A public hearing will be conducted by the Kansas Animal Health Department at 10 a.m. Tuesday, August 23, in the Florentine Room of the Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed regulation K.A.R. 9-18-1.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to George Teagarden, Kansas Livestock Commissioner, 708 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and the economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 10 working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Brenda Schuette at (785) 296-2326. There is no designated handicapped parking on the block.

**K.A.R. 9-18-1** sets the license fees for the different facility types.

Facility Description: The proposed action is to reissue an existing permit for the containment and discharge of wastewater from a quarrying and cement production operation. This facility quarries limestone, shale and sandstone used in the manufacture of Portland cement by dry process in a rotary kiln. Other process activities include crushing, grinding, pyro-processing, pulverizing, and storage of raw materials, intermediates and shipping of final products. Related operations include storage and utilization of waste-derived fuels (solids and liquids) burned in the cement kilns and disposal of solid wastes, including cement kiln dust (CKD), in on-site landfills. Plant process wastewater is normally recycled. A potential to discharge exists during and immediately after heavy precipitation events. Domestic wastewater from restrooms, treated by two separate jet pollution control plants at the liquid-waste-derived-fuel-control building and the crusher building, as well as noncontact cooling water are discharged. Quarry pit dewatering and stormwater runoff discharges also are covered by this permit. The proposed permit includes limits for biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, fecal coliform, oil and grease, and pH. Monitoring of metals and effluent flow also will be required. The permittee agrees to conduct a visual inspection of runoff contained in the oil storage dike areas to determine if removal of oil and grease is necessary prior to discharge. The permittee shall perform a priority pollutant scan within one year of the expiration date of this permit. The permit requirements are pursuant to the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards, K.A.R. 28-16-28(b-f), and Federal Surface Water Criteria, and are water-quality based.

Unless an action to contest the legality of the proposed revenue bonds of the college shall be filed in a court of law within 30 days of the date of publication of this notice, the right to contest the legality of any revenue bonds issued in compliance with the aforesaid resolution and other proceedings duly and legally had and taken by the board prior to the date of publication of this notice, and the right to contest the validity of the provisions of such proceedings, shall cease to exist, and no court shall thereafter have the authority to inquire into such matters. After the expiration of said 30 days from the date of publication of this notice, no one shall have any right to commence an action contesting the validity of such revenue bonds

or the provisions of such proceedings of the board and all such revenue bonds shall be conclusively presumed to be legal, and no court shall thereafter have the authority to inquire into such matters.

**Bonds and Warrants—Cash-Basis Law—Lease-Purchase Agreements; Conditions; Protest Petition and Election, When; Resolution; Publication. Senator Jim Barone, 13th District, Frontenac, May 23, 2005.**

The board of education of a unified school district is required under K.S.A. 10-1116c to publish a resolution stating its intention to enter a lease-purchase agreement when the agreement involves the acquisition of land or buildings, is for a term exceeding the current fiscal year of the district, and provides for yearly payments that in total exceed \$100,000. Because the law provides joint custodial parents with equal decisional rights regarding their child or children, absent any court order directing otherwise, either parent may authorize therapy for a child or children without the knowledge and/or consent of the other parent. ## Opinion 2005-14

**Cities and Municipalities—Buildings, Structures and Grounds—Definitions; Permissible Use of STAR Bonds; Lease-Back Arrangement. Representative John Edmonds, 112th District, Great Bend, May 23, 2005.**

K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 12-1773(a) specifically allows cities to acquire land as part of a redevelopment project. Subsection (b) of that statute allows cities to sell or lease such land to developers and to use proceeds from bonds issued under the Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Act to pay redevelopment project costs. K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 12-1770a(q) defines redevelopment project costs to include acquisition of property within the redevelopment project area. The statutes do not preclude resale of such property by the developer, for a profit, to other developers in accordance with the project plan. Further, these statutes are written to only restrict the first use of the bond proceeds, not any subsequent generation of dollars from the land, implements or structures built with those proceeds. Because the purpose of the TIF Act is to promote and stimulate development by assisting cities to help finance redevelopment projects, and because the Act does not specifically preclude the dedication of revenues from buildings and structures that have been constructed using Sales Tax and Revenue (STAR) bond moneys to provide incentives to developers, we do not believe that the Unified Government's lease, lease-back agreements that are the subject of Legislative Post Audit's February, 2005 Performance Audit Report violate K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 12-1773(b) and 12-1770a(q). ## Opinion 2005-15

**Procedure, Civil—Costs—State, Cities and Counties Exempt from Depositing Court Costs; Exceptions; County Hospitals. Kerry McQueen, Counsel, Southwest Medical Center, Liberal, May 24, 2005.**

K.S.A. 60-2005 provides an exemption from filing fees for specified governmental entities, including counties. Whether a specific action (filed by any person, official, employee or legal entity) is brought by a county is in large part a factual issue. County hospitals are vested with considerable autonomous authority, not dependent upon the creating county, including taxing and eminent domain powers. In our opinion, any civil suit filed by or on behalf of a county hospital created under K.S.A. 19-4601 *et seq.* may qualify for the K.S.A. 60-2005 fee exemption if the county is the named party. Absent some factual indicia that the county is itself a party to a specific action, we believe that the fee exemption allowed by K.S.A. 60-2005 may not be warranted for a county hospital. However, while a city can charter out of such requirement, the Kansas Department of Revenue must administer, enforce and collect a local retailers' sales tax in conformity with state law dictating the department's role in such matters. **111-4-2278. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

**111-4-2281. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Great Escape Hybrid Doubler Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Great Escape Hybrid Doubler Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning

mail pickup on Tuesday, September 13, 2005. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, September 13, 2005, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in a secure receptacle, transported to the state fair, and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum with all entries deposited at the state fair and into any other receptacle designated by the lottery.

(b) The drawing shall be held at the Kansas state fair lottery building and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Sunday, September 18, 2005, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove a single entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of one of the grand prizes identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2279, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. This process shall be repeated for the second of two grand prizes.

(e) After two entries have been drawn on September 18, 2005, and the entries have been verified as valid, four more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time to serve as alternate entries for the grand prizes. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A. Each winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the tenth day following the drawing to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. (f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Great Escape Hybrid Doubler Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (e) herein.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Great Escape Hybrid Doubler" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Great Escape Hybrid Doubler" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on September 18, 2005, after the winners and alternatives have been selected, and all

**111-4-2282. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Great Escape Hybrid Doubler Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-05, May 25, 2005.)

**111-4-2283. "Golden Riches" instant ticket lottery game number 474.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Golden Riches" commencing on or after June 5, 2005. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2283.

(b) The "play symbols" for this game are as follows: 10 - 11 - 12 - 13 - 14 - 15 - 16 - 17 - 18 - 19 - 20 - 21 - 22 - 23 - 24 - 25 - 26 - 27 - 28 - 29 - 30 - 31 - 32 - 33 - 34 - 35 - 36 - 37 - 38 - 39 - 40 - 41 - 42 - 43 - 44 - 45 - 46 - 47 - 48 - 49 - 50 - 51 - 52 - 53 - 54 - 55 - 56 - 57 - 58 - 59 - 60. There are no "play symbol captions" in this game.

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 60 play spots within the play area or areas.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149.

(e) The three letters comprising the retailer validation codes used in this game shall appear in three of eight varying locations among the play symbols. The retailer validation codes for this game and their meanings are as follows:

The second part consists of "GAME 1" and "GAME 2." "GAME 1" consists of 18 numbers covered by translucent latex. "GAME 2" consists of 24 numbers covered

by translucent latex. A player will scratch the "YOUR NUMBERS," and then scratch all the numbers in "GAME 1" and "GAME 2" which exactly match any of the "YOUR NUMBERS." If the player matches all the numbers in any one straight horizontal or vertical line in any "GAME," the player wins the corresponding prize for that line.

(h) Each ticket in this game may win up to four times.

**111-7-198. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" and will accept entries starting June 5, 2005, for the drawing to be conducted on Friday, August 26, 2005. Rules applicable to the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-7-198 through 111-7-202 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-05, May 25, 2005.)

**111-7-199. Prize.** The 40 prize winners selected in the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-7-198 shall receive two tickets for each day of the 2005 races conducted at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, on October 8, 2005, and October 9, 2005, one double occupancy hotel room and room taxes at Great Wolf Lodge in Kansas City, Kansas, for the eve-

nings of October 7, 2005, and October 8, 2005, round-trip transportation between the Kansas Speedway and the hotel, food and other amenities at the Kansas lottery hospitality chalet during said races at the Kansas Speedway, \$300 cash, and mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" prize packages:

(h) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(i) No later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth calendar day following the drawing, the winner of a prize as the result of the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (d) of K.A.R. 111-7-202 shall be declared the winner. All alternate winners shall then be subject to the same rules of eligibility as original winners.

(j) A total of 40 prize packages shall be awarded. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-05, May 25, 2005.)

**111-7-200. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) With every single purchase of \$5 or more for the Kansas lottery "eScratch" game from June 5, 2005, through August 20, 2005, the purchaser shall receive one entry form for the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing."

(2) The purchaser must complete the information on the entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(3) Place one or more entry form(s) into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 8099, Topeka, KS 66608-0099. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, August 23, 2005.

(4) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(5) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-7-198. Forty entries and 10 alternate entries will be drawn.

(6) Entry forms obtained during the stated period of time may be entered in the drawing.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one prize package.

(c) All eligible entry forms which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, August 23, 2005, shall be entered into the drawing to be conducted on Friday, August 26, 2005.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry form and entering the ticket into any drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-05, May 25, 2005.)

**111-7-201. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" shall all be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-05, May 25, 2005.)

**111-7-202. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pick up for the drawing after the morning mail delivery on Tuesday, August 23, 2005, prior to the drawing on Friday, August 26, 2005.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the drawing shall contain all entries eligible for the drawing. The drum shall be rotated 10 times or receptacle mixed thoroughly as may be applicable. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 40 valid entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in order drawn from one through and including 40. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-7-199,

subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After 40 entries have been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, 10 more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required by K.A.R. 111-7-199(i). The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 14 calendar days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All "Buy \$5 Get an Entry Free Drawing" entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-05, May 25, 2005.)

#### Notice of Final Nursing Facility Medicaid Rates for State Fiscal Year 2006; Methodology for Calculating Final Rates, and Rate Justifications; Response to Written Comments; Notice of Intent to Amend the Medicaid State Plan

Under the Medicaid program, 42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq., the state of Kansas pays nursing facilities, nursing facilities for mental health and hospital long-term care units (hereafter collectively referred to as nursing facilities) a daily rate for care provided to residents who are eligible for Medicaid benefits. The Secretary of Aging administers the Medicaid nursing facility services payment program on behalf of the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services (beginning July 1, 2005, the Director of the Division of Health Policy and Finance). As required by 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(13), as amended by Section 4711 of the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, P.L. No. 105-33, 101 Stat. 251, 507-08 (August 5, 1997), the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS) and the Secretary of the Kansas Department on Aging (KDOA) are publishing the final Medicaid per diem rates

for Medicaid-certified nursing facilities for state fiscal year 2006, the methodology underlying the establishment of the final nursing facility rates, and the justifications for those final rates. SRS and KDOA also are providing notice of the state's intent to submit amendments to the Medicaid State Plan to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) on or before September 30, 2005.

#### I. Methodology Used to Calculate Medicaid Per Diem Rates for Nursing Facilities

In general, the state uses a prospective, cost-based, facility-specific rate-setting methodology to calculate nursing facility Medicaid per diem rates, including the rates listed in this notice. The state's rate-setting methodology is contained primarily in the following described documents and authorities and in the exhibits, attachments, regulations or other authorities referenced in them:

A. The following portions of the Kansas Medicaid State Plan are maintained by SRS:

1. Attachment 4.19D, Part I, Subpart C, Exhibit C-1, inclusive; and

B. SRS regulations set out in K.A.R. Article 30-10.

The text of those portions of the Medicaid State Plan identified above in Section IA.1, but not the documents, authorities and the materials incorporated into them by reference, are reprinted in this notice. Those Medicaid State Plan provisions set out in this notice appear in the versions that the state currently intends to submit to CMS on or before September 30 2005. The proposed Medicaid State Plan amendments that the state ultimately submits to CMS may differ from the versions contained in this notice.

Copies of the documents and authorities containing the state's rate-setting methodology are available upon written request. A request for copies will be treated as a request for public records under the Kansas Open Records Act, K.S.A. 45-215 et seq. The state will charge a fee for copies. #### A.1 Attachment 4.19D, Part I, Subpart C, Exhibit C-1: Methods and Standards for Establishing Payment Rates for Nursing Facilities

Under the Medicaid program, the state of Kansas pays nursing facilities (NF), nursing facilities for mental health (NFMH) and hospital long-term care units (hereafter collectively referred to as nursing facilities) a daily rate for care provided to residents who are eligible for Medicaid benefits. The narrative explanation of the nursing facility reimbursement formula is divided into 12 sections. The sections are: Cost Reports, Rate Determination, Quarterly Case Mix Index Calculation, Resident Days, Inflation Factors, Upper Payment Limits, Quarterly Case Mix Rate Adjustment, Real and Personal Property Fee, Incentive Factors, Rate Effective Date, Retroactive Rate Adjustments and Comparable Private Pay Rates.

## 1) Cost Reports

The Nursing Facility Financial and Statistical Report (MS2004) is the uniform cost report. It is included in Kansas Administrative Regulation (K.A.R.) 30-10-17. It organizes the commonly incurred business expenses of providers into three reimbursable cost centers (operating, indirect health care and direct health care). Ownership costs (i.e., mortgage interest, depreciation, lease and amortization of leasehold improvements) are reported but reimbursed through the real and personal property fee. There is a nonreimbursable/nonresident-related cost center so that total operating expenses can be reconciled to the providers' accounting records.

All cost reports are desk reviewed by agency auditors. Adjustments are made, when necessary, to the reported costs in arriving at the allowable historic costs for the rate computations.

### Calendar Year End Cost Reports:

All providers that have operated a facility for 12 or more months on December 31 shall file a calendar year cost report. The requirements for filing the calendar year cost report are found in K.A.R. 30-10-17.

When a non-arms length change of provider takes place or an owner of the real estate assumes the operations from a lessee, the facility will be treated as an ongoing operation. In this situation, the related provider or owner shall be required to file the calendar year end cost report. The new operator or owner is responsible for obtaining the cost report information from the prior operator for the months during the calendar year in which the new operator was not involved in running the facility. The cost report information from the old and new operators shall be combined to prepare a 12-month calendar year end cost report.

### Projected Cost Reports:

The filing of projected cost reports are limited to: 1) newly constructed facilities; 2) existing facilities new to the Medicaid program; or 3) a provider re-entering the Medicaid program that has not actively participated or billed services for 24 months or more. The requirements are found in K.A.R. 30-10-17.

## 2) Rate Determination

### Rates for Existing Nursing Facilities:

Medicaid rates for Kansas NFs are determined using a prospective, facility-specific rate-setting system. The rate is determined from the base year cost data submitted by the provider. The current base year is 2001.

The allowable expenses are divided into three cost centers. The cost centers are Operating, Indirect Health Care and Direct Health Care. They are defined in K.A.R. 30-10-18.

The allowable historic per diem cost is determined by dividing the allowable resident-related expenses in each cost center by resident days. The allowable historic per diem cost may be adjusted by an inflation factor. The resident days and inflation factors used in the rate determination will be explained in greater detail in the following sections.

The inflated allowable historic per diem cost for each cost center is then compared to the cost center upper pay-

ment limit. The allowable per diem rate is the lesser of the inflated allowable historic per diem cost in each cost center or the cost center upper payment limit. Each cost center has a separate upper payment limit. If each cost center upper payment limit is exceeded, the allowable per diem rate is the sum of the three cost center upper payment limits. There also is a separate upper payment limit for owner, related party, administrator and co-administrator compensation. The upper payment limits will be explained in more detail in a separate section.

The case mix of the residents adjusts the Direct Health Care cost center. The reasoning behind a case mix payment system is that the characteristics of the residents in a facility rather than the characteristics of the facility should determine the payment rate. The idea is that certain resident characteristics can be used to predict future costs to care for residents with those same characteristics. For these reasons, it is desirable to use the case mix classification for each facility in adjusting provider rates.

There are add-ons to the allowable per diem rate. The add-ons consist of the incentive factor and the real and personal property fee. The incentive factor and real and personal property fee are explained in separate sections of this exhibit. The add-ons plus the allowable per diem rate equal the total per diem rate.

### Rates for New Construction and New Facilities:

The per diem rate for newly constructed nursing facilities or new facilities to the Kansas Medical Assistance program shall be based on a projected cost report submitted in accordance with K.A.R. 30-10-17.

### Rates for Facilities Recognized as a Change of Provider:

The payment rate for the first 24 months of operation shall be based on the base year historical cost data of the previous owner or provider. If base year data is not available, the most recent calendar year data for the previous provider shall be used. Beginning with the first day of the 25th month of operation, the payment rate shall be based on the historical cost data for the most recent calendar year submitted by the new provider.

### Rates for Facilities Re-entering the Program:

The per diem rate for each provider reentering the Medicaid program shall be determined from a projected cost report if the provider has not actively participated in the program by the submission of any current resident service billings to the program for 24 months or more. The per diem rate for all other providers re-entering the program shall be determined from the last historic cost report filed with the agency.

## 3) Quarterly Case Mix Index Calculation

Providers are required to submit to the agency the uniform assessment instrument, which is the Minimum Data Set (MDS), for each resident in the facility. The MDS assessments are maintained in a computer database.

The Resource Utilization Groups-III (RUG-III) Version 5.12b, 34 group, index maximizer model is used as the resident classification system to determine all case mix indices, using data from the MDS submitted by each facility. Standard Version 5.12b case mix indices developed by the Health Care Financing Administration (now the

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Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) shall be the basis for calculating facility average case mix indices to be used to adjust the Direct Health Care costs in the determination of upper payment limits and rate calculation. Resident assessments that cannot be classified will be assigned the lowest CMI for the state.

Each resident in the facility on the first day of each calendar quarter with a completed and submitted assessment shall be assigned a RUG-III 34 group calculated on the resident's most current assessment available on the first day of each calendar quarter. This RUG-III group shall be translated to the appropriate CMI. From the individual resident case mix indices, three average case mix indices for each Medicaid nursing facility shall be determined four times per year based on the assessment information available on the first day of each calendar quarter.

The facility-wide average CMI is the simple average, carried to four decimal places, of all resident case mix indices. The Medicaid-average CMI is the simple average, carried to four decimal places, of all indices for residents where Medicaid is known to be a per diem payer source on the first day of the calendar quarter or at any time during the preceding quarter. The private-pay/other average CMI is the simple average, carried to four decimal places, of all indices for residents where neither Medicaid nor Medicare were known to be the per diem payer source on the first day of the calendar quarter or at any time during the preceding quarter. Case mix indices for ventilator-dependent residents for whom additional reimbursement has been determined shall be excluded from the average CMI calculations.

The resident listing cutoff for calculating the average CMIs will be the first day of the quarter before the rate is effective. The following are the dates for the resident listings and the quarter in which the average Medicaid CMIs will be used in the quarterly rate-setting process.

The resident listings will be mailed to providers prior to the dates the quarterly case mix-adjusted rates are determined. This will allow the providers time to review the resident listings and make corrections before they are notified of new rates. The cutoff schedule may need to be modified in the event accurate resident listings and Medicaid CMI scores cannot be obtained from the MDS database.

**4) Resident Days**

The allowable historic per diem costs for the Direct Health Care cost center and for food and utilities in the Indirect Health Care cost center are determined by dividing the allowable resident-related expenses by the actual resident days during the cost report period used to establish the base year rate. The allowable historic per diem cost for the Operating and Indirect Health Care Cost Centers less food and utilities is subject to an 85% minimum occupancy rule. The greater of the actual resident days

for the cost report period used to establish the base year rate or the 85% minimum occupancy based on the number of licensed bed days during the cost report period used to establish the base year rate is used as the total resident days in the rate calculation for the Operating cost center and the Indirect Health Care cost center less food and utilities. All licensed beds are required to be certified to participate in the Medicaid program.

There are two exceptions to the 85% minimum occupancy rule. The first is that it does not apply to a provider who is allowed to file a projected cost report for an interim rate. Both the rates determined from the projected cost report and the historic cost report covering the projected cost report period are based on the actual resident days for the period.

The second exception is for the first cost report filed by a new provider who assumes the rate of the previous provider. If the 85% minimum occupancy rule was applied to the previous provider's rate, it also is applied when the rate is assigned to the new provider. However, when the new provider files a historic cost report for any part of the first 12 months of operation, the rate determined from the cost report will be based on actual days and not be subject to the 85% minimum occupancy rule for the months in the first year of operation. The 85% minimum occupancy rule is then reapplied to the rate when the new provider reports resident days and costs for the 13th month of operation and after.

**5) Inflation Factors**

An additional 12 months of inflation will be applied to the allowable reported costs from the calendar year end 2001 cost reports. The inflation will be based on the Data Resources, Inc.-WEFA, National Skilled Nursing Facility Market Basket Without Capital Index (DRI Index).

The DRI Indices listed in the latest available quarterly publication will be used to determine the inflation tables for the payment schedules processed during the payment rate period. This may require the use of forecasted factors in the inflation table. The inflation tables will not be revised until the next payment rate period.

The inflation factor will not be applied to the following costs:

- 1) Owner/Related Party Compensation
- 2) Interest Expense
- 3) Real and Personal Property Taxes

The inflation factor for the real and personal property fees will be based on the Data Resources, Inc.-WEFA, National Skilled Nursing Facility Total Market Basket Index (DRI Index). An additional 12 months of inflation will be applied to the real and personal property fees in effect June 1, 2005.

**6) Upper Payment Limits**

There are three types of upper payment limits that will be described. One is the owner/related party/administrator/co-administrator limit. The second is the real and personal property fee limit. The last type of limit is an upper payment limit for each cost center. The upper payment limits are in effect during the payment rate period unless otherwise specified by a state plan amendment.

Owner/Related Party/Administrator/Co-Administrator Limits:

Since salaries and other compensation of owners are not subject to the usual market constraints, specific limits are placed on the amounts reported. First, amounts paid to nonworking owners and directors are not an allowable cost. Second, owners and related parties who perform resident-related services are limited to a salary chart based on the Kansas civil service classifications and wages for comparable positions. Owners and related parties who provide resident-related services on less than a full-time basis have their compensation limited by the percent of their total work time to a standard work week. A standard work week is defined as 40 hours. The owners and related parties must be professionally qualified to perform services that require licensure or certification.

The compensation paid to owners and related parties shall be allocated to the appropriate cost center for the type of service performed. Each cost center has an expense line for owner/related party compensation. There also is a cost report schedule titled "Statement of Owners and Related Parties." This schedule requires information concerning the percent of ownership (if over 5 percent), the time spent in the function, the compensation, and a description of the work performed for each owner and/or related party. Any salaries reported in excess of the Kansas civil service-based salary chart are transferred to the Operating cost center where the excess is subject to the owner/related party/administrator/co-administrator per diem compensation limit.

The Schedule C is an array of nonowner administrator and co-administrator salaries. The schedule includes the base-year historic cost reports in the database from all active nursing facility providers. The salary information is not adjusted for inflation. The per diem data is calculated using an 85% minimum occupancy level for those providers in operation for more than 12 months. The Schedule C for the owner/related party/administrator/co-administrator per diem compensation limit is the first schedule run during the rate setting.

The Schedule C is used to set the per diem limitation for all nonowner administrator and co-administrator salaries and owner/related party compensation in excess of the civil service-based salary limitation schedule. The per diem limit for a 50-bed or larger home is set at the 90th percentile on all salaries reported for nonowner administrators and co-administrators. A limitation table is then established for facilities with less than 50 beds. This table begins with a reasonable salary per diem for an administrator of a 15-bed or less facility. A linear relationship is then established between the compensation of the administrator of the 15-bed facility and the compensation of the administrator of a 50-bed facility. The linear relationship determines the per diem limit for the facilities between 15 and 50 beds.

The per diem limits apply to the nonowner administrators and co-administrators and the compensation paid to owners and related parties who perform an administrative function or consultant type of service. The per diem limit also applies to the salaries in excess of the civil service-based salary chart in other cost centers that are transferred to the operating cost center.

Real and Personal Property Fee Limit:

The property component of the reimbursement methodology consists of the real and personal property fee that is explained in more detail in a later section. The upper payment limit will be 105% of the median determined from a total resident day-weighted array of the inflated property fees.

Cost Center Upper Payment Limits:

The Schedule B computer run is an array of all per diem costs for each of the three cost centers—Operating, Indirect Health Care and Direct Health Care. The schedule includes the base-year cost data from all active nursing facility providers. Projected cost reports are excluded from the database.

The per diem expenses for the Operating cost center and the Indirect Health Care cost center less food and utilities are subject to the 85% minimum occupancy. All previous desk review and field audit adjustments are considered in the per diem expense calculations. The costs are adjusted by the owner/related party/administrator/co-administrator limit.

Prior to the Schedule B arrays, the cost data on certain expense lines will be adjusted for historical and forecasted inflation, where appropriate. This will bring the costs reported by the providers to a common point in time for comparisons. The historic inflation will be based on the DRI Index for the cost center limits effective July 1, 2005. This historic inflation factor will adjust costs from the midpoint of each provider's cost report period to December 31, 2004, for the Schedule B processing.

Certain costs are exempt from the inflation application when setting the upper payment limits. They include owner/related party compensation, interest expense, and real and personal property taxes.

The final results of the Schedule B run are the median compilations. These compilations are needed for setting the upper payment limit for each cost center. The median for each cost center is weighted based on total resident days. The upper payment limits will be set using the following:

Operating	110% of the median
Indirect Health Care	115% of the median
Direct Health Care	120% of the median

Direct Health Care Cost Center Limit:

The Kansas reimbursement methodology has a component for a case mix payment adjustment. The Direct Health Care cost center rate component and upper payment limit are adjusted by the facility average CMI.

For the purpose of setting the upper payment limit in the Direct Health Care cost center, the facility cost report period CMI and the statewide average CMI will be calculated. The facility cost report period CMI is the resident day-weighted average of the quarterly facility-wide average case mix indices, carried to four decimal places. The quarters used in this average will be the quarters that most closely coincide with the financial and statistical reporting period. For example, a 01/01/20XX-12/31/20XX financial and statistical reporting period would use the facility-wide average case mix indices for quarters beginning 04/01/XX, 07/01/XX, 10/01/XX and 01/01/XY.

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The statewide average CMI is the resident day-weighted average, carried to four decimals, of the facility cost report period case mix indices for all Medicaid facilities calculated effective each payment rate period.

The statewide average CMI and facility cost report period CMI are used to set the upper payment limit for the Direct Health Care cost center. The limit is based on all facilities with a historic cost report in the database. There are three steps in establishing the base upper payment limit.

The first step is to normalize each facility's Direct Health Care inflated per diem cost to the statewide average CMI. The following will describe the normalization process. A facility has an average inflated per diem cost of \$60(A) and a facility cost report period CMI of 1.4000(B). The statewide average CMI is .9500(C). First, divide the statewide average CMI (C) by the facility cost report period CMI (B) ( $.9500/1.4000=.68$ ). Second, the quotient is then multiplied by the average inflated per diem cost (A) to determine the normalized inflated cost at the statewide average CMI ( $\$60 \times .68 = \$40.80$ ). Normalizing each facility's cost to the statewide average CMI ensures a level comparison of direct health care costs can be made when setting the upper payment limit.

The second step is to array the normalized inflated costs, based on the statewide average CMI, to determine the median. The median is located using a day-weighted methodology. That is, the median cost is the per diem cost for the facility in the array at which point the cumulative total of all resident days first equals or exceeds half the number of the total resident days for all providers. The facility with the median resident day in the array sets the median inflated direct health care cost. For example, if there are 8 million resident days, the facility in the array with the 4 millionth day would set the median.

The final step in calculating the base Direct Health Care upper payment limit is to apply the percentage factor to the median cost. For example, if the median cost is \$45 and the upper payment limit is based on 120% of the median, then the upper payment limit for the statewide average CMI would be \$54 ( $D=120\% \times \$45$ ).

Once the base limit for the Direct Health Care cost center is established at the statewide average CMI, the base limit is adjusted by each facility's cost report period CMI to determine a facility specific Direct Health Care cost center upper payment limit. The following will describe the facility-specific upper payment limit process. A facility has an average facility cost report period CMI of 1.4000(A). The statewide average CMI is .9500(B). First, divide the facility cost report period average CMI (A) by the statewide average CMI (B) ( $1.4000/.9500=1.47$ ). Second, the statewide average CMI limit D (\$54) is multiplied by the quotient to determine the upper payment limit for the facility ( $\$54 \times 1.47 = \$79.38$ ). In the example above, the facility-inflated Direct Health Care cost was \$60, which is less than the upper payment limit of \$79.38 for a facility average CMI of 1.4000.

#### 7) Quarterly Case Mix Rate Adjustment

The allowance for the Direct Health Care cost component will be based on the average Medicaid CMI in the facility. The first step in calculating the allowance is to

determine the lower of the inflated Direct Health Care cost or the facility's specific Direct Health Care upper payment limit. Using the example in the Upper Payment Limit section, the Direct Health Care cost of \$60 was less than the upper payment limit of \$79.38 for an average CMI of 1.4000.

The next step is to determine the Medicaid acuity adjusted allowable Direct Health Care cost. The Medicaid CMI is divided by the facility cost report period CMI. Using the example above, if the Medicaid average CMI is 1.6000, it is divided by 1.4000 to arrive at a quotient of 1.1400 ( $1.6000/1.4000$ ). The lower of the inflated per diem cost or the facility specific Direct Health Care upper payment limit is multiplied by the quotient to determine the Medicaid acuity adjusted allowable Direct Health Care cost. In the example, the allowable Medicaid acuity adjusted Direct Health Care cost will be \$68.40 ( $\$60 \times 1.1400$ ).

For illustrative purposes, if the facility-specific upper payment limit had been \$55 for an average CMI of 1.4000, the Medicaid rate would have been calculated using the upper payment limit since it was lower than the cost of \$60. In this situation, the allowable Medicaid acuity adjusted cost would be \$62.70 ( $1.1400 \times \$55$ ).

The Direct Health Care component of the Medicaid rate is adjusted quarterly for changes in the Medicaid CMI. Using the first example above, if the average Medicaid CMI increases from 1.6000 to 1.7000 the following quarter, the allowance for the Direct Health Care cost would increase from \$68.40 to \$72.60. The first step is to divide the new average Medicaid CMI by the facility cost report period CMI established for the rate year (July 1 through June 30) to determine the new quotient ( $1.7000/1.4000=1.2100$ ). The lower of the facility specific Direct Health Care upper payment limit or the inflated Direct Health Care per diem cost is multiplied by the new quotient to determine the Medicaid allowance. ( $1.21 \times \$60 = \$72.60$ ).

Conversely, if the average Medicaid CMI decreases from 1.6000 to 1.5000 the following quarter, the allowance for the Direct Health Care cost would decrease from \$68.40 to \$64.20. Again, the first step is to divide the new average Medicaid CMI by the facility cost report period CMI established for the rate year (July 1 through June 30) to determine the new quotient ( $1.5000/1.4000=1.0700$ ). The lower of the facility specific Direct Health Care upper payment limit or the inflated Direct Health Care per diem cost is multiplied by the new quotient to determine the Medicaid allowance. ( $1.0700 \times \$60 = \$64.20$ ).

#### 8) Real and Personal Property Fee

The property component of the reimbursement methodology consists of the real and personal property fee (property fee). The property fee is paid in lieu of an allowable cost of mortgage interest, depreciation, lease expense and/or amortization of leasehold improvements. The fee is facility specific and does not change as a result of a change of ownership, change in lease, or with re-enrollment in the Medicaid program. The original property fee was comprised of two components, a property allowance and a property value factor. The differentiation of fee into these components was eliminated effective July

1, 2002. At that time each facility's fee was re-established based on the sum of the property allowance and value factor.

The property fees in effect on June 1, 2005 were inflated with 12 months of inflation effective July 1, 2005. The inflation factor was from the Data Resources, Inc.-WEFA, National Skilled Nursing Facility Total Market Basket Index (DRI Index). The providers received the lower of the inflated property fee or the upper payment limit.

For providers re-enrolling in the Kansas Medical Assistance program or providers enrolling for the first time but operating in a facility that was previously enrolled in the program, the property fee shall be the sum of the last effective property allowance and the last effective value factor for that facility. The property fee will be inflated and then compared to the upper payment limit. The property fee will be the lower of the facility-specific inflated property fee or the upper payment limit.

Providers entering the Kansas Medical Assistance program for the first time, who are operating in a building for which a fee has not previously been established, shall have a property fee calculated from the ownership costs reported on the cost report. This fee shall include appropriate components for rent or lease expense, interest expense on real estate mortgage, amortization of leasehold improvements, and depreciation on buildings and equipment. The process for calculating the property fee for providers entering the Kansas Medical Assistance program for the first time is explained in greater detail in Exhibit A-14 (K.A.R. 30-10-25).

There is a provision for changing the property fee. This is for a rebasing when capital expenditure thresholds are met (\$25,000 for homes with fewer than 51 beds and \$50,000 for homes with more than 50 beds). The original property fee remains constant but the additional factor for the rebasing is added. The property fee rebasing is explained in greater detail in Exhibit A-14 (K.A.R. 30-10-25). The rebased property fee is subject to the upper payment limit.

**9) Incentive Factors**

An incentive factor will be awarded to both NF and NF-MH providers that meet certain outcomes measures criteria. The criteria for NF and NF-MH providers will be determined separately based on arrays of outcomes measures for each provider group.

Nursing Facility Quality and Efficiency Incentive Factor:

The Nursing Facility Quality and Efficiency Outcomes Incentive Factor is a per diem add-on ranging from zero to \$3. It is designed to encourage quality care and efficiency. The incentive factor is determined by six outcome measures: case mix-adjusted nurse staffing ratio; operating expense; staff turnover rate; staff retention rate; occupancy rate; and survey performance. The most recent cost report data for each provider will be used to determine the outcome measures except for the staff turnover and retention rates, which will be determined from 2003 cost report data. Each provider is awarded points based on their outcome measures, and the total points for each provider determine the per diem incentive factor included in the provider's rate calculation.

Providers may earn up to two incentive points for their case mix-adjusted nurse staffing ratio. They will receive two points if their case mix-adjusted staffing ratio equals or exceeds 4.20, which is 120% of the statewide NF median of 3.50. They will receive one point if the ratio is less than 120% of the NF median but greater than or equal to 3.85, which is 110% of the statewide NF median. Providers with staffing ratios below 110% of the NF median will receive no points for this incentive measure.

Providers also may earn up to two points for their occupancy outcome measures. If they have total occupancy greater than or equal to 90% they will earn one point. If they have Medicaid occupancy greater than or equal to 60% they also will earn one point. Providers that meet both of these criteria will receive a total of two incentive points for occupancy outcomes, and providers that fail to meet either criterion will receive zero points for occupancy.

The incentive points awarded for survey performance also will range from zero to two points. Two points will be awarded to providers that have no health survey deficiencies on all surveys conducted during the review period. Providers that have no more than five health survey deficiencies, nor any one health survey deficiency rated higher than an "E" on the CMS scope and severity chart, on each survey conducted during the review period will earn one incentive point. All other providers will receive zero incentive points for survey results. The review period for determining survey performance incentive points will be the 15-month period ending December 31, 2004.

Providers also may earn one point for each of the following outcomes measures: low operating expenses; low staff turnover; and high staff retention. Providers with per diem operating expenses below the statewide median per diem operating expense of \$20.23 will earn one point. Providers with staff turnover below the statewide median staff turnover rate of 70% will earn one point. Finally, providers with staff retention rates above the statewide median staff retention rate of 64% will earn one point.

The table below summarizes the incentive factor outcomes and points:

Nursing Facility for Mental Health Quality and Efficiency Incentive Factor:

The Quality and Efficiency Outcomes Incentive plan for Nursing Facilities for Mental Health (NFMH) will be established separately from NF. NFMH serve people who often do not need the NF level of care on a long-term basis. There is a desire to provide incentive for NFMH to work cooperatively and in coordination with Community Mental Health Centers to facilitate the return of persons to the community. The outcome measures for FY06 for NFMH will be the same as regular NF with the exception of occupancy rate.

The Quality and Efficiency Outcomes Incentive Factor is a per diem add-on ranging from zero to \$3. It is designed to encourage quality care, efficiency and cooperation with discharge planning. The incentive factor is determined by six outcome measures: case mix-adjusted nurse staffing ratio; operating expense; staff turnover rate; staff retention rate; occupancy rate; and survey performance. Each provider is awarded points based on their outcome measures, and the total points for each provider determine the per diem incentive factor included in the provider's rate calculation.

Providers may earn up to two incentive points for their case mix-adjusted nurse staffing ratio. They will receive two points if their case mix-adjusted staffing ratio equals or exceeds 3.21, which is 120% of the statewide NFMH median of 2.67. They will receive one point if the ratio is less than 120% of the NFMH median but greater than or equal to 2.94, which is 110% of the statewide NFMH median. Providers with staffing ratios below 110% of the NFMH median will receive no points for this incentive measure.

NFMH providers also may earn one point for their occupancy outcomes measure. If they have total occupancy less than or equal to 94%, the statewide median for NFMH, they will earn one point

The incentive points awarded for NFMH survey performance also will range from zero to two points. Two points will be awarded to providers that have no health survey deficiencies on all surveys conducted during the review period. Providers that have no more than five health survey deficiencies, nor any one health survey deficiency rated higher than an "E" on the CMS scope and severity chart, on each survey conducted during the review period will earn one incentive point. All other providers will receive zero incentive points for survey results. The review period for determining survey performance incentive points will be the 15-month period ending December 31, 2004.

NFMH providers also may earn one point for each of the following outcomes measures: low operating expenses; low staff turnover; and high staff retention. Providers with per diem operating expenses below \$17.63, the statewide median per diem operating expense for NFMH, will earn one point. Providers with staff turnover

below 69%, the statewide median staff turnover rate for NFMH, will earn one point. Finally, providers with staff retention rates above 67%, the statewide median staff retention rate for NFMH, will earn one point.

The table below summarizes the incentive factor outcomes and points:

**10) Rate Effective Date**

Rate effective dates are determined in accordance with K.A.R. 30-10-19. The rate may be revised for an add-on reimbursement factor (i.e., rebased property fee), desk review adjustment or field audit adjustment.

**11) Retroactive Rate Adjustments**

Retroactive adjustments, as in a retrospective system, are made for the following three conditions:

A retroactive rate adjustment and direct cash settlement is made if the agency determines that the base year cost report data used to determine the prospective payment rate was in error. The prospective payment rate period is adjusted for the corrections.

If a projected cost report is approved to determine an interim rate, a settlement also is made after a historic cost report is filed for the same period.

All settlements are subject to upper payment limits. A provider is considered to be in projection status if they are operating on a projected rate and they are subject to the retroactive rate adjustment.

**12) Comparable Private Pay Rates**

The last factor considered in determining a provider's Medicaid per diem payment rate is their private pay rate. Providers are reimbursed the lower of the calculated Medicaid rate or their private pay rate. The agency maintains a registry of private pay rates. It is the responsibility of the providers to send in private pay rate updates so that the registry is updated. When new Medicaid rates are determined, if the private pay rate reflected in the

registry is lower, then the provider is held to that private pay rate until the provider sends notification that it has a higher private pay rate.

**Case Mix Adjustments to Private Pay Rates:**

Private pay rates submitted to the agency are adjusted up if a provider's average private pay/other CMI is lower than its Medicaid average CMI. This is accomplished by multiplying the provider's average private pay rate in the private pay registry by the ratio of their Medicaid average CMI to their average private pay/other CMI. This ensures that providers' Medicaid rates are not limited to a lower private pay rate that may be attributed to the lower acuity of the private pay residents. There is no adjustment to private pay rates if the facility's Medicaid average CMI is less than its average private pay/other CMI. There also is no adjustment to private pay rates if the facility's total Medicaid rate is less than its average private pay rate.

**II. Final Medicaid Per Diem Rates for Kansas Nursing Facilities**

**A. Cost Center Limitations:** The state establishes the following cost center limitations that are used in setting rates effective July 1, 2005.

These amounts were determined according to the "Reimbursement Limitations" section. The Direct Healthcare Limit is calculated based on a CMI of 0.9197, which is the statewide average.

**B. Case Mix Index.** These final rates are based upon each nursing facility's Medicaid average CMI calculated with a cutoff date of April 1, 2005, using the July 1, 2005 Kansas Medicaid/Medikan CMI Table. In Section II.C below, each nursing facility's Medicaid average CMI is listed beside its final per diem rate.

**C. Final Nursing Facility Per Diem Rates and CMI.** The following list includes the calculated Medicaid rate for each nursing facility provider currently enrolled in the Medicaid program and the Medicaid case mix index used to determine each rate.

**III. Justifications for the Final Rates**

1. The final rates are calculated according to the rate-setting methodology in the Kansas Medicaid State Plan and pending amendments thereto.

2. The final rates are calculated according to a methodology that satisfies the requirements of K.S.A. 39-708c(x) and Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services regulations in K.A.R. Article 30-10 implementing that statute and applicable federal law.

3. The state's analyses project that the final rates:

a. Would result in payment, in the aggregate of 92.29% of the Medicaid day-weighted average inflated allowable nursing facility costs statewide; and

b. Would result in a maximum allowable rate of \$130.80, with the total average allowable cost being \$125.77.

4. Estimated annual aggregate expenditures in the Medicaid nursing facility services payment program will increase by approximately \$10 million.

5. The state estimates that the final rates will continue to make quality care and services available under the Medicaid State Plan at least to the extent that care and services are available to the general population in the geographic area. The state's analyses indicate:

a. Service providers operating a total of 306 nursing facilities (representing 97% of all the licensed nursing facilities in Kansas) participate in the Medicaid program, while an additional 42 hospital-based long-term care units also are certified to participate in the Medicaid program;

b. There is at least one Medicaid-certified nursing facility and/or nursing facility for mental health, or Medicaid-certified hospital-based long-term care unit in each of the 105 counties in Kansas;

c. The statewide average occupancy rate for nursing facilities participating in Medicaid is 85.2%;

d. The statewide average Medicaid occupancy rate for participating facilities is 56.4%; and

e. The final rates would cover 91.82% of the estimated Medicaid health care costs incurred by participating nursing facilities statewide.

6. Federal Medicaid regulations at 42 C.F.R. 447.272 impose an aggregate upper payment limit that states may pay for Medicaid nursing facility services. The state's analysis indicates that the final methodology will result in compliance with the federal regulation.

**IV. The State's Response to Written Comments on the Published Proposals**

The state received four letters with comments to the Notice of Proposed Nursing Facility Medicaid Rates for State Fiscal Year 2006, Methodology for Calculating Proposed Rates, and Rate Justifications; Notice of Intent to Amend the Medicaid State Plan and Request for Comments published in the April 28, 2005 Kansas Register.
