K.A.R. 63-1-4. Section (b) contains a language clarification regarding examinations, and section (c) has a grammatical change.

There is no fiscal impact expected from these changes. Copies of the regulations and their fiscal impact statements may be obtained from the agency upon written request. Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the board as the basis for making changes to these regulations.

The proposed permanent rules and regulations will become effective 45 days after their publication in the *Kansas Register* unless a specified date is contained in the regulation.

All interested persons may attend the hearing and will be given an opportunity to express comments either orally or in writing, or both. In addition, the period of at least 30 days notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed rules and regulations.

K.A.R. 4-7-510. Updates the federal standards for frozen dairy desserts adopted by reference to the January 1, 1989, edition.

K.A.R. 4-7-511. Establishes cooking requirements for homemade ice cream manufactured by licensed food service establishments.

K.A.R. 4-7-512. Establishes requirements for manufacture of homemade ice cream by licensed food service establishments.

K.A.R. 4-7-513. Establishes requirements for equipment used in manufacturing homemade ice cream.

Regarding the implementation of K.A.R. 4-7-510, 4-7-511, 4-7-512 and K.A.R. 4-7-513, there will be minimal, if any, fiscal or economic impact on this agency, other governmental agencies, individuals, private businesses or the general public.

A public hearing will be conducted from 10 to 11 a.m. Wednesday, December 27, in Room 108 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations 44-9-103, 44-9-104, 44-11-111, 44-11-112, 44-11-113, 44-11-114, 44-11-116, 44-11-121, 44-11-122, 44-11-123, 44-11-126, 44-11-128, 44-11-129, 44-11-130, 44-11-131, 44-11-132, 44-11-133, 44-11-134 and 44-11-135 of the Kansas Department of Corrections. These regulations will become effective 45 days after their publication in the *Kansas Register* unless a specific date is contained in the regulation. In addition, certain regulations may be revoked.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Roger Werholtz, Deputy Secretary, Kansas Department of Corrections, 4th Floor, Landon State Office Building, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to express their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to five minutes.

This 30-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

A summary of the regulations is as follows:

44-9-103. Clarifies the manner of parole supervision and the procedure for obtaining an override of the level of supervision.

44-9-104. Provides for amended categories of parole supervision, including the number of contacts a parole officer shall have with a parolee.

44-11-111. Defines terms used in regulations relating to the community corrections act.

44-11-112. Provides that advance grants for development of comprehensive plans shall be based on the experience of existing programs and the availability of planning funds.

44-11-113. Changes from July to January the time when primary correctional needs will be annually determined by the secretary of corrections.

44-11-114. Specifies information to be included in the budget for each program contained in the comprehensive plan.

44-11-116. Will be revoked.

44-11-121. Establishes time frames and requirements for quarterly financial reports regarding grant funds.

44-11-122. Changes the due date for submission of plans from December to May 1 of each year and provides for the secretary's action on the plan to be by June 30 rather than December 31.

44-11-123. Provides that amendments to plans or transfer of funds shall be based on specific dollar amount, not a percentage of grant funds.

44-11-126. Will be revoked.

(continued)

44-11-128. Will be revoked.

44-11-129. Changes from 30 to 60 days the period for the secretary to act on requests to transfers funds.

44-11-130. Establishes guidelines for the use of grant funds for real estate acquisition and capital construction and the disposition of property that ceases to be used for community corrections purposes.

44-11-131. Establishes guidelines for the use of grant funds to remodel or renovate space for community corrections use and the refunding of grant funds if the space ceases to be used for community corrections purposes.

44-11-132. Provides that grant funds may be used to contract for services.

44-11-133. Provides that grant funds may be used to purchase jail space and establishes guidelines for the use of such space.

44-11-134. Provides guidelines for the use of urinalysis tests for controlled substances.

44-11-135. Provides guidelines for the distribution to state agencies and community corrections programs of items created with community corrections funds.

These regulations provide for the receipt, expenditure, and accounting for grants received under the Community Corrections Act. The regulations are procedural in nature and in some instances are necessary in order to be in compliance with amendments to the Community Corrections Act contained in Chapter 92 of the 1989 *Session Laws of Kansas*. Grants to counties will be determined as provided by new Section 15, Chapter 92, 1989 *Session Laws of Kansas* and will be within appropriations made for the community corrections program. The regulations are not estimated to have any economic impact on governmental units, persons subject to proposed rules and regulations, or the general public, other than requiring community corrections programs, in some instances, to restructure their budgets to comply with the regulations.

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Wednesday, December 27, in the SRS board room, sixth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations on a temporary basis.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 Harrison, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a temporary basis and are scheduled to become effective January 1, 1990. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

The phrase "Federal Mandate" following an item indicates that the change is required by federal policy. Optional changes in regulations related to federal programs are subject to approval by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

30-4-101. Standards for persons in own home, other family home, specialized living, commercial board and room, or commercial room-only living arrangements. This regulation is being amended to reduce the basic standards by \$9.00 per person. This will also reduce the amount of the energy supplement contained within these standards to \$12.00 per person. These reductions are necessary because of shortfalls in the agency's budget for the remainder of fiscal year 1990.

Economic Impact: It is estimated that the reduction in basic standards will result in a decrease in expenditures for the remainder of fiscal year 1990 of \$3,968,257 (\$2,059,001 state general funds). If this reduction is carried for the entire calendar year, the total yearly savings would be \$7,936,514 (\$4,118,002 state general funds).

Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENTS FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM

30-5-58. Definitions. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-59. Provider participation requirements. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-60. Provider termination. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-62. Reinstatement of a provider previously terminated from the medicaid/medikan program. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-65. Filing limitations for medical claims. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-67. Disallowance of claims for services generated by providers ineligible for participation in the medicaid/medikan program. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-68. Fees for consultants to the medicaid/medikan program. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-70. Payment of medical expenses for eligible recipients. This regulation is being amended to delete references to the MediKan Program in all categories of services and related services: 30-5-111, adult care homes MediKan services; 30-5-112, local health department MediKan services; 30-5-113, advanced registered nurse practitioner MediKan services; 30-5-114, case management MediKan services; 30-5-115, hospice MediKan services; 30-5-116, rehabilitation MediKan services. Deleted MediKan categories are: 30-5-151, hospital services; 30-5-152, rural health clinic services; 30-5-154, community mental health center services; 30-5-156, physician services; 30-5-157, home health services; 30-5-158, pharmacy services; 30-5-159, dental services; 30-5-160, chiropractic services; 30-5-161, podiatric services; 30-5-162, psychological services; 30-5-163, hearing services; 30-5-164, ambulance services; 30-5-165, non-ambulance medical transportation; 30-5-166, durable medical equipment; 30-5-167, free-standing psychiatric facility services; 30-5-168, family planning; 30-5-169, partial hospitalization; 30-5-170, ambulatory surgical center services; 30-5-171, substance abuse services; and 30-5-172, optometric services. These deletions are necessary to eliminate reimbursement for MediKan services.

Economic Impact: It is estimated that this change will result in decreased expenditures for the remainder of fiscal year 1990 of \$4,702,996 (\$4,702,996 state general funds). For fiscal year 1991, the annualized savings to the state would be \$19,100,000 (\$19,100,000 state general funds).

30-5-71. Co-payment requirements. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-73. Requirements for facilities to participate. This

regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-81a. Participation in the diagnosis related group reimbursement system. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-82. Scope of rural health clinic services. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-89. Scope of home health services. This regulation is being amended to delete attendant care for independent living services for adults.

Economic Impact: Estimated cost savings of \$205,360 (\$102,680 state general funds).

30-5-94. Reimbursement for pharmacy services. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-101. Scope of chiropractic services. This regulation is being revoked so as to eliminate chiropractic services from the Medicaid Program.

Economic Impact: Estimated cost savings of \$80,000 (\$49,712 state general funds).

30-5-101a. Reimbursement for chiropractic services. This regulation is being revoked as it corresponds to K.A.R. 30-5-101, which is also being revoked.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-101.

30-5-103. Scope of podiatric services. This regulation is being revoked so as to eliminate podiatric services from the Medicaid Program.

Economic Impact: Estimated cost savings of \$130,000 (\$60,116 state general funds).

30-5-103a. Reimbursement for podiatric services. This regulation is being revoked as it corresponds to K.A.R. 30-5-103, which is also being revoked.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-103.

30-5-111. Screening, evaluation, and referral for adult care home services for persons ineligible to participate in the medicaid/medikan program. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-112. Scope of local health department services. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-113. Scope of advanced registered nurse practitioner and registered nurse anesthetist services. This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-114. Scope of targeted case management services.

This regulation is being amended to delete the references to the MediKan Program.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-5-170. Scope of services for ambulatory surgical centers for medikan program recipients.

30-5-171. Scope of substances abuse services for medikan program recipients.

30-5-172. Scope of optometric services for adult medikan program recipients.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

Article 6.—MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM— CLIENTS' ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION

30-6-65. Automatic eligibles. This regulation is being amended to eliminate automatic medical eligibility for adult general assistance (GA) clients who do not meet the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-77 regarding coverage of pregnant women. As the state MediKan Program is being eliminated effective January 1, 1990, due to shortfalls in the agency's budget for fiscal year 1990, medical assistance will not be available to GA clients.

Economic Impact: See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-5-70.

30-6-103. Determined eligibles; protected income levels. This regulation is being amended to reduce the protected income level for two or more persons in independent living arrangements and in the home- and community-based services program. The two person level is being reduced from \$475/month to \$460/month and the three person level is being reduced from \$480/month to \$465/month. For four or more persons, a reduction of \$9/month per person will occur as the protected income level for this group is based on the public assistance standards. These reductions are necessary in light of the reductions in the public assistance basic standards, which take effect January 1, 1990. (Federal Mandate.)

Economic Impact: It is estimated that this change will

result in decreased expenditures for the remainder of fiscal year 1990 of \$177,255 (\$79,764 state general funds). If this reduction is carried for the entire calendar year, the total yearly savings would be \$354,510 (\$156,765 state general funds).

This regulation is being further amended to reduce the poverty level standard for pregnant women and for infants under age one from 150 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines to 100 percent. This reduction is necessary because of shortfalls in the agency's budget for the remainder of fiscal year 1990.

Economic Impact: It is estimated that the reduction in the poverty level standard will result in a decrease in expenditures for the remainder of fiscal year 1990 of \$2,516,776 (\$1,112,919 state general funds). If this reduction is carried for the entire calendar year, the total yearly savings would be \$8,885,952 (\$3,998,678 state general funds).
