Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Monday, March 27, at the office of the Board of Veterinary Examiners, 10475 Purple Sage Road, Wamego, to consider the adoption on a permanent basis of proposed new regulations K.A.R. 70-7-1, 70-8-1, 70-9-1 and 70-10-1.

K.A.R. 70-7-1 concerns standards of veterinary practice, 70-8-1 concerns unprofessional conduct, 70-9-1 concerns continuing education, and 70-10-1 concerns fines.

The regulations are being adopted to implement the 1993 Kansas Veterinary Practice Act, K.S.A. Chapter 47, Article 8. The Practice Act specifically references these "rules and regulations established by the board." This change is not mandated by federal law. There will be no cost to this agency, other governmental agencies or units, private citizens, or consumers of veterinary products or services. This change is being requested by the Board of Veterinary Examiners and will have no effect on any other governmental agency, private citizen or consumer. There is no economic impact on any business, individual or the state economy.

This notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing or request copies of the proposed regulations and fiscal impact statement by contacting Dirk Hanson, D.V.M., Executive Director, State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, 10475 Purple Sage Road, Wamego, 66547, (913) 456-8781. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations. The new water policies being proposed are flood management, water quality and water rights banking. The basin plan revisions identify water quality problems and priority areas in the basins that may benefit from targeted state technical and financial assistance.

Proposals will be issued upon request to all prospective bidders who have been prequalified by the Kansas Department of Transportation on the basis of financial condition, available construction equipment, and experience. Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid. This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of the affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid-approval

package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Plans and specifications for the projects may be examined at the office of the respective county clerk or at the KDOT district office responsible for the work.

Criminal Procedure—Grand Juries—Secrecy of Proceedings and Disclosure.

State Boards, Commissions and Authorities—State Board of Technical Professions—Discipline of Licensees. James R. Campbell, Coffey County Attorney, Burlington, February 13, 1995.

Because the secrecy of grand jury proceedings is a well-guarded aspect of American criminal procedure, the minutes of a grand jury are to be kept secret pursuant to K.S.A. 22-3012 and, in the absence of a court order, are not to be provided to a state agency desiring to pursue disciplinary action against a licensee. This is true even though the indictments of that grand jury were quashed on the basis of a technical deficiency in the impaneling of the grand jury. Cited herein: K.S.A. 22-3001; 22-3012. NKF

Opinion No. 95-21

Public Health—Solid and Hazardous Waste; Solid Waste—Collection and Disposal by County; Assessment and Collection of Fees. Senator Janice L. Hardenburger, 21st District, Haddam; Representative Bill Bryant, 106th District, Washington, February 13, 1995.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-3410, a county may adopt a resolution establishing mandatory fees to generate revenues for operation of its solid waste management program. Such resolution, however, must be adopted on or before July 1 of the calendar year for which such fees are imposed. A county may not adopt a resolution after July 1 that establishes monthly fees for the same calendar year. While solid waste fees may be established, billed and collected on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis, a county may not establish both a monthly fee and an annual fee covering the same month. The county may authorize its solid waste management department to bill and collect solid waste fees in the first instance, but the procedure set forth in K.S.A. 65-3410(a)(1)-(4) is the exclusive method for the collection of delinquent fees. To the extent that Attorney General Opinion No. 76-205 is inconsistent with conclusions reached herein, it is withdrawn. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 19-101a; K.S.A. 65-3401; 65-3405; 65-3410. Terms of the Bonds

The bonds will be dated March 15, 1995, and will mature serially on February 1 in the years and in the amounts set forth below. The bonds will bear interest from the date thereof at rates to be determined when the bonds are sold as provided herein. The bonds will consist of fully registered certificated bonds, each in the denomination of \$5,000 or integral multiples thereof. A bidder may elect to have all or a portion of the bonds scheduled to mature in the years 2011 to 2014, inclusive, issued as term bonds scheduled to mature in 2014 and subject to mandatory redemption requirements consistent with the schedule of serial maturities set forth above, subject to the following conditions: Serial bonds selected for conversion to term bonds with mandatory redemption requirements shall be chosen in inverse order of maturity, beginning with bonds scheduled to mature in 2014. Thereafter, the paying agent and bond registrar will notify the owners of the bonds of the district's redemption call by United States first-class mail, postage prepaid. Condition of Bids, Bid Form and Good Faith Deposit

Approval and Delivery of the Bonds

The bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and paid for by the district. The bonds will be sold subject to the approving legal opinion of Jonathan P. Small, Chartered, bond counsel, of Topeka, Kansas, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be furnished and paid for by the district, printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder as and when the bonds are delivered. Said opinion will state that in the opinion of bond counsel under existing law and assuming continued compliance by the district with the provisions of the resolution authorizing the issuance of the bonds and the code, the interest on the bonds is exempt from federal income taxation (with specified minor exceptions) and excluded from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income for income tax purposes.

The denomination of the bonds and the names, addresses and social security or taxpayer identification numbers of the registered owners to be shown on the bonds initially delivered shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the district and bond registrar not later than 4 p.m. C.S.T. on March 21, 1995. Subsequent to the issuance of the bonds, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, imposes requirements upon the district which must be met to maintain the excludability of the interest on the bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes. The district will and does hereby covenant to comply with these requirements. Its failure to do so could adversely affect the tax-exempt status of the bonds. Purchasers of the bonds should be aware that in the event the bonds lose their tax-exempt status as a result of the district's failure to comply with the requirements imposed upon it under the code, the bonds are neither callable nor will the rate of interest on the bonds be adjusted to reflect such circumstances.

The code includes interest on tax-exempt obligations, such as the bonds, in the adjusted current earnings of certain corporations in the calculation of alternative minimum taxable income.

The district will *not* designate the bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" under Section 265 of the code.

Official Statement

The district has authorized the preparation and distribution of a preliminary official statement, dated as of February 24, 1995, relating to the bonds, copies of which may be obtained from the district treasurer and general director of fiscal services, Administration Building, 624 W. 24th, Topeka, KS 66611; or the district's financial advisor, David Brant, Bank IV, 534 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, KS 66603. The preliminary official statement is in a form "deemed final" by the district for the purpose of the Securities and Exchange Commission's Rule 15c2-12, but is subject to revision, amendment and completion in the final official statement. Upon the sale of the bonds, the district shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the final official statement, without additional cost, upon request. Copies of the final official statement in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered at the successful bidder's expense. Authorization is hereby given to redistribute this official notice of bond sale and the preliminary official statement, but this entire official notice of bond sale and the entire preliminary official statement, and not portions thereof, must be redistributed.

Offering Price Certificate

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to 7 U.S.C. 136v, FMC Corporation has filed an application for a special local need registration for Furadan 15G Insecticide-Nematicide. The purpose of the proposed special local need registration is to allow the use of this pesticide to control insect pests of grain sorghum and sorghum grown for forage. At present, this pesticide is still registered under Section 3 of FIFRA for this purpose. However, sorghum use under Section 3 is being phased out under an EPA/FMC negotiated settlement of an Avian Hazard Special Review.

By establishing this agreement with FMC, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency was able to place restrictions on the allowable uses of Furadan 15G without engaging in a cancellation proceeding as provided under FIFRA.

In July 1994, the National Grain Sorghum Producers submitted information to the EPA supporting the critical need for granular carbofuran, and justification of its continued use by sorghum growers. The EPA has conducted an in-depth review of this information and has concluded that Furadan 15G use on sorghum may continue for a period of two years (1995-96). This extended use will only be permitted under the auspices of FIFRA Section 24(c) labels issued by the identified states. Further, randomly selected producers' fields will be monitored for unreasonable adverse effects to birds.
