Temporary notes in the principal amount of \$2,655,000 will be retired out of proceeds of the bonds and other available funds, which will reduce the outstanding general obligation indebtedness of the issuer to \$20,120,000.

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

111-4-3424. Treasure Hunt on-site second-chance drawing. (a) Beginning June 3, 2016, through June 11, 2016, the Kansas lottery will provide a drawing receptacle where non-winning "Treasure Hunt" tickets can be entered for a second-chance drawing. The drawing receptacle shall be located at the Kansas lottery selling location at the Riverfest in Wichita, Kansas, and shall be open to the public during the Kansas lottery's selling hours at the Riverfest. Entries into the drawing shall close at approximately 6:00 p.m. on June 11, 2016.

(b) Entries into the drawing shall be limited to non-winning Treasure Hunt instant tickets, game number 696. A player shall complete his or her name and address on the back of the ticket and place the ticket in the drawing receptacle.

(c) At least 10 minutes before the drawing, the draw official, or person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing, shall announce to the audience the time that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(d) After the drawing has closed, lottery security, or a designee of the executive director, shall seal the drum, if sealable, and rotate the drum a minimum of 10 times. After rotation or mixing, any seals shall be removed. Using a bare arm technique and while looking away from the receptacle the drawing official shall remove one ticket from the receptacle. Lottery security and the draw official shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the ticket back is legible and whether the ticket is valid. (e) The first ticket selected and determined as valid, shall be the winner of the second-chance drawing and shall win a \$5,000 cash prize.

(f) A person is not required to be present in order to win a prize in this drawing.

The drawing shall be audio and video tape recorded by lottery security.

(g) A winner, or alternate winner, shall be notified via phone call and/or email that he or she has won a prize. The winner, or alternate winner, shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(g) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas lottery "Treasure Hunt" instant game ticket not eligible to win an instant prize under the rules of the "Treasure Hunt Cash" instant game number 696.

(h) "Secondary prize" means the prizes to be given away identified in K.A.R. 111-4-3427(b) and (c) and which prizes shall differ in value. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-4-3427. Prize. (a) The grand prize winner in the "Treasure Hunt Drawing and Giveaway" event shall receive a cash prize of \$25,000.

(b) The two finalists who are eliminated immediately in the final giveaway event after opening a small treasure chest, and who are not awarded the grand prize, shall each receive a secondary prize consisting of \$1,000 cash.

(c) The two finalists who continue in the final giveaway event after two finalists of the five finalists are immediately eliminated, and who are not awarded the grand prize, shall each receive a secondary prize consisting of \$5,000 cash.

(d) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs, and deductions authorized by law.

(e) The Kansas lottery may, at its sole and absolute discretion, substitute a prize of approximate equal value. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-4-3428. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Treasure Hunt Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Treasure Hunt" Kansas instant lottery ticket, game number 696;

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Treasure Hunt" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Treasure Hunt Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Treasure Hunt Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning instant ticket shall locate the App Code located on the ticket and enter the App Code sequence online through the Kansas lottery players club at www.kslottery.com. A player shall then select and follow the hyperlink specifically developed for the purpose of accessing an interactive Treasure Hunt game.

(5) Each App Code has been pre-assigned one Treasure Hunt game outcome and is valid for one interactive game play. The Treasure Hunt game outcome reveals a random number of entries, up to and including as many as 15, into the "Treasure Hunt Drawing."

(6) The player will be automatically entered in the "Treasure Hunt Drawing" using the player's pre-determined number of entries once the player has played the interactive game.

(7) No prizes shall be awarded for playing the interactive Treasure Hunt game.

(8) Players may select the "Play for Fun" version of the interactive Treasure Hunt game, for which membership in the Kansas lottery players club is not required. Neither prizes nor entries into the "Treasure Hunt Drawing" will be awarded in the "Play for Fun" version of the game.

(9) Only one App Code is available on each non-winning instant ticket. Each App Code allows a player to play the interactive game only one time.

(10) Non-winning Treasure Hunt instant tickets which are mailed will not be accepted as valid entries into the "Treasure Hunt Drawing." (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-4-3429. Selection of drawing winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of the winners in the "Treasure Hunt Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall select five winners using a random number generator drawing machine in accordance with standard drawing procedures identified by the Kansas lottery and regulations incorporated as part of these rules.

(b) For the drawing to be conducted after the entry period closes at noon on May 24, 2016, 10 entries shall be selected. The first five entries that are selected, numbers 1 through 5, shall be identified as winners and shall become finalists in the "Treasure Hunt Drawing and Giveaway" event. The next five entrants that are selected, numbers 6 through 10, shall be used as alternates, if necessary, and shall otherwise win no prize.

(c) A winner shall be notified via email that he or she has been selected as a finalist and prize winner in the final event giveaway. At that time, the winner shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(d) A winner shall be sent a claim form via U. S. mail at the time the winner is notified he or she has been selected as a finalist and prize winner.

(e) A player who is among the first five winners selected in the drawing to be a finalist in the grand prize giveaway event and to receive a prize must return his or her completed claim form, which must be received by the Kansas lottery within seven days following the date of

(continued)

the online drawing. A player who is among the entrants selected as alternate winners in the drawing to be a finalist in the grand prize giveaway event and to receive a prize must return his or her completed claim form within seven days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail.

(f) Completed claim forms can be mailed by the winner via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winner can deliver the completed claim form to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during the hours the claim center is open for business.

(g) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said prize shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(h) Each finalist winner shall be informed that he or she is not required to be present at the grand prize giveaway event on June 11, 2016, but is encouraged to do so. In the event the winner opts for a proxy designee, the executive director of the Kansas lottery, or his designee, shall designate a proxy individual on the winner's behalf to participate in the promotional event giveaway. If the winner has submitted a completed claim form to the lottery within seven days of the drawing, but fails to designate a proxy individual to participate in the grand prize giveaway event on the winner's behalf, prior to the grand prize giveaway event on June 11, 2016, the executive director of the Kansas lottery, or his designee, shall designate a proxy individual on the winner's behalf to participate in the promotional event giveaway. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-4-3430. Determination of grand prize winner and secondary prize winners. On June 11, 2016, at approximately 6:00 p.m., in conjunction with the Riverfest in Wichita, Kansas, the Kansas lottery will determine the winner of the grand prize and winners of the secondary prizes in the "Treasure Hunt Drawing and Giveaway" event as follows:

(a) The five finalists of the "Treasure Hunt Drawing" described in these rules, or their proxies, will present themselves at a location designated by the executive director of the Kansas lottery at the Riverfest event.

(b) The Kansas lottery will present five small treasure chests, each of which will encase either a check or a key. Two of the small treasure chests will each hold a \$1,000 check. The remaining three small treasure chests will each hold a key bearing a number, either 1, 2, or 3, and of which one of the keys will unlock a larger treasure chest.

(c) In the order drawn as finalists and winners, numbers 1 through 5, and according to these rules, the "Treasure Hunt Drawing" winners, or their designated proxy, shall come forward, one by one, and select one of the five small treasure chests. The finalist shall present himself or herself in front of the small treasure chest until each

finalist has claimed a small treasure chest. All five finalists will then open their treasure chests. The two finalists who find a \$1,000 check in the small treasure chest which he or she opened, shall be eliminated from the final giveaway event and shall not continue. The remaining three finalists, who find a numbered key in the small treasure chest that was opened, shall come forward, one by one, in the order in which his or her key is numbered, and shall attempt to unlock the large treasure chest. The finalist who unlocks the large treasure chest shall be the winner of \$25,000 cash. The two finalists who found keys in their small treasure chest, but whose keys did not unlock the large treasure chest, shall each be the winner of \$5,000 cash as described in these rules.

(e) A drawing winner and finalist in the grand prize giveaway event shall be the winner of whatever prize is determined by his or her proxy, if used, during the grand prize giveaway event.

(f) Any person representing a drawing winner by proxy shall not be entitled to any prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-4-3431. Certification of drawing and grand prize winner determination. (a) The "Treasure Hunt Drawing and Giveaway" event shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department serving as the event manager or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery as the event manager.

(b) Prior to the grand prize giveaway event on June 11, 2016, Kansas lottery security personnel shall record and certify, in writing, the name of any individual serving as proxy on a drawing winner's behalf at the grand prize giveaway event. Such record shall be verified by the event manager, also prior to the grand prize giveaway event, to confirm that the drawing winner's name correctly matches the designated proxy individual's name.

(c) Upon completion of the drawings and grand prize giveaway event, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the names of the prize winners are correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES

111-17-27. Keno madness drawings. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct three second-chance online event drawings entitled "Keno Madness." The Kansas lottery will accept online entries into the drawings beginning at 5:00 a.m. on March 9, 2016. Entry into the drawings will close at noon on April 5, 2016. The drawings will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawings has closed, but before noon on April 8, 2016.

(b) The specific ticket eligible for entry into the second-chance online event drawings shall be any winning or non-winning Kansas lottery online Keno ticket. The entry ticket may include single plays, multiple plays, or multi-draws on a single ticket. The entry ticket must be

purchased during the period beginning at 5:00 a.m. on March 9, 2016, through 2:00 a.m. on April 5, 2016.

(c) A player shall enter qualifying tickets through the online Kansas lottery players club. At the time of entry, a player shall select "school choice," and shall choose one of the following three schools: the University of Kansas, Kansas State University, or Wichita State University. Only one school may be selected per online ticket entry.

(d) The Kansas lottery shall conduct three separate drawings before noon on April 8, 2016. There will be one drawing for each of the three schools referenced in subsection (c). The eligible entries into each drawing for the specific school shall be determined by the school which was selected by the player at the time of entry into the drawing. The first drawing shall consist of entries where the players selected the University of Kansas at the time of entry into the drawing. The second drawing shall consist of entries where the players selected Kansas State University at the time of entry into the drawing. The third drawing shall consist of entries where the players selected Wichita State University at the time of entry into the drawing.

(e) For each "Keno Madness Drawing" conducted before noon on April 8, 2016, the Kansas lottery shall award one grand prize and five secondary prizes. The grand prize winner in each drawing will receive \$500 cash and autographed merchandise. The autographed merchandise for the first drawing shall be from the University of Kansas. The autographed merchandise for the second drawing shall be from Kansas State University. The autographed merchandise for the third drawing shall be from Wichita State University. Each secondary prize winner will receive a \$50 gift card. The \$50 gift cards for the first drawing shall be from the University of Kansas. The \$50 gift cards for the second drawing shall be from Kansas State University. The \$50 gift cards for the third drawing shall be from Wichita State University.

(f) For each drawing described in subsections (d) and (e), the Kansas lottery shall select 20 entrants. The first entry selected in each drawing shall be awarded a grand prize described in subsection (e). The next five entries selected in each drawing (numbers 2 through 6) shall be awarded a secondary prize described in subsection (e). The next 14 entries selected in each drawing (numbers 7 through 20) shall be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(g) A player may enter the drawing(s) an unlimited number of times, but may win only one prize package in each drawing.

(h) A winner of a prize shall be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. At that time, the winner shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(i) A winner shall be sent a claim form via U. S. mail at the time the winner is notified he or she has won a prize.

(j) A player who is among the first six winners selected in each drawing to receive a prize must return his or her completed claim form, and must be received by the Kansas lottery within 15 days following the date of the online event drawing. A player who is among the entrants selected as alternate winners in these drawings to receive a prize must return his or her completed claim form within 15 days following the date the alternate winner was sent

a claim form via U. S. mail.

(j) Completed claim forms can be mailed by the winner via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winner can deliver the completed claim form to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during the hours the claim center is open for business.

(k) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(l) Each person who enters a Kansas lottery online Keno ticket in the Keno Madness Drawing agrees to release the University of Kansas, Kansas State University, Wichita State University, and the Kansas lottery and respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize.

(m) In the event any prize awarded for this drawing is postponed, changed, or canceled in whole or in part, no cash prize substitutions or other compensation shall be provided.

(n) Rules applicable to this online event drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-17-27 and K.A.R. 111-16-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

Article 401.—NORTHEAST GAMING ZONE

111-401-200a. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Hollywood Casino at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, entitled "Top 3."

The rules and regulations for the game of "Top 3" are contained in K.A.R. 111-401-200a through 111-401-205, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-401-201. Object of game and method of play.

(a) The object of the primary game for the "Top 3" game is to have the total point value of the player's hand exceed the total point value of the dealer's hand without going over a total point value of 21.

(b) All "Top 3" games will be dealt from a dealing shoe or shuffling device. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-401-202. Definitions. The following definitions when pertaining to the game of "Top 3" shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Blackjack" shall mean an ace and any card having a point value of 10 dealt as the initial two cards to a player or a dealer, except that this shall not include an ace and a ten point value card dealt to a player who has split pairs.

(b) "Burn" or "burning" a card shall mean to remove a

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card from play.

(c) "Dealer" shall mean the person responsible for dealing the cards.

(d) "Discard rack" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed after each round of decisions is rendered in a game.

(e) "Flush" shall mean three cards in the same suit.

(f) "Hard total" shall mean the total point count of a hand which contains no aces or which contains one or more aces that are each counted as having one point in value.

(g) "Push" or "tie" shall mean the player does not lose or win the hand played.

(h) "Shoe" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed to be held for dealing to the players and dealer.

(i) "Soft total" shall mean the total point count of a hand containing an ace when the ace is counted as having 11 points in value.

(j) "Straight" shall mean three consecutive cards, for example 8, 9, and 10.

(k) "Straight flush" shall mean three cards in consecutive order and all in the same suit.

(l) "Suited three-of-a-kind" shall mean three cards of the same rank and in the same suit.

(m) "Three-of-a-kind" shall mean three cards of the same rank. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-401-203. Characteristics of the game. (a) The game "Top 3" shall be played on a table consisting of five, six, or seven individual betting areas.

(b) The game of "Top 3" is played on a layout approved by the lottery that is similar to a blackjack layout with an additional betting area for the three-card poker bet and the "Top 3" bet. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-401-204. Wagers and payout odds. (a) Minimum and maximum wagers will be posted on a sign at each table.

(b) Maximum table payouts, if any, will be posted at each table and will not be less than the maximum wager times the maximum odds.

(c) If a player has been permitted to wager less than the table minimum, the dealer will take or pay the amount actually wagered. If a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the excess will be returned to the player and the dealer will pay the correct odds on the posted maximum amount. The player will be informed of the table minimum or maximum for subsequent wagers.

(d) A player may play two hands at double the table minimum per hand not to exceed the table maximum. A player may play three hands at five times the table minimum, per hand, not to exceed the table maximum. Exceptions to this subsection are permitted if approved by the pit manager, casino shift manager, or higher ranking casino official due if in his or her opinion business demands at the time justify otherwise.

(e) The following describes a list of permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win, loss, or tie:

(1) Original wagers:

(A) An original wager will be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being dealt.

(B) An additional original wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) An original wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21. In the event the player's first two cards have a total point value of 21, the player will have a blackjack.

(D) An original wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is lower than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(E) An original wager will tie ("push") if the total point value of the player's cards is equivalent to the total point value of the dealer's cards. A blackjack beats a hand with a total point value of 21 that uses the point value of three or more cards.

(F) When a player's hand consists of a blackjack, the winning hand will be paid out at a rate of 3 to 2. All winning original wagers, except hands consisting of a blackjack, will be paid out at the rate of 1 to 1.

(2) Insurance wager:

(A) An insurance wager is a one-time wager in an amount up to one-half of the original wager that may be taken when the dealer has an ace for his up card (the first card dealt to the dealer, which card is dealt face up). An insurance wager will be made prior to the dealer looking at the hole card (the second card dealt to the dealer, which card is dealt face down).

(B) An additional insurance wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) An insurance wager will win at the rate of 2 to 1 if the dealer has a blackjack.

(D) An insurance wager will lose if the dealer does not have a blackjack.

(3) Double down wager:

(A) An additional wager may be made by the player up to the amount of the player's original wager on the condition only one additional card will be dealt to the player. This wager can be made on any hand consisting of two cards including after splitting, except that the wager may not be made after splitting aces.

(B) An additional double down wager may be made as a tip for the dealer only if the player has made an original wager for the dealer.

(C) A double down wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21.

(D) A double down wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is less than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(E) A double down wager will tie ("push") if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are of equal total point value.

(F) A winning double down wager will be paid at the rate of 1 to 1.

(4) Split wager:

(A) An additional wager made when a player's initial two cards are of the same face value provided the player makes a wager equal to the original wager. A player may split up to three times for a total of four hands. A player

may double down after splitting with the exception of after splitting aces. A player will only receive one additional card after splitting aces.

(B) A split wager will win if the total point value of the cards in each hand held by a player exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21. The point value of player's cards and the dealer's cards are totaled separately.

(C) A split wager will lose if the total point value of the cards in each hand held by a player exceeds 21 or is less than the total point value of the dealer's cards. The point value of player's cards and the dealer's cards are totaled separately.

(D) A split wager will tie ("push") if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are of equal total point value.

(E) A winning split wager will be paid at the rate of 1 to 1.

(F) An additional split wager may be made as a tip for the dealer only if the player has made an original wager for the dealer.

(5) Three-card wagers:

(A) An optional three-card wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area designated for the three-card wager. The player must make an original blackjack wager in order to place the three-card wager.

(B) An additional three-card wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) A three-card wager will win if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(D) A three-card wager will lose if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(E) Winning three-card wagers will be paid out as follows:

(i) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or a straight flush, the hand will be paid at a rate of 9 to 1.

(ii) All three-card wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues.

(6) Top 3 wagers:

(A) An optional Top 3 wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area designated for the Top 3 wager. The player must make an original blackjack wager and a three card wager in order to place the Top 3 wager.

(B) An additional Top 3 wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) A Top 3 wager will win if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined equal a three-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a suited three-of-a-kind.

(D) A Top 3 wager will lose if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a three-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a suited three-of-a-kind.

(E) Winning Top 3 wagers will be paid out as follows:

(i) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a three-of-a-kind the hand will be paid at a rate of 90 to 1.

(ii) When the player's original two cards and the deal-

er's up card combined equal a straight flush the hand will be paid at a rate of 180 to 1.

(iii) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a suited three-of-a-kind the hand will be paid at a rate of 270 to 1.

(iv) All Top 3 wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-401-205. Game operations. (a) The game of Top 3 is played with six or more decks of cards. The following procedures for shuffling cards shall be implemented:

(1) The cards will be shuffled at various times including, but not limited to, the following circumstances:

(A) New decks are put into play.

(B) A shuffle will be performed after the completion of the hand in which the cut card appeared.

(C) The decks have been dropped or otherwise mishandled.

(D) When instructed to do so by a table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official.

(2) The cards may be shuffled manually.

(3) Alternatively, a shuffling machine may be used to shuffle the cards.

(b) The following procedures for card cutting shall be implemented:

(1) Upon completion of the shuffle, the dealer will offer the decks to a player to cut. In the event players at the table fail or refuse to perform the cut, the dealer or table games supervisor will cut the cards.

(2) The cut will be performed by inserting the cut card a minimum of approximately one deck from either end of the stack.

(3) Once the deck has been cut, the dealer will insert the cut card approximately one and one-half decks from the back of the shoe unless otherwise instructed by the table games supervisor or pit manager.

(c) The following procedures for dealing and taking cards shall be implemented:

(1) All original wagers must be in place before the first card is dealt from the shoe.

(2) Cards are distributed to the players, one at a time, from left to right. The dealer distributes one card to himself face up before continuing. The dealer deals a second card to each player, one at a time, from left to right and deals a second card to himself face down directly under the up card.

(3) The winning three-card bets will be paid and losing three-card bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(4) The winning Top 3 bets will be paid and losing Top 3 bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(5) The winning insurance bets will be paid and losing insurance bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(6) Beginning with the first player position to the left of the dealer, each player will indicate whether they wish to stand or hit. The player will indicate wanting a hit by making a clearly visible motion with his or her hand. Cards will continue being distributed to each player, one

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a time, receiving an additional signal from the player after each card, until the player indicates his or her desire to stand or the player's hand exceeds a total of 21 ("busts"), whichever comes first. To indicate a player's wish to stand, a player should motion slightly with his or her hands, palm down, toward the dealer.

(7) After all of the players have stood or broken, the hole card will be turned face up announcing the total point value of the two cards. If any player's hand is still in action, the dealer will hit if the dealer holds cards with a total point value of 16 or less or a soft 17. The dealer will stand on a hard 17 or higher total point value. A "soft 17" hand contains an ace that is being counted as 11 points. A "hard 17" hand does not contain an ace that is being counted as 11 points.

(8) Winning original blackjack wagers, double down wagers, and split wagers will then be paid and losing blackjack wagers, double down wagers, and split wagers will then be collected beginning on the right and working towards the left.

(9) If a player has a losing hand, the dealer will remove the player's chips and pick up the cards for placement into the discard rack.

(d) The following procedures for burning cards shall be implemented:

(1) Dealers will burn a card after completion of the shuffle; and,

(2) Dealers will burn a card upon entering a game. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

Article 501.—SOUTH CENTRAL GAMING ZONE

111-501-122. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Kansas Star Casino in Mulvane, Kansas, entitled "Top 3."

The rules and regulations for the game of "Top 3" are contained in K.A.R. 111-501-122 through 111-501-127, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-501-123. Object of game and method of play.

(a) The object of the primary game for the "Top 3" game is to have the total point value of the player's hand exceed the total point value of the dealer's hand without going over a total point value of 21.

(b) All "Top 3" games will be dealt from a dealing shoe or shuffling device. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-501-124. Definitions. The following definitions when pertaining to the game of "Top 3" shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Blackjack" shall mean an ace and any card having a point value of 10 dealt as the initial two cards to a player or a dealer, except that this shall not include an ace and a ten point value card dealt to a player who has split pairs.

(b) "Burn" or "burning" a card shall mean to remove a card from play.

(c) "Dealer" shall mean the person responsible for dealing the cards.

(d) "Discard rack" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed after each round of decisions is rendered in a game.

(e) "Flush" shall mean three cards in the same suit.

(f) "Hard total" shall mean the total point count of a hand which contains no aces or which contains one or more aces that are each counted as having one point in value.

(g) "Push" or "tie" shall mean the player does not lose or win the hand played.

(h) "Shoe" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed to be held for dealing to the players and dealer.

(i) "Soft total" shall mean the total point count of a hand containing an ace when the ace is counted as having 11 points in value.

(j) "Straight" shall mean three consecutive cards, for example 8, 9, and 10.

(k) "Straight flush" shall mean three cards in consecutive order and all in the same suit.

(l) "Suited three-of-a-kind" shall mean three cards of the same rank and in the same suit.

(m) "Three-of-a-kind" shall mean three cards of the same rank. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-501-125. Characteristics of the game. (a) The game "Top 3" shall be played on a table consisting of five, six, or seven individual betting areas.

(b) The game of "Top 3" is played on a layout approved by the lottery that is similar to a blackjack layout with an additional betting area for the three-card poker bet and the "Top 3" bet. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-501-126. Wagers and payout odds. (a) Minimum and maximum wagers will be posted on a sign at each table.

(b) Maximum table payouts, if any, will be posted at each table and will not be less than the maximum wager times the maximum odds.

(c) If a player has been permitted to wager less than the table minimum, the dealer will take or pay the amount actually wagered. If a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the excess will be returned to the player and the dealer will pay the correct odds on the posted maximum amount. The player will be informed of the table minimum or maximum for subsequent wagers.

(d) A player may play two hands at double the table minimum per hand not to exceed the table maximum. A player may play three hands at five times the table minimum, per hand, not to exceed the table maximum.

(e) The following describes a list of permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win, loss, or tie:

(1) Original wagers:

(A) An original wager will be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being dealt.

(B) An additional original wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) An original wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21. In the event the player's first two cards have a total point value of 21, the player will have a blackjack.

(D) An original wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is lower than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(E) An original wager will tie ("push") if the total point value of the player's cards is equivalent to the total point value of the dealer's cards. A blackjack beats a hand with a total point value of 21 that uses the point value of three or more cards.

(F) When a player's hand consists of a blackjack, the winning hand will be paid out at a rate of 3 to 2. All winning original wagers, except hands consisting of a blackjack, will be paid out at the rate of 1 to 1.

(2) Insurance wager:

(A) An insurance wager is a one-time wager in an amount up to one-half of the original wager that may be taken when the dealer has an ace for his up card (the first card dealt to the dealer, which card is dealt face up). An insurance wager will be made prior to the dealer looking at the hole card (the second card dealt to the dealer, which card is dealt face down).

(B) An additional insurance wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) An insurance wager will win at the rate of 2 to 1 if the dealer has a blackjack.

(D) An insurance wager will lose if the dealer does not have a blackjack.

(3) Double down wager:

(A) An additional wager may be made by the player up to the amount of the player's original wager on the condition only one additional card will be dealt to the player. This wager can be made on any hand consisting of two cards including after splitting, except that the wager may not be made after splitting aces.

(B) An additional double down wager may be made as a tip for the dealer only if the player has made an original wager for the dealer.

(C) A double down wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21.

(D) A double down wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is less than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(E) A double down wager will tie ("push") if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are of equal total point value.

(F) A winning double down wager will be paid at the rate of 1 to 1.

(4) Split wager:

(A) An additional wager made when a player's initial two cards are of the same face value provided the player makes a wager equal to the original wager. A player may split up to three times for a total of four hands. A player may double down after splitting with the exception of after splitting aces. A player will only receive one additional card after splitting aces.

(B) A split wager will win if the total point value of the cards in each hand held by a player exceeds the to-

tal point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21. The point value of player's cards and the dealer's cards are totaled separately.

(C) A split wager will lose if the total point value of the cards in each hand held by a player exceeds 21 or is less than the total point value of the dealer's cards. The point value of player's cards and the dealer's cards are totaled separately.

(D) A split wager will tie ("push") if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are of equal total point value.

(E) A winning split wager will be paid at the rate of 1 to 1.

(F) An additional split wager may be made as a tip for the dealer only if the player has made an original wager for the dealer.

(5) Three-card wagers:

(A) An optional three-card wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area designated for the three-card wager. The player must make an original blackjack wager in order to place the three-card wager.

(B) An additional three-card wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) A three-card wager will win if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(D) A three-card wager will lose if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(E) Winning three-card wagers will be paid out as follows:

(i) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or a straight flush, the hand will be paid at a rate of 9 to 1.

(ii) All three-card wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues.

(6) Top 3 wagers:

(A) An optional Top 3 wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area designated for the Top 3 wager. The player must make an original blackjack wager and a three card wager in order to place the Top 3 wager.

(B) An additional Top 3 wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) A Top 3 wager will win if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined equal a three-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a suited three-of-a-kind.

(D) A Top 3 wager will lose if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a three-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a suited three-of-a-kind.

(E) Winning Top 3 wagers will be paid out as follows:

(i) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a three-of-a-kind the hand will be paid at a rate of 90 to 1.

(ii) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a straight flush the hand will be paid at a rate of 180 to 1.

(iii) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's up card combined equal a suited three-of-a-kind the hand will be paid at a rate of 270 to 1.

(continued)

(iv) All Top 3 wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)

111-501-127. Game operations. (a) The game of Top 3 is played with six or more decks of cards. The following procedures for shuffling cards shall be implemented:

(1) The cards will be shuffled at various times including, but not limited to, the following circumstances:

(A) New decks are put into play.

(B) A shuffle will be performed after the completion of the hand in which the cut card appeared.

(C) The decks have been dropped or otherwise mishandled.

(D) When instructed to do so by a table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official.

(2) The cards may be shuffled manually.

(3) Alternatively, a shuffling machine may be used to shuffle the cards.

(b) The following procedures for card cutting shall be implemented:

(1) Upon completion of the shuffle, the dealer will offer the decks to a player to cut. In the event players at the table fail or refuse to perform the cut, the dealer or table games supervisor will cut the cards.

(2) The cut will be performed by inserting the cut card a minimum of approximately one deck from either end of the stack.

(3) Once the deck has been cut, the dealer will insert the cut card approximately one and one-half decks from the back of the shoe unless otherwise instructed by the table games supervisor or pit manager.

(c) The following procedures for dealing and taking cards shall be implemented:

(1) All original wagers must be in place before the first card is dealt from the shoe.

(2) Cards are distributed to the players, one at a time, from left to right. The dealer distributes one card to himself face up before continuing. The dealer deals a second card to each player, one at a time, from left to right and deals a second card to himself face down directly under the up card.

(3) The winning three-card bets will be paid and losing three-card bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(4) The winning Top 3 bets will be paid and losing Top 3 bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(5) The winning insurance bets will be paid and losing insurance bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(6) Beginning with the first player position to the left of the dealer, each player will indicate whether they wish to stand or hit. The player will indicate wanting a hit by making a clearly visible motion with his or her hand. Cards will continue being distributed to each player, one at a time, receiving an additional signal from the player after each card, until the player indicates his or her desire to stand or the player's hand exceeds a total of 21 ("busts"), whichever comes first. To indicate a player's wish to stand, a player should motion slightly with his or her hands, palm down, toward the dealer.

(7) After all of the players have stood or broken, the hole card will be turned face up announcing the total point value of the two cards. If any player's hand is still in action, the dealer will hit if the dealer holds cards with a total point value of 16 or less or a soft 17. The dealer will stand on a hard 17 or higher total point value. A "soft 17" hand contains an ace that is being counted as 11 points. A "hard 17" hand does not contain an ace that is being counted as 11 points.

(8) Winning original blackjack wagers, double down wagers, and split wagers will then be paid and losing blackjack wagers, double down wagers, and split wagers will then be collected beginning on the right and working towards the left.

(9) If a player has a losing hand, the dealer will remove the player's chips and pick up the cards for placement into the discard rack.

(d) The following procedures for burning cards shall be implemented:

(1) Dealers will burn a card after completion of the shuffle; and,

(2) Dealers will burn a card upon entering a game. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-31-16, Feb. 10, 2016.)
