Performance Review Board**Request for Comments**

The Kansas Performance Review Board has reviewed information provided by its staff on the operation of DISC long distance telephone service to state agencies. To ensure DISC's customers have the best service at the lowest cost, KPRB evaluated the organization of the DISC's Telecommunications Bureau, its rate schedule, its billing procedures, and other areas that affect the customer's total long distance charges.

Based on the preliminary data and initial staff findings, KPRB concludes that DISC should renegotiate its long distance rates now to achieve the lowest rates possible in today's competitive telecommunications market. In doing so, DISC should shift the billing function it presently performs to the carrier if this results in a savings to the state.

In order to better understand and service all government agencies, particularly for high volume customers, DISC should initiate a mechanism for advice, feedback, strategy formulation and tactical planning in the form of a standing council of customers for telecommunications. This council would be comprised of the Regents universities' telecommunications directors and other high volume agency representatives.

KPRB recommends that the existing 5 percent surcharge to long distance customers be reviewed as a funding approach for DISC.

The Kansas Performance Review Board invites public comment on this preliminary recommendation and has scheduled a public hearing from 10 to 11 a.m. January 7 in Room 313-South, State Capitol, 300 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka.

Governmental Ethics Commission

Opinion No. 1998-29

Written November 5, 1998, to Debra Dickerhoof, LBSW, Emporia SRS Office.

This opinion is in response to your letter of October 27, 1998, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the state level governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 76-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

Factual Statement

We understand that you request this opinion in your capacity as a program consultant in Medicaid management for the Emporia Adult Services Unit of the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS). You have informed us that your position primarily involves the approval of plans for the care and quality assurance of the home- and community-based services for physically disabled adults between the ages of 18 and 64. In this capacity you review adult case files and conduct consumer home visits. In addition, you occasionally conduct intakes for the Adult Protective Services investigations.

You have been invited to serve on the Juvenile Offender Citizen Review Board for the 5th Judicial District. In this capacity you will review juvenile case files, participate in fact-finding review hearings, and make recommendations to the court regarding juvenile offender cases.

Question

Is it a violation of state ethics laws for you to serve on the Juvenile Offender Citizen Review Board while employed as a program consultant for the Emporia Adult Services Unit of the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services?

Opinion

You advise that your state duties do not involve the Children and Family Services Division of SRS and that you do not participate in decisions regarding the welfare of children. You have also informed a member of our staff that you do not participate in the licensure, regulation or inspection of the providers of child care services. In addition, you have informed us that the Medicaid area manager's husband is the director of Court Services for the 5th Judicial District and that the Medicaid area manager signs your employee evaluation.

With the above understanding regarding the facts, it is our opinion that nothing in K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.* prohibits the situation you have described.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Lansing Correctional Facility has applied for a Class II operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-540. Emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), particulate matter with a diameter of less than 10 microns (PM₁₀), oxides of sulfur (SO_x), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process. The purpose of a Class II permit is to limit the potential-to-emit for these pollutants to below major source thresholds.

Lansing Correctional Facility, Lansing, owns and operates the correctional institution located at Section 20, Township 9 South, Range 22 East, Leavenworth County.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, and at the KDHE northeast district office, 800 W. 24th, Lawrence. 


