Notice Concerning Proposed Kansas Air Quality Construction Permit Modification

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. MGPI Processing, Inc. has applied for a modification of an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300. Emissions of Volatile Organic

Compounds (VOC) and Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

MGPI Processing, Inc., 1300 Main St., Atchison, KS 66002, owns and operates a facility that produces alcohol, gluten, and starch from various raw materials such as a milo, corn, and wheat flour located at 1300 Main St., Atchison, Atchison County, KS 66002, at which the proposed replacement of a distiller’s dried grains with solubles dryer system is to be installed.

The proposed action is to reissue a modified State/NPDES permit for an existing facility. The existing facility is a mechanical Sequencing Batch Reactor (SBR) treatment plant consisting of two mechanical screen units, emergency bar screen, Eutek grit removal system, three-unit sequencing batch reactors, SBR effluent equalization basin, three multi-unit UV disinfection, one primary and two secondary aerobic sludge digesters, belt filter press, plant reuse water system, covered sludge storage, and cascade reaeration. Executive Order No. 21-23
Rescinding Certain Executive Orders
Relating to the COVID-19 Pandemic

WHEREAS, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of residents of the State of Kansas is this Administration's top priority;

WHEREAS, a State of Disaster Emergency was proclaimed for the State of Kansas on March 12, 2020, and such emergency was extended to May 28, 2021, through various legislative mechanisms and by Senate Bill 40 enacted during the 2021 Legislative Session;

WHEREAS, as of this date, there have been 316,014 positive cases of COVID-19 in Kansas, spread among all 105 counties and 5,125 deaths as a result of the illness, though rates of positive cases, hospitalizations, and deaths have fallen dramatically from the peaks reached during the winter of 2020-2021;

WHEREAS, since declaring a state of disaster emergency in March 2020, my administration has used every means at its disposal to keep Kansans safe, including preventing unnecessary spread of COVID-19 by making it easier to interact with government agencies online or to postpone the payment of certain fees or to extend certain deadlines;

WHEREAS, many of these measures have been accomplished through emergency executive orders, and as the conditions of the pandemic or relevant law have evolved I have rescinded certain executive orders that have become no longer needed for our emergency response efforts; and

WHEREAS, certain emergency executive orders still in effect—addressing issues from tax withholding and driver's license renewals to unemployment benefits and tuberculin testing—are no longer essential to the emergency response to the pandemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including the authority granted me by K.S.A. 48-924 and K.S.A. 48-925(b), (c)(1), and (c)(11), I hereby rescind the following orders effective as of 11:59 p.m. on the dates noted below:

1. Executive Order 21-10 regarding remote notaries and witnesses is hereby rescinded effective July 15, 2021.
2. Executive Order 21-12 regarding licensure, certification, and registration for persons and Licensure of "Adult Care Homes" during state of disaster emergency is hereby rescinded effective June 15, 2021.
3. Executive Order 21-16 regarding provisions related to drivers' license and identification cards during the state of disaster emergency is hereby rescinded effective June 30, 2021.
4. Executive Order 21-17 waiving the waiting week requirement for unemployment insurance benefits is hereby rescinded effective June 15, 2021.
5. Executive Order 21-18 regarding temporary provisions for employer payment of income tax withholding for work performed in another state is hereby rescinded effective June 15, 2021.
6. Executive Order 21-19 regarding temporary relief from certain tuberculin testing requirements is hereby rescinded effective June 15, 2021.
7. Executive Order 21-20 regarding extending time for Kansas rural water districts to hold annual meetings during the COVID-19 pandemic is hereby rescinded effective June 30, 2021.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order 21-23. It shall become effective immediately.

The amendment to this regulation which is proposed on a permanent basis, seeks to update the language contained in the regulation, including previous publishing errors and grammatical issues. While employees and officials are expected to exercise care in incurring expenses and the State of Kansas supports the position of least costly, the amendment of K.A.R. 1-18-1a allows all relevant factors such as the urgency of the travel, nature of travel, type of vehicle required for the number of passengers, tool or

equipment load, employee time and effort, proximity to rental or state vehicles as relevant variables that are to be considered, in addition to cost. Further, language is introduced which gives the agency designee authority to approve K.A.R. 1-18-1a travel reimbursement provisions when deemed appropriate and in the best interest of the State.

K.A.R. 1-18-2 addresses the applicability of K.A.R. 1-18-1, however that regulation was revoked in 1979 and the statute referenced, K.S.A. 1973 Supp. 75-4606, was repealed in 1988. The Secretary of Administration proposes to revoke K.A.R. 1-18-2.

Article 28a.—PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

100-28a-5. Continuing education. (a) Each physician assistant shall submit with the renewal application one of the following:

(1) Evidence of satisfactory completion of at least 50 continuing education credit hours during the preceding year. At least 20 continuing education credit hours shall be acquired from category I and at least one continuing education credit hour shall be acquired from category III, if 50 continuing education credit hours are submitted with the renewal application;

(2) evidence of satisfactory completion of at least 100 continuing education credit hours during the preceding two-year period. At least 40 continuing education credit hours shall be acquired from category I and at least two

continuing education credit hours shall be acquired from category III, if 100 continuing education credit hours are submitted with the renewal application; or

(3) evidence verifying satisfactory completion of continuing education credit hours equivalent, in number and category, to those hours required by paragraph (a) (1) or (2), issued by a national, state, or local organization with continuing education standards that are at least as stringent as the board's standards.

(b) A continuing education credit hour shall be 50 minutes of instruction or its equivalent. Meals and exhibit breaks shall not be included in the calculation of continuing education credit hours.

(c) Any applicant that does not meet the requirements for license renewal in subsection (a) may request an extension from the board. The request shall include a plan for completion of the continuing education requirements within the requested extension period. An extension of up to six months may be granted by the board if documented circumstances make it impossible or extremely difficult for the individual to reasonably obtain the required continuing education hours.

(d) Each physician assistant initially licensed within one year of a renewal registration date shall be exempt from the continuing education required by subsection (a) for that first renewal period.

(e) The categories of continuing education credit shall be the following:

(1) Category I: attendance at an educational presentation that is approved by the board;

(2) category II: participating in or attending an educational activity that is approved by the board. Category II continuing education may include self-study or group activities; and

(3) category III: participating in or attending an internet or live educational activity that meets the requirements of either a category I or a category II continuing education activity and meets at least one of the following content requirements:

(A) Acute or chronic pain management;

(B) the appropriate prescribing of opioids; or

(C) the use of prescription drug monitoring programs.

(f) Evidence of satisfactory completion of continuing education shall be submitted to the board as follows:

(1) Documented evidence of attendance at or participation in category I, II, and III activities; or

(2) verification, on a form provided by the board, of self-study from reading professional literature or other self-study activities. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-28a03; im-

plementing K.S.A. 65-28a04; effective, T-100-2-13-01, Feb. 13, 2001; effective June 1, 2001; amended March 30, 2012; amended July 9, 2021.)

100-28a-16. Reinstatement; lapsed and revoked licenses. (a) Each applicant who has not been in active practice as a physician assistant in another state or jurisdiction and who wants to reinstate a license that has been lapsed for failure to renew shall submit proof of continuing medical education as follows:

(1) If the time since the license lapsed has been one year or less, no continuing medical education shall be required in addition to that which would have been necessary had the license been renewed before expiration.

(2) If the time since the license lapsed has been more than one year but less than five years, the applicant shall provide one of the following:

(A) Evidence of completion of at least 50 hours of continuing education credit, including at least one hour from category III, within 12 months before the date the application for reinstatement was submitted; or

(B) proof that the applicant has passed an examination approved by the board within 12 months before the date the application for reinstatement was submitted, or has successfully completed a continuing education program or other individual program approved by the board.

(3) If the time since the license lapsed has been five years or more, the applicant shall provide proof of passage of an examination approved by the board within 12 months before the date the application for reinstatement was submitted, or proof of successful completion of a continuing education program or other individual program approved by the board.

(b) Each applicant who has been in active practice as a physician assistant in another state or jurisdiction that requires a license, registration, or certification to practice and who wants to reinstate a license that has been lapsed for failure to renew shall submit proof of the current license, registration, or certification and proof of compliance with the continuing medical education requirements of that state or jurisdiction.

(c) Each applicant seeking reinstatement of a revoked license shall be required to successfully complete an individual program approved by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-2865 and 65-28a03; implementing K.S.A. 65-2844 and 65-28a03; effective, T-100-2-13-01, Feb. 13, 2001; effective June 1, 2001; amended July 9, 2021.)
