Notice of Pending Kansas/NPDES Water
Pollution Control General Permit

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has prepared a Kansas Water Pollution Control and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general permit for discharges from the application of pesticides to, over, or near waters of the United States within the borders of Kansas, except for Indian lands.

This general permit authorizes coverage for four specific pesticide use patterns as well as providing automatic coverage for pesticide research and development activities. The four specific pesticide use patterns are: mosquito and other flying or aquatic insect pest control; weed, algae, pathogen, or fish parasite control; nuisance animal control; and forest canopy pest control. This general permit does not address or regulate pesticide application activities associated with conventional terrestrial agricultural practices that continue to be regulated through the requirements and provisions of Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) and/or the Kansas Pesticide Law. Discharges from the application of pesticides to waters of the United States for pesticide use patterns not listed in this permit, or approved by KDHE, and violations of this general permit are violations of the Clean Water Act (CWA) and Kansas law. This general permit mirrors the scope and extent of the discharges from pesticide application activities addressed in EPA's 2011 NPDES Pesticide General Permit and the proposed draft 2016 NPDES Pesticide General Permit published in the January 26, 2016 Federal Register that will replace the EPA's 2011 general permit.

The general permit describes the conditions under which a formal application, Notice of Intent (NOI), is required. Operators proposing to apply pesticides to a water of the United States for one of the designated pesticide use patterns, that triggers an annual treatment area threshold criteria, or that are proposing to discharge in, over, or near an Outstanding National Resource Water (ONRW), or are proposing to discharge within ¼-mile of a public water supply surface water intake are required to submit an NOI and \$60 permit fee. All other operators under this general permit continue to be automatically covered.

All operators covered by this general permit must comply with technology-based and water quality-based effluent limitations, standard conditions and monitoring, reporting, record keeping, and document retention requirements. Coverage under this general permit does not negate the requirements of any federal or Kansas law, statute, or regulation and specifically references FIFRA, the Kansas Agricultural Chemical Act, and the Kansas Pesticide law. The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is seeking the services of a consulting engineering firm to measure vertical clearances of bridge structures (approximately 864 structures) over roadways in Douglas, Johnson, Leavenworth, Lyon, Miami, Sedgwick, Shawnee, and Wyandotte Counties within a 6 month period.

Project 106 KA 4452-01, includes all structures over KDOT routes and roads under KDOT routes. Examples would include bridges, 10'-20' structures (500 Series), railroad structures, pedestrian structures, City/County roads under, City/County roads over, Kansas Turnpike Authority (KTA) bridges over, etc. Measurements are to be provided at each lane line from edge of pavement to edge of pavement, and at both the approach and exit ends of every opening that crosses over or under each structure. All measurements shall be taken in a preapproved method that minimizes the impact on traffic (traveling laser system, Lidar, etc.). These measurements shall be within an accuracy of ½".

Qualifications-Based Selection Process: Based on the qualifications submitted in the Letter of Interest and other information available to KDOT, on or about October 8, 2016, KDOT will shortlist three firms and notify all firms submitting Letters of Interest of the names of the short-listed firms by return email. Thereafter, KDOT will issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) to the shortlisted firms soliciting a technical proposal. At KDOT’s option, shortlisted firms may be interviewed by telephone conference call or asked to attend meetings or participate in other discussions with KDOT. Technical proposals will be evaluated on the basis of the factors listed below, evenly weighted, to rank the most qualified firm in order of preference as first, second and third, etc. Evaluation factors: 1) the quality of the response to the RFP; 2) qualifications and experience of consultant personnel proposed for services; 3) proposed approach to performance, data gathering vehicle speed, and accuracy of services; and 4) past performance history. The highest ranked firm will be asked to enter into negotiations with KDOT for an Agreement. In the event KDOT cannot reach agreement with the highest ranked firm, it will terminate negotiations with such firm and commence negotiations with the next highest ranked firm, and so on, until either agreement is reached for a satisfactory scope of services for a fair and reasonable price, or KDOT decides to pursue other alternatives. KDOT intends to conclude or terminate negotiations on or before November 1, 2016.

(Because SCKEDD employs weatherization crews, only the work that cannot be performed in-house will be contracted out.) Weatherization work includes: performing air sealing, repairing broken windows, adding weather-strips to exterior doors, installing plastic vapor barriers in crawl spaces, insulating foundation walls and floors using fiberglass batting material, installing dense pack blown cellulose insulation in exterior walls, installing roof vents and insulating attics with blown cellulose. Mobile home weatherization work includes: repairing duct work systems and installing blown fiberglass insulation into bellies, walls and roof cavities. Work will be performed on single family dwellings and mobile homes.

All weatherization contractors will be responsible for complying with the EPA's Renovation Repair and Painting (RRP) regulations as enforced by KDHE in Kansas. KDHE and Kansas weatherization requires all licensed firms to employ only Certified Renovators to perform weatherization work. Other contractor requirements include, but are not limited to:

- Capability to be licensed in all municipalities served by SCKEDD weatherization
- RRP Renovation firms licensed with KDHE
- All workers licensed as RRP Renovators with KDHE
- All workers have completed LSWP training provided

- Workman's Comp and general liability insurance

Contracts will be for a one year period through October 31, 2017, with an option to extend the contract for up to three additional one-year periods at the discretion of SCKEDD and the approval of the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amended regulation K.A.R. 51-9-7 regarding the Schedule of Medical Fees for Workers Compensation.

A summary of the proposed regulation and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulation:

K.A.R. 51-9-7. Fees for medical and hospital services. Updates the workers compensation schedule of medical fees by increasing the reimbursement for most physician services 3 percent, changes the outpatient and ambulatory surgical center's reimbursement to a prospective payment system from billed charges, and revises fees for independent medical exams, depositions and testimony and trauma activation levels.

Economic Impact:

Costs to the agency: No additional costs will be incurred by KDOL Department of Workers Compensation for these regulatory changes.

Costs to the regulated community and consumers: The total estimated impact on Kansas Workers compensation is an overall savings of 0.4% or \$2 million.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: Kansas State Self Insurance Fund that covers state employees under the Kansas Workers Compensation Act will also see an overall cost savings of 0.4% or \$2 million.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public com-

ment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amended regulation.
