Request for Comments

The State of Kansas will submit by December 31, 2024, the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Annual Report (ACF-204) and Caseload Reduction Report (ACF-202). Federal TANF regulations require states to submit an annual report containing information on TANF and State Maintenance of Effort programs. Submission of Form ACF-204 satisfies this requirement. Federal regulations also require a reduction in a state's required work participation rate for a fiscal year by the state's caseload reduction credit for that fiscal year. The caseload reduction credit gives a state credit for reducing its caseload between a base year and a comparison year. States submit data for the calculation of their caseload reduction credit by completing Form ACF-202.

The purpose of the TANF program is to assist low-income families with children in identifying and addressing barriers to becoming self-sufficient. TANF-funded programs are intended to prepare adults served to obtain and maintain employment necessary to support their families. The program also coordinates supportive services intended to increase opportunities for families to thrive.

The Kansas Department for Children and Families (DCF) is preparing Form ACF-204 and Form ACF-202. In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57a through 63, 28-18-1 through 17, 28-18a-1 through 31 and 33, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, various draft water pollution control documents (permits, notices to revoke and reissue, notices to terminate) have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The proposed actions concerning the draft documents are based on staff review, applying the appropriate standards, regulations, and effluent limitations of the state of Kansas and the Environmental Protection Agency.
