Atchison County has certified that the application is consistent with their solid waste management plan and compatible with surrounding land use. KDHE is providing

This facility is a mechanical treatment plant consisting of an influent pump station, two mechanical bar screens, manual bar screen, mechanical grit removal, five anaerobic basins, two anoxic basins, two extended aeration activated sludge basins, two final clarification basins, ultraviolet disinfection and cascade re-aeration, gravity belt sludge thickener, centrifuge sludge thickener, an aerated sludge digestion tank and an aerated sludge storage tank. The proposed permit contains limits for biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, ammonia, E. coli, dissolved oxygen, whole effluent toxicity, and pH, as well as monitoring for total phosphorus, nitrate + nitrite, total Kjeldahl nitrogen, total nitrogen, priority pollutants, and flow.

Article 4.—ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

40-4-42a. Notice requirements of adverse decisions. (a) Each written notification of an adverse decision shall be printed in clear, legible type and in at least 12-point type.

(b) The notice of adverse decision shall explain the principal reason for the adverse decision in language

easily understood by a person with an eighth-grade reading level. An insurer may meet this requirement by omitting medical terminology that describes an insured's medical condition. The notice shall include the legal names of all impacted parties and their telephone numbers and addresses.

(c) The notice of adverse decision shall explain how an insured, as defined in K.S.A. 40-22a13, and amendments thereto, can initiate an external review with the commissioner. If an insured is eligible for an expedited review due to an emergency medical condition as defined in K.S.A. 40-22a13, and amendments thereto, then the notice shall explain how an insured can initiate an expedited review.

(d) The notice shall explain that an insured may file for an external review with the commissioner within 120 days of receipt of a final adverse decision. The notice shall also list the Kansas insurance department's toll-free number.

(e) The notice of adverse decision shall describe how the insured can request a written statement of the clinical rationale and clinical review criteria used to make the adverse decision. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 40-22a16; implementing K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 40-22a14; effective Jan. 7, 2000; amended Sept. 1, 2017.)
