The following Interim Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) cost center limits are being set forth for public comment. Comments should be sent to Melissa Warfield, Director of Fiscal and Program Evaluation, Financial and Information Services, 503 Kansas Ave., Topeka, KS 66603. The comment period will expire 30 days from the publication of this notice.

K.A.R. 30-10-214 provides for the annual review and adjustment of Class II ICF/IID cost center limits, approved by the secretary of the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) or designee, based on current cost information supplied by the enrolled, licensed providers of ICF/IID services, and formula set forth in the Kansas State Medicaid Plan (Attachment 4.19-D, Part II, Subpart O, page 1). The formula is as follows: Total allowable costs, including an inflation factor, are compared to the amount to be reimbursed under the current limits.

The formula threshold requires that 60 percent of all ICF/IIDs are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs. If less than 60 percent of the facilities are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs, then the cost center limits are adjusted until the threshold is met. The inflation factor is based on the IHS Healthcare Cost CMS Nursing Home without Capital Market Basket.

To determine where to make the adjustments, two major cost centers are analyzed according to the following prescription:

- Administrative costs are based on facility size
- Habilitation costs are based on facility size and level of care (LOC)

The cost analysis for 2016 demonstrates 80 percent of the Class II ICF/IIDs are being reimbursed 90 percent or more of their allowable costs, once inflation factors are applied. Therefore, adjustments through rebasing are not required for rates effective October 1, 2017.

Recommendations

Based on cost report analysis and available funding, cost center limits for Class II ICF/IIDs are as follows:

Permanent Administrative Regulations

**Article 71.—VOLUNTARY CLEANUP AND
PROPERTY REDEVELOPMENT PROGRAM**

28-71-1. Definitions. In addition to the terms defined

in K.S.A. 65-34,162 and amendments thereto, each of the following terms, as used in this article of the department's regulations, shall have the meaning specified in this regulation:

(a) "Anthropogenic levels" means concentrations of chemicals or substances that are present in the environment due to human activity.

(b) "Class one contamination" and "class I" mean that suspected or confirmed contamination exists on the property described in the application, but the property is not a source of the contamination.

(c) "Class two contamination" and "class II" mean that suspected or confirmed soil or groundwater contamination, or both, resulting from operations that have occurred on the property is suspected or exists on or off the property described in the application, or both.

(d) "Days" means calendar days unless otherwise specified. Documents due on the weekend or a holiday shall be submitted on the first working day after the weekend or holiday.

(e) "Enforcement action" means an administrative or judicial claim made by a governmental agency pursuant to state, federal, or common law against the property described in the application, which enforcement action is based upon the contaminants to be cleaned up under the VCPRP.

(f) "Environmental site assessment" means an investigation of a property, performed in accordance with standard industry practices, that identifies and defines recognized environmental conditions at the property.

(g) "Environmental use control" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-1,222, and amendments thereto.

(h) "Hazard index value" means the sum of more than one hazard quotient for multiple substances, multiple exposure pathways, or both.

(i) "Hazard quotient" means the ratio of a single substance exposure level over a specified time period to a reference dose for that substance derived from a similar exposure period.

(j) "Institutional control" means a legal mechanism that limits access to or use of property, or warns of a hazard, the purpose of which is to ensure the protection of human health and the environment.

(k) "Maximum contaminant level" and "MCL" have the meaning specified for "maximum contaminant level" in K.A.R. 28-16-28b.

(l) "Naturally occurring levels" means ambient concentrations of chemicals or substances present in the environment that are typical of background levels near the property subject to the voluntary agreement when not affected by the identified contamination source.

(m) "Nonresidential property" means any property that does not meet the definition of residential property.

(n) "Person" means an individual, firm, corporation, association, partnership, consortium, joint venture, commercial entity, state agency, unit of local government, school district, federal agency, tribal entity, interstate body, or other legal entity.

(o) "Potable water" has the meaning specified in K.A.R. 28-16-28b.

(continued)

(p) "Remedial action" means those actions taken to address the effects of a release of a contaminant, so that it does not cause a significant risk to present or future public health or welfare, or to the environment.

(q) "Remediation" means the act of implementing, operating, and maintaining a remedial action.

(r) "Residential property" means any property currently used or proposed for use as one of the following:

(1) A residence or dwelling, including a house, apartment, mobile home, nursing home, or condominium; or

(2) a public use area, including a school, educational center, day care center, playground, unrestricted outdoor recreational area, or park.

(s) "Risk management plan" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,176, and amendments thereto.

(t) "Voluntary cleanup and property redevelopment program" and "VCPRP" mean the implementation of the voluntary cleanup and property redevelopment act, as defined in K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq. and amendments thereto, by the department.

(u) "Voluntary party" means an applicant whose property is determined by the secretary to be eligible for the voluntary cleanup and property redevelopment program. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,164, K.S.A. 65-34,165, K.S.A. 65-34,166, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,167, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,168, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,169, and K.S.A. 65-34,172; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-2. Applicant. Each applicant shall include a person that has title, control, or access to the property described in the application and is one of the following:

(a) A person who owns the property;

(b) a person who operates a facility located on the property;

(c) a person who previously owned, operated, or otherwise controlled activities on the property;

(d) a prospective owner of the property;

(e) a prospective operator of a facility located on the property;

(f) a person or generator of hazardous or solid waste who by contract, agreement, or otherwise, directly or indirectly, arranged for the disposal of contaminants at the property;

(g) a person who legally controls the property; or

(h) any unit of government that acquired title or control of the property involuntarily through bankruptcy, tax delinquency, abandonment, or other circumstances. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,164; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-3. Eligibility determination. (a) The property described in the application shall contain an actual, threatened, or suspected release of a contaminant or be impacted or threatened by contaminants from an off-property source.

(b) Properties that may be eligible for application to VCPRP shall include the following:

(1) Properties that have been assessed by the United States environmental protection agency, its contractors and agents, and the department, if the property meets the additional criteria required by K.S.A. 65-34,161 et

seq., and amendments thereto, and this article of the department's regulations;

(2) contaminated properties that are currently under an existing department order or agreement, upon completion of the actions required by the department order or agreement, if the property meets the additional criteria required by K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq., and amendments thereto. The determination of completion of the actions required by the order or agreement shall be made by the secretary;

(3) portions of a larger property that have or require a resource conservation and recovery act (RCRA) permit, but these portions do not require a permit in accordance with RCRA, which contains a corrective action component, as determined by the secretary, if the property meets the additional criteria required by K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq., and amendments thereto;

(4) portions of a larger property that includes oil and gas activities regulated by the state corporation commission, but the specific portion is not regulated by the state corporation commission, if the property meets the additional criteria required by K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq., and amendments thereto; and

(5) contaminated properties that are not statutorily excluded. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,164; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-4. Application process. (a) Each applicant shall submit to the department a complete application consisting of the following:

(1) An application form provided by the department;

(2) a nonrefundable application fee of \$200.00; and

(3) all documentation that supports the application, including environmental site assessments, investigation reports, or both.

(b) Determination of whether the property described in the application is eligible for participation in the VCPRP shall be made by the secretary pursuant to K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq., and amendments thereto.

(c) The applicant shall submit a revised application package if the initial application is determined by the department to be incomplete.

(d) The applicant may submit an additional revised application package if the revised application is determined by the department to be incomplete. The applicant shall submit an additional application fee of \$200 with the additional revised application. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,164 and 65-34,165; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-5. Classification determination. (a) Each applicant shall include the following documentation for consideration by the secretary in determining placement of the property described in the application into one of two contamination classes, as defined in K.A.R. 28-71-1:

(1) The application and associated documentation that supports the voluntary party's application;

(2) review of available technical bulletins and scientific documents describing the geology and geohydrology of the property and surrounding area; and

(3) scientific information relating to the toxicity, mobility, persistence, and other characteristics of the contaminants suspected or identified at a property.

(b) Any applicant may provide additional information to support a reclassification of property subject to the voluntary agreement. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,165 and 65-34,166; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-6. Voluntary agreement. (a) Upon the secretary's approval of the application for the voluntary cleanup and property redevelopment program, the voluntary party shall enter into a voluntary agreement with the secretary. The voluntary agreement shall be developed by the department and submitted to the voluntary party for signature. The voluntary agreement shall specify all of the terms and conditions for implementation of the work anticipated in the VCPRP.

(b) Oversight, management, and review activities pertaining to the property shall not be commenced by the department until the voluntary agreement is signed by both the secretary and the voluntary party.

(c) The voluntary agreement shall require the voluntary party to deposit one of the following with the department, as applicable:

- (1) For class I, an initial amount of \$2,000; or
- (2) for class II, an initial amount not to exceed \$5,000.

(d) The voluntary agreement shall require the voluntary party to provide the department with access to the property at all reasonable times, upon reasonable notice to the voluntary party during all the activities conducted under K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq., and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,165; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-7. Initial deposit and reimbursement. (a) The initial deposit made by the voluntary party shall be based on the contamination classification of the property described in the application. The voluntary party shall submit quarterly payments upon billing for direct and indirect costs to maintain the voluntary party's account at a balance of at least \$1,000 for class I and at least \$2,000 for class II.

(b) The voluntary party shall be subject to oversight performed by the department or its contractors. This oversight shall include the following:

- (1) The review of documents, studies, and test results;
- (2) collection of split samples, laboratory analysis, and sampling supplies;
- (3) travel;
- (4) per diem;
- (5) verification activities; and
- (6) associated indirect costs. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,165; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-8. Environmental site assessments. (a) Each environmental site assessment shall be prepared by an individual who possesses the education, experience, or licensure sufficient to prepare a competent environmental site assessment.

(b) Each environmental site assessment shall include the following information regarding the property either described in the application or subject to a voluntary agreement:

- (1) The legal description and a map identifying the location, boundaries, and size of the property;

- (2) the physical characteristics of the property and areas contiguous to the property, including the location of any surface water bodies and groundwater aquifers;

- (3) the location of any water wells located on the property or in an area within a one-half mile radius of the property and a description of the use of the those wells;

- (4) the operational history of the property, based upon the best efforts of the applicant and the current use of areas in the vicinity of the property;

- (5) the present and proposed uses of the property;

- (6) information concerning the nature and extent of any contamination;

- (7) information on releases of contaminants that have occurred at the property, including any environmental impact on areas in the vicinity of the property;

- (8) any sampling results, evidence, or other data that characterizes the soil, groundwater, or surface water on the property; and

- (9) a description of the human and environmental exposures to contamination at the property, based upon current use and any future use proposed by the property owner as approved by the local zoning authority. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,165 and 65-34,166; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-9. Voluntary cleanup work plans and reports. (a) Upon signature of the voluntary agreement by the voluntary party and the secretary, the voluntary party shall submit each environmental site assessment, investigation report, or both, for review by the department to determine whether the following objectives have been met:

- (1) The sources for contaminants have been adequately identified and investigated.

- (2) The vertical and horizontal extent of contaminants has been determined.

- (3) The human health and environmental receptors have been identified.

- (4) The potential risks and impacts to receptors have been evaluated.

- (5) Quality assurance and quality control have been maintained.

- (6) The work has been performed in accordance with standard industry practices.

(b) If the secretary determines that further investigation is necessary to meet the objectives specified in subsection (a), the voluntary party shall submit a work plan to the department for review and approval. After approval of the work plan by the secretary, the following actions shall occur:

- (1) The voluntary party shall implement the approved work plan for investigation.

- (2) The voluntary party shall document and submit the results of the investigation in a report, which shall be submitted to the department for review.

- (c) If the secretary determines that remediation is necessary to mitigate the risks posed by the property subject to the voluntary agreement, the voluntary party shall submit a proposal for remediation to the department for review and approval. The proposal for remediation shall meet the following requirements:

(continued)

(1) Be protective of human health and the environment for documented present and proposed future land uses;

(2) meet applicable state standards or acceptable contaminant concentrations as determined by a risk analysis that evaluates the property subject to the voluntary agreement and surrounding properties as a whole and that is approved by the secretary;

(3) evaluate remedial alternatives that are proven reliable and are economically and technically feasible by completing the following activities:

(A) Comparing at least two alternatives, not including the “no action” alternative; and

(B) documenting the ability of each remedial alternative to attain a degree of cleanup and control of contaminants established by the department; and

(4) provide a description and evaluation of the voluntary party’s proposed remedial alternative.

(d) If the secretary approves the proposal for remediation, the applicant shall submit a cleanup plan. The cleanup plan shall include the following:

(1) A description of all tasks necessary to implement the preferred remedial alternative;

(2) preliminary or final design plans and specifications of the preferred remedial alternative;

(3) a description of all necessary easements and permits required for implementation of the cleanup;

(4) an implementation schedule;

(5) a plan to monitor the effectiveness of the cleanup during implementation; and

(6) a verification plan to document that cleanup objectives have been achieved, which shall include sampling to be performed by the voluntary party, department, or both, as determined by the secretary. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 65-34,166, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,167, and K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,168; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-10. “No further action” determination.

(a) For the purposes of the regulations in this article of the department’s regulations, the term “no further action” determination shall mean that the secretary has determined, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-34,161 et seq. and amendments thereto, that no further action is necessary at the property subject to the voluntary agreement.

(b) Each voluntary party shall demonstrate to the department that the following conditions have been met to receive a “no further action” determination for class one contamination:

(1) The owner or operator of the property, or both parties, submit a complete application to the department, including environmental site assessments and investigation reports.

(2) A determination that the contamination on the property resulted from an off-property source is made by the secretary.

(3) A determination that there is no on-site source of contamination, including soil contamination, is made by the secretary.

(4) The owner or operator of the property, or both parties, document that the past and current use of the property did not contribute to the contamination of soils, surface water, or groundwater.

(c) Each voluntary party shall demonstrate to the department that the following conditions have been met to receive a “no further action” determination for class two contamination:

(1) No contamination was detected.

(2) Contamination was detected, and following review of the environmental site assessment, investigation reports, and remediation reports, or a combination of these, the secretary has determined that contamination levels do not present significant risk to human health and the environment and, based on those levels, are less than applicable federal or state standards or site-specific cleanup levels as specified in K.A.R. 28-71-11.

(3) Contamination does not exceed acceptable contaminant concentrations as determined by the secretary in a site-specific qualitative risk analysis that evaluates the property and surrounding properties as a whole.

(d) Each voluntary party shall demonstrate to the department that the following conditions have been met to receive a “no further action” determination for class two contamination with conditions:

(1) Site conditions described in paragraph (c)(2) or (c)(3) have been met.

(2) Secretary-approved controls, including institutional controls, environmental use controls, a risk management plan, or a combination of these restricting the use of a property, are in place to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,169; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-11. Remedial standards and remedial actions.

(a) All remedial alternatives performed by the voluntary party and approved by the secretary shall attain a degree of cleanup, control, or both, of contaminants that ensures protection of human health and the environment.

(b) All remedial actions to restore the environment to conditions before its altered state shall be considered by the department if protection of human health and the environment is maintained and the movement of contaminants is controlled.

(c) The voluntary party shall propose any one of the following approaches to determine cleanup levels for the property:

(1) Comparison to background levels;

(2) comparison to department-established risk-based levels;

(3) comparison to a site-specific, risk-based quantitative analysis conducted by the voluntary party or the department, based on formulas, exposure parameters, and land-use scenarios; or

(4) other risk analysis methods approved by the secretary.

(d) Responsibility for reviewing and approving the approach and final selection of cleanup levels for property subject to the voluntary agreement shall rest with the secretary.

(1) The selection of cleanup levels shall be based on the present and proposed future uses of the property and surrounding properties.

(2) Land use shall include two general categories: residential property and nonresidential property.

(3) Multiple media, exposure pathways, and contaminants shall be taken into account during the determination of cleanup levels.

(4) Existing and applicable federal or state standards shall be considered by the department during the determination of cleanup levels.

(e) Secretary-approved controls, including the controls specified in K.A.R. 28-71-10, may be required by the department to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment.

(1) Approved controls for property subject to the voluntary agreement shall not be proposed as a substitute for evaluating remedial actions that would otherwise be technically and economically practicable.

(2) Approved controls for property subject to the voluntary agreement shall be considered as remedial actions.

(f) Soil cleanup levels and the depths to which the cleanup levels shall apply shall be based on human exposure, the present and proposed uses of the property, the depth of the contamination, and the potential impact to groundwater, surface water, or both, and any other risks posed by the soil contamination to human health and the environment.

(g) Soil and groundwater property-specific cleanup levels may be determined by the secretary for contaminants for which there is insufficient toxicological evidence to support a regulatory standard for risk-based cleanup levels or for nontoxic contaminants for which cleanup is required as a result of other undesirable characteristics of those contaminants. The soil levels shall be based on the following:

(1) The ability of the impacted soil to support vegetation representative of unimpacted properties in the vicinity of property subject to the voluntary agreement; and

(2) the potential of the contaminant to impact and degrade groundwater, surface water, or both, through infiltration or runoff.

(h) If there are multiple contaminants in the soil, the cleanup level of each contaminant shall not allow the cumulative risks posed by the contaminants to exceed a cancer risk level of 1×10^{-4} , one in 10,000, or a hazard index value of 1.0.

(i) Soil cleanup levels shall ensure that migration of contaminants in the soil shall not cause the cleanup levels established for groundwater, surface water, or both, to be exceeded.

(j) Groundwater cleanup levels shall be based on the actual and most probable use of the groundwater considering present and future uses. The most probable use of the groundwater is for a potable water source, unless demonstrated otherwise by the voluntary party and approved by the secretary.

(k) Groundwater potentially or actually used as a potable water source and impacted by the site contamination shall require maximum protection in determining cleanup levels.

(l) Remedial action to restore contaminated groundwater shall, at a minimum, prevent additional degradation and migration.

(m) When the need for cleanup of a contaminant can be predicated on characteristics of that contaminant other than toxicity, including the contribution of an undesirable taste or odor, or both, the site-specific cleanup levels

as determined by the department or secondary maximum contaminant levels (MCLs) may be used as cleanup levels for contaminants for which insufficient toxicological evidence has been gathered to support a regulatory standard for risk-based cleanup levels or nontoxic contaminants. These levels shall be based on the aesthetic quality and usability of the groundwater, surface water, or both, for the present and proposed future use.

(n) Surface water cleanup levels shall meet the Kansas surface water quality standards, as specified in K.A.R. 28-16-28e. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,167 and K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,168; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

28-71-12. Public notification and participation. (a) The public shall have the opportunity during the public comment period to submit to the department written comments regarding the cleanup plan.

(b) The voluntary party or a member of the public may request a meeting following the 15-day public comment period.

(1) The public information meeting shall provide the public with information about relevant activities at the property associated with the voluntary cleanup and property redevelopment program. Public information meetings shall be attended by a member of the department and the voluntary party or designated representative, or both.

(2) A notice to the city, the county, or both, of the public information meeting shall be provided by the department. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-34,168; effective June 26, 1998; amended Sept. 29, 2017.)

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

111-4-3499. Kansas State Fair second-chance drawing. (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a second-chance drawing in conjunction with the Kansas State Fair event giving away four (4) \$500 Bass Pro Shops gift cards. The drawing will be conducted at 10:00 a.m. on September 19, 2017, and the winners will be announced at 10:00 a.m. on September 22, 2017.

(b) To enter the drawing, a player shall purchase \$20 of any Kansas lottery ticket(s) in a single purchase at the Kansas lottery's selling location at the Kansas State Fair. A player may purchase lottery products during the hours the Kansas lottery selling location at the Kansas State Fair is open each day to the public beginning September 8, 2017, through September 17, 2017. For each qualifying purchase, the player will be given an official entry form by the representative selling the ticket(s). A player shall complete the entry form in a legible manner and deposit

(continued)

the entry form into a receptacle designated for the purpose of this drawing no later than 2:00 p.m. on September 17, 2017. Only one name shall appear on an eligible entry.

(c) After the close of entries on September 17, 2017, the entry forms shall be transported by Kansas lottery security officials, or a security designee, in a sealed container from the selling location at the Kansas State Fair to Kansas lottery headquarters and secured until the drawing occurs.

(d) At the designated time and date, the drawing shall be conducted by a drawing official designated by the executive director of the Kansas lottery in accordance with the Kansas lottery's established drawing procedures.

Four entries shall be drawn. The person whose name appears on each valid entry drawn shall be the winner of a prize described in these rules. After four entries have been drawn and verified as valid, five more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, which entries drawn will serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in the order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A.

Winners shall be contacted by phone and/or in person and also in writing as soon as possible following the drawing. Each winner shall be informed that he or she has been selected as a winner and shall be mailed a claim form.

Each winner shall then have until 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the mailing of a claim form to the winner to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the fourteenth day following the mailing of a claim form to the winner falls on a weekend or holiday, the fourteenth day shall be extended to the next business day. If the prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the prize will be awarded to the next alternate ticket selected in the order drawn. An alternate winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following mailing of a claim form to an alternate winner to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the fourteenth day following the mailing of a claim form to an alternate winner falls on a weekend or holiday, the fourteenth day shall be extended to the next business day. If an alternate prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the prize will be awarded to the next alternate ticket selected in the order drawn. The alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(e) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time.

(f) Eligible entrants in the "Kansas State Fair Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(g) Completing the information on the entry form and entering the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the persons whose entries are drawn.

(h) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for any lost, destroyed, mutilated, illegible, or altered entries into the "Kansas State Fair Drawing."

(i) Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-3499, K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.*, and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-8-28-17, July 12, 2017.)

Article 15.—RAFFLE GAMES

111-15-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations.

The Kansas lottery may conduct a lotto game entitled "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" beginning at 5:00 a.m. September 8, 2017, for a drawing to be conducted on January 3, 2018.

The rules and regulations for the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-1 through 111-15-11 and K.A.R. 111-15-21, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012; amended, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013; amended, T-111-9-4-14, Aug. 13, 2014; amended T-111-9-14-15, Aug. 12, 2015; amended, T-111-9-9-16, Aug. 10, 2016; amended, T-111-8-28-17, July 12, 2017.)

111-15-2. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game:

(a) "Available ticket(s)" or "ticket(s) available for sale" means one or any number of tickets from one through 200,000 that is available to sell during the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game.

(b) "Check-A-Ticket Machine" means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.

(c) "Computer pick" or "quick pick" means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

(d) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(e) "Electronic drawing machine" or "random number generator" means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.

(f) "Final Drawing" means the last and final drawing in the series of "Holiday Millionaire Raffle Drawings" which shall be conducted on January 3, 2018, selecting the grand prize winner along with secondary prize winners identified in these rules.

(g) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.

(h) "Holiday Bonus Drawings" means a series of drawings for prizes to be held on October 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29; and November 5, 12, 19, and 26; and December 3, 10, and 17, 2017, before the final raffle drawing on January 3, 2018.

(i) "Online lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(j) "Order drawn" means the sequential order in which a "WINNING" ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.

(k) "Pari-mutuel prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game.

(l) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(m) "Serial number" means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.

(n) "Set Prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, and which will be equal to the prize amount established by these rules for the prize level.

(o) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an online, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(p) "Ticket Number" means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.

(q) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(r) "Winning number" or "winning numbers" means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.

(s) "Winning ticket" or "winning tickets" means a raffle ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the raffle, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012; amended, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013; amended, T-111-9-4-14, Aug. 13, 2014; amended, T-111-9-14-15, Aug. 12, 2015; amended, T-111-9-9-16, Aug. 10, 2016; amended, T-111-8-28-17, July 12, 2017.)

111-15-3. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" is a raffle drawing which offers a total of 200,000 online tickets available for sale. Each ticket shall bear a "TICKET NUMBER" on the face of the ticket. The Kansas lottery will conduct 12 "Holiday Bonus Drawings" according to the following schedule, unless otherwise determined by the executive director:

For each Holiday Bonus drawing, one ticket number will be drawn to determine the winner of a Holiday Bonus drawing prize. In each Holiday Bonus drawing, numbers 1 through 12, the holder of a winning ticket will receive a \$10,000 cash prize. A ticket must be purchased before 6:59 p.m. the day of the Holiday Bonus drawing to be eligible for that drawing. The next three "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the fourth (4th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the sixth (6th) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the third prize winners. The next five "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the seventh (7th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the eleventh (11th) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the fourth prize winners, and the next 15 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the twelfth (12th) "WINNING NUMBER," through the twenty-sixth (26th) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the fifth prize winners. The next 35 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of twenty-seventh (27st) "WINNING NUMBER" through the sixty-first (61st) "WINNING NUMBER" shall be the sixth prize winners. The next 1,700 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of sixty-second (62nd) "WINNING NUMBER" through the one thousand seven hundred sixty-first (1,761st) "WINNING NUMBER" shall be the seventh prize winners. The next 2,500 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of one thousand seven hundred sixty-second (1,762nd)

"WINNING NUMBER" through the four thousand two hundred sixty-first (4,261st) "WINNING NUMBER" shall be the eighth prize winners. If 190,000 of the 200,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid as a cash lump sum payment. If less than 190,000 tickets available for sale are sold, all prizes may be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. To play the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle," a player shall purchase a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket which bears a ticket number on the face of the ticket.

(b) A "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket shall sell for \$20 (twenty) dollars).

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer.

(e) All tickets sold by a retailer shall be a "computer pick" or "quick pick" ticket.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the original winning ticket to and receipt of said ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent.

(g) The only guaranteed methods of win checking a ticket to determine whether the ticket bears a winning number shall be through the Kansas lottery check-a-ticket machines, or submission of a ticket to the Kansas lottery or an authorized retail agent.

(h) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error. Exchange tickets may be printed by the lottery for Holiday Bonus drawing winners at the discretion of the executive director.

(i) There shall be a total of 200,000 available tickets for sale.

(j) Ticket sales will begin at 5:00 a.m. central time on September 8, 2017.

(k) Ticket sales will end at 2:00 a.m. central time on January 3, 2018, or whenever all 200,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, whichever comes first.

(l) The game will officially close at 4:30 a.m. on January 3, 2018.

(m) The drawing shall be conducted by January 3, 2018, before noon central time, at a secure location as determined by the executive director, after the game is closed and the drawing official has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(n) Each player shall have the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the ticket. The purchase of a ticket is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(o) For any reason or under any circumstance, the liability of the Kansas lottery or its agents shall be strictly limited to a refund of the amount of the ticket purchase price.

111-19-4. Kansas Speedway drawings. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct two drawings entitled “Kansas Speedway Drawings.” The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the first drawing beginning at 5:00 a.m., January 25, 2017, through noon on March 21, 2017, and announce the winners on March 24, 2017. Entries submitted between 12:01 a.m. on January 25, 2017, and the effective date of the regulation are deemed valid, provided the entry complies with all other statutory and regulatory requirements. The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the second drawing beginning at 12:01 p.m., March 21, 2017, through noon on August 29, 2017, and announce the winners on September 1, 2017.

(b) Only registered PlayOn members may enter the “Kansas Speedway Drawings.” PlayOn members must enter themselves into the drawings according to the terms and conditions of PlayOn. Entries shall not be accepted which are submitted by any method other than through PlayOn.

(c) A total of 580 player loyalty club points is required for a PlayOn member to enter a single drawing described in this regulation one time.

(d) There is no limit to the number of entries a member may make in any single drawing.

Each VIP racing weekend prize package shall consist of two tickets at Kansas Speedway for the ARCA Series race on October 20, 2017; NASCAR Xfinity Series Kansas Lottery 300 race on October 21, 2017; and Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup Hollywood Casino 400 race on October 22, 2017; one double occupancy hotel room for the evenings of October 19, 20, and 21, 2017; transportation between the hotel and Kansas Speedway; food and other amenities at the Kansas lottery winner’s suite at Kansas Speedway; \$400 cash; and state and federal mandatory income withholding taxes. Each VIP racing weekend prize package is valued at approximately \$4,800.

(g) The first drawing shall select 100 entrants. The first 30 entrants drawn in the first drawing shall be awarded prizes identified in subsection (e). The next 70 entrants drawn in this drawing (identified as numbers 31 through 100) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn. The second drawing shall select 35 entrants. The first 30 entrants drawn in the second drawing shall be awarded prizes identified in subsection (f). The next five entrants drawn in this drawing (identified as numbers 31 through 35) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(h) A player may enter the drawing(s) an unlimited number of times, but may win only one prize package in this promotion. Entries into the first drawing will be eligible to win a prize in the second drawing provided the entry was not selected as the winner of a prize package in the first drawing. 111-401-63. Wagers and payout odds. (a) Minimum and maximum wagers will be posted on a sign at each table.

(b) Maximum table payouts, if any, will be posted at each table and will not be less than the maximum bet times the maximum odds.

(c) If a player has been permitted to wager less than the table minimum, the dealer will take or pay the amount actually wagered. If a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the excess will be returned to the player and paid the correct odds on the correct wager. The player will be informed of the table minimum and maximum for subsequent wagers.

(d) The following describes a list of the permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win, loss, or tie:

(1) Ante:

(A) An ante wager is placed by a player prior to receiving his or her initial two cards in area designated for the ante.

(B) Winning ante wagers will be paid as follows:

(i) Royal flush, 500 to 1;

(ii) Straight flush, 100 to 1;

(iii) Four-of-a-kind, 40 to 1;

(iv) Full house, 10 to 1;

(v) Flush, 6 to 1;

(vi) Straight, 4 to 1;

(vii) Three-of-a-kind, 3 to 1;

(viii) Two pair, 2 to 1;

(ix) Pair of jacks or higher ranking hand, 1 to 1.

(C) The ante wager will win if the player's five card hand contains a pair of jacks or higher ranking hand.

(D) The ante wager will lose if the player forfeits or the player's five card hand contains a pair of 5s or lower ranking hand.

(E) The ante wager will push (tie) if the player's five card hand contains a pair of 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s, or 10s.

(F) An additional ante wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(2) Third street:

(A) A third street wager is placed by a player after receiving his or her initial two cards in the area designated

for the third street wager. The third street wager must be in an amount equal to one time, two times, or three times the ante wager.

(B) Winning third street wagers will be paid as follows:

- (i) Royal flush, 500 to 1;
- (ii) Straight flush, 100 to 1;
- (iii) Four-of-a-kind, 40 to 1;
- (iv) Full house, 10 to 1;
- (v) Flush, 6 to 1;
- (vi) Straight, 4 to 1;
- (vii) Three-of-a-kind, 3 to 1;
- (viii) Two pair, 2 to 1;
- (ix) Pair of jacks or higher ranking hand, 1 to 1.

(C) The third street wager will win if the player's five card hand contains a pair of jacks or higher ranking hand.

(D) The third street wager will lose if the player forfeits, or the player's five card hand contains a pair of 5s or lower ranking hand.

(E) The third street wager will push (tie) if the player's five card hand contains a pair of 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s, or 10s.

(F) An additional third street wager may be made as a tip for the dealer if the dealer has an ante wager.

(3) Fourth street:

(A) A fourth street wager is placed by a player after receiving his or her initial two cards and after the third street has been exposed in an area designated for the fourth street wager. The fourth street wager must be in an amount equal to one time, two times, or three times the ante wager.

(B) Winning fourth street wagers will be paid as follows:

- (i) Royal flush, 500 to 1;
- (ii) Straight flush, 100 to 1;
- (iii) Four-of-a-kind, 40 to 1;
- (iv) Full house, 10 to 1;
- (v) Flush, 6 to 1;
- (vi) Straight, 4 to 1;
- (vii) Three-of-a-kind, 3 to 1;
- (viii) Two pair, 2 to 1;
- (ix) Pair of jacks or higher ranking hand, 1 to 1.

(C) The fourth street wager will win if the player's five card hand contains a pair of jacks or higher ranking hand.

(D) The fourth street wager will lose if the player forfeits, or the player's five card hand contains a pair of 5s or lower ranking hand.

(E) The fourth street wager will push (tie) if the player's five card hand contains a pair of 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s, or 10s.

(F) An additional fourth street wager may be made as a tip for the dealer if the dealer has an ante wager.

(4) Fifth street:

(A) A fifth street wager is placed by a player after receiving his or her initial two cards and after the third and fourth street cards have been exposed in an area designated for the fifth street wager. The fifth street wager must be in an amount equal to one time, two times, or three times the ante wager.

(B) Winning fifth street wagers will be paid as follows:

- (i) Royal flush, 500 to 1;
- (ii) Straight flush, 100 to 1;
- (iii) Four-of-a-kind, 40 to 1;
- (iv) Full house, 10 to 1;
- (v) Flush, 6 to 1;

(vi) Straight, 4 to 1;

(vii) Three-of-a-kind, 3 to 1;

(viii) Two pair, 2 to 1;

(ix) Pair of jacks or higher ranking hand, 1 to 1.

(C) The fifth street wager will win if the player's five card hand contains a pair of jacks or higher ranking hand.

(D) The fifth street wager will lose if the player forfeits, or the player's five card hand contains a pair of 5s or lower ranking hand.

(E) The fifth street wager will push (tie) if the player's five card hand contains a pair of 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s or 10s.

(F) An additional fifth street wager may be made as a tip for the dealer if the dealer has an ante wager.

(5) Progressive:

(A) Players may participate in the optional progressive jackpot by placing a \$1 chip in the designated area. The player must have an ante wager to make a progressive bet.

(B) The progressive jackpot will be comprised of a base amount of \$10,000.

(C) The amount of the progressive jackpot will be displayed in a manner visible to patrons.

(D) Winning progressive bets will be paid at the rate of:

(i) If the player's hand consists of a three of a kind, 9 for 1.

(ii) If the player's hand consists of a straight, 30 for 1.

(iii) If the player's hand consists of a flush, 40 for 1.

(iv) If the player's hand consists of a full house, 50 for 1.

(v) If the player's hand consists of four-of-a-kind, 300 for 1.

(vi) If the player's hand consists of a straight flush, 10 percent of the progressive jackpot.

(vii) If the player's hand consists of a royal flush, 100% of the progressive jackpot.

(E) A progressive bet will win if the player's hand consists of a three-of-a-kind, straight, flush, full house, four-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a royal flush.

(6) Winning progressive bets will be paid in the following manner:

(A) If the winning hand consists of a three-of-a-kind, straight, flush, or a full house, or four-of-a-kind, the dealer will make the appropriate payout.

(B) If the winning hand consists of straight flush, or a royal flush, the table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official will verify the winning hand and will verify the progressive bet was made. The table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official will notify the table games pit manager or higher ranking casino official. Surveillance will also be notified to verify the winning hand.

(i) The dealer will verify the deck of cards by counting down and sorting the remaining cards by suit.

(ii) Once the jackpot has been deducted from the progressive jackpot for the straight flush or royal flush, new cards will be placed on the table and play will resume.

(iii) In the case of a royal flush, the meter will reset to an amount equal to the sum of \$10,000.

(iv) In the event of multiple winning progressive hands consisting of Straight Flush or Royal Flush, the jackpot will be determined by whoever received their hand first according to the time on surveillance video at the lottery gaming facility.

(C) A progressive bet will lose if the player's hand consists of any combination of cards other than a three-of-a-

kind, straight, flush, full house, four-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a royal flush.

(7) Envy bonus:

(A) Players who wager \$1 on the progressive bet qualify for the envy bonus.

(i) Only the seated player for a position qualifies for the envy bonus.

(ii) If two players have an envy bonus jackpot, the players are paid on both hands.

(iii) The position which contains the qualifying envy bonus hand (royal flush or straight flush) cannot win the envy bonus.

(B) The envy bonus payouts are as follows:

(i) Royal flush, \$1,000;

(ii) Straight flush, \$300.

(8) Three card bonus side wager:

(A) Players who have placed an ante wager may also participate in the optional three card bonus by placing a wager in the designated area. The three card bonus wager is a side wager based on the community cards. The dealer's cards have no bearing on the three card bonus wager's outcome. The three card bonus wager will remain an active wager and be resolved even if the player otherwise forfeits the hand.

(B) The three card bonus wager will win if the community cards contain a pair or higher ranking hand and will lose if the community cards do not contain a pair or higher ranking hand.

(C) Winning three card bonus wagers will be paid as follows:

(i) Straight flush (three consecutively ranked cards of the same suit), 40 to 1;

(ii) Three of a kind, 30 to 1;

(iii) Straight (three consecutively ranked cards of any suit), 6 to 1;

(iv) Flush (three cards of the same suit), 3 to 1; and,

(v) Pair, 1 to 1.

(D) An additional three card bonus wager may be made as a tip for the dealer. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-5-31-13, May 15, 2013; amended, T-111-8-28-17, July 12, 2017.)

111-401-208. Card and hand rankings. (a) The rank of the cards used in "High Card Flush," in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be: ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. All suits shall be considered equal in rank. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an ace may also be used to complete a "straight flush" in combination with a 2 card and 3 card. The only permissible hands in the game of High Card Flush are certain straight flushes and flushes.

(b) The permissible straight flushes in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be as follows:

(1) "Seven card straight flush" is a hand consisting of seven cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, and 8 being the highest ranking seven card straight flush and 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking seven card straight flush.

(2) "Six card straight flush" is a hand consisting of six cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack, 10 and 9 being the highest ranking six

card straight flush and 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking six card straight flush.

(3) "Five card straight flush" is a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack and 10 being the highest ranking five card straight flush and 5, 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking five card straight flush.

(4) "Four card straight flush" is a hand consisting of four cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen and jack being the highest ranking four card straight flush and 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking four card straight flush.

(5) "Three card straight flush" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with ace, king and queen being the highest ranking three card straight flush and 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking three card straight flush.

(c) The permissible flushes in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be as follows:

(1) "Seven card flush" is a hand consisting of seven cards of the same suit not in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, and 7 being the highest ranking seven card flush and 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking seven card flush.

(2) "Six card flush" is a hand consisting of six cards of the same suit not in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack, 10 and 8 being the highest ranking six card flush and 7, 5, 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking six card flush.

(3) "Five card flush" is a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit not in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack and 9 being the highest ranking five card flush and 6, 4, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking five card flush.

(4) "Four card flush" is a hand consisting of four cards of the same suit not in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen and 10 being the highest ranking four card flush and 5, 3, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking four card flush.

(5) "Three card flush" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same suit not in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, and jack being the highest ranking three card flush and 4, 2 and ace being the lowest ranking three card flush.

(6) "Two card flush" is a hand consisting of two cards of the same suit not in consecutive ranking, with ace and queen being the highest ranking two card flush and 3 and ace being the lowest ranking two card flush.

(d) When comparing two hands that are of identical rank, the hand that contains the highest ranking card that is not contained in the other hand shall be considered the higher ranking hand. If the hands are of identical rank after the application of this comparison, the hands shall be considered a tie or draw and any ante wager and raise wager are returned to the player. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-24-17, April 12, 2017; amended, T-111-8-28-17, July 12, 2017.)

111-401-209. Wagers. (a) The following wagers may be placed in the game of High Card Flush:

(1) In order to participate in a round of play, before any cards are dealt a player must place an ante wager that is

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in any amount within the minimum and maximum wagers posted at the table.

(2) After examination of his or her cards, each player who has placed an ante wager shall have the option to either forfeit the ante wager and end his or her participation against the dealer's hand or compete against the dealer. If a player chooses to compete against the dealer, the player must place one of the following raise wagers:

(A) if the player's hand contains fewer than five (5) cards of the same suit, the raise wager must be in the same amount as the player's ante wager;

(B) if the player's hand contains five (5) or more cards of the same suit, the raise wager may be in any amount up to two times the player's ante wager; or,

(C) if the player's hand contains six (6) or seven (7) cards of the same suit, the raise wager may be in any amount up to three times the player's ante wager.

(3) A player placing an ante wager may also compete against a payable by placing a flush bonus wager and/or straight flush bonus wager in any amount within the minimum and maximum wagers posted at the table; or,

(4) A player may compete against both the dealer and the payable by placing wagers in accordance with the requirements of (a)(1), (a)(2) and (a)(3) above.

(b) All wagers at High Card Flush shall be made by placing gaming chips or authorized coupons on the appropriate betting areas of the game table layout.

(c) Only players who have placed wagers at a gaming position at a High Card Flush game table are eligible to receive cards.

(d) All ante wagers, flush bonus wagers and straight flush bonus wagers shall be placed prior to dealing any cards. No wager shall be made, increased, or withdrawn after the first card has been dealt in that round of play.

(e) An additional wager may be made as a tip for the dealer on the ante wager, raise wager, flush bonus wager, and the straight flush bonus wager. In order to place a raise wager for the dealer, the player must have previously placed an ante wager as a tip for the dealer. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-24-17, April 12, 2017; amended, T-111-8-28-17, July 12, 2017.)

111-401-210. Play. (a) The game of High Card Flush is played with a standard 52-card deck of playing cards.

(b) All ante wagers, flush bonus wagers and straight flush bonus wagers shall be placed prior to the first card being dealt in a round of play.

(c) A shuffling machine may be used in the game of High Card Flush. When a shuffling machine is used, the machine will deal seven (7) cards at a time. Beginning with the first player to the left of the dealer who has placed an ante wager and continuing clockwise in order around the table, the dealer shall deal each player who has placed an ante wager and the dealer a stack of seven (7) cards. In the event a shuffling machine is not used and the dealer manually shuffles the cards, beginning with the first player to the left of the dealer who has placed an ante wager and continuing clockwise in order around the table, the dealer shall deal each player who has placed an ante wager and the dealer seven (7) cards one card at a time face down.

(d) After all cards have been dealt, each player may examine his or her cards. Each player who places a wager shall be responsible for his or her own hand and no person other than the dealer and the player to whom the cards were dealt may touch the cards of that player.

(e) After examination of his or her cards, each player who has placed an ante wager shall have the option to either forfeit the ante wager and end his or her participation against the dealer's hand or make a raise wager. A raise wager must be equal to the amount of the player's ante wager unless the player's hand consists of five (5) or more cards of the same suit. If the player's hand consists of five (5) or more cards of the same suit, the player may make a raise wager up to two (2) times the amount of the player's ante wager. If the player's hand consists of six (6) or seven (7) cards of the same suit, the player may make a raise wager up to three (3) times the amount of the player's ante wager. If a player has placed an ante wager along with a flush bonus wager and/or straight flush bonus wager but does not make a raise wager, the player shall forfeit the ante wager.

(f) After each player has either placed a raise wager on the designated area of the table or forfeited his or her wager and hand, the dealer shall collect all forfeited wagers and associated cards, placing them in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine. The dealer shall then reveal the dealer's cards and place the cards so as to form the highest possible ranking hand available for the dealer's cards.

(g) The dealer shall then settle the wagers remaining on the table by performing the procedure in subsection "h" below. All cards collected during the procedure shall be placed in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine.

(h) Starting with the player farthest to the dealer's right and continuing counterclockwise around the table the dealer shall:

(1) Determine the highest ranking hand of each remaining player;

(2) Collect all losing wagers;

(3) Pay each winning wager in accordance with the payout odds listed below; and,

(4) Collect all player cards and place them in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine.

(i) All cards collected by the dealer shall be picked up in order and placed in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine in such a way that they can be readily arranged to reconstruct each hand in the event of a question or dispute.

(j) There are three winning payout types, as follows:

(1) A player in competition against the dealer shall be paid at odds of one to one on both the ante wager and the raise wager if the player's hand is ranked higher than the dealer's hand, except that to win both wagers the dealer's hand must contain at least a three card flush containing a 9 or higher ranking card and the player's hand must be ranked higher than the dealer's hand. If the dealer does not hold a hand with at least a three card flush containing a 9 or higher ranking card, the player's ante wager shall automatically be paid at odds of one to one and the player's raise wager shall be returned to the player as a draw (tie).

(2) A player placing a flush bonus wager shall be paid at the following odds:

Four card flush	1 to 1
Five card flush	10 to 1
Six card flush	100 to 1
Seven card flush	300 to 1

(3) A player placing a straight flush bonus wager shall be paid at the following odds:

Three card straight flush	7 to 1
Four card straight flush	60 to 1

Five card straight flush	100 to 1
Six card straight flush	1000 to 1
Seven card straight flush	8000 to 1
