The Patrol's Central Communications Center is based in Salina, Kansas, and provides dispatching services for troopers statewide. Central Communications via Communication Specialists support field personnel 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by broadcasting information on the Highway Patrol's radio communication system. Communication Specialists also coordinate emergency medical relays across the state using aircraft and ground units, and monitor alarms and warning systems, such as those issued by the National Weather Service and local emergency managers. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has drafted a water quality certification per Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) requested by Brian Lang PE, for Doyle Creek Watershed Joint District #86 for a Section 404 of the CWA #NWK-2008-01774 see: https://www.nwk.usace.army.mil/Media/Public-Notices/. The project is a floodwater retarding structure to be built across an unnamed tributary to Doyle Creek. The embankment will be 27 feet tall and approximately 1360 feet long. It will be constructed of compacted earthfill materials from the required excavation of the auxiliary spillway and from excavation in the sediment pool upstream of the embankment. The principal spillway will consist of a 24-inch reinforced concrete pipe with a 42-inch concrete pipe riser and other appurtenances. The principal spillway will outlet into a riprap lined stilling basin before entering the natural channel approximately 150 feet downstream of the centerline of the embankment.

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. BCE-Mach III LLC – Achenbach 14/11-35-12 1H has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300. Emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOC), particulate matter (PM), particulate matter with less than or equal to 10 microns in aerodynamic diameter (PM₁₀), particulate matter with less than or equal to 2.5 microns in aerodynamic diameter (PM_{2.5}), carbon monoxide (CO), oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), oxides of sulfur (SO_x), and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.
