The Kansas Water Authority will meet November 2-3 at the Seward County Activity Center in Liberal. The Authority will meet at 1 p.m. November 2 as a committee of the whole to discuss background on current policy issues in the Kansas Water Plan which are up for revision. The Authority will provide direction to the Kansas Water Office on whether to proceed with developing new drafts of policy subsections pertaining to flooding, water quality, education and water rights. Such drafts would be reviewed by the Authority in January.

The Authority also will deliberate and make recommendations on the expenditures from the State Water Plan Fund for fiscal year 1996 as part of its annual report to the Governor and the Legislature. Six agencies have requested \$28.9 million in expenditures for water programs and projects. The State Water Plan Fund is expected to have about \$18.3 million available in FY 1996. The Authority may also take action on any contracts intended to implement the Kansas Water Plan in FY 1995, including possible contracts to purchase additional storage in federal reservoirs.

The chairpersons of the 12 Basin Advisory Committees will meet in conjunction with the Authority meeting and are scheduled to meet with the Authority on a variety of water issues. The Authority will convene as the full Kansas Water Authority to take official action on items at 10 a.m. November 3.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency

Public Notice

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 7 proposes to issue a written exemption from the Acid Rain Program permit and monitoring requirements to the following plants in the state of Kansas, pursuant to the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments *Title IV Acid Deposition Control*, and implementing regulations found in the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40, Parts 72 through 78. Under the Acid Rain Program regulations (40 CFR 72.7), utilities may petition EPA for an exemption from permitting and continuous emission monitoring for any new utility unit that serves one or more generators with total nameplate capacity of 24 MW or less and burns only fuels with a sulfur content of 0.05 percent or less by weight. The effective date of the exemption would be from January 1, 1995 through December 31, 1999.

The owners and operators of each exempt unit have not been allocated allowances under the Acid Rain Program. On the earlier of the date, a unit exempted under 40 CFR 72.7 that burns any fuel with a sulfur content in excess of 0.05 percent by weight, or 24 months prior to the date the unit first serves one or more generators with total nameplate capacity in excess of 25 MW, shall no longer be exempted under this section and shall be subject to all permitting and monitoring requirements of the Acid Rain Program.

The EPA proposes to issue written exemptions to the following plants in the state of Kansas:

Chanute 3 units 12 and 13, owned and operated by the city of Chanute. The designated representative for Chanute 3 is Robert Walker.

The city of Girard power station units 2101-1119, 2012-1147, VO3572, and VO3393, owned and operated by the city of Girard. The designated representative for Girard is William W. Crawford.

Holton municipal power plant unit 11, owned and operated by the city of Holton. The designated representative for Holton is Bradley J. Mears.

Horton power plant units 1 and 2, owned and operated by the city of Horton. The designated representative for Horton is Theodore M. Hauser.

Kingman power station unit 9, owned and operated by the city of Kingman. The designated representative for Kingman is Ira M. Hart III.

The city of Mulvane units 7 and 8, owned and operated by the city of Mulvane. The designated representative for Mulvane is Gary Rambo.

Osborne municipal light plant units 4-CAT and 5-CAT, owned and operated by the city of Osborne. The designated representative for Osborne is Norman B. Christie.

Russell municipal power and light units 11 and 12, owned and operated by the city of Russell. The designated representative for Russell is Earl Homewood.

Sabetha municipal power plant unit 11, owned and operated by the City of Sabetha. The designated representative for Sabetha is Ted L. Hayden.

The EPA is issuing the above-described exemptions as direct final actions and is simultaneously proposing the above-described exemptions as draft exemptions for public comment.

Comments on any of the exemptions must be received within 30 days after the date this notice is published or the date on which a similar notice is published in the Federal Register, whichever is later. If no adverse comments are timely received on an exemption, that exemption will automatically become final on the 40th day after the later publication date. If adverse comments are timely received on an exemption, that exemption will be withdrawn as a direct final action, and all public comment received on the exemption will be addressed in a subsequent final action based on the relevant draft exemption.

Any comments must be submitted in duplicate and must identify the action to which the comments apply, the commenter's name, address, and telephone number. All relevant, timely comments will be considered, but not comments pertaining to issues not relevant to the exemption, such as the environmental effects of acid rain. Comments, requests for a public hearing, and requests to receive notice of future actions must be sent to William A. Spratlin, Director, Air and Toxics Division, EPA Region 7, 726 Minnesota Ave., Kansas City, KS 66101.

Any person who requests a public hearing must state the issue proposed to be raised in the hearing. The EPA will evaluate any request and conduct a hearing if it finds that a hearing will contribute to the decision-making process by clarifying significant issues affecting the exemption.

Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES

RULES FOR INSTANT GAME NO. 81
"CASH HARVEST"

111-4-620. Name of game. The Kansas Lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Cash Harvest" commencing on or after September 26, 1994. The specific rules for the "Cash Harvest" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-620 through 111-4-623. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-4-621. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Cash Harvest" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in WGI Symbol Font 15. A game symbol appears in "YOUR SYMBOL" area, in the "PRIZE" area and in each of four play spots within the "LUCKY SYMBOLS" area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: \$1.00 - \$5.00 - 10.00 - 50.00 - \$500\$ - and images of a sunflower, a tractor, a pumpkin, a chicken, a silo, a milk bottle, a pail, a cow, a pitch fork, and a barn.

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is a 10-digit number which appears under the latex covering on the front of each ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book

number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the front of each instant game ticket.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a two letter code printed and appearing in two of five varying locations among the game symbols in the play area. The codes and their meanings are as follows: CC = \$1.00; DD = \$2.00; EE = \$3.00; KK = \$5.00; BB = \$10.00; GG = \$15.00. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-4-622. Determination of instant prize winners. An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering play areas entitled "YOUR SYMBOL," "PRIZE," and "LUCKY SYMBOLS" to reveal the game symbols and captions in the play area. If any of the four symbols in the "LUCKY SYMBOLS" area matches the symbol in the "YOUR SYMBOL" area, the player wins the amount shown in the "PRIZE" area. Two matches of "YOUR SYMBOL" in the "LUCKY SYMBOLS" area doubles the amount of the prize shown. Three matches of "YOUR SYMBOL" in the "LUCKY SYMBOLS" area triples the amount of the prize shown. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i); implementing K.S.A. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i) and 74-8720(b) and (d); effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-4-623. Number and value of instant prizes. (a) There will be approximately 1,800,000 tickets ordered for this instant game. The expected number and value of the instant prizes are as follows:

(b) The executive director may terminate the sale of tickets prior to the complete sale of all tickets. In this event, the number and value of prizes will be approximately proportional to the number of tickets actually sold.

(c) All prizes are subject to deductions provided by law. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710(b), (c) & (f); implementing K.S.A. 74-8710(b), (c) & (f); and 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

**Article 5.—KANSAS LOTTO AMERICA
GAME RULES**

111-5-34a. Powerball doubler promotion. (a) The "Powerball Doubler Promotion" is a limited extension of the "Powerball" game and is conducted in accordance with the Powerball game rules and applicable on-line generic rules contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* The promotion will begin with the third drawing after the August 31, 1994, drawing which follows a jackpot win, and will continue for a total of eight drawings. The promotion will offer to the owners of a qualifying play a chance to double the amount of any cash set prize won in a drawing held during the promotion.

(b) A qualifying play is any play included in a five-play or five-board ticket which contains at least five plays at a total cost of \$5 eligible for a single drawing held during the eight-drawing promotion. The five-play or five-board ticket eligible for a single drawing held during the promotion may be part of a multiple draw play.

(c) A qualifying play which wins one of the eight cash set prizes (paying \$1 through \$100,000) will pay double if, in a separate random drawing announced during the live "Powerball" drawing, the "Double Prize" chance is selected.

(d) MUSL will conduct an additional random "Double Prize" drawing and announce results during each of the regular "Powerball" drawings held during the promotion. The "Double Prize" drawings will be designed to guarantee that, at least once during the promotion, the set prizes will be doubled. The probability of the set prizes being doubled during each drawing of the promotion will never be greater than one in eight. On the first drawing of the promotion, the probability of the set prizes being doubled will be one in eight. If the prizes are not doubled during the first drawing, then on the second drawing of the promotion, the probability of the set prizes being doubled will be one in seven. The probability of the set prizes being doubled will be reduced for each drawing during the promotion until the "Double Prize" chance is selected. Once the "Double Prize" chance is selected, the drawing process will start over with the probability of the "Double Prize" chance being selected at one in eight. The probability of the "Double Prize" chance being selected during the promotion is as follows:

(e) The payment of double prizes shall be made from the MUSL "Set Prize Reserve Account." If the total of the regular set prizes and the doubled set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the set prizes, plus the doubled amounts, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes, including the doubled prizes, awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order: (i)

the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any; (ii) an amount from the "Set Prize Reserve Account," if available in the account, not to exceed twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) per drawing for all MUSL members. If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded, including the doubled prizes, then the highest set prize, including the doubled prize, shall become a parimutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a parimutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize shall become a parimutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become parimutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-8-25-94, Aug. 19, 1994; amended, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

Article 7.—CASH LOTTO GAME RULES

"TOUCHDOWN TO LAS VEGAS DRAWING"

111-7-106. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a Club Keno ticket drawing entitled "Touchdown to Las Vegas." Entries may be made at locations identified in K.A.R. 111-7-109 starting September 9, 1994, and the drawing will take place on Tuesday, November 1, 1994, at 10:00 a.m. at the Kansas lottery headquarters, 128 N. Kansas, Topeka, Kansas 66603. Applicable rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.*, and 111-7-106 through 111-7-112. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-7-107. Prerequisites for a drawing. Before the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" may be validly conducted, a location and a receptacle or drum must be approved by the executive director or his designee and the drawing must be open to the public. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-7-108. Prizes. (a) The winner selected at the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" specified in K.A.R. 111-7-106 shall receive a prize of a trip for two to Las Vegas including air fare, hotel accommodations for two nights, game tickets for the Kansas State v. University of Nevada at Las Vegas football game on November 26, 1994, and \$500.00 cash. The flight departs from Kansas City on November 25, 1994, and returns November 27, 1994. All prize awards are subject to lottery validation, set offs and deductions provided by law.

(b) The retailer selling the winning ticket for the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" shall receive two season tickets for the 1994-1995 Kansas State men's basketball season. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-7-109. Entry into drawing. Entry into the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

(a) Obtain a valid Club Keno Kansas on-line lottery ticket;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with Club Keno game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the on-line game rules;

(c) Only non-winning Club Keno tickets are eligible to win the drawing. Each individual ticket shall constitute one entry whether it is a \$1.00 single play ticket, a multiple dollar ticket or a multi-draw ticket.

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) Entries into the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" by holders of non-winning tickets may be made as follows:

(1) Players may take non-winning tickets with the completed information on the back of the ticket to any participating Manhattan or Junction City lottery retailer location and place them in the receptacle provided. Receptacles will be picked up by lottery representatives by October 28, 1994.

(2) Players may also enter by mailing entries to "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing," c/o Kansas Lottery, P.O. Box 7777, Lawrence, Kansas 66045-7777. Mailed entries must be received by 5:00 p.m. on or before Monday, October 31, 1994.

(3) Receptacles will also be available at Kansas lottery sponsored remotes and special events including the Kansas State Fair between September 9, 1994 and October 28, 1994.

(f) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(g) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate time listed in K.A.R. 111-7-106.

(h) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-7-110. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" envelopes at the United States Post Office in Lawrence on a daily basis and transport it to the mail room where the envelopes will be opened and non-winning entry tickets placed in a drum or receptacle. Following each deposit of tickets in the drum or receptacle, the security person making the deposit shall reseal the drum or receptacle.

(b) The selection process shall be held at 10:00 a.m. on the date established in K.A.R. 111-7-106. The drawing shall be held at lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and be open for public attendance and with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) Prior to the drawing the drum or receptacle shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum ten (10) times, if a drum is used, or by mixing the content

with a shovel or by other means for at least two minutes if another type receptacle is used.

(d) The selection of the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" winner shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the executive director, using a bare arm technique, removing one ticket from the contents of the receptacle or drum. Lottery security shall review the ticket selected to determine whether it is a valid non-winning ticket and the name is determined to be legible. If it is a valid non-winning ticket and the name is legible, the name shall be announced to the audience.

(e) The named person need not be present at a drawing, but must in any event provide proper identification in order to claim the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" prize.

(f) The person whose ticket has been drawn from the receptacle or drum shall be determined the "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" winner.

(g) The winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery.

(h) If the ticket is not a valid ticket, is a winning ticket, or the name on the ticket is not legible, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a winner is selected. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-7-111. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security and by an auditor.

(b) The executive director or the senior lottery official present shall designate a lottery staff person to serve as an auditor to perform the necessary services.

(c) Upon completion of the drawing, the designated lottery security person and the auditor shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of the prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

111-7-112. Ticket disqualification. Any non-winning Kansas Club Keno lottery ticket entered into a "Touchdown to Las Vegas Drawing" which is not drawn shall not be eligible for any other Kansas lottery promotions. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-29-94, Sept. 9, 1994.)

Administrative Interpretation No. 1004
Guaranteed Auto Protection (GAP)

There have been requests to permit the sale of a financial product called Guaranteed Auto Protection (GAP) to provide assurance there will be no deficiency balance against a consumer in the event physical damage insurance does not pay the consumer's debt in full when the consumer has experienced a total loss of the consumer's vehicle. It has been determined in other states that this GAP product is not an insurance product, therefore no filings of coverage or rates need be filed with the Kansas Insurance Department.

To avoid including the cost of this product in the finance charge, certain criteria must be met. K.S.A. 16a-2-501(1)(d) states, "charges for other benefits, including insurance, conferred on the consumer, if the benefits are of value to the consumer and if the charges are reasonable in relation to the benefits, are of a type which is not for credit, and are excluded as permissible additional charges from the finance charge by rules and regulations adopted by the administrator."

This subsection refers to regulation 75-6-9, which states, "Additional charges. (a) The charges enumerated in K.S.A. 16a-2-501(1)(d) shall be considered to be "additional charges in connection with a consumer credit transaction" if such charges:

(1) are made under conditions which permit their exclusion from the definition of "finance charge" under the provisions of K.S.A. 16a-1-301(18)(b)(iii); and

(2) are payable to a third party who is not related to the creditor.

(b) Additional charges shall be deemed to be "in connection with a consumer credit transaction," as used in K.S.A. 16a-2-501 and subsection (a) of this regulation if:

(1) in relation to insurance premiums, the creditor or a person related to the creditor receives a commission on any insurance sold on the same day on which the consumer credit transaction was consummated; or

(2) in relation to all other additional charges, such charges are made for goods and/or services rendered within one month prior to or after the consummation of the consumer credit transaction."

To determine whether the benefits are of value to the consumer and the charges are reasonable in relation to the benefits, this administrative interpretation will set forth minimum standards and acceptable charges to meet this test required by statute.

1. The GAP product may only be sold on loans that:
 - a. have the original loan-to-value ratio greater than 90 percent (excluding the cost of "GAP");
 - b. the consumer signs or initials authorization that the consumer wishes to purchase product and it is optional;
 - c. have the price of the product clearly disclosed as an additional charge in the disclosure portion of the loan; and
 - d. have no other substantial collateral securing the loan except the vehicle being guaranteed under the GAP product.

2. The GAP product must:

- a. follow the loan if the loan is sold or assigned with no subrogation rights against the consumer;
- b. have a 30-day unconditional consumer right to cancel with a full refund;
- c. provide coverage for at least \$500 of consumers property insurance deductible;
- d. provide coverage for all physical damage claims that constitute a total loss under the consumer's auto insurance policy;
- e. have the only reason for non-payment in the event of a physical damage total loss be the consumer's failure to maintain physical damage coverage on the vehicle; and
- f. have the price and contract form of the product registered and annually approved by the Consumer Credit Commissioner on or before January 1 of each year. Annual actuarial reports shall be provided to the commissioner at the same time providing at least the following information:

1. total dollar amount and number of contracts written in Kansas to date and for the preceding fiscal year ending no earlier than September 30;

2. total dollar amount and number of claims paid during the preceding fiscal year;

3. sales and administrative expenses of the program for the preceding fiscal year; and

4. certification by an authorized company representative that the provided information is accurate.

The initial maximum allowable charge for this GAP product will be as follows:

1. loans less than \$5,000 - 1 percent of the amount financed;

2. loans from \$5,000 to \$10,000 - 2 percent of the amount financed; and

3. loans over \$10,000 - 3 percent of the amount financed up to a maximum of \$400.

Any changes in the approved price will be provided in writing to the companies registered to sell this product 60 days prior to the effective date of the price change.

The commissioner does find value in this GAP product to consumers that for various reasons are required to finance a significant portion of the purchase price of the vehicle. It is the intent of this administrative interpretation to provide consumers additional protection from accelerated depreciation on motor vehicles which could cause economic loss and hardship in the event a physical damage loss covered by casualty insurance does not provide funds adequate enough to repay the consumer's loan in full. Similar products not meeting these minimum requirements will need to be included in the finance charge and disclosed accordingly.

RegulationsArticle 7.—KANSAS COMMUNITY
SERVICES PROGRAM

110-7-1. Definitions. For the purpose of these regulations, the following terms shall have the meanings provided herein, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

(a) "Business firm" means:

(1) any business entity authorized to do business in the state of Kansas which is subject to the state income tax imposed by the provisions of the Kansas income tax act;

(2) any national banking association, state bank, trust company or savings and loan association paying an annual tax on its net income pursuant to article 11 of chapter 79 of the Kansas statutes annotated; or

(3) any insurance company paying an annual tax on its net income pursuant to article 28 of chapter 40 of the Kansas statutes annotated.

(b) "Community service organization" means any organization performing community service in Kansas which:

(1) is exempt from income taxation under the provisions of section 501(c)3 of the federal internal revenue code;

(2) is incorporated in the state of Kansas or another state as a nonstock, non-profit corporation;

(3) has been designated as a community development corporation by the United States government under the provisions of title VII of the economic opportunity act of 1964; or

(4) is chartered by the United States congress.

(c) "Community service program."

(1) Community service program means a program in which activities are conducted that meet a demonstrated community need and that are designed to achieve one or more of the targets for change identified on pages 23-68 of the report to the 1992 Kansas legislature by the special committee on children's initiatives, entitled "A Blueprint for Investing in the Future of Kansas Children and Families," as filed December, 1991, which is hereby adopted by reference. The targets for change which are set forth in the blueprint include:

(A) greater support to children and their families;

(B) invest in young children ages 0-5;

(C) restructure schools to respond to changing educational and developmental needs of children;

(D) improve the physical health and mental health status of children;

(E) modify service delivery systems;

(F) make business a partner; and

(G) reduce high risk behavior in children and families.

(2) Each community service program shall be approved by local planning councils prior to submittal to Kansas department of commerce & housing.

(d) "Crime prevention" means any nongovernmental activity which aids in the prevention of crime in an impoverished area.

(e) The term "health care services" shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

(1) services provided by:

(A) local health departments;

(B) city, county or district hospitals;

(C) city or county nursing homes; or

(D) other residential institutions;

(2) preventive health care services offered by a community service organization, including:

(A) immunizations;

(B) prenatal care;

(C) home health care services which enable postponement of entry into nursing homes; and

(3) community-based services, including:

(A) services for persons with a disability;

(B) mental health services;

(C) indigent health care;

(D) physician or health care worker recruitment;

(E) health education;

(F) emergency medical services;

(G) services provided by rural health clinics;

(H) integration of health care services;

(I) home health services; and

(J) services provided by rural health networks.

(f) "Department" means the Kansas department of commerce and housing (KDOC&H).

(g) "Director" means the director of community development of KDOC&H.

(h) "Proposal" means the act by a non-profit organization of putting forth a proposed program for carrying out a specific project consistent with the Kansas community services program act, L. 1994, Chapter 38.

(i) "Rural community" means:

(1) any city having a population of fewer than 15,000 located in a county that is not part of a standard metropolitan statistical area as defined by the United States department of commerce or its successor agency;

(2) any city having a population of fewer than 15,000 located in a county defined as a standard metropolitan statistical area, if a substantial number of persons in such county derive their income from agriculture; and

(3) any city in a county defined as a standard metropolitan statistical area which is the only city in its county that has a population that exceeds 15,000. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1994, Chap. 38, Sec. 5; effective, T-110-9-1-94, Sept. 1, 1994; effective Dec. 5, 1994.)

110-7-2. Submission of proposals. (a) Each proposal shall be made on an application form prescribed by the department. The department may request any additional information the department determines to be necessary to evaluate a proposal or plan.

(continued)

(b) A proposal shall be approved by the director for a period of one year. To continue eligibility for tax credit in future years, a new application and current documentation shall be required.

(c) Proposals shall be accepted for consideration during a specified period which will be announced by the director for the tax year 1994. If tax credits remain from the 1995 state fiscal year another specified period for accepting proposals shall be announced prior to the end of the fiscal year. Future periods in which proposals will be accepted for consideration shall be announced by the director, as determined by the availability of tax credits.

(1) The program year shall coincide with the state fiscal year for all projects which shall begin July 1 and end June 30.

(2) Proposals may be accepted at other times during the year at the discretion of the director.

(d) For each proposal submitted, a prompt reply acknowledging receipt shall be provided to the applicant by the director.

(e) Contents of proposals.

(1) Each proposal shall address at least one of the following areas in order to qualify for approval.

(A) The proposed project shall meet a demonstrated community need related to one or more of the targets for change set forth in "A Blueprint for Investing in the Future of Kansas Children and Families."

(B) The proposed project shall aid in the prevention of crime in an impoverished area.

(C) The proposed project shall contribute to health care services.

(2) Each proposal shall set forth:

(A) the project to be conducted;

(B) why the project is needed;

(C) the estimated amount to be invested in the project; and

(D) the plans for implementing the project.

(3) Each proposal shall set forth the following impact measurements of the project.

(A) The proposal shall estimate the number of individuals who will benefit from the proposed project.

(B) The proposal shall identify the population group in society which will benefit from this project, including but not limited to women, children, the elderly, or teenage mothers. The proposal shall also set forth historical data on the targeted group that supports the need for services which will be provided by the proposed project.

(C) The proposal shall describe the community needs the proposed project will benefit, including but not limited to care of the elderly, crime prevention or prevention of teenage suicide.

(D) The proposal shall address the impact of the project on society, with projected statistical results. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1994, Chap. 38, Sec. 5; effective, T-110-9-1-94, Sept. 1, 1994; effective Dec. 5, 1994.)

110-7-3. Review of proposals. (a) Approval or disapproval of each proposal shall be based on the following criteria.

(1) The non-profit organization submitting the proposal shall demonstrate its capability to adequately administer the project.

(2) There shall be a demonstrated need for the program in the area within which the project is to be carried out.

(3) A proposal which was granted approval for the previous program year, and is being submitted for approval for the current program year shall be evaluated on the performance of the project in the previous year or years, and the continued need for the project.

(4) An independent audit of the non-profit organization's financial records shall accompany each proposal.

(b) A project shall not be approved if the proposal does not include a written endorsement of the agency of local government or planning council within the area in which the project is to be provided.

(c) Within 90 days after submission, the applicant shall be notified by the director of the disposition of the submitted proposal.

(d) Only those contributions which are cash contributions shall be eligible for tax credit provided in K.A.R. 110-7-4.

(e) Each applicant who submits a proposal that is approved shall file an annual report on or before June 30, specifying:

(1) the amount of tax credit which was utilized in the prior fiscal year;

(2) the actual dollars utilized by the project; and

(3) a complete list of contributors and the amount of each contribution.

(f) Selection committee.

(1) There shall be a selection committee comprised of three members appointed by the director.

(2) The selection committee shall review each application and recommend approval or disapproval to the director.

(g) Priority.

(1) In making recommendations for approval or disapproval to the director, the selection committee shall give priority to proposals from non-profit organizations who solicit cash contributions from business firms that contribute above and beyond the firm's average annual charitable contribution for the preceding three tax years. All other proposals shall be considered equally.

(2) In order to receive approval priority, the non-profit organization submitting a proposal which meets the requirements of paragraph (g)(1) above shall also be responsible for obtaining from the business firm or firms from which contributions were solicited a signed certification form which shall include the following language:

"I (name), as a duly authorized representative of (name of firm), do hereby certify that a tax credit will only be claimed for that portion of (name of firm)'s cash donation which exceeds the amount of (name of firm)'s average annual charitable donation for the preceding three tax years."

(Signature of firm's representative)

(Date)

(Authorized by and implementing L. 1994, Chap. 38, Sec. 5; effective, T-110-9-1-94, Sept. 1, 1994; effective Dec. 5, 1994.)

110-7-4. Amount of tax credits. (a) If the proposal has been approved, a tax credit against the tax liability of a business firm shall be granted by the department of revenue. The tax credit shall not exceed 50% of the total amount contributed during the taxable year by the business firm to a community service organization or governmental entity.

(b) The amount of credit shall not exceed 70% of the total amount contributed during the taxable year by the business firm to a community service or governmental entity in a rural community.

(c) Tax credits shall not be given to a business firm whose contributions are granted for activities that are a part of that firm's normal course of business.

(d) Any tax credit not used for the taxable year the contribution was made may be carried over in succeeding tax years until the total amount of the credit is used.

(e) Tax credit shall not be given for any funds expended or contributions received prior to the approval of the proposal by the director. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1994, Chap. 38, Sec. 5; effective, T-110-9-1-94, Sept. 1, 1994; effective Dec. 5, 1994.)

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, November 30, in the conference room at the Kansas Racing Commission, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations of the Kansas Racing Commission. This 30-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on these proposed regulations.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Damien Baker at the Kansas Racing Commission, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka 66611-2228, (913) 296-5800.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

Article 12.—Kansas Horse Breeding Development Fund

K.A.R. 112-12-2 - Stallion eligibility certificate. This regulation has been amended to conform with the changes in K.A.R. 112-12-3, which eliminated the need for filing a breeding report. All language referencing the breeding report has been deleted. This report is not necessary in the verification process for registration of foals.

The regulation has also been amended to delete any language referring to Class B foals, which conforms to the changes in the classes of horses set out in 112-12-5. Class B foals have been eliminated in 112-12-5.

K.A.R. 112-12-3 - Breeding report. The entire regulation regarding breeding reports has been revoked. The report is not necessary in the verification process for registration of foals. This will simplify paper work requirements for stallion owners and eliminate cost to the Kansas Horsemen's Association for mailing reminders to those who forget to file a stallion report. This change was prompted by the need to control costs to the registering agency and to simplify paper work.

K.A.R. 112-12-4 - Mare eligibility certificate. Amendments are made in this regulation to allow for the new Class NR foal and delete references to Class B foals, which is in conformance with the classes of horses changed in 112-12-5. There is new language under section (b) that requires a mare to be bred back to a Kansas stallion at least every other year that the mare foals, and new language under section (i) that encourages nonresident horsemen to participate in the Kansas-bred program by controlling some of the costs to nonresident mare owners. These changes are to encourage nonresident horsemen to participate in the Kansas-bred program by providing a classification for nonresident foals. This will allow full distribution of the Kansas Bred Development Fund (KBDF) purse money and will provide protection for the Kansas-bred stallion owners by assuring that mares will be bred back to Kansas-bred stallions.

K.A.R. 112-12-5. Classes of Kansas-bred horses. The classes of horses have been changed to eliminate Class B, C and G and to amend the existing Class A and create a new Class NR. These changes eliminate the requirement that owners have to be Kansas residents. Both sire and dam no longer need to be certified and registered under Class A, and the new Class NR foals allows for nonresident horsemen to be able to participate in the Kansas-bred program. By eliminating some of the classes, full privilege is given to all foals sired by Kansas-bred or Kansas-domiciled stallions and mares to be eligible to receive purse supplements. This provides equal purse opportunity to all foals, provides incentive for breeders to register foals into the program and simplifies the distribution of Kansas-bred purse money. There is also new language which will provide some guarantee the mare is bred back to a Kansas-bred stallion.

K.A.R. 112-12-6. Registration of Kansas-bred horses. These changes are consistent with the changes in 112-12-5 regarding the changes in classification of horses, which is to encourage nonresident horsemen to participate in the Kansas-bred program by providing a classification for nonresident foals. It also allows for full distribution of the KBDF purse money.

K.A.R. 112-12-7. Registration of Kansas-domiciled horses. This regulation is amended to delete language requiring owners to be Kansas residents. It encourages nonresident horsemen to participate.

(continued)

K.A.R. 112-12-8. Kansas-registered stallion awards. This change conforms to 112-12-5, which eliminates the classes of horses to allow for nonresident horsemen to participate in the Kansas-bred program and to allow for full distribution of the breed moneys.

K.A.R. 112-12-9. Kansas-registered mare awards. The changes under section (b) (1) and (2) delete references to the classes of horses and add a new requirement in the payment of mare awards, which states that mares must be certified before the foal is conceived if the foal was conceived or foaled before December 31, 1992. For foals conceived or foaled after December 31, 1992, mares are no longer required to be certified before the foal is conceived.

K.A.R. 112-12-12. Registration of horses dropped before January 1, 1990. Language is deleted limiting owners to be Kansas residents only. This allows for nonresident horsemen to participate in the Kansas-bred program.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Executive Director, State Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka 66604-4027. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 82-4-1. Definitions. The amendment to subsection (u)(4) changes the effective date for the federal regulations incorporated by reference. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment to governmental agencies or units, to persons subject to the proposed rules and regulations or to the general public.

K.A.R. 82-4-3. Motor carrier safety regulations. The amendment to subsection (a) changes the effective date for the federal regulations incorporated by reference. The amendment to subsection (a)(2) eliminates a federal regulation previously incorporated by reference. The federal regulation involved covers a type of farm vehicle not regulated by the State Corporation Commission. The amendment to subsection (a)(5) removes reference to a federal regulation that only affects the state of Hawaii. The amendment adding subsection (a)(12) adds a federal regulation to be incorporated by reference. This change is to bring state law into conformity with federal regulations. The removal of subsections (c)(3) and (c)(6), as well as the changes to subsection (c)(4), are to bring the Kansas regulations into conformity with federal regulations. Former subsections (c)(4) and (5) have been renumbered in light of removal of subsection (c)(3). There is no economic impact associated with these amendments to governmental agencies or units, to persons subject to the proposed rules and regulations or to the general public.

K.A.R. 82-4-6d. Waiver of physical requirements. The amendment to subsection (a) changes the effective date for the federal regulations incorporated by reference. The amendment of subsection (e) brings state practice regarding revocation of a physical waiver into conformity with federal regulations. The amendment to subsection (g) clarifies when a motor carrier must provide no-

tice of any conviction or revocation or suspension of a driver's driving privileges. There is no economic impact associated with these amendments to governmental agencies or units, persons subject to the proposed rules and regulations or to the general public.

K.A.R. 82-4-20. Transportation of hazardous materials by motor vehicles. The amendment to subsection (a) changes the effective date for the federal regulations incorporated by reference. The amendment to subsection (b) clarifies the existing intent of the regulation. There is no economic impact associated with these amendments to governmental agencies or units, to persons subject to the proposed rules and regulations or to the general public.


