Notice of Kansas Volunteers  
for Literacy Grant Program

The Kansas Alliance for Literacy (KAL) announces the second year of the Kansas Volunteers for Literacy grant program. The State Librarian selected the Kansas Alliance for Literacy as the body to receive, review, evaluate and recommend funding proposals. The State Librarian recommends those choices to the State Library Advisory Commission.

The FY 1993 economic development investment fund (EDIF) funded 40 literacy programs for a \$7,000 average, or \$283,700. The EDIF grant funding supports the development and enhancement of Kansas volunteer literacy programs.

The 1994 Kansas Volunteers for Literacy grant program received a 1 percent cut to \$280,863. The grant program is a creative resource to assist both new and established volunteer literacy efforts. Typical grants will be between \$2,000 and \$10,000. Larger proposals will also be considered. Proposals should show a balance between funds requested and the number of volunteers and adult learners proposed or currently active.

Grant eligibility is open to any literacy program that uses or intends to use volunteers to promote adult literacy instruction *except* literacy programs receiving FY 1993 EDIF Kansas Volunteers for Literacy grants.

Send letter requesting a FY 1994 application to: Vikki Jo Stewart, P.O. Box 87, Andover 67002-0087. The deadline for submission of proposal is December 17. Rural communities are especially encouraged to apply.

The funding *will not* support paying salaries or administration and requires a 25 percent match, which may be in-kind. The funding may be used for materials for learners/volunteers, recruitment, promotion, research, hardware/software, basic supplies, innovative ideas regarding literacy, etc.

There will be no additional agency costs to other governmental agencies or units, costs to private citizens, or costs to consumers of the products or services subject to the regulation.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, November 18, at the Farmway Coop Building, 204 E. Court, Beloit, to consider the adoption of a department regulation. There will be a public comment period at the beginning of the meeting and additional comments may be taken during the meeting on agenda items.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. November 18 at the location listed above. The public also will be given the opportunity to comment on any items during the meeting. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m. then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. November 19 at the same location.

If notified in advance, the department will have an interpreter available for the hard of hearing. To contact the department for this or any other reason, members of the public with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777. All public meeting areas are accessible to those who are physically disabled.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulation. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulation.

Copies of the complete text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be obtained from the chairman of the commission at the address above.

The regulation which will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting is:

115-25-6. Turkey; spring season, bag limit, permits and game tags. This exempt regulation would establish the 1994 spring turkey season, bag limits, hunting units, permit numbers, game tags and the application process.

It is estimated that a total of 15,500 permits and 3,000 game tags would be issued resulting in department revenue of \$345,250. Approximately 75,000 recreational days would occur, thus providing benefit to certain businesses.

The proposed expanded facility will have the capacity for approximately 350 swine.

Wastewater Control Facilities: Wastewater will be impounded for subsequent application to agricultural land for beneficial use. Wastewater storage capacity is provided in excess of minimum requirements.

Compliance Schedule:

1. A livestock waste management plan for the facility shall be developed. The plan shall cover, but not be limited to, the following items: handling and disposal equipment for both solid and liquid wastes, land application practices used to protect against runoff and leaching, waste application rates based on crop nutrient utilization, and identification of adequate land areas for application of all wastes. ### Kansas Insurance Department

#### Permanent Administrative Regulations

##### Article 1.—GENERAL

**40-1-39. Insurance; endorsements and riders; change in coverage; consent of policyholder.** (a) No company, or company representative shall be permitted to add coverage to new, renewal, or existing policies if the insured or policyowner has not consented to additional coverage.

(b) This regulation does not apply if a coverage addition is:

- (1) Provided without any additional premium charge;
- (2) mandated by law; or
- (3) required by filings approved for the company's use. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, 40-2404a; implementing K.S.A. 40-443, 40-444, 40-941, 40-2403, K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-928, 40-1113, 40-2215; effective Nov. 29, 1993.)

**40-1-41. Insurance companies; managing general agents; management agreements or contracts; definitions; requirements; prohibitions.** (a) This regulation shall:

- (1) Apply to managing general agents as defined by K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2,130; and
- (2) not apply to administrators holding a certificate of registration pursuant to K.S.A. 40-3810, as amended.

(b) Definitions.

(1) "Payments" means amount paid to any person, organization or corporation pursuant to a management contract or agreement in excess of reimbursement of actual expenses.

(2) "Reimbursement" means amounts paid to any person, organization or corporation pursuant to a management contract or agreement to cover the costs or actual expenses incurred in procuring or otherwise managing the business of any insurer.

(c) Any management agreement or contract which provides for payments, other than reimbursement for actual expenses, in excess of the guidelines contained in subsections (c) through (g) of this regulation shall

be deemed by the commissioner of insurance to be in violation of K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2,132, as operating to the financial detriment of the insurer in such a manner as to endanger the financial stability of the insurer or otherwise be hazardous to policyholders and creditors of the insurer.

(d) No payment shall exceed reimbursement plus a percentage of the reimbursement equal to the percentage profit experienced by the company over the previous five years.

(e) Profit shall be calculated as follows:

(1) For property/casualty insurers—net income divided by premium earned;

(2) for life/health/accident insurers—net income divided by premium and annuity consideration, annuity and other fund deposits, and consideration for supplementary contracts; and

(3) for health maintenance organizations—net income divided by premium.

(f) For insurers with fewer than five years experience, the payments shall not exceed 15 percent of the actual expenses reimbursed.

(g) In no case shall the payments exceed 20 percent of the actual expenses reimbursed.

(h) No management agreement or contract shall allow for reimbursement based on a percentage of premium. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2,136; implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2,136; effective Nov. 29, 1993.)

#### Article 2.—LIFE INSURANCE

**40-2-23. Life insurance; preneed funeral contracts or arrangements; disclosure; requirements.** (a) This regulation shall apply to any solicitation, negotiation or procurement occurring within this state with respect to life insurance or annuity contracts used to fund a preneed funeral contract or arrangement. As used in this regulation, the term "preneed funeral contract or arrangement" shall mean an agreement by or for an individual before that individual's death relating to the purchase or provision of specific funeral or cemetery merchandise or services.

(b) The following information shall be adequately disclosed at the time an application is made, prior to accepting the applicant's initial premium, for a preneed funeral contract or arrangement:

(1) The fact that a life insurance policy or annuity contract is involved or being used to fund a preneed funeral contract or arrangement;

(2) the nature of the relationship between the soliciting agent or agents, the provider of the funeral or cemetery merchandise or services, the administrator and any other person. This requirement shall not apply to officers, directors or bonafide employees of the funeral home or cemetery to which the original preneed funeral contract or arrangement applies;

(3) the relationship of the life insurance policy or annuity contract to the funding of the preneed funeral contract or arrangement and the nature and existence of any guarantees relating to such contract or arrangement;

(4) the impact on the preneed funeral contract or arrangement:

(A) Of any changes in the life insurance policy or annuity contract including but not limited to, changes in the assignment, beneficiary designation or use of the proceeds;

(B) of any penalties to be incurred by the policyholder as a result of failure to make premium payments; and

(C) of any penalties to be incurred or monies to be received as a result of cancellation or surrender of the life insurance policy or annuity contract;

(5) a list of the merchandise and services which are applied or contracted for in the preneed funeral contract or arrangement and all relevant information concerning the price of the funeral services, including a clear disclosure that the purchase price is either guaranteed at the time of purchase or to be determined at the time of need;

(6) all relevant information concerning what occurs and whether any entitlements or obligations arise if there is a difference between the proceeds of the life insurance policy or annuity contract and the amount actually needed to fund the preneed funeral contract or arrangement; and

(7) any penalties or restrictions, including but not limited to geographic restrictions or the inability of the provider to perform, on the delivery of merchandise, services or the preneed funeral contract or arrangement guarantee.

(c) In accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 40-283a, the following requirements shall apply to premium financing arrangements between an insurer or agent and the insured for the first and any future premium payable on any life insurance policy or annuity contract sold to fund a preneed funeral contract or arrangement.

(1) Each premium financing arrangement and any renewal of such arrangement shall be signed by the applicant and shall include the total amount of the loan, the amount of any down payment made to an agent at the time of sale, and the unpaid balance.

(2) The policy shall contain a provision or endorsement which fully describes the financing arrangement.

(3) Upon delivery, a policy receipt or acceptance form shall be executed which states that the insured acknowledges and understands the provisions and obligations of the financial indebtedness incurred, including the fact that the premium financing arrangement cannot be effective for a term exceeding one year. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, 40-2404a; implementing K.S.A. 40-283a, K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2404(1); effective Nov. 29, 1993.)

#### Article 3.—FIRE AND CASUALTY INSURANCE

**40-3-10.** (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, 40-2404a; implementing K.S.A. 40-941, 40-1122, 40-928, 40-1113, 40-2403; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1986; revoked Nov. 29, 1993.)

**40-3-32. Fire and casualty insurance; modification of form filing requirements.** (a) Bond forms. Bonds which cannot practicably be filed before they are used

need not be filed with the commissioner if they are required by:

- (1) law;
- (2) court order; or
- (3) any federal, state or municipal government or agency.

(b) Marine or inland marine forms. Each marine or inland marine form which cannot practicably be filed before use need not be submitted for approval pursuant to K.S.A. 40-216. This exception shall not apply to marine or inland marine policy and endorsement forms that contain standardized wording.

(c) Aircraft hull or aircraft liability endorsement forms. Each aircraft hull or aircraft liability endorsement form which cannot practicably be filed before use need not be submitted for approval pursuant to K.S.A. 40-216. The exception shall not apply to aircraft hull or aircraft liability endorsement forms that contain standardized wording or that are so designated by the commissioner. The exception shall not apply to basic aircraft hull or aircraft liability insurance policies from the filing requirement of K.S.A. 40-216.

(d) Restrictive endorsements. Each fire and casualty endorsement or form used on an individual risk which restricts coverage otherwise applicable, shall be considered an increase in the rate otherwise applicable and considered as forms which cannot practicably be filed before they are used. Such forms shall be filed with the commissioner of insurance within 30 days after their effective date and shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 40-216. The disapproval of any form shall be effective as of the inception date of the policy to which it is attached and shall be deleted from the policy.

(e) Policy or endorsement form prescribed by committee on surety bonds and insurance. Each property and casualty policy or endorsement form specifically prescribed by the committee on surety bonds and insurance pursuant to K.S.A. 75-4109 need not be filed with the commissioner of insurance. The phrase "forms specifically prescribed by the committee on surety bonds and insurance" shall mean each property and liability policy, endorsement, or amendment, the exact wording for which is contained in an invitation for bids authorized by the committee.

(f) Each form submitted pursuant to this regulation shall be deemed approved unless disapproved by the commissioner within 30 days of receipt. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, 40-216; implementing K.S.A. 40-216; effective Jan. 1, 1968; amended Jan. 1, 1973; amended Jan. 1, 1974; amended May 1, 1975; amended May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1986; amended Nov. 29, 1993.)

**40-3-33. Same; basic property insurance; inspection; placement; procedures; requirements.** (a) Each insurer, as defined in section (b)(1), shall file a statement with the commissioner, pledging its full participation and cooperation in carrying out the plan established by this regulation.

(b) Definitions.

(1) "Insurer" means any insurance company or other organization licensed to write and engaged in writing property insurance business in this state on a direct basis, including the property insurance com-

ponents of multi-peril policies. This definition does not include insurers which elect not to participate.

(2) "Basic property insurance" means the coverage against direct loss to real and tangible personal property at a fixed location in an urban area that is provided in a basic fire policy with extended coverage perils and vandalism, including builders' risk. Basic property insurance does not include farm risks, automobile risks, or types of manufacturing risks excluded by the governing committee with the approval of the commissioner.

(3) "All-industry placement facility" or "facility" means the organization formed by insurers to assist applicants in urban areas in securing basic property insurance and to administer the Fair Access to Insurance Requirements (FAIR) plan and the joint reinsurance association.

(4) "Joint reinsurance association" means the association formed by the insurers which provides for the equitable distribution of risks.

(5) "Inspection bureau" means the rating bureau or other organization designated by the facility with the approval of the commissioner to make inspections as required under the plan and to perform other duties authorized by the facility.

(6) "Urban area" includes any municipality or other political subdivision of a state and any additional areas designated by the commissioner.

(7) "Premiums written" means gross direct premiums, excluding that portion of premium on risks ceded to the joint reinsurance association, charged during the second preceding calendar year with respect to property in this state on all policies of basic property insurance; and the basic property insurance premium components of all multi-peril policies, as computed by the facility, less return premiums, dividends paid or credited to policyholders, or the unused or unabsorbed portions of premium deposits.

(8) "Habitational" means basic property insurance included under the personal lines statistical plan other than automobile.

(9) "Commercial" means basic property insurance not included under the personal lines statistical plan other than automobile.

(10) "Property owner," with respect to any real, personal, or mixed real and personal property, means any person having an insurable interest in the property.

(11) "Person" includes any individual or group of individuals, corporation, partnership, association, or any other organized group of persons.

(12) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of insurance of the state of Kansas.

(13) "Servicing insurer" means an insurer designated by the governing committee to issue policies on behalf of the facility.

(14) "Fire division" means a building or structure eligible for separate rating in accordance with the rules filed with the commissioner by ISO Commercial Risk Services, Inc., or its successor.

(15) "Plan" means the system of providing insurance coverage through the all-industry placement facility and joint reinsurance association.

(continued)

(c) The manner and scope of the inspections of plan business shall be prescribed by the facility with the approval of the commissioner.

(d) An inspection report shall be made for each property inspected. The report shall cover pertinent structural and occupancy features as well as the general condition of the building and surrounding structures. Representative photographs of the property may be taken during the inspection.

(e) Within 12 business days after the inspection, a copy of the completed inspection report and any photograph indicating the pertinent features of the building, construction, maintenance, occupancy and surrounding property shall be sent promptly to the facility. A copy of the inspection report shall be made available to the applicant.

(f) If upon receipt of an application for coverage and the corresponding inspection report from the inspection bureau, the facility finds that the property is eligible for insurance under the plan, the facility shall assign the application to a servicing insurer.

(g) After assignment of an application to a servicing insurer as in (f) above, the facility shall apportion the liability so assumed to the insurers in the manner provided in section (u).

(h) Assessments upon each insurer in the plan for expenses in connection with plan business shall be levied and assessed by the governing committee of the facility in the manner provided in section (u), subject to such minimum assessment as shall be established by the governing committee.

(i) All servicing expenses, losses and loss adjustment expenses of a servicing insurer shall be recoverable from the facility in the manner and to the extent determined by the governing committee.

(j) The maximum limits of liability which may be placed through the plan are:

(1) On any habitational property in one fire division under one ownership, its insurable market value, actual cash value or \$200,000, whichever is less; and

(2) on any commercial property in one fire division under one ownership, its insurable market value, actual cash value or \$1,000,000, whichever is less. Maximum limits shall apply jointly to real and personal property.

(k) The facility shall, within 10 business days after receipt of the inspection report and application, complete an action report advising that:

(1) The risk is acceptable;

(2) the risk is acceptable at a surcharged rate and the facility shall attach a rate make-up statement, including the condition charge;

(3) the risk will be acceptable if the improvements noted in the action report are made by the applicant and acknowledged by the facility; or

(4) the risk is not eligible for the reasons stated in the action report.

(l) If a risk is declined because it fails to meet reasonable underwriting standards, the facility shall so notify the applicant. Factors to be considered when assessing whether a risk meets reasonable underwriting standards shall include the following:

(1) Physical condition of the property, including its construction, heating, wiring, evidence of previous fires or general deterioration; and

(2) its present use or housekeeping.

(m) If the risk is acceptable to the facility, the facility shall notify the applicant and the licensed producer designated by the applicant, of the name of the servicing insurer and the premium to be charged. The servicing insurer, upon receipt of the total premium, shall within five business days issue the policy to be effective at 12:01 a.m. of the effective date of coverage. The policy and any necessary copies shall be forwarded to the licensed producer for delivery. The servicing insurer shall pay the commission to the licensed producer designated by the applicant.

(n) In the event the risk is conditionally declined because the property does not meet reasonable underwriting standards but can be improved to meet the standards, the facility shall promptly advise the applicant of what improvements noted in the action report should be made to the property. Upon satisfactory completion of the improvements by the applicant or property owner and notification of the facility, the facility may have the property reinspected and shall then process the application in the manner described in subsection (m) above.

(o) If the inspection of the property reveals that there are one or more substandard conditions, surcharges may be imposed in conformity with filings approved by the commissioner.

(p) If the facility declines the risk, or agrees to write the coverage sought on the condition that the property will be improved, the facility shall promptly send a copy of both the inspection and action reports to the property owner and the commissioner. At the time the facility sends these reports to the property owner, it shall also explain the right to appeal the decision of the facility to the commissioner pursuant to subsection (z) of the plan and shall set forth in writing the procedures to be followed for the appeal.

(q) Any insurer, which is a member of a group of insurers under the same management or ownership, shall have the option of designating the insurer within the group to whom assignments shall be made as a servicing insurer.

(r) The servicing insurer shall cede to and the joint reinsurance association shall assume 100 percent of all policies written under the plan.

(s) A joint reinsurance association shall be created consisting of all insurers.

(t) Each insurer shall participate in the writings, expenses, profits and losses of the association in the following manner:

(1) For habitational risks, in the same proportion as its habitational premiums written bear to the aggregate habitational premiums written by all insurers in the plan; and

(2) for commercial risks, in the same proportion as its commercial premiums written bear to the aggregate commercial premiums written by all insurers in the plan.

(u) The association shall adopt a plan of operation and rules of procedure which, prior to being placed into

effect, shall be filed with and approved by the commissioner. Any amendments to the plan of operation or rules of procedure so adopted shall also be filed and approved by the commissioner prior to being placed into effect.

(v) All policies issued shall be for basic property insurance on the forms and in accordance with the rates and rating procedures approved by the commissioner for use with the plan. The policies shall be issued for a term of one year.

(w) A servicing insurer shall not cancel a policy or binder issued under the plan without approval of the governing committee.

(x) Each notice of cancellation of a policy or binder issued under the plan or notice of declination at expiration of a policy, together with a statement of the reason therefor, shall be sent to the insured and a copy sent to the agent. Any cancellation notice shall be sent not less than 30 days prior to the cancellation date. Any declination at expiration of a policy shall be sent not less than 30 days prior to expiration for habitational risks and not less than 60 days prior to expiration for commercial risks.

(y) Each notice of cancellation or declination at expiration to the insured relating to a policy or binder issued under the plan shall contain the procedures for obtaining an inspection under the plan and shall be accompanied by a statement that the insured has a right of appeal as provided in subsection (z) of this regulation.

(z) Any applicant may make a written appeal of a decision of the facility relating to the conditions for acceptance of coverage. This appeal shall be made to the commissioner within 30 days from the decision of the facility.

(aa) Other than as provided in subsection (z) above, any applicant or insurer shall have the right of appeal to the governing committee. A decision of the committee may be appealed in writing to the commissioner within 30 days from the action or decision of the committee.

(bb) Commissions under the plan shall be as determined by the governing committee and shall be paid to the licensed producer designated by the applicant. A servicing insurer may pay the applicable commission to an agent licensed for any property insurance company licensed by the state of Kansas.

(cc) This plan shall be administered by a governing committee of the facility, subject to the supervision of the commissioner, and operated by a manager appointed by the committee.

(dd) The governing committee shall have the authority to make and issue the operating rules necessary to implement this plan. The operating rules shall be subject to approval by the commissioner prior to their use.

(ee) The governing committee shall consist of seven insurers and two agents which shall be selected from each of the following:

- (1) Kansas association of property and casualty companies;
- (2) other non-stock companies;
- (3) other stock companies;
- (4) Kansas stock insurers;
- (5) alliance of American insurers;

(6) American insurance association;

(7) national association of independent insurers; and

(8) professional independent insurance agents of Kansas.

The three insurer associations shall designate their representatives to the committee. The two Kansas insurer groups shall designate their representatives in the manner mutually agreed upon by their respective companies. The agents' association shall designate its representatives to the committee. The "other stock companies" and "other non-stock companies" members of the committee shall be selected by the other seven representatives.

(ff) Representatives on the governing committee shall serve for a period of one year or until successors are elected or designated.

(gg) There shall be an annual meeting of the insurers and members of the governing committee on a date fixed by the committee.

(hh) A special meeting may be called at a time and place designated by the committee or upon the written request to the committee by 10 insurers, not more than one of which may be in a group under the same management or ownership.

(ii) Twenty days' written notice of the annual or special meeting shall be given by the committee to the insurers. A majority of the insurers shall constitute a quorum. Voting by proxy shall be permitted. Notice of any meeting shall be accompanied by an agenda for the meeting.

(jj) Any matter, including amendment of this plan, may be proposed and voted upon by mail provided this procedure is unanimously authorized by the members of the committee. If so approved by the committee, notice of any proposal shall be mailed to the insurers not less than 20 days prior to the final date fixed by the committee for voting thereon.

(kk) At any regular or special meeting at which the vote of the insurers is or may be required on any proposal including amendment to this plan, or any vote of the insurers which may be taken by mail on any proposal, the votes shall be cast and counted on a weighted basis in accordance with each insurer's premiums written. On any proposal deemed by the committee to relate exclusively to habitational or exclusively to commercial business, the votes shall be cast and counted on a weighted basis in accordance with each insurer's respective habitational or commercial premiums written. A proposal shall become effective when approved by at least two-thirds of the votes cast on this weighted basis.

(ll) Each amendment of the plan shall be subject to approval by the commissioner.

(mm) The committee shall meet as often as may be required to perform the general duties of administration of the plan or on the call of the commissioner.

(nn) The governing committee shall be empowered to appoint a manager, who shall serve at the pleasure of the committee, to budget expenses, levy assessments, disburse funds, and perform all other duties necessary or incidental to the proper administration of

(continued)

the plan. The adoption of, or substantive changes in, pension plans or employee benefit programs shall be subject to approval of insurers. Assessments upon each insurer shall be levied on the basis of its premiums written.

(oo) Annually, the manager shall prepare an operating budget which shall be subject to approval of the committee. This budget shall be furnished to the insurers after approval. Any contemplated expenditure in excess of, or not included in, the annual budget shall require prior approval by the committee.

(pp) The committee shall furnish to all insurers and to the commissioner an annual written report of operations. The form and detail of the report shall be determined by the committee.

(qq) The presence of seven members of the committee, at least five of whom shall be insurers, shall constitute a quorum.

(rr) The committee shall appoint an underwriting committee to review with the manager of the plan, risks which have been submitted for insurance and may appoint other committees as it may deem advisable.

(ss) The servicing insurers shall maintain records by policyholder, producer of record, and dates of coverage for each application received and assigned pursuant to subsection (f) of this regulation.

(tt) Each servicing insurer shall separately code and maintain separate statistics on business written in accordance with the foregoing plan and shall make reports thereon as may be required by the governing committee and the commissioner.

(uu) The manager shall submit annually, or at any other periods as may be designated by the commissioner, to the committee and the commissioner a report setting forth the number of requests for inspections, the number of risks inspected, the number of policies written, the number of risks conditionally accepted and reinspections made, the number of risks declined, and any other information as the commissioner may request. **40-3-50. Fire and casualty insurance; rating organizations; availability of rating information for individual insureds; charges, fees, conditions prohibited.** No rating organization or insurer shall impose any conditions or fees upon any insured or any authorized representative of such insured for information requested pursuant to K.S.A. 40-1117 that is specifically relevant to any experience modification factor which is used or may be used to determine an individual insured's workers compensation premium. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-1117; effective Nov. 29, 1993.)

#### Article 4.—ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

**40-4-2. Accident and sickness insurance policies; franchise plan; requirements.** (a) Forms for accident

and sickness insurance policies shall be approved for writing on a franchise plan when:

(1) Accident and sickness insurance on a franchise plan may be issued to:

(A) Three or more employees of any corporation, co-partnership, or individual employer, or any governmental corporation, agency or department; or

(B) 10 or more members of any trade or professional association, a labor union, or any other association that has been in active existence for at least two years when the association or union has a constitution or bylaws and is formed in good faith for purposes other than that of obtaining insurance; and

(2) Each person, with or without their dependents, will be issued the same individual policy form varying only as to amounts and kinds of coverage applied for, under an arrangement whereby the premiums on the policies may be paid to the insurer periodically by:

(A) The employer, with or without payroll deductions;

(B) the association for its members; or

(C) some designated person on behalf of the employer or association.

(b) The term "employees" includes the officers, managers, employees and retired employees of the employer and the individual proprietor or partners if the employer is an individual proprietor or partnership. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2203(G); implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 40-2215; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended May 1, 1986; amended Nov. 29, 1993.)

#### Article 5.—CREDIT INSURANCE

**40-5-12. Consumer credit insurance; termination of coverage; prohibited contractual provisions.** (a) A policy or certificate of consumer credit insurance as defined in K.S.A. 16a-4-103, that may be issued, delivered, renewed or continued within or outside this state covering residents of this state, shall not contain provisions which permit coverage to be terminated by the insurer with respect to any policyholder, certificate holder or other insured person unless:

(1) The policy or certificate is formally and specifically terminated;

(2) the insured and any affected certificate holder is provided not less than ten days written notice of termination; and

(3) any unearned premium is returned to the borrower or credited to the account of the consumer as required by K.S.A. 16a-4-108.

(b) The restrictions imposed by section (a) of this regulation shall not apply with respect to transactions permitted or required by K.S.A. 16a-4-108. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; 16a-4-112; implementing K.S.A. 16a-4-203; effective Nov. 29, 1993.)

 "CASH HARVEST"

**111-4-522. Name of game.** The Kansas Lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Cash Harvest" commencing on or after September 30, 1993. The specific rules for the "Cash Harvest" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-522 through 111-4-525. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-4-93, Sept. 24, 1993.)

**111-4-523. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Cash Harvest" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in WGI Symbol Font 15. A game symbol appears in the "YOUR SYMBOL" area, in the "PRIZE" area and in each of four play spots within the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: \$1.<sup>00</sup> — \$5.<sup>00</sup> — 10.<sup>00</sup> — 50.<sup>00</sup> — \$500\$ — and images of a sunflower, a tractor, a pumpkin, a chicken, a silo, a milk bottle, a pail, a cow, a pitch fork, and a barn.

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is a 10-digit number which appears under the latex covering on the front of each instant ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit

book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the front of each instant game ticket.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a two letter code printed and appearing in two of five varying locations among the game symbols in the play area. The codes and their meanings are as follows: CC = \$1.00; DD = \$2.00; EE = \$3.00; KK = \$5.00; BB = \$10.00; GG = \$15.00. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-4-93, Sept. 24, 1993.)

**111-4-524. Determination of instant prize winners.** An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering play areas entitled "YOUR SYMBOL," "PRIZE," AND "LUCKY NUMBERS," to reveal the game symbols and captions in the play area. If any of the four numbers in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area matches the number in the "YOUR SYMBOL" area, the player wins the amount shown in the "PRIZE" area. Two matches of "YOUR SYMBOL" in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area doubles the amount of the prize shown. Three matches of "YOUR SYMBOL" in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area triples the amount of the prize shown. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710(b), (c) & (i); implementing K.S.A. 74-8710(b), (c) & (i) and 74-8720 (b) & (d); effective, T-111-10-4-93, Sept. 24, 1993.)

**111-4-525. Number and value of instant prizes.**

(a) There will be approximately 2,400,000 tickets ordered for this instant game. The expected number and value of the instant prizes are as follows:

**111-4-526. Name of game.** The Kansas Lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Holiday Bonus" commencing on or after November 8, 1993. The specific rules for "Holiday Bonus" are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-526 through 111-4-530. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-4-93, Sept. 24, 1993.)

**111-4-527. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Bonus" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the game area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. On this instant ticket, there are three separate games with game symbols printed in black ink imaged in "WGI Symbol Font 15" with matching captions in "WGI Cap Font." The games are "Match 3," "Quick Cold Cash" and "Bonus Play." A game symbol appears in each of six play spots within the "Match 3" game play area, in two play spots in the "Quick Cold Cash" play area and in one play spot in the "Bonus Play" play area. The game symbols for "Match 3" are \$2.<sup>00</sup>, \$5.<sup>00</sup>, 10.<sup>00</sup>, 20.<sup>00</sup>, \$200\$ and 20000. It is hereby agreed that the grain herein described has been graded as provided by law and may be stored with other grain of the same grade; that this grain is stored under all the rights, powers, privileges and duties provided by chapter 34, article 2 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated. This grain is fully covered by fire, lightning, tornado and internal explosion insurance. The storage, insurance, elevation and other charges on said grain shall be governed by the published schedule of charges, which includes any legal change, in effect during the period from date of receipt of the grain until sold or delivered to the above named depositor or his order." (b) For municipal solid waste landfills disposing of less than 100 tons per day of any combination of household, commercial, or industrial waste, based on an annual average, the effective implementation date for 40 CFR Part 258 shall be April 9, 1994, unless otherwise specified. 
