PROPOSED AIR QUALITY PERMIT

The Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment is proposing to issue an air quality permit to G.D.H. Partners, Newton, for installation and operation of a woodworking facility to be located at 831 S. Columbus, Newton. The permit would be issued in accordance with Kansas administrative regulation 28-19-14, Permits Required.

Estimates of emissions by the Bureau of Air Quality and Radiation Control (BAQRC) using federal emission factors have shown that the woodworking facility can be expected to meet applicable emission limits.

Opinion No. 89-75

Schools—Food Service Programs—Acceptance of Benefits of Federal Acts; Administration of Programs; Legal Expenses. Senator Frank D. Gaines, 16th District, Augusta, June 19, 1989.

Legal expenses for prosecuting a civil action against unfaithful employees incurred by a Child Care Food Program institution are not necessary to the planning, organizing and managing of a food service, and are therefore not reimbursable. Cited herein: K.S.A. 72-5113; 7 C.F.R. §§ 226.2, 226.4 (1988). MWS

Opinion No. 89-76

Cities of the Second Class—Mayor-Council Form of Government—Incompatibility of Officers Doctrine. Larry R. Baer, Halstead City Attorney, Newton, June 22, 1989.

The doctrine of incompatibility of offices precludes one person from holding the office of reserve police officer while at the same time serving as a city council member in a city of the second class having the mayor-council form of government. However, as stated in Attorney General Opinion No. 81-74, a person could hold the office of council member and still serve as a member of a volunteer fire department, as such volunteers are neither officers nor employees of the city for the purposes of the doctrine. Cities and Municipalities—Buildings, Structures and Grounds; Business Improvement Districts—Advisory Board; Incompatibility of Offices. Barry L. Arbuckle, Valley Center City Attorney, Wichita, June 23, 1989.

One individual may not hold a position as member of a business improvement district advisory board and a second office as member of the city governing body, for the two offices are incompatible. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-1781; 12-1788; 12-1790; 12-1791. TRH

Cities and Municipalities—Miscellaneous Provisions—City and County Service for Programs for the Elderly; Tax Levy; Proper Mill Levy Rate.

Townships and Township Officers—Miscellaneous Provisions—Tax Levies for Funds to Improve Township Roads; Proper Mill Levy Rate. Joseph O'Sullivan, Reno County Counselor, Hutchinson, June 23, 1989.

After the first year in which a tax is levied, the mill levy rate specified by voters pursuant to K.S.A. 12-1680 may be adjusted by the board of county commissioners, subject to the voter approved upper limit and other pertinent budgetary constraints.

Similarly, the mill levy rate established and approved pursuant to K.S.A. 80-1413 does not obligate the township board to henceforth levy the maximum approved rate. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-1680, 79-1802; 79-1945; 79-1964; 80-1413. TMN

A public hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Wednesday, August 9, at the office of the executive secretary of the Abstracters' Board of Examiners, 112 E. Bramley, Jetmore, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the Abstracters' Board of Examiners.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Joanne Clarke, Executive Secretary, Abstracters' Board of Examiners, 112 E. Bramley, Box 218, Jetmore, 67854. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

85-7-1. Examination fee. The fee for examination will increase from \$25 to \$35 per examination. Due to carryover balances being reduced during 1988 and 1989 budget years, the carryover needed for agency operations is falling too low. There will be no significant economic impact to private industry, governmental agencies or units of the general public.

This increase in fees is necessary to produce more receipts in the coming budget years.

85-6-1. Insurance. The amount of deductible on errors and omissions insurance policies shall be not more than a maximum amount which would be equal to 10 percent of the policy amount. Errors and omissions insurance must be in an amount of not less than \$25,000. There is no significant economic impact to private industry, governmental agencies or units of the general public.

85-4-1. License fees. The fee for obtaining an abstracter's license will increase from \$25 to \$35 per license. This is due to low carryover balances for the last two years. The carryover needed for agency operations is falling too low. This increase in fees is necessary to produce more receipts in the coming budget years. There will be no significant economic impact to private industry, governmental agencies or units of the general public. Fee increases will be passed on to customers. This will be a minimal charge.

Details of the Sale

Subject to the terms and conditions of the complete official notice of bond sale, dated as of June 27, 1989, prepared by the city of Wichita, Kansas, in connection with the bonds hereinafter described, sealed, written bids shall be received at the office of the mayor, first floor, City Hall, 455 N. Main, Wichita, until 10 a.m. C.D.T. on Tuesday, July 18, 1989, for the purchase of each of the series of bonds of the city hereinafter described. All bids shall be publicly opened, read aloud and considered on said date and at said time and shall be immediately thereafter acted upon by the governing body of the city at its regular meeting place in the City Council Room at City Hall.

The bonds to be sold are in the aggregate principal amount of \$16,820,000, and consist of Series 720 in the principal amount of \$8,185,000 and Series 721 in the principal amount of \$8,635,000. Each series of bonds shall be sold separately. Bidders may bid on either or both series of bonds, but must bid on the entire amount of a series. No oral or auction bids for the bonds shall be considered, and no bids for less than the entire amount of a series shall be considered.

Bids shall be accepted only on the respective official bid forms that have been prepared for these series of bonds, which may be obtained from the city's director of finance/city clerk. Bids may be submitted by mail or may be delivered in person and must be received at the place and no later than the date and time hereinbefore specified. Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check drawn on a bank located within the United States and made payable to the order of the city, and shall be in an amount equal to 2 percent of the principal amount of the series of bonds for which the bid is made.

Details of the Bonds

The bonds shall be issued as fully registered bonds in denominations of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding the principal amount maturing in each year. BOARD OF ACCOUNTANCY

PERMANENT ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Article 6.—ADDITIONAL OFFICES

74-6-2. Management of an Office. (a) Each office as defined by K.A.R. 74-6-1, and located in this state, shall have a resident manager in charge who is the holder of a current permit to practice as a certified public accountant issued by this state who devotes more than half of his or her working time to the affairs of that office.

(b) Each individual, partnership or professional corporation registered to practice in this state may, however, have one additional office which does not meet the resident manager requirement in (a) above, provided that:

(1) a permit-holding certified public accountant has direct supervision of the additional office as the resident manager, and oversees the planning, administration, direction, and review of the services being performed in that office;

(2) the additional office has a resident manager who is present at least two thirds of the hours the office is listed as being open; and

(3) the individual, partnership or professional corporation registers the additional office by writing the board, listing the name of the resident manager, and the days and hours the additional office will be advertised and open. STATE BOARD OF INDIGENTS' DEFENSE SERVICES

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Article 10.—SYSTEMS FOR PROVIDING LEGAL DEFENSE SERVICES FOR INDIGENT PERSONS

105-10-1. Public defender systems at the trial level. (a) The public defender office shall provide indigent felony and related defense services at the trial level in the following districts and in all other counties which are served by one of the following public defender offices by mutual agreement between the district administrative judge for that county and the board:

- (1) the third judicial district;
- (2) the eighth judicial district;
- (3) the tenth judicial district;
- (4) the eighteenth judicial district; and
- (5) the twenty-eighth judicial district.

(b) The conflicts attorney office shall provide indigent felony and related defense services at the trial level for those cases in Shawnee county that cannot be handled by the third judicial district public defender office due to potential conflicts of interest.

(c) In the public defender districts designated above, the trial court shall appoint the public defender to provide felony defense services in all felony and other cases set forth in K.A.R. 105-1-1(a) with the following exceptions:

- (1) If K.A.R. 105-10-2 requires the appointment of the state appellate defender;
- (2) if a conflict of interest will not permit the public defender to represent the defendant and the conflicts attorney office is not available; or
- (3) if the public defender office withdraws from the case as provided in K.A.R. 105-21-3.

(d) If one of the exceptions stated above prevents the appointment of the public defender, the court shall appoint an attorney as provided in K.A.R. 105-3-1 on a form approved by the board.

(e) This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1989. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4501 and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4503 and 22-4522; effective, T-86-33, October 23, 1985; effective May 1, 1986; amended November 1, 1988; amended T-105-6-22-89, July 1, 1989.)
