Opinion No. 2020-02

Written April 22, 2020 to Bradley D. Jurgensen, 7333 Lincoln Rd., Oskaloosa, KS 66606.

Synopsis: Under the facts provided, a former state employee may accept employment with a state contractor by application of the K.S.A. 46-233(d)(1) exception to any waiting period provided for in K.S.A. 46-233(a) and (b).

Cited herein: K.S.A. 46-233, Ethics Opinions, Nos. 2000-48 and 2012-01.

Dear Mr. Jurgensen:

We understand you request our opinion concerning application of the state governmental ethics laws, K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, because of your prior state employment as the former director of the Kansas Correctional Industries (KCI), Kansas Department of Corrections (KDOC). Our opinion in response to your request is limited in its applicability. This opinion does not address whether some other statutory system, common law theory, or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry.

Factual Statement

As indicated in your opinion request, you retired from employment with the State of Kansas in December 2019. It is your intent to pursue employment with Union Supply Group. As a state employee you were substantially involved in the preparation of or participated in the making of a KDOC contract with Union Supply Company, Inc., d/b/a Union Supply Group. Specifically, you drafted

the specifications for the Request for Proposal, was part of the procurement negotiation committee and met with representatives from Union Supply Group, one of several companies that responded to the Request for Proposal, which was published for competitive bids in the Kansas Register, vol. 31, no. 32 (August 9, 2012). You helped review the proposals and developed the evaluation narrative and ranking report and eventually was a signatory to the contract.

The contract was awarded April 17, 2013 through June 30, 2018, with the option to renew the contract for an additional five-year term. A 2015 amendment only required the contract to collect, report and remit Kansas sales tax and any local sales tax by a political subdivision. The KDOC and Union Supply Group exercised the option to renew the contract on July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2023. You were not involved with this five-year extension.

Questions

Under the provided facts, may a prospective offer of employment from Union Supply Group be accepted without violating the K.S.A. 46-233 limitation on post-state employment with a person or business which contracted with the state within the preceding two years?

Analysis and Opinion

The state ethics law which may limit a state employee's acceptance of employment after working for the state is K.S.A. 46-233. It provides in pertinent part:

(a) ... (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whenever any individual has participated as a state officer or employee in the making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business as an employee, independent contractor or subcontractor until two years after performance of the contract is completed or until two years after the individual terminates employment as a state officer or employee, whichever is sooner. This prohibition on accepting employment shall not apply in any case where a state officer or employee who participated in making a contract while employed by the state of Kansas is laid off or scheduled to be laid off from any state position on or after July 1, 2002. As used in this subsection (a) (2), "laid off" and "layoff" mean a state officer or employee in the classified service under the Kansas civil service act, being laid off under K.S.A. 75-2948, and amendments thereto.

- (d) Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to the following:
- (1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice; and
- (2) contracts for property or services for which the price or rate is fixed by law.

Because the contract which you were substantially involved in the preparation of or participated in the making of was let for competitive bid after advertised published notice the K.S.A. 46-233(d)(1) exception applies. Hence, you are not subject the prohibition contained in K.S.A. 46-233(b).

When the was amended in 2016, the amendment was approved under your signature on behalf of Kansas Correctional Industries. Because the amendment did not involve a renegotiation of the contract, or new negotiated terms, the amendment will not "subject to the prohibitions contained in K.S.A. 46-233(a) and (b)." See Ethics Opinion Nos. 2000-48 and 2012-01.

Conclusion

Under the facts provided, you may immediately accept employment with the Union Supply Group and not violate the provisions of the Kansas governmental ethics laws, K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq*.

K.A.R. 60-11-116. Reinstatement of inactive or lapsed license. The proposed revision adds the language of inactive license to this regulation that covers reinstatement of a license. Prior to this revision the APRNs did not have the option of an inactive license, only to let their license lapse if not renewed. There is no economic impact difference to an APRN that reinstates an inactive or lapsed license. The cost of reinstatement is the same for a lapsed and an inactive license. There is no economic impact difference to the Board of Nursing for a reinstatement of an inactive vs. a lapsed license. The reinstatement application for an inactive license and a lapsed license is the same application. There is no economic impact on businesses or the general public.

K.A.R. 60-11-119. Payment of fees. The proposed revision adds language for fees for an inactive license and renewal of an inactive license. The economic impact of an inactive license for APRNs is a cost of \$20 vs. a lapsed license has no cost. An inactive license must be renewed every two years for a cost of \$20 and a lapsed license is not renewed. The economic impact to the Board of Nursing is the revenue of the inactive license and renewal of the inactive license. There is no economic impact on business or the general public.

K.A.R. 60-13-110. Reinstatement of inactive or lapsed authorization. The proposed regulation adds language of inactive status for a nurse anesthetist authorized to practice in Kansas who wishes to reinstate their authorization to practice. Prior to this revision the nurse anesthetists did not have the option of an inactive authorization, only to let their authorization lapse if not renewed. There is no economic impact difference to a nurse anes-

thetist that reinstates an inactive or lapsed authorization. The cost of reinstatement is the same for a lapsed and an inactive authorization. There is no economic impact difference to the Board of Nursing for a reinstatement of an inactive vs. a lapsed authorization. The reinstatement application for both is the same application. There is no economic impact on businesses or the general public.
