Facility Description: The proposed action is to issue five new Class III Salt Solution Mining Well permits. The fluids to be injected consist of fresh water and unsaturated brine. Injection is into the Hutchinson Salt member of the Wellington formation. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed regulation during the public hearing. In order to provide all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes. The hearing shall be conducted in compliance with the public hearing procedures of the Kansas State Board of Education.

K.A.R. 91-31-32. This regulation describes the Performance and Quality Criteria each school must meet in order to maintain its status of accreditation by the Kansas State Board of Education. The proposed amendment to K.A.R. 91-31-32 adds a requirement for all accredited schools to provide suicide awareness and prevention training to all staff. The regulation will require at least one hour of training per calendar year. This training may be accomplished through independent self-review of online training materials. The training must also include a building crisis plan for each school building in case staff recognizes the need to intervene to prevent and/or respond to a student suicide. The proposed amendment to K.A.R. 91-31-32 will have no economic impact on schools beyond what is already required by the Jason Flatt Act (SB 323) (2016), which imposes the same requirements on schools since May 19th, 2016.

The Kansas State Board of Education does not anticipate any significant financial or economic impact with the proposed regulation.

Article 29—STATE UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS

K.A.R. 88-29-11 sets forth the qualified admission pre-college curriculum for state university applicants who graduated from high school in academic year 2013-2014 or earlier. The regulation is being amended to adopt an updated list of precollege curriculum courses approved for university admissions purposes for students who graduated in academic year 2010 or later (but before AY 2014-2015), arrived at after consultation with the Department of Education and high school officials. Amendments to the course list will not adversely affect any students as the amendments are effective going forward, generally expand rather than limit the course list, and courses that are being eliminated will fulfill Qualified Admission curriculum requirements if a student took the course before it was removed from the list.

K.A.R. 88-29-2, 88-29-5, 88-29-6, 88-29-7, 88-29-7a, 88-29-8, 88-29-8c, 88-29-9, and 88-29-10 are all being revoked because they have timed out in accordance with their own terms, and are replaced by the provisions of K.A.R. 88-29a-2, 88-29a-5, 88-29a-6, 88-29a-7, 88-29a-7a, 88-29a-8, 88-29a-8c, 88-29a-9, and 88-29a-10.

Economic Impact: There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board, state universities, community colleges, technical colleges, Washburn University, Washburn Institute of Technology, high schools, or students/parents as a result of this amendment or the revocations. There will be no economic impact on other agencies or private business as a result of these regulations.

Except as otherwise set forth in the rules herein, all rules of the game of blackjack shall remain unaltered and any optional Dead Man's Hand wager made shall not affect any other blackjack wager.

(b) The Dead Man's Hand optional wager shall be played following the rules of the game of blackjack except as follows:

(1) A player may not place a Dead Man's Hand wager unless the player has also placed at least the minimum blackjack wager required at that blackjack table.

(2) Blackjack tables where the optional Dead Man's Hand wager is available shall have a spot designated on the table game layout where the wager can be placed.

(3) At the option of Boot Hill Casino & Resort, the game shall be played using one, two, five, six or eight standard 52-card decks of playing cards.

(4) At the same time a player makes his or her standard blackjack wager, the player has an opportunity to make the optional Dead Man's Hand wager in even dollar amounts. The minimum and maximum amounts of the Dead Man's Hand wager permitted shall be posted on the table signage and cannot be more than the maximum original blackjack wager.

(5) If the player is playing more than one hand, the same number of Dead Man's Hand wagers can be made.

(6) Players that have made the Dead Man's Hand wager and are not dealt at least one ace or one eight on his or her first two cards in each hand will lose his or her Dead Man's Hand wager.

(7) Players who make the optional Dead Man's Hand wager will win and be paid according to the pay table set forth hereinafter if:

(A) one of his or her first two cards dealt is an ace or an eight;

(B) his or her first two cards are an ace and an eight; or,

(C) his or her first two cards are two aces or two eights and the dealer has a blackjack.

(8) Players who have been dealt a pair of aces or a pair of eights can choose to split his or her hands. No additional Dead Man's Hand wager is required to split these hands. Splitting pairs will be handled as follows:

(A) Except as otherwise stated in these rules, the standard rules of the game of blackjack will apply to splitting pairs;

(B) Players may split pairs up to three times for a maximum of four hands;

(C) If a player splits a pair and then receives cards that bust the hand (results in a sum exceeding 21), the dealer will remove the cards that busted the hand and leave the initial aces or eights on the game table in a horizontal position. Once the player has completed taking cards, the dealer will calculate the winning pay out according to the pay table and pay the player accordingly;

(D) Players will be paid for the number of aces and/or eights they have been dealt when all splitting is done;

(E) If the player splits but does not receive any additional aces or eights, they will be paid for his or her initial pair of aces or eights according to the pay table;

(F) The objective of the game is to be dealt four sets of aces and/or eights after the player has split his or her initial pair of aces or eights;

(G) Players who split a pair of eights must clearly indicate on which hand they want to take an additional card or cards;

(H) Players who split eights up to three times under house rules allowing the splitting of aces only once will be paid for any two hands with an ace and an eight. Three or more hands with an ace and eight will not increase the payout; and,

(G) The game then continues to the next player.

(9) Players who make the Dead Man's Hand wager and are dealt a pair of aces or a pair of eights may choose not to split his or her pair and complete his or her hand according to his or her preference.

(10) In those instances when the dealer's card dealt face up is an ace, the procedure shall be as follows:

(A) Per standard rules of blackjack the dealer will offer all players the right to place an insurance wager;

(B) Per standard rules of blackjack the dealer will then check if he or she has a blackjack. If the dealer has a blackjack the dealer will collect all losing blackjack wagers from right to left;

(C) Per standard rules of blackjack the dealer will pay-out any winning insurance wagers; and,

(D) Starting from the dealer's right to left, the dealer shall then collect all losing Dead Man's Hand wagers and pay all winning Dead Man's Hand wagers according to the pay table, below.

(11) In those instances where the dealer's card dealt face up has a value of ten (10), the procedure shall be as follows:

(A) The dealer shall check to see if he or she has a blackjack. If the dealer does have a blackjack, the dealer will collect all losing blackjack wagers and all losing Dead Man's Hand wagers;

(B) Starting from the dealer's right to left, the dealer will then pay all winning Dead Man's Hand wagers according to the pay table, below; and,

(C) If the dealer does not have a blackjack, the game resumes per the standard rules of the game of blackjack.

(12) The pay table of payout odds for the Dead Man's Hand optional wager is as follows (only the highest payout for which the hand is eligible shall be paid):

- Two sets of aces and 8's—Pays 100 to 1
- One ace and one 8 dealt in the player's first two cards—Pays 4 to 1
- Two aces or two 8's with only an ace and 8 remaining after split—Pays 20 to 1
- Two aces or two 8's with no split – Pays 4 to 1
- Any ace or 8 dealt in the player's first two cards – Pays 2 to 1
- Two aces or two 8's and the dealer has a blackjack – Pays 50 to 1

(13) Optional token wagers (dealer gratuities) may be placed on Dead Man's Hand wagers at the same time as the Dead Man's Hand wager is placed, and if placed shall also be paid or taken at the same time as the player's Dead Man's Hand wager is paid or taken and shall be paid at the same odds as the player's winning Dead Man's Hand wager. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-8-7-14, July 16, 2014; amended, T-111-8-17-16, July 13, 2016.)

Article 307. — SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES; ULTIMATE TEXAS HOLD'EM POKER

111-307-5. Wagers. (a) All wagers at Ultimate Texas Hold'em shall be made by placing gaming chips or, if applicable, a match play coupon on the appropriate abetting areas of the table layout. A verbal wager accompanied by cash shall not be accepted.

(b) All ante, blind, trips, and progressive wagers shall be placed prior to the dealer dealing the hand. Except for a "play wager" as provided in K.A.R. 111-307-6, "play," no wager shall be made, increased, or withdrawn after the dealer begins to deal the hand.

(c) Upon placing an ante wager and a blind wager, a player may also place a trips wager by placing a wager on the designated betting area of the layout. The outcome of the trips wager shall have no bearing on any other wager made by the player at the game of Ultimate Texas Hold'em.

(d) Upon placing an ante and a blind wager, a player may also place a progressive wager by placing a \$1 wager on the designated betting area of the layout. The outcome of the progressive wager shall have no bearing on any other wager made by the player at the game of Ultimate Texas Hold'em.

(e) Play wagers shall be made in accordance with the provisions set forth in these rules.

(f) Only players who are seated at the Ultimate Texas Hold'em poker table may place a wager at the game.

Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play.

(g) A player shall not be permitted to wager on more than one player position at an Ultimate Texas Hold'em table. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010; amended, T-111-8-17-16, July 13, 2016.)

111-307-7. Payout odds. (a) A lottery gaming facility manager shall pay each winning ante and play wager at odds of 1 to 1.

(b) If a player's five-card hand ranks higher than the dealer's five-card hand, the lottery gaming facility manager shall pay the player's blind wager in accordance with the following odds:

Player's Five-Card Hand	Payout Odds
Royal flush	500 to 1*
Straight flush	50 to 1*
Four-of-a-kind	10 to 1*
Full house	3 to 1*
Flush	3 to 2*
Straight	1 to 1*
Less than a straight	Push

*This does not include the return of the player's original bet.

(c) The lottery gaming facility manager shall pay each winnings trips wager at no less than the odds set forth in the alternative pay table set forth below that is implemented by the lottery gaming facility manager as approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery:

Royal flush	50 to 1	50 to 1	50 to 1	50 to 1
Straight flush	40 to 1	40 to 1	40 to 1	40 to 1

*The payouts listed above do not include the return of the player's original bet. The trips bets are paid as each hand decision is made.

(d) All winning progressive wagers shall be paid as follows:

Hand	Payout
Royal flush	100% of the progressive jackpot
Community royal flush	\$1,000
Straight flush	\$250
Four-of-a-kind	\$75
Full house	\$10

The progressive payouts do not include the return of the original bet. The progressive payouts are paid in turn as each player's hand is resolved. A "community royal flush" is a royal flush comprised only of the five community cards. In the event a community royal flush is dealt, all players who made a progressive wager on that hand

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will win \$1,000. The initial and reset amount for the progressive jackpot shall be \$1,000, which shall be funded by the lottery gaming facility manager. For each progressive wager made thereafter, 27 percent of the wager shall be credited to the progressive jackpot.

(e) The following irregularities shall apply:

(1) If any card dealt to the dealer in Ultimate Texas Hold'em is exposed prior to each player having either folded or placed a play wager, all hands shall be void.

(2) If any card is found face up in the shoe or the deck during the dealing of the cards, all hands shall be void and the cards shall be reshuffled.

(3) If a player is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all players' hands shall be voided. If the dealer is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all players' hands shall be void.

(4) If an automated card shuffling device is being used and the device jams, stops shuffling during a shuffle, or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards shall be reshuffled.

(5) If an automated dealing shoe is being used and the device jams, stops dealing cards, or fails to deal cards during a round of play, the round of play shall be void and the cards shall be removed from the device and re-shuffled with any cards already dealt, in accordance with procedures approved by the Kansas lottery commission.

(6) Any automated card shuffling device or automated dealing shoe shall be removed from a gaming table before any other method of shuffling or dealing may be utilized at that table.
