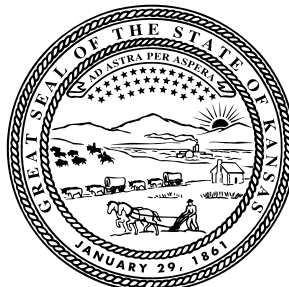

The Kansas Department for Children and Families, Faith-based and Community Initiatives, announces the release of a request for proposals to award a grant to up to three organizations. Those who will receive the grant(s) will demonstrate expertise and capacity to assist fathers who are receiving government assistance and are in arrears of child support payments to the state in the DCF Wichita, East and West regions. The grant will fund services to fathers, through the replication of a pilot program developed by Connections to Success, for case management, mentoring, work readiness, fathering skills, relationship skills, financial management and family violence prevention training. These services have been shown to help low-income fathers find sustained employment, pay child support and improve their family relationships.

Eligible applicants include organizations that are located within the DCF Wichita, East and/or West regions that (1) have experience effectively providing services to low-income families; (2) preferably, have been in business for five or more years with strong community partnerships; (3) have a volunteer-driven component with current active volunteers; (4) have some experience in job placement for unemployed individuals; and (5) understand the barriers and obstacles of employment facing low-income families. In submitting a bid, the bidder warrants that it has read the contract documents and is fully familiar therewith and that it has visited the site of the work to fully inform itself as to all existing conditions and limitations, and shall include in its bid a sum to cover the cost of all items of the work as specified in the contract documents.

No oral telegraphic, telephonic proposals or alterations will be considered. Facsimile transmissions will not be accepted.

Each bidder shall file with its bid a bid bond, a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on an acceptable bank, made payable to city of Lenexa, Kansas, in an amount equal to 5 percent of the total bid, which shall be retained by the city of Lenexa until a contract for the project has been executed. Bid bonds will be returned to the bidders, with the exception of the best and lowest and second best and second lowest responsible bidders, within 21 days after their bids are rejected. The bid deposit of the lowest and the second lowest responsible bidders will be returned when the Performance Bond, Maintenance Bond and Statutory Bond, each in an amount equal to 100 percent of the contract amount, required insurance certifi-

cates and other required documents shall have been furnished and the contract documents have been executed by the successful bidder.

In the event the low bidder is unable to execute the contract, for whatever reason, within the time provided in the Notice of Award, the city may annul the Notice of Award and the bid deposit may be forfeited, and the city shall exercise its legal prerogatives, including, but not limited to, enforcement of its rights as to the bid security or specific performance.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday, February 19, in Room 556A of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the Board of Accountancy.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director of the Board of Accountancy, Suite 556, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days

in advance of the hearing by contacting Judy Jenks at 785-296-8148 or by email at info@ksboa.ks.gov. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of Landon State Office Building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 74-2-1. Applications for examination. Amendments to this regulation require testing candidates to notify the board or its designee of any change of home or business address within 30 days of the change, which is a requirement for certificated and permitted CPAs.

K.A.R. 74-2-7. Concentration in accounting. Amendments to this regulation clarify the specific course requirements for the CPA exam.

K.A.R. 74-4-9. Continuing professional education controls and reporting. Amendments to this regulation require those chosen for audit of their CPE hours to respond within a time frame specified by the board, in conjunction with the amendment made to K.A.R. 74-5-407.

K.A.R. 74-5-2. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation update materials adopted by reference and specify excluded sections.

K.A.R. 74-5-101. Independence. Amendments to this regulation update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-5-202. Compliance with standards. Amendments to this regulation update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-5-406. Firm or professional names. Amendments to this regulation are for clarification and incorporate language found in K.S.A. 1-316 to include "professional names" to capture unincorporated sole practitioners and fictitious firm names.

K.A.R. 74-5-407. Cooperation with the board. Amendments to this regulation allow the board leeway in determining how much response time is warranted to respond to inquiries and requests by the board.

K.A.R. 74-6-2. Management of an office. Amendments to this regulation clarify the requirements for management of an office.

K.A.R. 74-11-6. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-11-7. Renewal of a firm's registration. Amendments to this regulation set forth a board policy that has been in effect for several years relative to what is required for proof of peer review at the time of firm renewal.

K.A.R. 74-11-15. Peer review oversight. Revoked.

The board does not anticipate any economic impact upon itself, to governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals in the adoption of these revisions to its regulations.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statement follows:

K.A.R. 109-2-7. Ground ambulance staffing. The proposed amendment adds language to include staffing requirements for a type IIA ambulance. The language was changed but the version was not adopted by the board when several other operational regulations were, consequently failing to establish standards for staffing on type IIA ambulances.

K.A.R. 109-2-11. Standards for type V air ambulances and equipment. The proposed changes in this regulation add language regarding staffing from existing K.A.R. 109-2-13, standards for fixed-wing ambulance aircrafts and equipment, to make staffing consistent with both fixed-wing and rotor-wing aircrafts.

Article 10.—ADULT CARE HOME PROGRAM

129-10-31. Responsibilities of, assessment of, and disbursements for the nursing facility quality care assessment program. (a) In addition to the terms defined in K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-7435 and amendments thereto, the following terms shall have the meanings specified in this subsection, unless the context requires otherwise.

(1) "High medicaid volume skilled nursing care facility" means any facility that provided more than 25,000 days of nursing facility care to medicaid recipients during the most recent calendar year cost-reporting period.

(2) "Kansas homes and services for the aging," as used in K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-7435 and amendments thereto, means leadinagage Kansas.

(3) "Nursing facility quality care assessment program" means the determination, imposition, assessment, collection, and management of an annual assessment imposed on each licensed bed in a skilled nursing care facility required by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-7435, and amendments thereto.

(4) "Skilled nursing care facility that is part of a continuing care retirement facility" means a provider who is certified as such by the Kansas insurance department before the start of the state's fiscal year in which the assessment process is occurring.

(5) "Small skilled nursing care facility" means any facility with fewer than 46 licensed nursing facility beds.

(b) The assessment shall be based on a state fiscal year. Each skilled nursing facility shall pay the annual assessment as follows:

(1) The assessment amount shall be \$325 annually per licensed bed for the following:

(A) Each skilled nursing care facility that is part of a continuing care retirement facility;

(B) each small skilled nursing care facility; and

(C) each high medicaid volume skilled nursing care facility.

(2) The assessment amount for each skilled nursing care facility other than those identified in paragraphs (c)(1)(A) through (C) shall be \$1,950 annually per licensed bed.

(3) The assessment amount shall be paid according to the method of payment designated by the secretary of the Kansas department of health and environment. Any skilled nursing care facility may be allowed by the secretary of the Kansas department of health and environment to have an extension to complete the payment of the assessment, but no such extension shall exceed 90 days. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-7435; effective Feb. 18, 2011; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

Article 8.—EXAMINATIONS

66-8-3. Engineering examinations. (a) The examination required of each applicant for engineering licensure shall be the national council of examiners for engineering and surveying (NCEES) examination consisting of an engineering fundamentals section and a professional practice section.

(b) The examination shall be graded by the NCEES, subject to approval by the board.

(c) Each applicant for a professional license shall be required to pass the section on engineering fundamentals, meet the educational requirements under K.A.R. 66-9-4, and meet the professional engineering experience requirements under K.S.A. 74-7021 and amendments thereto before submitting an application to take the section on professional practice. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7017, K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7021, and K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7023; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Nov. 6, 2009; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

66-8-6. Reexamination. (a) Any applicant for a license to practice engineering, land surveying, or geology who fails an examination on the first attempt may take the examination two additional times, except as specified in subsections (b) and (c).

(b) Except as specified in subsection (c), the fourth and any subsequent attempts by an applicant to retake an examination may be allowed by the board if the applicant establishes that the areas of deficiency identified in the examination failure report provided by the testing administrator have been addressed through either of the following:

(1) Additional coursework; or

(2) experience under the supervision of a person licensed in the technical profession for which the applicant is seeking licensure.

(c) Any applicant's examination results may be rejected by the board and permission to retake an examination may be withheld by the board upon a report by the testing administrator of any possible violation by the applicant of the provisions of any candidate testing agreement regarding examination irregularities.

(d) Each applicant shall submit the appropriate fee for each examination. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7009 and 74-7023; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended June 18, 2010; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

Article 9.—EDUCATION

66-9-7. Educational standard acceptable to the board for reciprocity applicants. For purposes of K.S.A. 74-7024 and amendments thereto, the following shall apply:

(a) Each applicant for a license to practice engineering, surveying, landscape architecture, or geology by reci-

procuity shall be deemed to have met the educational standard acceptable to the board if the applicant's educational qualifications when the original license was issued would have met the Kansas requirements in effect on that date.

(b) Each applicant for a license to practice architecture by reciprocity shall provide proof of certification by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB). The requirements for this certification shall be those specified in sections one through six on pages 11-16 of the "certification guidelines," published by the national council of architectural registration boards and revised July 2012. These six sections are hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7024; effective Feb. 4, 2005; amended Jan. 6, 2012; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

Article 10.—EXPERIENCE

66-10-1. Architectural experience of a character satisfactory to the board. Each applicant shall complete the intern development program (IDP) as specified on pages 9-20 in the "intern development program guidelines," dated November 2012 and published by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB). These pages are hereby adopted by reference. Each applicant shall provide a completed record of architectural experience prepared by the NCARB. 66-10-3. Architectural experience required of a reciprocity applicant. Each applicant for a license to practice architecture by reciprocity shall provide proof of certification by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB), for approval by the board. The requirements for this certification shall be those specified in the portions of the "certification guidelines" adopted by reference in K.A.R. 66-9-7. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7019; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended Jan. 6, 2012; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

66-10-9. Engineering experience of a character that is satisfactory to the board. (a) The work experience required of each applicant shall expose the applicant to all phases of work integral to the discipline of engineering in which the applicant claims qualification to practice and shall be verified as specified in paragraph (b)(2).

(b) Engineering work experience shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Fall within the definition of "the practice of engineering" pursuant to K.S.A. 74-7003, and amendments thereto;

(2) be directly supervised and verified by a licensed professional engineer. However, direct supervision by a

licensed professional engineer shall not be required of the employees of any person, firm, or corporation not offering services in the technical professions to the public, although verification by the applicant's supervisor shall still be required; and

(3) include at least two years of work experience, which shall have been gained in the United States.

(c) The following requirements and provisions shall be used to assign credit for work experience:

(1) The applicant shall demonstrate four years of acceptable work experience.

(2) One year of credit toward the experience requirement may be given for a master's or doctoral degree in engineering, unless that degree is used to satisfy the educational requirement described in K.A.R. 66-9-4(b). Credit for concurrent experience shall not be granted if the applicant is working full-time while earning a master's degree and that master's degree is received less than four calendar years from the date of the baccalaureate degree.

(3) Teaching engineering at a college or university that offers an engineering curriculum accredited by the engineering accreditation commission of the accreditation board for engineering and technology (EAC/ABET) of four years or more may be considered engineering experience.

(4) Work experience credit shall not be allowed for work performed before graduation with the baccalaureate degree.

(d) Each applicant shall supply at least three references from professional engineers who are licensed in the United States and are familiar with the applicant's engineering experience. 66-10-13. Geology experience of a character that is satisfactory to the board. (a) The work experience required of each applicant shall expose the applicant to all phases of work integral to the discipline of geology in which the applicant claims qualification to practice and shall be verified as specified in paragraph (b)(2).

(b) Geology experience shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Fall within the definition of "the practice of geology" in K.S.A. 74-7003, and amendments thereto; and

(2) be directly supervised and verified by a licensed geologist for work performed after July 1, 2000. However, direct supervision by a licensed geologist shall not be required of the employees of any person, firm, or corporation that does not offer services in the technical professions to the public, although verification by the applicant's supervisor shall still be required.

(c) The following shall be used to assess credit for work experience:

(1) Experience credit shall not be allowed for work performed before graduation.

(continued)

(2) One year of credit toward the experience requirement may be given for a master's degree in geology or in a closely related specialty area acceptable to the board.

(3) Teaching geology in a college or university that offers a geology curriculum of four years or more approved by the board may be considered geology experience.

(d) Each applicant shall supply at least three references from licensed geologists or licensed professional engineers who are familiar with the applicant's geology experience. At least two of these references shall be licensed geologists. One of the three references may be a licensed professional engineer. (1) Provide verification from the employer of at least four years of experience in the practice of engineering, as defined in K.S.A. 74-7003 and amendments thereto. One year of credit toward the experience requirement may be given for a master's or doctoral degree in engineering; and

(2) supply at least three references from professional engineers who are licensed in the United States and are familiar with the applicant's engineering experience.

(b) Each applicant for a land surveying license by reciprocity shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Provide verification from the employer of at least eight years of land surveying experience or education, or a combination of these, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-7022 and amendments thereto, K.A.R. 66-10-10, K.A.R. 66-10-10a, K.A.R. 66-10-10b, and K.A.R. 66-10-11; and

(2) supply at least three references from licensed land surveyors or licensed professional engineers who are familiar with the applicant's land surveying experience. At least one reference shall be from a licensed land surveyor.

(c) Each applicant for a geology license by reciprocity shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Provide verification from the employer of at least four years of experience in the practice of geology, as defined in K.S.A. 74-7003 and amendments thereto. One year of credit toward the experience requirement may be given for a master's degree in geology or in a closely related specialty area acceptable to the board; and

(2) supply at least three references from licensed geologists or licensed professional engineers who are familiar with the applicant's geology experience. At least two of these references shall be from licensed geologists. One of the three references may be from a licensed professional engineer. Article 11.—INTERN CERTIFICATION AND ADMISSION TO THE FUNDAMENTALS EXAMINATION

66-11-1. Intern engineer certificate. An intern engineer certificate shall be issued to each individual who meets the following requirements:

(a) Passes the examination in the fundamentals of engineering as administered by the national council of examiners for engineering and surveying (NCEES);

(b) submits proof of completion of a baccalaureate engineering curriculum or equivalent as described in K.A.R. 66-9-4; and

(c) submits an application, on a form provided by the board, that is approved by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7021; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Nov. 6, 2009; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

Article 14.—CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

66-14-1. Requirements. (a) Each licensee shall have completed 30 professional development hours (PDHs) of acceptable continuing education requirements during the two-year period immediately preceding the biennial renewal date established in K.A.R. 66-6-6 as a condition for license renewal. If the licensee exceeds the requirement in any renewal period, the licensee may carry a maximum of 30 PDHs forward into the subsequent renewal period.

(b)(1) Each land surveyor shall complete, as part of the 30 PDHs required, at least two PDHs of preapproved continuing education activity on the Kansas minimum standards adopted by reference in K.A.R. 66-12-1(b).

(2) Each provider of a continuing education activity specified in paragraph (b)(1) shall submit an application for preapproval of the continuing education activity on a form provided by the board.

(3) To qualify for preapproval, each continuing education activity shall meet the following conditions:

(A) The activity has a definable purpose and objective.

(B) The activity is created and conducted by a person qualified in the subject area.

(C) The activity equals two contact hours.

(D) Documentation is provided to the participant upon completion of the activity. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Jan. 23, 2009; amended Dec. 27, 2013.)

Notice of Amended Nursing Facility Medicaid
 Rates for State Fiscal Year 2014;
 Methodology for Calculating Final Rates and
 Rate Justifications; Notice of Intent to Amend
 the Medicaid State Plan

Under the Medicaid program, 42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq., the state of Kansas pays nursing facilities, nursing facilities for mental health, and hospital long-term care units (hereafter collectively referred to as nursing facilities) a daily rate for care provided to residents who are eligible for Medicaid benefits. The secretary for the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services administers the nursing facility program, which includes hospital long-term care units, and the nursing facility for mental health program. The secretary acts on behalf of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health Care Finance (DHCF), the single state Medicaid agency.

As required by 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(13), as amended by Section 4711 of the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, P.L. No. 105-33, 101 Stat. 251, 507-08 (August 5, 1997), the secretary for the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) is publishing amended Medicaid per diem rates for Medicaid-certified nursing facilities for state fiscal year 2014, the methodology underlying the establishment of the final nursing facility rates, and the justifications for those final rates. KDADS is also providing notice of the state's intent to submit proposed amendments to the Medicaid State Plan to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) on or before March 31, 2014.

I. Methodology Used to Calculate Medicaid Per Diem Rates for Nursing Facilities

In general, the state uses a prospective, cost-based, facility-specific rate-setting methodology to calculate nursing facility Medicaid per diem rates, including the rates listed in this notice. The state's rate-setting methodology is contained primarily in the following described documents and authorities and in the exhibits, attachments, regulations or other authorities referenced in them:

- A. The following portions of the Kansas Medicaid State Plan are maintained by DHCF:
1. Attachment 4.19D, Part I, Subpart C, Exhibit C-1, inclusive;
 2. Attachment 4.19D, Part I, Subpart U

The text of the amended portions of the Medicaid State Plan identified above in section IA.1, but not the documents, authorities and the materials incorporated therein by reference, is reprinted in this notice. The Medicaid State Plan provision set out in this notice appears in the version which the state currently intends to submit to CMS on or before March 31, 2014. The proposed Medicaid State Plan amendment that the state ultimately submits

to CMS may differ from the version contained in this notice.

Copies of the documents and authorities containing the state's rate-setting methodology are available upon written request. A.1 Attachment 4.19D, Part I, Subpart C, Exhibit C-1: Methods and Standards for Establishing Payment Rates for Nursing Facilities

Under the Medicaid program, the State of Kansas pays nursing facilities (NF), nursing facilities for mental health (NFMH), and hospital long-term care units (LTCU) (hereafter collectively referred to as nursing facilities) a daily rate for care provided to residents who are eligible for Medicaid benefits. The following section will be added to the narrative explanation of the nursing facility reimbursement formula. All the current sections of the narrative explanation will remain in effect.

Trending Factor

A trending factor of 1.25% will be applied to the total of the allowable per diems for the Operating, Indirect Healthcare and Direct Healthcare cost centers. The trending factor is effective for rates beginning 01/01/2014.

A.2 Quality Care Assessment Per Diem Pass-Through:

To compensate providers for increased expenses incurred due to the quality care assessment, a per diem pass-through will be determined and paid to each Medicaid provider. The per diem will be added to the nursing facility Medicaid per diem rate. The quality care assessment pass-through will not be subject to cost center limits or the 85% occupancy rule. The per diem pass through will be in effect for one quarter until it is recalculated.

1) Qualifying Providers

All providers currently enrolled in the Medicaid program will be eligible for the quality care assessment pass-through per diem.

2) Per Diem Pass-Through Calculation

The quality care assessment pass-through per diem will be determined by multiplying the quarterly quality care assessment paid by each qualifying provider by four to determine an annualized assessment expense. The assessment amount used in the calculation is the amount due 30 days after the start of the quarter. (For example; for the quarter beginning 1/1/2014, the assessment amount due on 1/30/2014 will be used to calculate the pass through for the quarter beginning 1/1/2014. The annualized assessment expense will be divided by the total resident days from the calendar year cost report preceding the start of the fiscal year. For example, during fiscal year 2014 (July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014), the resident day total from the calendar year 2012 cost report will be used

to determine the per diem pass-through. For providers filing a projected cost report the projected resident day total will be used to initially calculate the pass-through per diem. The per diem pass-through will be adjusted retroactively for an historical cost report covering the projection period.

II. Amended Medicaid Per Diem Rates for Kansas Nursing Facilities

The following list includes the calculated Medicaid rate for each nursing facility provider currently enrolled in the Medicaid program and the Medicaid case mix index used to determine each rate. The calculated Medicaid rate includes the 1.25% trending factor.
