A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 21, at the Kansas Historical Museum, 6425 S.W. 6th Ave., Topeka, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism.

A general discussion and workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. March 21 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at approximately 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing and more business. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meeting for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. March 22 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting and may request the meeting materials in an accessible

format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the meeting by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at 620-672-5911. This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations. **K.A.R. 115-25-9.** This permanent regulation sets the open season, bag limits and permits for deer.

The proposed action is to reissue an existing permit for the operation of an existing wastewater treatment facility. This is a petroleum refinery producing a full range of petroleum products, by-products, and chemicals including benzene and toluene. The facility discharges at an average flow rate of 2.135 mgd. Boiler blowdown, cooling tower blowdown, domestic sewage/wastewater, water softener regenerate, wastewater from the oily sewer system, ammonia stripping wastewater, groundwater oil recovery wastewater, fire/service wastewater, phenolic area stormwater runoff and other contaminated stormwater runoff from the refinery stormwater system, sul-

fide, fluoride, spent caustic solution, and outside source hydrostatic test water are treated in an API oil-water separator and dissolved air flotation (DAF) unit. Benzene containing oily sewers (BCOS) wastewater is treated by an oil and sludge catcher, two corrugated plate interceptors (CPIs), a gas flotation unit and a nitrogen stripper prior to either being directed to the API separator or commingled with the DAF effluent. The combined flows are further treated in two complete mix activated sludge (CMAS) basins in series and two secondary clarifiers in parallel. Under normal operating conditions the clarifier effluent is further treated by flowing directly to a five-cell constructed wetland system operated in parallel, prior to discharge to the Walnut River via the effluent channel. A portion of the clarifier flow can be diverted to a three-cell oxidation pond polishing lagoon system to maintain adequate volume in the lagoon system for plant fire protection. Waste activated sludge is treated in an Imhoff tank and a belt filter press. Dewatered waste-activated sludge is taken to the Butler County Landfill for disposal but also has the potential to be sent to the delayed coking unit for hydrocarbon recovery. The API, DAF, CPI and other oily sludges are sent to the delayed coker unit or sent off-site to a permitted hazardous waste treatment, storage and disposal (TSD) facility. Stormwater basin receives excess stormwater that has been diverted by flow-limiting weir gates prior to entering the API separator during storm events. Overflow from the main stormwater basin discharges to the Walnut River. The Stanolind Pond receives stormwater from nonsewered areas of the plant. Pumps located at the Stanolind Pond normally pump the collected water to the Oxidation Ponds. Under excess stormwater flow conditions accumulated stormwater discharges through the emergency overflow to an unnamed tributary in the drainage of the Walnut River. Nonhazardous wet gas scrubber effluent wastewater is discharged to a permitted underground injection control (UIC) system (under Kansas permit KS-01-115-001). The proposed permit contains limits for chemical oxygen demand, oil and grease, total suspended solids, biochemical oxygen demand, fluoride, ammonia, phenolic compounds, sulfides, whole effluent toxicity and pH, as well as monitoring for E. coli, chlorides and effluent flow.

**Article 1.—GENERAL**

**40-1-20. Same; subrogation clause prohibited for certain coverages.** No insurance company or health insurer, as defined in K.S.A. 40-4602 and amendments thereto, may issue any contract or certificate of insurance in Kansas containing a subrogation clause, or any other policy provision having a purpose or effect similar to that of a subrogation clause, applicable to coverages providing for reimbursement of medical, surgical, hospital, or funeral expenses.
