**Request for Comments**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Post-Closure Plan from Williams Petroleum Services, LLC (Williams), regarding the closed slop oil emulsion and acid neutralization ponds at the former Augusta Refinery, located at 2nd and Oak Street in Augusta. The slop oil emulsion and acid neutralization ponds were closed as surface impoundments in 1988 and are under interim status with respect to RCRA Subtitle C. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Identification Number for this site is KSD007235138.

The former Augusta Refinery began petroleum production in 1917 and was owned by the White Eagle Oil and Refining Company. Williams purchased the refinery in 1983 from Mobil Oil Corporation. Williams began closing down the facility in 1988, and presently most of the refinery has been dismantled. During the active periods

at the refinery the slop oil emulsion pond was used to dispose of a mixture of crude oil and water that would not readily separate, and the acid neutralization pond was used to dispose of spent acids and caustics from refinery operations. After RCRA went into effect, Mobil submitted Part A of a hazardous waste permit application in 1980 and attained interim status as a hazardous waste treatment, storage and disposal facility. In 1984, Williams submitted a revised Part A permit application to transfer the slop oil emulsion and acid neutralization ponds to Williams. Since the closure of the units, Williams has been performing groundwater monitoring as required by the Consent Agreement, Case Number 89-E-19. The Post-Closure Plan, currently on public notice, was submitted to KDHE as required by Title 40 Code of Federal Regulation (CFR) Part 265 Subpart G. As the Closure Plan was approved in 1988, the current document establishes revised plans for post-closure care including groundwater monitoring.

The purpose of the Post-Closure Plan is to outline the planned groundwater monitoring and maintenance activities and the frequencies at which they will be performed. The Post-Closure Plan also establishes a groundwater monitoring well network to determine if the contaminant plume is expanding, detect any changes in the environmental conditions, and demonstrate and verify the attainment of cleanup goals. This can only be accomplished by the collection of representative groundwater quality data; therefore, attached to the Post Closure Plan is a Sampling and Analysis Plan.

Volatile organic compounds, semivolatile organic compounds and heavy metals are the chemicals of concern in the groundwater beneath the regulated units.

Approval of the plan must follow 40 CFR 265.118(f), which includes notification through a legal newspaper notice with a 30-day public comment period. Depending on the comments received, a public hearing may be held.

The revised Post-Closure Plan and accompanying fact sheet are available for public review at the Augusta Public Library, 1609 State St., Augusta, and at the KDHE Bureau of Waste Management Office, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 320, Topeka.

Written public comments on the revised plan must be postmarked during the 30-day public comment period that will end December 16. Any request for a public hearing must be received by December 16. ## Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Westar Energy Inc., Abilene Energy Center has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Westar Energy Inc., Abilene Energy Center, Topeka, owns and operates an electrical generation facility located 2 miles south of Abilene and .25 mile east of Kansas Highway 15, Abilene.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permit can be reviewed at the KDHE North Central District Office, 2501 Market Place, Suite D, Salina. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact Dayne I. Moreton, (785) 296-1691, at the KDHE central office; and to review the proposed permit only, contact Stan Marshall, (785) 827-9639, at the KDHE North Central District Office. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit to Dayne I. Moreton, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business December 19.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business December 19 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was im-

practicable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, January 17, in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed regulation of the Kansas State Employees Health Care Commission on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Harry Bossi, Benefits Manager, Division of Health Policy and Finance, Department of Administration, Room 920-S, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1251, or by e-mail to [harry.bossi@da.state.ks.us](mailto:harry.bossi@da.state.ks.us). All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and its economic impact statement in an accessible format. Summaries of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follow.

**K.A.R. 108-1-4** establishes the local unit employee health care benefits component of the state's health care benefits program (the "local unit plan"). K.S.A. 75-6506 (c) provides that the Kansas State Employees Health Care Commission (HCC) may designate by rules and regulations those entities that are qualified to participate in the state health care benefits program. An amendment is proposed to include certain public hospitals in the definition of "local unit": any hospital established, maintained and operated by a city of the first or second class, a county, or a hospital district in accordance with applicable law.

Based on a survey conducted by the Kansas Hospital Association at the request of the HCC staff, it is estimated that a total of 77 additional local units and 10,794 additional employees would become eligible for the local unit plan. Of these, 10 local units with 1,002 qualified employees indicated an interest in participating in the local unit plan if it is made available to them, which could expand the number of participants enrolled in the local unit plan by approximately 16 to 17 percent.

Extending eligibility to these interested local units is not expected to have an immediate impact on the existing contributions by qualified local units or on existing premiums for active participants and those individuals participating in the local unit plan on a direct bill basis. Further, the proposed amendment is not expected to have an impact on future plan design for the existing Kansas health care benefits program, on employer (state agency) contributions, or on premiums for active participants and direct bill participants in the Kansas health care benefits program.

The local units that would become eligible consist of an average of 140 employees each. Therefore, inclusion of these local units in a funding pool should offer the opportunity to provide the local units and their participants with greater benefit levels, improved premium stability, or both, when compared to plans negotiated individually by each of these local units. However, the economic impact on the additional local units and the participating employees will be dependent on what the employer and employee contributions are under the local unit plan relative to their current, employer-provided health insurance.

Certain administrative resources are required to enroll each new qualified local unit and its participants. Because there are units scattered over the state with a relatively large number of participants associated with each of the new local units, there will be an impact on the existing staff resources required to enroll and administer the local unit plan. Additional staff may be required to provide membership, billing, enrollment and on-going customer service. The composite rate currently charged to nonstate employer groups includes administrative fees to help offset necessary administrative costs. Therefore, an increase in the administrative fees applied to all nonstate employer groups may be required to support any additional staff needed due to expanded eligibility. No economic impact on the general public is anticipated.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment received an application from Mitchell County to add 36 acres to its existing 40-acre solid waste facility and to construct and operate three new construction and demolition (C&D) landfill trenches totaling 1.9 acres. The proposed new C&D landfill trenches would add approximately 20,000 cubic yards of capacity for a projected 10 years of active disposal. The facility is located at 1993 280 Road, in the Northeast Quarter of Section 36, Township 6 South, Range 8 West in Mitchell County, approximately 2 miles west and 1 mile north from the junction of K-14 and U.S. 24 in Beloit. Existing solid waste management activities at this facility include a municipal solid waste transfer station, C&D landfill, waste tire monofill, yard waste composting, scrap metal salvaging, tree and brush burn pit, and care of a closed municipal solid waste landfill.

Mitchell County has certified that the application described herein is consistent with its solid waste management plan and compatible with surrounding land use. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to issue a permit to Mitchell County to allow the facility modifications described herein. However, a final decision to issue the permit has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. ## Article 1.—GENERAL

**40-1-42.** **Electronic filing and filing financial statements.** (a) "Insurer," as used in this regulation, shall mean the following entities that are operating under the designated articles of chapter 40 of the Kansas statutes annotated and amendments thereto:

- (1) An insurance company operating under article 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 12a, 13, 15, or 35;
- (2) a fraternal benefit society operating under article 7;
- (3) a reciprocal operating under article 16;
- (4) a nonprofit dental service corporation operating under article 19a;
- (5) a nonprofit medical and hospital service corporation operating under article 19c; and
- (6) a health maintenance organization operating under article 32.

(b) Each insurer that does business in this state and files a statement of its condition dated December 31 of the preceding year on a form prescribed by the national association of insurance commissioners shall, pursuant to K.S.A. 40-225 and amendments thereto, submit the statement of its condition by electronically readable means to the national association of insurance commissioners on January 1 of each year or within 60 days thereafter. The statement of the insurer's condition shall be prepared in accordance with the instructions and the accounting practices and procedures prescribed and adopted periodically by the national association of insurance commissioners and any additions or amendments that the commissioner of insurance requires.

(c) Each insurer organized under the laws of this state and either licensed or operating in any other state shall file quarterly statements of its condition dated the preceding March 31, June 30, and September 30 on a form

prescribed by the national association of insurance commissioners.

(1) Each quarterly statement shall be prepared in accordance with the instructions and the accounting practices and procedures prescribed and adopted periodically by the national association of insurance commissioners and any additions or amendments that the commissioner of insurance requires.

(2) Each insurer shall submit the quarterly statement of its condition by electronically readable means to the national association of insurance commissioners within 45 days after the end of that reporting period. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and 40-225; implementing K.S.A. 40-225; effective Jan. 24, 1997; amended May 25, 2001; amended Dec. 2, 2005.)

**40-1-51. Securities valuation; requirements.** The following document prepared by the national association of insurance commissioners and dated December 2004 is hereby adopted by reference: "purposes and procedures of the securities valuation office of the national association of insurance commissioners."
