## Kansas Water Office

## Notice of Hearings

The Kansas Water Office will conduct public hearings in October on proposed Kansas Water Plan policy recommendations addressing "Small Dam Safety and Rehabilitation." Written comments are encouraged. The hearings will be held in conjunction with the meetings of the Basin Advisory Committees in each of the state's 12 river basins during the period of October 4-21.

**Small Dam Safety and Rehabilitation**

Nearly 6,000 small dams in Kansas are subject to Kansas Stream Obstruction Act regulations administered by the Kansas Department of Agriculture. Some of the dams are aging and need structural rehabilitation, while others need enhancements like wider spillways and more freeboard to meet the requirements of higher hazard class dams. Hazard class increases have occurred due to development downstream from some dams.

Recommendations are made for expenditure of a \$750,000 appropriation by the 2005 Kansas Legislature to the State Conservation Commission. Other recommendations address minimizing future dam hazard class changes and providing long-term state financial assistance for small dam repairs and upgrades.

The Kansas Water Office also is seeking public comment on the recommendations of three other policy studies outlined below. These recommendations in their entirety also can be found on the Kansas Water Office's Web site.

**Water Conservation**

The state's role in water conservation, from setting water conservation goals to evaluating the effectiveness of conservation efficiency measures, is the subject of this seven-part policy study.

**Economic Development Opportunities at Federal Reservoirs**

The state of Kansas is investigating the economic development opportunities at and adjacent to federal reservoirs. One such opportunity is the creation of public-private partnerships that will increase public access and use of the reservoir lands. However, the exclusive, private use of public land would not be allowed. Another opportunity is the development of private land adjacent to the reservoirs. Encouraging such development is considered to be in the best interest of the state.

**Public Involvement in the Water Planning and Implementation Process**

The study emphasizes the importance of the public's input into making decisions on state water resource issues and offers alternative ways to encourage constructive participation.

The scope of services is to provide right-of-way plans for K-18 from Walnut Street in Ogden to west of K-113 in Manhattan. The design will be a four-lane freeway. All required environmental documentation and extensive public involvement are to be provided by the consultant. Other factors affecting the design are flooding at Ogden and the Kansas River, growth of Fort Riley, expansion of the Manhattan airport, the railroad location and potential interchanges. All required surveys will be provided by KDOT. The project is scheduled for completion in June 2008. A corridor preservation project, KA-0112-01, is a joint project with Riley County near completion. KDOT also has a construction project, K-6796-02 (county line north to Walnut), scheduled for letting in February 2006.

3. location of firm with respect to proposed project;

Bids will be accepted only on the official bid form that has been prepared for the public bidding on these bonds, which may be obtained from the county clerk. Bids may be submitted by mail or delivered in person, and must be received at the place and not later than the date and time herein specified. Each bid must be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a qualified financial surety bond or certified or cashier's check drawn on a bank located within the United States, each made payable to the order of the county and each in an amount equal to 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds.

Details of the Bonds

The aggregate principal amount of the bonds is \$300,000\*. The bonds will be dated as of October 1, 2005, and will be issued as fully registered bonds in the denomination of \$5,000, or integral multiples in excess thereof not exceeding the principal amount of bonds maturing in any year. The bonds shall initially be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of the Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, to which payment of principal of and interest on the bonds will be made. In-

dividual purchases of bonds will be made in book-entry form only. Purchasers will not receive certificates representing their interest in bonds purchased. Clay Center Municipal Power Plant has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and

requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance. Notice also is given that certain requirements in the construction permit dated December 17, 2003, are being modified by a modification of permit conditions.

Clay Center Municipal Power Plant, 427 Court St., Clay Center, owns and operates an electrical generation facility located at 4th and Clay St., Clay Center.

The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business October 24 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. #### Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

##### KANSAS RETAILERS NEWSLETTER INCENTIVE AND DRAWINGS

**111-2-179. Kansas Retailers newsletter incentive and drawings.** (a) In addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery may also offer all Kansas lottery retailers the "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" promotion.

(b) *Kansas Retailers* is a periodic newsletter printed by the Kansas lottery and distributed free of charge to all Kansas lottery retailers. From time to time, the lottery may include in said newsletter a contest whereby a Kansas lottery retailer may enter a contest as described in K.A.R. 111-2-181.

(c) Rules applicable to the "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" are contained in K.A.R. 111-2-179 through K.A.R. 111-2-183. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-2-180. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" means the acts of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at Kansas lottery headquarters in Topeka, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-2-182.

(c) "Entry" and "entry form" means the entry form printed in the applicable edition of *Kansas Retailers* newsletter.

(d) "Receptacle" means a container in which entry forms are placed and from which the "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" are made. Receptacles may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm, and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing.

(f) "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" means the drawings which will occur as described at K.A.R. 111-2-182. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-2-181. Entry into drawing.** Entry into each "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" ("drawing") is accomplished as follows:

(a) Any Kansas lottery retailer may obtain an entry form contained in the applicable *Kansas Retailers* newslet-

ter, and shall answer the question posed therein and otherwise complete the information requested.

(b) The retailer shall mail the entry form with the completed information to the address set forth in the newsletter.

(c) To be eligible for the drawing, the completed entry form must be received by the lottery by the date set forth in the newsletter.

(d) Entrants are not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-2-182. Determination of "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" winners and prizes.** (a) At the time of the drawing, all entries shall be placed into the drawing receptacle and mixed thoroughly to ensure random selection.

(b) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

(c) The selection of drawing winner(s) shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the drawing official, using a bare arm technique, removing one entry from the drawing receptacle. A designated drawing official and a person representing Kansas lottery security shall review the selected entry to determine if the information required on the entry has been completed and if the question posed has been correctly answered. If the entry is determined to be valid and eligible to win, the first prize shall be awarded to that retailer. If additional prizes are to be awarded, this process shall be repeated until all valid winners have been selected. Each valid entry drawn shall be marked in such a way as to identify the order in which they were drawn.

(d) Each valid winner selected shall be awarded the prize identified and set forth in the applicable *Kansas Retailers* newsletter.

(e) The security representative conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the eligibility of any entry drawn. A retailer location entrant may only win one prize in each drawing. The first prize winning entry drawn for each entrant invalidates all other entries for the drawing for that entrant. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-2-183. Certification of drawing.** (a) Each "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of each drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner(s). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-5-121. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing," and will accept entries starting September 4, 2005, for the drawing to be conducted on December 9, 2005. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-5-121 through 111-5-125 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-5-122. Prizes.** (a) The winner of the grand prize at the "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing" shall receive one or more bank or credit card company gift or credit cards having a cumulative total value of \$10,000, together with mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. Four secondary prizes shall also be awarded and the winner of each secondary prize shall receive one or more bank or credit card company gift or credit cards having a cumulative total value of \$2,000 for each prize, together with mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to all prizes:

(1) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize may be delivered at a time and place to be announced by the lottery.

(2) Any taxes and other expenses that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(3) Prizes are not redeemable for cash.

In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-5-124 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-5-123. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Beginning at 5:00 a.m. on September 4, 2005, and ending at the close of business as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on December 3, 2005, for every single Kansas Powerball ticket purchase that includes purchase of the Power Play option, the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the drawing, which entry blank shall be automatically dispensed from the terminal upon the qualifying purchase.

(2) The executive director may suspend or terminate this promotion at any time or modify the qualifying purchase necessary to receive an entry during periods of high sales of Powerball tickets, which renders the generation of entries impractical.

(3) The holder of an entry blank must fill in the entry blank in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on an entry blank.

(continued)

(4) Place one or more completed entry blank(s) for said drawing into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing, P. O. Box 8099, Topeka, Kansas 66608-0099." Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, December 6, 2005. A receptacle or drum may also be available for deposit of entries at locations specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to the place of the drawing, and secured until the time of the drawing.

(5) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend said drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time.

(c) All eligible entries which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, December 6, 2005, and those deposited at locations specifically designated by the lottery pursuant to subsection (a) herein, shall be entered into said drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the drawing must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry blank and entering it into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-5-124. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, December 6, 2005. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, December 6, 2005, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. Prior to the drawing, all mailed entries and entries retained from such other locations as specifically designated by the lottery shall then be transported to the location of the drawing and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum.

(b) The drawing shall be held at such location designated by the lottery, and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Friday, December 9, 2005, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be mixed thoroughly with a shovel or by other means prior to the drawing.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize of one or more gift or credit cards having a cumulative value of \$10,000 as identified in K.A.R. 111-5-122, subject to vali-

ation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. Four more entries shall be selected, one at a time, in the same manner. The person whose name appears on each of those entries shall each be the winner of a secondary prize of one or more gift or credit cards having a cumulative value of \$2,000 for each prize as identified in K.A.R. 111-5-122, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After five entries have been drawn and verified as valid, five more entries will be drawn, one at a time. The last five entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the prize packages. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A. The alternate entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a full-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth calendar day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If a winner or an alternate winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to present a full-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth calendar day following the claim form being given or sent to the alternate winner, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 14 calendar days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn, unless it is valid to win an instant scratch ticket prize, in which event the person whose name appears on the ticket shall be paid said prize amount. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) Only original entry forms as defined by these rules are eligible for the drawing. Copies of said entry forms are not eligible.

(i) All entries remaining in the drum or receptacle on December 9, 2005, after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)

**111-5-125. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Power Play Shopping Spree Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery ("event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in

selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005.)
