civil fines assessed for failure to timely file a complete and accurate water use report paid; and

(3) has had no period of nonuse with a duration of five or more consecutive years since January 1, 1990, except for enrollment in the water right conservation program pursuant to K.A.R. 5-7-4 or L. 2011, ch. 89, sec. 25 and amendments thereto, enrollment in the federal conservation reserve program, or enrollment in another multi-year federal or state conservation program.

(f) "Significant water conservation measures" means actual physical changes in a water distribution system or management practices that improve water use efficiency, including the following:

(1) Conversion from flood irrigation to center pivot irrigation with a nozzle package designed to improve water use efficiency;

(2) irrigation scheduling;

(3) conversion to subsurface drip irrigation; and

(4) removal of an end gun, resulting in a significant reduction in the number of irrigated acres. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 82a-736, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 89, sec. 28; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended Jan. 6, 2006; amended, T-5-8-29-11, Aug. 29, 2011; amended Dec. 16, 2011.)

5-16-3. Establishing a flex account. (a) A flex account shall be established by filing an application for a flex account and a term permit on a form prescribed by the chief engineer. Each application shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Show the location of all wells located within one-half mile of the proposed point of diversion and the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of the owners of those wells. Except as specified in subsection (e), a separate application shall be filed for each water right and each point of diversion for which the owner desires to establish a flex account. Each application shall be accompanied by the filing fee specified in K.A.R. 5-16-2;

(2) be date-stamped showing the date the application was filed with the chief engineer;

(3) indicate the five consecutive years that are to be designated as the flex account period; and

(4) indicate whether the flex account period will commence with the year in which the application is filed or with the next year after the year in which the application is filed.

(b) Before any application to establish a flex account and a term permit will be accepted for filing, the appli-

(continued)

cation shall be signed by at least one owner of the water right, or a duly authorized agent of an owner of the water right.

(c) Before the flex account can be established or the term permit approved, all of the water rights owners, or a duly authorized agent of the owners, shall verify upon oath or affirmation that the statements contained in the application are true and complete.

(d) If one or more owners refuse to sign the application or if a written request is filed by one or more of the owners to withdraw their signatures from the application before the application is approved, the application shall be dismissed.

(e) A single application to establish a flex account and apply for a term permit may be filed in either of the following situations:

(1) Multiple water rights authorize the diversion of water from a single point of diversion that diverts water to an identical place of use for a single type of use.

(2) Multiple points of diversion are authorized by the chief engineer to divert water through a single water flowmeter before going to an identical place of use.

(f) The flex account shall not be established and the term permit to exercise the flex account shall not be valid until both have been approved by the chief engineer. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 82a-736, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 89, sec. 28; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended, T-5-8-29-11, Aug. 29, 2011; amended Dec. 16, 2011.)

5-16-5. Maximum annual quantity of water authorized by term permit. (a) Except as specified in subsections (b) through (e), the maximum quantity of water deposited in a flex account and authorized to be diverted in five consecutive calendar years under the authority of a term permit shall be determined in accordance with K.S.A. 82a-736, and amendments thereto, by means of performing the following calculations:

(1) Add the quantity of water lawfully used under the base water right or rights each year during the period 2000 through 2009. This sum is the total quantity of water;

(2) divide that total quantity of water by 10;

(3) multiply that resulting quantity in paragraph (a)(2) by the BAUF;

(4) multiply that resulting quantity in paragraph (a)(3) by five; and

(5) if the application required by K.A.R. 5-16-3 was filed after November 1 of the year designated as the first year of the flex account period, subtract the quantity of water used under the base water right during the year in which the application was filed from the resulting quantity in paragraph (a)(4).

(b) If significant water conservation measures were implemented under the base water rights at any time during the period of calendar years 2000 through 2009, the average annual quantity of water actually used may be calculated using the five consecutive calendar years immediately preceding the implementation of significant water conservation measures, but these five calendar years shall

not begin before calendar year 1995. The five-year allocation under the term permit shall be determined by performing the following calculations:

(1) Add the quantity of water lawfully used each year under the base water right or rights for the five consecutive calendar years. This sum is the total quantity of water;

(2) divide that total quantity of water by five;

(3) multiply that resulting quantity in paragraph (b)(2) by the BAUF;

(4) multiply that resulting quantity in paragraph (b)(3) by five; and

(5) if the application required by K.A.R. 5-16-3 was filed after November 1 of the year designated as the first year of the flex account period, subtract the quantity of water used under the base water right during the year in which the application was filed from the resulting quantity in paragraph (b)(4).

(c) If water use records for a base water right are inadequate to accurately determine actual water use during any calendar year during the period used to determine the base average usage, then that year shall be counted as having no water use.

(d) No flex account shall be allowed if the flex account is inconsistent with the provisions of any intensive groundwater use control area created pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1036 through K.S.A. 82a-1040, and amendments thereto.

(e)(1) If water was authorized to be diverted for less than the entire period used to determine the base average usage, the five-year allocation shall be determined by means of these calculations:

(A) Add the quantity of water lawfully used each year under the base water right or rights for the entire period used. This sum is the base average usage;

(B) divide the base average usage by the number of years, or parts thereof, that water was authorized to be diverted by the chief engineer;

(C) multiply that resulting quantity in paragraph (e)(2) by the BAUF;

(D) multiply that resulting quantity in paragraph (e)(3) by five; and

(E) if the application required by K.A.R. 5-16-3 was filed after November 1 of the year designated as the first year of the flex account period, subtract the quantity of water used under the base water right during the year in which the application was filed from the resulting quantity in paragraph (e)(4).

(2) Water rights that authorized use of water for less than two calendar years during the period used to determine the base average usage shall not be eligible for a flex account. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 82a-736, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 89, sec. 28; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended Jan. 6, 2006; amended, T-5-8-29-11, Aug. 29, 2011; amended Dec. 16, 2011.)
