Request for Comments

The following ICFsMR cost center limits are being set forth for public comment. Comments should be sent to Kimberly Pierson, Program Manager at Community Supports and Services, 10th Floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612. The comment period will expire 30 days from the date of publication of this notice.

K.A.R. 30-10-214 provides for the annual review and adjustment of Class II ICFsMR cost center limits, approved by the secretary of SRS or designee, based on current cost information supplied by the enrolled, licensed providers of ICF-MR services, and formula set forth in the Kansas State Medicaid Plan (Attachment 4.19-D, Part II, Subpart O, page 1). The formula is as follows: total allowable costs, including an inflation factor, are compared to the amount to be reimbursed under the current limits. The formula threshold requires that 60 percent of all ICFsMR are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs. If less than 60 percent of the facilities are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs, then the cost center limits are adjusted until the threshold is met. The inflation factor is based on the Data Resources, Inc. (DRI)-WEFA, National Skilled Nursing Facility Total Market Basket Index.

To determine where to make the adjustments, two major cost centers are analyzed according to the following prescription:

- Administrative costs are based on facility size.
- Habilitation costs are based on facility size and level of care (LOC).

The cost analysis for 2005 showed that 89 percent of the Class II ICFsMR were being reimbursed 90 percent or more of their allowable costs. Per the state plan, the analysis indicates that adjustments are not required.

Recommendations

Based on cost report analysis and available funding, cost center limits for Class II ICFsMR will remain as follows:

Administrative per diem limits are based on the size of the facility, using the same classes as referred to above.

Fiscal Impact

Due to the inflation factor, the estimated cost increase is \$124,575.

Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, November 30, in the main conference room, Kansas Department of Commerce, Suite 100, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of regulations administering the Individual Development Account Program Act, K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 74-50,201 through 74-50,208.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for submitting written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments before the hearing to Howard R. Fricke, Secretary of Commerce, Suite 100, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-3481. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on these regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the existing regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 10 working days in advance of the hearing to Merrill J. Hicklin Befort at the address above or by calling (785) 291-3891. Handicapped parking is not available around the Curtis Office Building; however, all persons in a vehicle with a handicapped license plate may park in any metered space around the building, and there is no charge for parking. The curbs and all entrances on Jackson, 10th Street, and Kansas Avenue to the Curtis Office Building are accessible to individuals with disabilities.

Written copies of the regulations and their economic impact statements may be obtained by contacting Merrill J. Hicklin Befort. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 110-14-1. Allocation of tax credit to program contributors. This regulation provides the method in which tax credits shall be certified to the Department of Commerce and for the notification of those credits to the Department of Revenue.

K.A.R. 110-14-2. Tax credit. This regulation provides for the amount of tax credit that a community-based organization may receive each fiscal year and the method to reallocate tax credits not used by community-based organizations (see K.S.A. 74-50,208).

Economic Impact: It is anticipated that at least one employee of the department will be required to administer the program costs to the department, and would include the staff time spent reviewing and assisting community-based organizations by providing technical assistance, drafting reports, certification of tax credits and providing annual reports to the Legislature. The department estimates the cost to be between \$10,000 and \$20,000. The department does not anticipate the need to hire additional employees. The department anticipates that there will be negligible impact upon local governments. Long-term economic impacts would be positive to the local government, businesses in the community, and low income families and individuals. There would be no negative impact on other entities or persons. There would be a positive impact on state and local tax revenues since the program encourages low-income families to improve their individual situations.

Proposals will be issued upon request to all prospective bidders who have been prequalified by the Kansas Department of Transportation on the basis of financial condition, available construction equipment and experience. Also, a statement of unearned contracts (Form No. 284) must be filed. There will be no discrimination against anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid.

This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the

sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Article 15.—VIDEO SERVICE AUTHORIZATION

82-15-1. Application for a video service authorization certificate. (a) Each entity seeking to provide cable or video service on or after July 1, 2006 shall file an application with the commission for a video service authorization certificate. Each cable operator providing video service pursuant to a franchise that is in effect on July 1, 2006 shall file an application for a state-issued video service authorization certificate at least 30 days before the expiration of its franchise agreement in order to continue to provide video service.

(1) Each applicant shall use the application for video service authorization available from the commission, which shall include the information specified in the video competition act, 2006 SB 449, § 3(a)(1) through (5) and amendments thereto.

(2) Each applicant shall file the original and seven copies of the application with the commission, addressed to the executive director of the commission at its Topeka office.

(b)(1) Each entity that seeks statewide authorization to offer cable or video service on or after July 1, 2006 shall file an initial application.

(2) Each entity that holds a video service authorization certificate and wants to revise its original application shall file an amended application, except as provided in subsection (e).

(3) Each entity that holds a video service authorization certificate and wants to terminate its authority to provide cable or video service shall file a termination application.

(4) Each entity that holds a video service authorization certificate and wants to transfer its authority to provide cable or video service shall file a transfer application. Each entity to which the authority to provide cable or video service is transferred shall file an initial or amended application.

(c) Each applicant shall submit an electronic copy of the map of the area where the applicant will provide service, which is also known as the applicant's footprint. This map shall be provided on a compact disc and in the format specified in the application for video service authorization.

(d) Each applicant shall submit one or more of the following fees, as applicable:

(1) A filing fee of \$1,000 with an initial application; and

(2) a filing fee of \$250 with each type of application specified in paragraphs (b)(2) and (4).

(e) Each entity holding a video service authorization certificate shall provide notice of any change in the name of the entity, contact personnel, mailing address, and phone number by sending a notification letter specifying the number of the docket in which the certificate was granted. The notice shall be provided within 14 business days after the effective date of the change.

(f)(1) Each applicant that submits an incomplete application shall be notified that its application is incomplete

within 14 calendar days after the date of filing. If the applicant does not provide a complete application within seven calendar days after the date of the notice, the application shall be dismissed without prejudice within 30 days after the date of filing.

(2) A video service authorization certificate shall be issued in the form of a commission order within 30 days after the date of filing a complete application, if the applicant meets all application requirements. (Authorized by 2006 SB 449, § 3; implementing 2006 SB 449, §§ 3 and 6; effective, T-82-7-5-06, July 5, 2006; effective Oct. 13, 2006.)

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-188. Kwik Shop "Ask for the sale" promotion. (a) During the period beginning September 11, 2006 and ending September 24, 2006, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all Kwik Shop stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) Every day, beginning September 11, 2006, through September 24, 2006, all Kwik Shop store personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer locations shall display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery during each day of the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These materials must be on display during the entire promotion on the dates established in subsection (b) for a store to be eligible for a prize and shall consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold; and

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

(d) Any tickets given away above the \$100 allowance representing one hundred \$1 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Kwik Shop.

(e) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion. If all terms of the promotion have been complied with by the retail location, \$100 will be credited to the retailer's lottery account.

(f) Promotional items designated by the lottery will also be given to all participating stores who have an increase in sales. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

CABELA'S CASH DOUBLER DRAWING

111-4-2435. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing," and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery "Cabela's Cash Doubler" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on Tuesday, January 23, 2007, as specified in K.A.R. 111-4-2440. The drawing will be held on Friday, January 26, 2007. Rules applicable to the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-2435 through 111-4-2440 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

111-4-2436. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the place and time described in K.A.R. 111-4-2440, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2437.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "Cabela's Cash Doubler" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of the "Cabela's Cash Doubler" instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

111-4-2437. Prize. (a) The winner of the grand prize at the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" shall receive a \$20,000 shopping spree at the Cabela's retail store in Kansas City, Kansas, together with mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. Two secondary prizes shall be awarded and the winner of each secondary prize shall receive a \$10,000 shopping spree at the Cabela's retail store in Kansas City, Kansas, together with mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to all prizes:

(1) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize may be delivered at a time and place to be announced by the lottery.

(2) Any taxes and other expenses that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(3) Prizes are not redeemable for cash.

(4) Prizes may be transferred one time.

(b) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(c) The winner of a prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 30 calendar days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2440 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

111-4-2438. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" to be conducted on January 26, 2007, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Cabela's Cash" Kansas instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Cabela's Cash Doubler" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules. For purposes of this drawing, any ticket winning a purchase discount shall be deemed a non-winning ticket if said ticket is entered into the drawing instead of being redeemed for a discount on qualifying purchases at the Cabela's store.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the drawing.

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) A receptacle or drum may be available for deposit of entries at the various locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to lottery headquarters and secured until the time of the drawing.

(6) Entries may also be mailed with proper postage to "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing, P. O. Box 8099, Topeka, Kansas 66608-0099." Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, January 23, 2007. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawing will be conducted on Friday, January 26, 2007.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Cabela's Cash Doubler" tickets which are mailed to the address set forth above with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, January 23, 2007, and non-winning "Cabela's Cash Doubler" tickets entered at such other locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery shall be eligible for the drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

111-4-2439. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

111-4-2440. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, January 23, 2007. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, January 23, 2007, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. Prior to the drawing, all mailed entries and entries retained from such other locations as specifically designated by the lottery shall then be transported to the location of the drawing and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum.

(b) The drawing shall be held at such location designated by the lottery, and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Friday, January 26, 2007, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be mixed thoroughly with a shovel or by other means prior to the drawing.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize of one \$20,000 shopping spree as identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2437, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. Two more entries shall be selected one at a time in the same manner and marked in such a way as to note in what order they were drawn. The person whose name appears on each of those entries shall be the winner of a

secondary prize of a \$10,000 shopping spree as identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2437, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After three entries have been drawn, and the entries have been verified as valid, three more entries will be drawn, one at a time. The last three entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the prize packages. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. The alternate entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth calendar day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If a winner or an alternate winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth calendar day following the claim form being given or sent to the alternate winner, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first. If the grand prize is forfeited by the original winner, the first eligible second prize winner drawn shall be elevated to the grand prize winner.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Cabela's Cash Doubler Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 30 calendar days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn, unless it is valid to win an instant scratch ticket prize, in which event the person whose name appears on the ticket shall be paid said prize amount. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Cabela's Cash Doubler" instant tickets as defined by these rules are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Cabela's Cash Doubler" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on January 26, 2007, after the winners and alternatives have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-06, July 19, 2006.)

111-4-2441. "Twice Lucky Double Play" instant ticket lottery game number 596. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Twice Lucky Double Play" commencing on or after August 1, 2006. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2441.
