This study/plan will complete the needed transportation and land use planning for an approximately 15 mi.2 near the BNSF Intermodal Facility. Key components of the study/plan are: (1) an update to the Johnson County Arterial Roadway Network Plan with recommendations and capital program phasing for additional transportation system improvements; (2) identification and analysis of issues associated with the potential alignment of U.S. 56 along 199th Street from Edgerton to I-35; (3) a bicycle/pedestrian trail plan/concept plan for Johnson County Parks District land in the area with connections between Edgerton, Gardner, and Hillsdale Lake in Miami County; (4) a Safe Routes to Schools Plan for Nike Elementary; (5) a land use component testing alternative land use scenarios using travel demand modeling and highway capacity analysis software to ensure that planned developments will not exceed the capacity of the transportation system; and (6) a natural resource component with BMPs (MARC Eco-Logical) to protect Hillsdale Lake and JOCO Parkland as development occurs.

Notice of Hearings

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment will conduct two public hearings on the 2012 Kansas 303(d) List of Impaired Waters. Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act requires states to biennially prepare a list of waters failing to meet State Water Quality Standards. Such waters are required to have total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) prepared by the state to restore their water quality. A total maximum daily load is the maximum amount of the impairing pollutant that can enter the water without causing a violation of its water quality standards.

Since 1999, Kansas has developed TMDLs for impaired surface waters in each of the state's 12 river basins. KDHE develops and revises TMDLs for selected impairments identified in the current Section 303(d) list by rotating among the 12 basins generally over a five-year span. In accordance with the Kansas TMDL development cycle, TMDLs will be developed for the Marais des Cygnes and Missouri basins starting this year to be completed in 2013. Over the course of the next two years, TMDLs will be developed for the Neosho, Verdigris and Walnut basins in 2013 and 2014. The draft 2012 Kansas 303(d) list will emphasize waters in these five basins, including an initial designation of TMDLs to be developed over the next two years. The list and its methodology are available for review on the Internet at <http://www.kdheks.gov/tmdl/>.

The public hearings will open with a brief summary of the list and its methodology as it pertains to the waters of the applicable river basin. Public testimony will then be taken after the presentation. Please provide a written copy of any testimony at the hearings. Written testimony will be accepted by KDHE anytime prior to the close of business March 23. KDHE will prepare a response to all public comments and revise the draft list as necessary, and will submit the list, the methodology, the public comments and the KDHE response to Region VII of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency on March 30, 2012.

Notice of Draft General Wastewater Control Permit

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a Kansas/NPDES Water Pollution Control General Wastewater Control Permit for operating wastewater treatment/retention facilities for ready-mixed concrete plants, concrete product plants and their associated facilities. The draft permit covers both total retention facilities and facilities that discharge treated wastewater to surface waters of the state. The draft permit also requires the permittee to continue to update and comply with its stormwater pollution prevention plan.

A general wastewater permit is provided for those entities engaged in similar activities and discharging the same types of wastewater. The wastewater from these types of activities has a low public health and environmental risk. A general permit is placed on public notice once during the life of the permit and then is made available, without further public notice, to entities for activities that meet the requirements of the permit. The permittees also are required to meet all other federal, state and local requirements, including local zoning ordinances.

The draft permit contains limits for oil and grease, total suspended solids and pH, and monitoring for effluent flow, sulfate and chlorides. The permittee also is required to conduct inspections of the stormwater runoff control system. To be covered under the draft permit, the permittee is required to submit the Notice of Intent and receive a signed and dated permit from KDHE.

Article 5.—CONTINUING EDUCATION

109-5-7c. Advanced emergency medical technician transition course approval. (a) The transition course curriculum for the advanced emergency medical technician shall be pages 5 through 173 of the document titled “AEMT lesson plan,” dated May 28, 2011, in the “AEMT instructor manual,” published by the Kansas board of emergency medical services, excluding the “note” and the section titled “suggested student readings and reference material” on page 5 and any citations to these ref-

erence materials. The specified portion of the “AEMT lesson plan” is hereby adopted by reference.

(b) Each instructor-coordinator or training officer desiring to teach AEMT transition courses must have completed the following:

(1) The “EMR/EMT train the trainer course” as adopted by reference in K.A.R. 109-5-7a; and

(2) the “AEMT train the trainer course,” dated August 6, 2010 and developed by the Friesen group of North Newton, Kansas, which is hereby adopted by reference.

(c) Each sponsoring organization shall submit to the executive director for approval a single-program continuing education application to conduct, through teaching or coordinating, or both, a transition module or an entire transition course.

(d) Each sponsoring organization shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Ensure that the curriculum meets the requirements specified in subsection (a);

(2) submit a complete application for single-program approval to the executive director at least 30 days before the requested transition course. A complete application shall include the following:

(A) The signature of the instructor-coordinator or training officer who meets the requirements of subsection (b) and is responsible for the coordination of the transition course;

(B) the signature of the identified sponsoring organization’s medical advisor;

(C) a course schedule that includes the date and time of each transition course module or session, the title of each transition course topic, and the instructor for each transition course module or session; and

(D) assurance of use of the cognitive examination and psychomotor skills competency evaluation tools provided as part of the instructor manual for the transition course at the level of course to be taught;

(3) provide each student with a certificate of completion that includes the following:

(A) The name of the sponsoring organization;

(B) a statement that the transition course has been approved by the board;

(C) the title of the transition course module or entire transition course;

(D) the date and location of the transition course module or session;

(E) the amount of continuing education credit completed by the attendant for the transition course module or entire transition course;

(F) the board-assigned course identification number;

(G) the printed name and signature of the instructor-coordinator or training officer who meets the requirements specified in subsection (b) and is responsible for the coordination of the transition course; and

(H) the names of the primary instructor-coordinator (I-C), training officer (TO), and any person who provides teaching assistance including subject matter experts, lab assistants, clinical or field preceptors, and guest lecturers;

(4) provide a copy of all transition course rosters to the board office; and

(5) maintain the following records for at least five years:

(continued)

(A) A copy of all documents required to be submitted with the application for single-program approval;

(B) a list of all persons used in the teaching of the course. The list shall include the name and credentials of the primary I-C, training officer, and any person who provides teaching assistance including subject matter experts, lab assistants, preceptors, and guest lecturers;

(C) student attendance records; and

(D) completed copies of student evaluations for each of the transition course modules or entire transition course.

(e) A subject matter expert may apply content taught by the subject matter expert during a transition course as content needed to complete the subject matter expert's transition course. For the purpose of this regulation, "subject matter expert" shall mean an individual who understands, articulates, and implements the best practices of emergency medical services.

(f) Upon request by the executive director, each sponsoring organization shall provide a copy of all transition course records. Article 3.—STANDARDS FOR AMBULANCE ATTENDANTS, FIRST RESPONDERS, AND DRIVERS

109-3-3. Emergency medical responder; authorized activities. Each emergency medical responder shall be authorized to perform any intervention specified in K.S.A. 65-6144, and amendments thereto, and as further specified in this regulation:

(a) Emergency vehicle operations:

(1) Operating each ambulance in a safe manner in non-emergency and emergency situations. "Emergency vehicle" shall mean ambulance, as defined in K.S.A. 65-6112 and amendments thereto; and

(2) stocking an ambulance with supplies in accordance with regulations adopted by the board and the ambulance service's approved equipment list to support local medical protocols;

(b) initial scene management:

(1) Assessing the scene, determining the need for additional resources, and requesting these resources;

(2) identifying a multiple-casualty incident and implementing the local multiple-casualty incident management system;

(3) recognizing and preserving a crime scene;

(4) triaging patients, utilizing local triage protocols;

(5) providing safety for self, each patient, other emergency personnel, and bystanders;

(6) utilizing methods to reduce stress for each patient, other emergency personnel, and bystanders;

(7) communicating with public safety dispatchers and medical control facilities;

(8) providing a verbal report to receiving personnel;

(9) providing a written report to receiving personnel;

(10) completing a prehospital care report;

(11) setting up and providing patient and equipment decontamination;

(12) using personal protection equipment;

(13) practicing infection control precautions;

(14) moving patients without a carrying device; and

(15) moving patients with a carrying device;

(c) patient assessment and stabilization:

(1) Obtaining consent for providing care;

(2) communicating with bystanders, other health care providers, and patient family members while providing patient care;

(3) communicating with each patient while providing care; and

(4) assessing the following: blood pressure manually by auscultation or palpation or automatically by noninvasive methods; heart rate; level of consciousness; temperature; pupil size and responsiveness to light; absence or presence of respirations; respiration rate; and skin color, temperature, and condition;

(d) cardiopulmonary resuscitation and airway management:

(1) Applying cardiac monitoring electrodes;

(2) performing any of the following:

(A) Manual cardiopulmonary resuscitation for an adult, child, or infant, using one or two attendants;

(B) cardiopulmonary resuscitation using a mechanical device;

(C) postresuscitative care to a cardiac arrest patient;

(D) cricoid pressure by utilizing the sellick maneuver;

(E) head-tilt maneuver or chin-lift maneuver, or both;

(F) jaw thrust maneuver;

(G) modified jaw thrust maneuver for injured patients;

(H) modified chin-lift maneuver;

(I) mouth-to-barrier ventilation;

(J) mouth-to-mask ventilation;

(K) mouth-to-mouth ventilation;

(L) mouth-to-nose ventilation;

(M) mouth-to-stoma ventilation;

(N) manual airway maneuvers; or

(O) manual upper-airway obstruction maneuvers, including patient positioning, finger sweeps, chest thrusts, and abdominal thrusts; and

(3) suctioning the oral and nasal cavities with a soft or rigid device;

(e) control of bleeding, by means of any of the following:

(1) Elevating the extremity;

(2) applying direct pressure;

(3) utilizing a pressure point;

(4) applying a tourniquet;

(5) utilizing the trendelenberg position; or

(6) applying a pressure bandage;

(f) extremity splinting, by means of any of the following:

- (1) Soft splints;
- (2) anatomical extremity splinting without return to position of function;
- (3) manual support and stabilization; or
- (4) vacuum splints;
- (g) spinal immobilization, by means of any of the following:
 - (1) Cervical collar;
 - (2) full-body immobilization device;
 - (3) manual stabilization;
 - (4) assisting an EMT, AEMT, or paramedic with application of an upper-body spinal immobilization device;
 - (5) helmet removal; or
 - (6) rapid extrication;
 - (h) oxygen therapy by means of any of the following:
 - (1) Humidifier;
 - (2) nasal cannula;
 - (3) non-rebreather mask;
 - (4) partial rebreather mask;
 - (5) regulators;
 - (6) simple face mask;
 - (7) blow-by;
 - (8) using a bag-valve-mask with or without supplemental oxygen; or
 - (9) ventilating an inserted supraglottic or subglottic airway;
 - (i) administration of patient-assisted and non-patient-assisted medications according to the board's "emergency medical responder medication list," dated April 1, 2011, which is hereby adopted by reference;
 - (j) recognizing and complying with advanced directives by making decisions based upon a do-not-resuscitate order, living will, or durable power of attorney for health care decisions; and
 - (k) providing the following techniques for preliminary care:
 - (1) Cutting of the umbilical cord;
 - (2) irrigating the eyes of foreign or caustic materials;
 - (3) bandaging the eyes;
 - (4) positioning the patient based on situational need;
 - (5) securing the patient on transport devices;
 - (6) restraining a violent patient, if technician or patient safety is threatened;
 - (7) disinfecting the equipment and ambulance;
 - (8) disposing of contaminated equipment, including sharps and personal protective equipment, and material;
 - (9) decontaminating self, equipment, material, and ambulance;
 - (10) following medical protocols for declared or potential organ retrieval;
 - (11) participating in the quality improvement process;
 - (12) providing EMS education to the public; and
 - (13) providing education on injury prevention to the public. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 65-6111; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 65-6144, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 114, sec. 91; effective March 9, 2012.)

109-3-4. Emergency medical technician; authorized activities. Each emergency medical technician shall

be authorized to perform any intervention specified in the following:

- (a) K.S.A. 65-6144, and amendments thereto, and as further specified in K.A.R. 109-3-3; and
- (b) K.S.A. 65-6121, and amendments thereto, and as further specified in the following paragraphs:
 - (1) Airway maintenance by means of any of the following:
 - (A) Blind insertion of a supraglottic airway, with the exception of the laryngeal mask airway;
 - (B) oxygen venturi mask;
 - (C) gastric decompression by orogastric or nasogastric tube with any authorized airway device providing that capability;
 - (D) auscultating the quality of breath sounds;
 - (E) pulse oximetry;
 - (F) automatic transport ventilator;
 - (G) manually triggered ventilator;
 - (H) oxygen-demand valve;
 - (I) flow-restricted oxygen-powered ventilation device;
 - (J) bag valve mask with in-line small-volume nebulizer;
 - (K) carbon dioxide colorimetric detection;
 - (L) capnometry; or
 - (M) suctioning a stoma;
 - (2) application of a pneumatic antishock garment only for use as a pelvic splint; and
 - (3) administration of patient-assisted and non-patient-assisted medications according to the board's "emergency medical technician medication list," dated April 1, 2011, which is hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 65-6111; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 65-6121, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 114, sec. 84; effective March 9, 2012.)

109-3-5. Advanced emergency medical technician; authorized activities. Each advanced emergency medical technician shall be authorized to perform any intervention specified in the following:

- (a) K.S.A. 65-6144, and amendments thereto, and as further specified in K.A.R. 109-3-3;
- (b) K.S.A. 65-6121, and amendments thereto, and as further specified in K.A.R. 109-3-4; and
- (c) K.S.A. 65-6120, and amendments thereto, and as further specified in the following paragraphs:
 - (1) Advanced airway management, except for endotracheal intubation; and
 - (2) administration of patient-assisted and non-patient-assisted medications according to the board's "advanced EMT medication list," dated April 1, 2011, which is hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 65-6111; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 65-6120, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 114, sec. 83; effective March 9, 2012.)

Article 5.—CONTINUING EDUCATION

109-5-1c. Emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator, emergency medical technician-intermediate who is also certified as an emergency medical technician-defibrillator, and advanced emergency medical technician; continuing education. (a)(1) Each applicant for certification

(continued)

renewal as an EMT-I who is scheduled for renewal before January 1, 2014 shall have earned at least 36 clock-hours of documented and approved continuing education during the preceding biennial period.

(2) Each applicant for certification renewal as an EMT-I who is scheduled for renewal on or before December 31, 2014 or December 31, 2015 shall have completed the board-approved transition course to transition to the AEMT level of certification, as specified in K.S.A. 65-6120 and amendments thereto.

(b)(1) Each applicant for certification renewal as an EMT-D who is scheduled for renewal before January 1, 2014 shall have earned at least 36 clock-hours of documented and approved continuing education during the preceding biennial period.

(2) Each applicant for certification renewal as an EMT-D who is scheduled for renewal on or before December 31, 2014 or December 31, 2015 shall have completed the board-approved transition course to transition to the AEMT level of certification, as specified in K.S.A. 65-6123 and amendments thereto, and an initial emergency medical technician-intermediate course.

(c)(1) Each applicant for certification renewal who is certified both as an EMT-I and as an EMT-D and is scheduled for renewal before January 1, 2014 shall have earned at least 44 clock-hours of documented and approved continuing education during the preceding biennial period.

(2) Each applicant for certification renewal who is certified both as an EMT-I and as an EMT-D and is scheduled for renewal on or before December 31, 2014 or December 31, 2015 shall have completed the board-approved transition course to transition to the AEMT level of certification, as specified in K.S.A. 65-6120 and K.S.A. 65-6123 and amendments thereto.

(d) Each applicant for renewal as an AEMT shall have earned at least 36 clock-hours of documented and approved continuing education during the initial certification period and during each biennial period thereafter. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 65-6111, K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 65-6120, and K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 65-6123; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 65-6120, K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 65-6123, and K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 65-6129; effective March 9, 2012.)

Article 7.—FEES

109-7-1. Schedule of fees. (a) Attendant, I-C, training officer, and ambulance service application fees shall be nonrefundable.

(b) First responder and emergency medical responder fees:

- (1) Application for certification fee \$15.00
- (2) certification renewal application fee for a renewal that expires on a biennial basis if received before certificate expiration 20.00
- (3) certification renewal application fee if received within 31 calendar days after certificate expiration 40.00
- (4) certification renewal application fee if received on or after the 32nd calendar day after certificate expiration 80.00

(c) Paramedic fees:

- (1) Application for certification fee 65.00
- (2) certification renewal application fee if received before certificate expiration 50.00

- (3) certification renewal application fee if received within 31 calendar days after certificate expiration 100.00
- (4) certification renewal application fee if received on or after the 32nd calendar day after certificate expiration 200.00

(d) EMT, EMT-I, EMT-D, EMT-I who is also certified as an EMT-D, and AEMT fees:

- (1) Application for certification fee 50.00
- (2) certification renewal application fee if received before certificate expiration 30.00
- (3) certification renewal application fee if received within 31 calendar days after certificate expiration 60.00
- (4) certification renewal application fee if received on or after the 32nd calendar day after certificate expiration 120.00

(e) Instructor-coordinator and training officer fees:

- (1) Application for certification fee 65.00
- (2) certification renewal application fee if received before certificate expiration 30.00
- (3) certification renewal application fee if received within 31 calendar days after certificate expiration 60.00
- (4) certification renewal application fee if received on or after the 32nd calendar day after certificate expiration 120.00

(f) Type I, II, II-A, and V ambulance service fees:

- (1) Service permit application fee 100.00
- (2) service permit renewal fee if received on or before permit expiration 100.00
- (3) service permit renewal fee if received after permit expiration 200.00
- (4) vehicle license application fee 40.00

(g) Each application for certification shall include payment of the prescribed application for certification fee to the board.

(h) Payment of fees may be made by either of the following:

(1) An individual using a personal, certified, or cashier's check, a money order, a credit card, or a debit card; or

(2) an ambulance service, fire department, or municipality using warrants, payment vouchers, purchase orders, credit cards, or debit cards.

(i) Payment submitted to the board for application for certification fee or renewal fee for more than one attendant, training officer, or I-C shall not be accepted, unless the fee amount is correct. Article 13.—TRAINING OFFICERS

109-13-1. Training officers. (a) A training officer I may coordinate and teach continuing education for attendants. A training officer II may coordinate and teach continuing education for attendants and be the primary in-

structor and coordinate first responder and emergency medical responder initial courses of instruction.

(b) Each initial applicant for training officer I certification shall apply to the board using forms provided by the executive director and shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Validate certification at or above the level of EMT or licensure as a physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or professional nurse;

(2) validate appointment by one of the following persons:

(A) The chief executive officer of an ambulance service, a hospital, a fire department, or a municipal rescue squad; or

(B) the administrator for an educational institution or corporation that conducts EMS training programs; and

(3) provide evidence of successful completion of a board-approved training officer initial course of instruction at the appropriate training officer level.

(c) In addition to meeting the requirements listed in subsection (b), an initial applicant for training officer II certification shall establish current board approval as a training officer I.

(d) Training officer certification may be renewed upon meeting all of the following conditions:

(1) Submitting an application using forms approved by the board;

(2) providing verification of current certification at or above the level of EMT or licensure as a physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or professional nurse;

(3) providing verification of appointment by one of the following persons:

(A) The chief executive officer of an ambulance service, a hospital, a fire department, or a municipal rescue squad; or

(B) the administrator for an educational institution or organization that conducts EMS training programs; and

(4) providing proof of attendance at an educator conference approved by the board and proof of having instructed 20 hours of training applicable to EMS values, skills, knowledge, and practice during the biennial period immediately preceding renewal.

(e) Each training officer shall maintain, for at least three years, copies of the attendance rosters for courses that the training officer conducted or coordinated and shall submit these records to the board upon request.
