Administrative Regulation

The Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board will conduct a public hearing from 10 to 11 a.m. Friday, September 20, in the board conference room, Suite 420, Eisenhower State Office Building, 700 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider adopting proposed amendments to a permanent rule and regulation for addiction counseling.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for purposes of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Max L. Foster, Jr., executive director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, Suite 420, Eisenhower State Office Building, 700 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66603-3929. Email comments may be directed to max.foster@bsrb.state.ks.us. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally at the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Leslie Allen, assistant director, at 785-296-3240 or the Kansas Relay Cen-

ter at 800-766-3777. There is designated accessible parking on Kansas Avenue and the front entrance of the board office is accessible.

Copies of the full text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the board office, and also are available on the board's website at www.ksbsrb.org, under "proposed regulations." The following is a summary of the proposed amendments and economic impact statement. The board does not have a less costly or less intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of this regulation.

K.A.R. 102-7-3 contains the education requirements for licensure as an addiction counselor and clinical addiction counselor. The amendments include language being added to implement the change in the approved 2012 statute (K.S.A. 65-6610) that affect the education requirements for a licensed baccalaureate social worker (LBSW) who also wants to obtain the licensed addiction counselor (LAC) designation. Additionally, the descriptions for courses required to obtain a license for both the addiction counselor and the clinical addiction counselor are being updated.

Economic Impact: There would be a positive impact to LBSW licensees, as the number of semester credit hours to obtain the LAC designation will be reduced from 33 semester credit hours to 12 semester credit hours. There would be no economic impact to the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, any other governmental agencies or the public.

If the player reveals a "COIN" symbol, the player wins triple the prize shown for that symbol.

(c) There are no "play symbol captions" for this game.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149.

(e) The price of instant tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$2.00 each.

(f) "Triple Bingo" is a two-part vertically oriented game. The first part consists of the "CALLER'S CARD." The "CALLER'S CARD" contains 24 draw numbers covered by opaque latex.

The second part consists of four "BINGO CARDS" each containing 23 numbers, a "HORSESHOE" symbol placed randomly, and a "FREE" space in the center of each card,

for a total of 25 squares. The free space and "HORSE-SHOE" symbol may be counted as numbers to form winning patterns. The "BINGO CARDS" are each covered by translucent scratch-off material.

A player removes the scratch-off material from the areas on the ticket indicated by the words "CALLER'S CARD" to reveal a total of 24 draw numbers. A player wins by matching the "CALLER'S CARD" to the numbers on the four "BINGO CARDS." If the player finds a diagonal, vertical, or horizontal straight line of at least five squares, or four corners of the grid, or an "X" pattern,

the player wins a prize according to the prize legend beside the respective "BINGO CARD."

(g) Each ticket in this game may win up to four times. Only one prize may be claimed on each of the four "BINGO CARDS."

(h) Approximately 1,200,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ONLINE GAMES AND DRAWINGS

111-5-127. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Hot Lotto" game:

(a) "Advertised grand prize" means the amount determined and publicly announced by the product group to be the grand prize for the drawing. The "advertised grand prize" amount is not the gross grand prize value. The advertised grand prize amount shall be the minimum cash amount that would be paid as a "withholding taxes paid" prize to the grand prize winner(s), on a pari-mutuel

basis, after calculating the potential federal and jurisdictional withholding taxes, if any, applicable to resident United States citizens with a valid social security number, to the gross grand prize value. If a member lottery advertises an "estimated grand prize", that shall have the same meaning as an "advertised grand prize".

(b) "Computer pick" means the random selection of two-digit numbers by the computer system, which appear on a ticket and are played by a player in the game.

(c) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(d) "Game board" or "boards" means that area of the play slip which contains two sets of numbered squares to be marked by the player, the first set containing 47 squares, number one through 47, and the second set containing 19 squares, number one through 19.

(continued)

(e) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the combination a person has selected.

(f) "Gross grand prize value" shall mean the prize value prior to deductions for any applicable withholding taxes due the federal or state government.

(g) "Guaranteed grand prize" as used in these rules means the guarantee by the product group as to the "gross grand prize value" amount; the "advertised grand prize" amount is not a guaranteed prize amount.

(h) "MUSL" means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the party lotteries.

(i) "MUSL Board" means the governing body of the MUSL which is comprised of the chief executive officer of each party lottery.

(j) "Multi-draw" means the optional ability for a player to purchase the same play(s) in one or more future drawings.

(k) "On-line lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(l) "Party Lottery" means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity which has joined the MUSL and, in the context of these Powerball product group rules, which has joined in selling the Powerball game.

(m) "Product group" means the group of lotteries which has joined together to offer a product pursuant to the terms of the multi-state lottery agreement and the group's own rules.

(n) "Play" means the six numbers, the first five from a field of 47 numbers and the last one from a field of 19 numbers, that appear on a ticket as a single lettered selection and are to be played by a player in the game.

(o) "Play slip" means a card used in marking a player's game plays and containing one or more boards and if the multi-draw option is available for play, the play slip shall include a box to mark the number of draws chosen.

(p) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(q) "Set Prize" means all other prizes except the grand prize that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment and, except in rare instances, outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the MUSL Board for the prize level.

(r) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(s) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(t) "Winning numbers" means the six numbers, the first five from a field of 47 numbers and the last one from a field of 19 numbers, randomly selected at each drawing which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket.

(u) "Withholding taxes paid prize" means a prize where the lottery pays the prize winner a net prize amount, that consists of the lottery withholding and depositing on behalf of the prize winner the required federal and state withholding taxes (if any) on the "prize value" and the residual amount paid to the prize winner.

(v) "Sizzler" or "multiplier option" means that the "Hot Lotto" game option, whereby a player may elect to pay an additional \$1 per play at the time of ticket purchase which will have the effect of multiplying any prize won on the play, except the grand prize, by a factor of three.

(w) These amendments shall take effect May 12, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-15-06, Feb. 15, 2006; amended T-111-3-14-08, Dec. 13, 2007; amended, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-5-128. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) "Hot Lotto" is a five out of 47 plus one out of 19 online lottery game which pays the grand prize, at the election of the player made in accordance with the rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules at the time of play purchase, as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for this prize on a parimutuel basis. All other prizes are paid on a set cash basis. To play "Hot Lotto," a player shall select five different numbers from one to 47 and one additional number from one to 19 for input into a terminal. The additional number may be the same as one of the first five numbers selected by the player.

(b) A "Hot Lotto" game ticket shall sell for one dollar.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. The player may select a set of five numbers and one additional number by:

(1) communicating the six numbers to the retailer;

(2) marking six numbered squares in any one or more game boards on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or

(3) requesting a "computer pick" or "quick pick" from the retailer.

If available at the time, a player may choose the multi-draw option by marking the appropriate box on the play slip or by communicating that desire to the retailer. If the multi-draw option is chosen, it shall apply to all boards played on that play slip. For each play upon which the multi-draw option is chosen, the player shall pay one additional dollar. The retailer shall then issue a ticket from the terminal containing the selected set or sets of numbers, each of which constitutes a game play, and if applicable, whether or not the multi-draw option has been chosen for all plays on that play slip.

(e) If available at the time, a player may choose the multiplier option by marking the appropriate box on the play slip or by communicating to the retailer the desire to play the multiplier option. If the multiplier option is chosen, it shall apply to all boards played on that play slip. For each play upon which the multiplier option is chosen, the player shall pay one additional dollar. The

retailer shall then issue a ticket from the terminal containing the selected set or sets of numbers, each of which constitutes a game play, and if applicable, whether or not the multiplier option has been chosen for all plays on that play slip.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent. A play slip shall have no pecuniary or prize value and shall not be used as evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(g) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error. No ticket which can be used to claim a prize shall be returned to the lottery for credit.

(h) Ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time on Wednesdays and Saturdays and will resume at approximately 9:05 p.m. on those days, for the next draw period.

(i) Drawings will be conducted twice weekly, on Wednesdays and Saturdays at approximately 9:58 p.m. central time (CT), after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(j) Each player shall be responsible for verifying the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the on-line retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(k) A grand prize winner shall receive a "withholding taxes paid prize." "Withholding taxes paid prize" means a prize where the lottery pays the prize winner a net prize amount, that consists of the lottery withholding and depositing on behalf of the prize winner the required federal and state withholding taxes (if any) on the "prize value" and the residual amount paid to the prize winner.

Federal and state withholding tax rates are subject to change and will be determined at the time the prize is awarded.

The "withholding taxes paid prize" amount reported to the federal and state revenue authorities by the lottery as subject to income taxation shall reflect the amount paid to the prize winner and also the amount remitted as withholding taxes to the federal and state authorities (if any) on behalf of the prize winner.

The lottery and MUSL are not responsible for additional income or other taxes applicable in excess of the amount withheld and remitted by the lottery that may be due when the prizewinner files all tax returns for the year the prize is claimed; prize winners should verify personal tax liability with a financial adviser.

(l) These amendments shall take effect May 12, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-15-06, Feb. 15, 2006; amended T-111-3-14-08, Dec. 13, 2007; amended, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-5-129. Prize pool; reserve account. (a) The prize pool for all prize categories shall consist of 50% of

each drawing period's sales, including tax, after the prize reserve accounts are funded to the amounts set by the product group. Any amount remaining in the prize pool at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement game or expended in a manner as directed by the product group in accordance with state and/or federal law.

(b) An amount equal to up to one percent of sales shall be deducted from the lottery's grand prize pool and placed in trust in one or more prize reserve accounts when the grand prize exceeds \$2,000,000, with an additional amount equal to two percent of lottery's sales placed in trust in one or more prize reserve accounts when the grand prize exceeds \$5,000,000 until such time as the lottery's share of the reserve account(s) reach(es) the amounts designated by the product group. When the prize reserve accounts exceed the designated amount, the excess shall become part of the grand prize pool. Any amount remaining in prize reserve accounts at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement prize reserve account or expended in a manner as directed by the product group in accordance with state law. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8731; effective, T-111-3-15-06, Feb. 15, 2006; amended, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-5-130. Expected prize payout. (a) The grand prize payment amounts shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes with the following expected approximate prize payout percentages:

(b) The prize money allocated to the gross grand prize value category shall be divided equally by the number of game boards winning the grand prize.

(c) The prize pool percentage allocated to the set prizes (the cash prizes of \$30,000 or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw. If the total of the set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes awarded

(continued)

shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

(1) the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any;

(2) an amount from the prize reserve account, if available, not to exceed the balance of the account; or

(3) an amount from the set-aside account, if available, not to exceed the balance of that account.

If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded, then the highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-15-06, Feb. 15, 2006; amended, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

(b) The grand prize amount is the gross grand prize value and does not include deductions for any applicable withholding taxes, the prize reserve account deduction, or any other deductions, if any. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-15-06, Feb. 15, 2006; amended, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-5-132. Prize payments. (a) Grand prize winners shall be paid with a single cash payment. The gross grand prize value shall be a guaranteed amount and the grand prize winners share shall be determined pursuant to K.A.R. 111-5-130.

(b) For past Hot Lotto grand prize winners who have elected an annuity payment of their grand prize, in the event of the death of a lottery winner during the annuity payment period, the product group, in its sole discretion, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner to the Kansas lottery, may accelerate the payment of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the estate. If the product group makes such a determination, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner's annuitized prize, may be distributed to the estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the product group.

(c) All low tier cash prizes, which are all prizes except the grand prize, shall be paid in cash through the party lottery which sold the winning ticket(s). If the multiplier option is played, the prize won on that play, except for the grand prize, shall be multiplied by a factor of three. A party lottery may begin paying low-tier cash prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

(d) Prizes which, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next drawing.

(e) If the grand prize is not won in a drawing, the prize money allocated for the grand prize shall roll over and be added to the grand prize pool for the following drawing.

(f) The product group may offer guaranteed minimum grand prize amounts or minimum increases in the grand prize amount between drawings or make other changes in the allocation of prize money where the product group finds that it would be in the best interest of the game. Minimum guaranteed prizes or increases may be waived if the alternate funding mechanism set out in K.A.R. 111-5-130 becomes necessary.

(g) The holder of a winning ticket may win only one prize per board in connection with the winning numbers drawn, and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(h) All prizes must be claimed within 365 days of the day of the drawing in which the prize was won.

111-7-187a. Buy a \$10 Keno 5-Spot game and get an additional 50 percent payout on prizes won. For every Kansas lottery online Keno single ticket purchase of \$10.00 or more on any 5-spot game, a player will receive an additional 50 percent payout on all prizes won on Keno drawings that occur beginning at 5:00 p.m. and ending at 8:00 p.m. on April 4, 11, 18, and 25, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

Article 15.—RAFFLE GAMES

111-15-12. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lotto game entitled Firecracker 50/50 (50/50) beginning on April 1, 2013, for a drawing to be conducted on July 2, 2013.

The rules and regulations for the Firecracker 50/50 game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-12 through 111-15-20, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-13. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the “Firecracker 50/50” game:

(a) “Available ticket(s)” or “ticket(s) available for sale” means one or any number of tickets from one through 450,000 that are available to sell during the “Firecracker 50/50” game.

(b) “Check-A-Ticket Machine” means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.

(c) “Computer pick” or “quick pick” means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

(d) “Drawing” means the formal process of selecting the winning number which determines the winner of the game.

(e) “Electronic drawing machine” or “random number generator” means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.

(f) “Game ticket” or “ticket” means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.

(g) “Online lottery game” means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(h) “Order drawn” means the sequential order in which a “WINNING” ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.

(i) “Retailer” or “agent” means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(j) “Serial number” means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.

(k) “Terminal” means a device authorized by the Kansas lottery to function in an online, interactive mode with the Kansas lottery’s computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(l) “Ticket Number” means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.

(m) “Validation” or “validate” means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(n) “Winning number” or “winning numbers” means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.

(o) “Winning ticket” means a 50/50 ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the 50/50 game, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-14. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) “Firecracker 50/50” is a raffle style drawing which offers a total of 450,000 online tickets available for sale. Each ticket shall bear a “TICKET NUMBER” on the face of the ticket. On a date specified in these rules, an electronic drawing machine, which has been approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery, shall randomly select a total of one “WINNING NUMBER.” A “WINNING NUMBER” consists of a six-digit number as it appears in exact order reading from left to right. A player wins by exactly matching his or her “TICKET NUMBER” to a “WINNING NUMBER” that was selected in the drawing. The “WINNING NUMBER” selected during the drawing process shall be the grand prize winner of 50 percent of net monies earned from total ticket sales. Ticket sales will be the sole determining factor in the amount of the grand prize. The higher the sales, the greater the grand prize will be. The prize shall be paid as a cash lump sum payment. To play the “Firecracker 50/50,” a player shall purchase a “Firecracker 50/50” ticket which bears a ticket number on the face of the ticket.

(b) A “Firecracker 50/50” ticket shall sell for \$20 (twenty) dollars.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer.

(e) All tickets sold by a retailer shall be a “computer pick” or “quick pick” ticket.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the original winning ticket to and receipt of said ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent.

(g) The only guaranteed methods of win checking a ticket to determine whether the ticket bears a winning number shall be through the Kansas lottery check-a-ticket machines, or submission of a ticket to the Kansas lottery or an authorized retail agent.

(h) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error.

(i) There shall be a total of 450,000 available tickets for sale.

(j) Ticket sales will begin at 5:00 a.m. central time on April 1, 2013.

(k) Ticket sales will end at 2:00 a.m. central time on July 2, 2013.

(l) The game will officially close at 4:30 a.m. on July 2, 2013.

(continued)

(m) The drawing shall be conducted on July 2, 2013, before noon central time, at a secure location as determined by the executive director, after the game is closed and the drawing official has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(n) Each player shall have the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the ticket. The purchase of a ticket is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(o) If, for any reason, a player's bet is not accepted, readable, discernible, or provable, the liability of the Kansas lottery or its agents shall be limited to a refund of the amount of the ticket purchase price.

(p) The winning ticket number shall be made available to the public on or about noon, July 2, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-15. Prize pool. (a) The prize pool in the lottery prize payment fund for the grand prize category shall consist of fifty percent (50%) of total net sales for this drawing. Net sales shall be total sales, less any tickets excluded as being unavailable for sale or any additional operating costs.

(b) Any moneys remaining in the prize pool following this drawing, except unclaimed prizes, shall be placed in the general prize reserve pool for subsequent lottery games. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-16. Probability of winning. Probability of winning a prize shall be one ticket in the number of valid tickets sold. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-17. Prize payments. (a) The holder of the winning ticket may win only one prize per ticket and shall be entitled only to the prize won by the ticket number which matches the winning number in the drawing.

(b) The grand prize must be claimed within 365 days of the day of the drawing in which the prize was won. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-18. Claiming prize; procedure and time period. (a) Prior to the payment of the prize, a ticket shall be validated by the retailer or lottery office pursuant to this act.

(b) The procedure for the payment of the "Firecracker 50/50" prize shall be as follows:

(1) The claimant may bring the signed ticket to any office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that the office is open to the public for business. Upon validation of the ticket and completion of a claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(2) The claimant may mail the ticket with a completed claim form to any office of the Kansas lottery. A claim form may be obtained from any lottery retailer or any office of the Kansas lottery. Upon receipt of the ticket and

completed claim form and validation of the ticket, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(c) Although the ticket and claim form may be presented or mailed to any Kansas lottery office, such prize may only be paid by lottery headquarters.

(d) The prize shall be claimed within 365 days of the drawing in which the prize was won. Any prize not claimed within the time specified shall be forfeited. If the prize is claimed by mail, the ticket and claim form must actually be received by the lottery within the claim period. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-19. Ticket validation requirements. (a) To be a valid ticket and eligible to receive a prize, a Kansas lottery Firecracker 50/50 ticket shall satisfy all the requirements established by the Kansas lottery for validation of winning tickets sold through its online system.

(b) Ticket eligibility requirements include, but are not limited to:

(1) The numbers and date printed on the ticket shall correspond to the lottery's central system.

(2) The ticket shall be intact.

(3) The ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted, or tampered with.

(4) The ticket may not be counterfeit or be a duplicate, facsimile, or facsimile of another ticket.

(5) The ticket shall have been issued through an authorized Kansas lottery retailer in an authorized manner.

(6) The ticket may not have been stolen or cancelled.

(7) The ticket data shall have been recorded on the central computer system prior to the drawing and the computer record shall match the ticket data in every respect.

(8) The ticket shall pass other confidential security checks performed by the Kansas lottery.

(c) Any question or dispute over the legitimacy or validation of any ticket or drawing in the game shall be determined by the executive director in his sole discretion.

(d) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for tickets which are altered in any manner.

(e) If a ticket is invalidated for any reason, the lottery's liability shall be limited to cost of a replacement ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)

111-15-20. Ticket responsibility. (a) Until such time as a signature, mark or name is placed on the back of a ticket in the area designated for a signature, mark or name, a ticket shall be owned by the holder of the ticket. When a signature, mark or name is placed on a ticket in the place designated, the person whose signature, mark or name appears in that area shall be the owner of the ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto.

(b) If the signature of more than one person appears on the back of the ticket in the designated place, the lottery shall make payment to the person presenting the ticket whose signature appears on both the ticket and the winner claim form. If all persons whose signatures appear in the appropriate space cannot identify one person to

whom payment should be made, the lottery shall keep the prize until a determination of entitlement is made by the parties. In no event shall more than one person be entitled to a particular prize.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen tickets. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-

8710; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-5-31-13, March 13, 2013.)
