Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 15, in the main conference room, Kansas Department of Commerce, Suite 100, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of regulations administering the Kansas Agritourism Promotion Act.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Howard Fricke, Secretary of Commerce, Suite 100, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on these regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 10 working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Merrill J. Hicklin Befort at (785) 291-3891. Handicapped parking is not available around the Curtis Office Building; however, all persons in a vehicle with a handicapped license plate may park in any metered space around the building, and there is no charge for parking. The curbs and all entrances on Jackson, 10th Street and Kansas Avenue to the Curtis State Office Building are accessible to individuals with disabilities.

Copies of the regulations and their economic impact statements may be obtained from Merrill J. Hicklin Befort, Department of Commerce, at the address and phone number above. The regulations also are posted on the department's Web site at www.kansascommerce.com (in the lower left hand corner of the home page you will find the Connect Code box; once there, type in the code "AGTOURREGS," click the "Go" button, and you'll be provided a direct link to the proposed agritourism regulations). Anyone reviewing the regulations on the Internet may comment for the record on these regulations by completing the online form.

A summary of the regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 110-12-1. Definitions. This regulation defines key terms in the regulations.

K.A.R. 110-12-2. Registration. Only those providers of agritourism activities who register with the Secretary of Commerce are eligible for the limited liability that accrues to registered operators and for tax credits for insurance purchased. Certain information is kept from disclosure to avoid use of such information for identity theft.

K.A.R. 110-12-3. Liability insurance; costs qualifying for credits. This regulation defines allowed costs that qualify for the state tax credits.

K.A.R. 110-12-4. Tax credits. This regulation states how operators qualify for tax credits and the information they must provide in order to qualify.

K.A.R. 110-12-5. Registration. The regulation limits application to those owners who register. Further, any change in operation of the agritourism activity requires the owners to file a new application with the secretary.

K.A.R. 110-12-6. Contracts. Each written contract or agreement with a participant shall contain certain warning notices and be printed in at least 10-point font.

These regulations help establish the tax credit program under the Agritourism Promotion Act, 2004 SB 334. The anticipated costs to state agencies or employees because of these regulations are minimal and will be absorbed in the agency budget.

Request for Comments

The state of Kansas received authorization June 26, 2000, from the U.S. Department of Labor to implement its Strategic Five-Year State Plan for Title I of the Workforce Investment Act and the Wagner-Peyser Act. This plan became effective July 1, 2000. The state of Kansas is proposing to modify its Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Strategic Five-Year Plan to include the following policy to resolve Memorandum of Understanding impasse situations:

Proposed Policy to Resolve Memorandum of Understanding Impasse Situations

The Workforce Network of Kansas Board (state board) recognizes the importance of resolving impasse situations that involve the organization and administration of the One-Stop Workforce Centers at the level where customer services are delivered. The following procedure will be used to resolve impasse situations for required Memorandums of Understanding (MOU):

1. The Local Workforce Investment Board (local board) and the required One-Stop partner must request assistance from the state board whenever a substantive impasse situation remains after a good-faith effort at the local level. The request must be in writing and include the contending issue(s) and supporting documentation.

2. Once the state board is notified, the chairperson will appoint a three- to five-member committee to meet with the parties to resolve the impasse within 30 calendar days of receiving notice. State board members who have a conflict of interest, or who cannot provide a fair and impartial consideration of the issues, will be excluded from the committee.

3. In compliance with WIA Sec. 662.310 (b), the local board and the required partner must report the impasse to the state agency responsible for administering the partner's program. The state board and the responsible state agency must report the impasse to the head of any other

federal agency with responsibility for oversight of a partner's program.

4. The committee will issue its decision within 30 calendar days of the meeting with the parties involved in the impasse. If necessary, the committee may consult with, and seek assistance from, the United States Department of Labor in order to formulate the decision.

5. Either party has 30 calendar days from the date the decision is issued to appeal the decision to the full state board. The request for appeal must be submitted in writing and must include the contending issue(s) and reason(s) for appealing the committee's decision.

6. The full state board will review the appeal at the next regularly scheduled meeting and issue its decision within 30 calendar days following the meeting. Its decision is final.

7. In order to stay within the regulatory provisions of the WIA regulations, required One-Stop partners who fail to execute a MOU will not be permitted to serve on the local board.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit and amending previously-issued construction approval. AGCO Corporation has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance. Notice also is given that certain requirements in the construction approval dated June 14, 1993, are being modified by a modification of approval conditions.

AGCO Corporation, Duluth, Georgia, owns and operates an agricultural equipment manufacturing facility located at 420 W. Lincoln Blvd., Hesston, Kansas.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. A public hearing will be conducted by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, January 18, at the Finney County Administration Center, 311 N. 9th, Garden City, to receive comments prior to final action on the proposed issuance of a revised air quality construction permit. KDHE is proposing to issue the revised permit, in accordance with prevention of significant deterioration (PSD) provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, which adopt the standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. The revised permit clarifies the best available control technology (BACT) and emission limitation to include only that portion of particulate matter that can be controlled, namely filterable PM₁₀.

This permit was initially issued on October 8, 2002, for Sand Sage Power, LLC to begin construction on a 660 MW pulverized coal-fired boiler, one natural gas auxiliary boiler, a new cooling tower, and changes to the coal, lime and ash handling equipment at the Sunflower Electric Cooperative's Holcomb Station. The facility is owned by Sand Sage Power, L.L.C., 301 W. 13th, Hays.

The Holcomb area is designated as an attainment area under the Clean Air Act, which means that the air quality meets or exceeds the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS). Any major source or major modifications to a major source has to undergo a preconstruction review as required by the PSD regulations.

KDHE has determined that a re-evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for particulate matter (PM) and particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM₁₀) is appropriate in granting the revision. The purpose of BACT is to effect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for the pollutant under review. Sand Sage conducted the required BACT re-analysis. The department has reviewed Sand Sage's BACT analysis and concurs with its findings that the initial BACT in the October 8, 2002, construction permit of fabric filters is BACT for PM and PM₁₀ is still applicable. However, the emission limitation of 0.018 pounds per million British thermal units (lb/mmBtu) was revised to 0.015 lb/mmBtu to reflect current BACT.
