A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, December 7, in the conference room in the office of the Kansas Development Finance Authority, 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, on the proposal for the KDFA to issue its Senior Multifamily Housing Development Revenue Bonds in the approximate maximum amount of \$8 million for the Olathe Good Samaritan Housing, L.P., Project (the developer). The bonds will be issued, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8901 *et seq.*, to (i) finance the costs of acquisition, improvement and equipping of 172 units of senior multifamily affordable housing facilities known as Good Samaritan Towers and College Way Village, both located at 1425 E. College Way, Olathe, Kansas 66062 (the project), owned and operated by the Olathe Good Samaritan Housing, L.P.; (ii) establish a reserve fund; and (iii) pay certain costs of issuing the bonds.

The bonds, when issued, will be a limited obligation of the KDFA and will not constitute a general obligation or indebtedness of the state of Kansas or any political subdivision thereof, including the KDFA, nor will the bonds constitute an indebtedness for which the faith and credit and taxing powers of the state of Kansas are pledged. The bonds will be payable solely from amounts received from the developer, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds when they become due.

All individuals who appear at the hearing will be given an opportunity to express their views, and all written comments previously filed with the KDFA at its offices at 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, 66603, will be considered. Additional information regarding the project may be obtained by contacting the KDFA.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Wednesday, January 25, in the Secretary of State's Office, Room 120, Memorial Hall, 120 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider an amended regulation, **K.A.R. 7-17-22**, which pertains to search logic used to conduct official searches of the Uniform Commercial Code database. This regulation is proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.

The regulation outlines the search criteria use to conduct official searches of financing statements in the Uniform Commercial Code database. Currently the regulation requires the elimination of the word "a" if it appears at the beginning of the debtor name, prior to conducting the search. The amended regulation removes the requirement of removing "a."

The amended regulation will require minimal programming by the Secretary of State and Kansas.gov, which will result in very little economic impact on these agencies. Creditors who filed incorrect UCC financing statements that were found on official searches because of the elimination of "a" will need to file an amendment to include the letter "a" in order to be found on future searches. The filing fee is \$10 for electronic filing and \$20 for paper filing.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. Comments may be submitted prior to the hearing to Melissa A. Wangemann, Legal Counsel, Office of the Secretary of State, Room 140, Memorial Hall, 120 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, 66612-1594, (785) 296-4801, MelissaW@kssos.org.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views. It may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes. Any person requiring visual, hearing or other communication aid or assistance, building access assistance or other similar accommodation should contact the Secretary of State's Office so appropriate arrangements can be made.

Contractors should read and be fully familiar with all contract documents including addenda before submitting a bid. In submitting a bid, the bidder warrants that it has read the contract documents and is fully familiar therewith and that it has visited the site of the work to fully inform itself as to all existing conditions and limitations and shall include in its bid a sum to cover the cost of all items of the work as specified in the contract documents.

No oral telegraphic, telephonic proposals or alterations will be considered. Facsimile transmissions will not be accepted.

The following items must be included in the sealed envelope with the Bid:

- a. Bid form;
- b. 5% bid security—bid bond, cashier's check or certified check (see below).

Each bidder shall file with its bid a bid bond, a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on an acceptable bank, made payable to the city of Lenexa, Kansas, in an amount equal to 5 percent of the total bid, which shall be retained by the city of Lenexa until a contract for the project has been executed. Bid bonds will be returned to the bidders, with the exception of the best and lowest and second best and second lowest responsible bidders, within 21 days after their bids are rejected. The bid deposit of the lowest and the second lowest responsible bidders will be returned when the performance bond, maintenance bond and statutory bond, each in an amount equal to 100 percent of the contract amount, required insurance certificates and other required documents shall have been furnished and the contract documents have been executed by the successful bidder.

In the event the low bidder is unable to execute the contract, for whatever reason, within the time provided in the notice of award, the city may annul the notice of award and the bid deposit may be forfeited, and the city shall exercise its legal prerogatives, including, but not limited to, enforcement of its rights as to the bid security or specific performance.

The city reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids and to waive any technicalities or irregularities therein. Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written request of the bidder received in the office of the city clerk prior to the time and date for bid opening.

All bidders agree that rejection shall create no liability on the part of the city because of such rejection, and the filing of any bid in response to this notice shall constitute an agreement of the bidder to these conditions.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 8.30 a.m. Wednesday, February 7, in the secretary's conference room, second floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes to the existing rules and regulations that support the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and the Kansas local retailers' sales tax. The secretary's conference room is accessed by entering Room 230 on the east side of the second floor of the Docking Building. The changes include the adoption of one new sales tax regulation, the amendment to two existing sales tax regulations, and the revocation of five local sales tax regulations and one sales tax regulation.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written comments from the public on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations before the hearing to Tom Hatten, Attorney/Tax Specialist, Office of Policy and Research, 2nd Floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66625. Public comments also may be submitted via e-mail before the hearing to tom_hatten@kdor.state.ks.us.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, either orally or in writing or both, concerning the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. The regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed rules and regulations and their economic impact follows:

Amendment of K.A.R. 92-19-16a. Gifts, premiums, prizes, coupons, and rebates. 2006 Kan. Sess. Laws, Ch. 202, Sec. 1 amended the definition of "sale or selling price" to exclude certain manufacturers' rebates from the tax base for sales or leases of motor vehicles. The law specifies that this provision is effective from July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009. This provision is an exception to the normal treatment of manufacturer's rebates. K.A.R. 92-19-16a was amended to provide for this exception. Before the new statute was enacted, the department advised the Legislature that the fiscal impact of its enactment would be a \$34.4 million reduction in the state general fund, a \$4.4 million reduction in the highway fund, and a \$12.5 million reduction in local sales tax receipts.

New regulation K.A.R. 92-19-16b. Manufacturers' rebates for motor vehicles. 2006 Kan. Sess. Laws, Ch. 202, Sec. 1 amended the definition of "sale or selling price" to exclude certain manufacturers' rebates from the tax base used for the sale or lease of a motor vehicle. K.A.R. 92-19-16b explains how this exception to the normal treatment of manufacturer's rebates is being implemented. Before the new statute was enacted, the department advised the Legislature that the fiscal impact of its enactment would be a \$34.4 million reduction in the state general fund, a \$4.4 million reduction in the highway fund, and a \$12.5 million reduction in local sales tax receipts.

Revocation of K.A.R. 92-19-55a. Leases and rentals of tangible personal property. K.A.R. 92-19-55a discusses how Kansas sales tax applies to leases. This regulation should be repealed because its definitions of "lease," "financing lease" and "operating lease" are different from the new Streamlined Sales Tax definition of "lease or rental" that are codified in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3602(r). Revocation of this regulation should have no economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since the treatment of leases under the new Streamlined Sales Tax definition is nearly identical to the treatment that was accorded to leases under K.A.R. 92-19-55a.

Amendment to K.A.R. 92-19-81. Abatement of final tax liabilities. K.A.R. 92-19-81 discusses "abatement of final tax liabilities" under the retailers' sales tax act. The incorrect citation of K.A.R. 92-19-66a is being changed to correctly cite K.A.R. 92-12-66a. The proposed change to this regulation has no economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public.

Revocation of K.A.R. 92-21-7. Place of sale. K.A.R. 92-21-7 discusses the place of sale for local sales tax purposes under the prior origin-based sourcing rules. This regulation should be repealed because it conflicts with the new destination-based sourcing rules that are codified in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670. Revocation of this regulation should have no additional economic impact on Kansas

retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670 is the Kansas controlling law, which has already been implemented.

Revocation of K.A.R. 92-21-8. Delivery only—application of local sale tax. K.A.R. 92-21-8 discusses "delivery only—application of local sales tax" under the sales tax act's prior origin-based sourcing rules. This regulation should be repealed because it conflicts with the new destination-based sourcing rules codified in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670. Revocation of this regulation should have no additional economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670 is the controlling Kansas law, which has already been implemented.

Revocation of K.A.R. 92-21-10. Place of business—out-of-state retailers. K.A.R. 92-21-10 discusses "place of business—out-of-state retailers" under the sales tax act's prior origin-based sourcing rules. This regulation should be repealed because it conflicts with the new destination-based sourcing rules codified at K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670. Under the new law, out-of-state retailers with nexus are required to collect the local use tax in place at the ship-to destination. Revocation of this regulation should have no additional economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670 is the controlling Kansas law, which has already been implemented.

Amendment of K.A.R. 92-21-14. Place of business—sales from vehicles. K.A.R. 92-21-14 discusses "place of business—sales from vehicle" under the sales tax act's prior origin-based sourcing rules. This regulation needs to be amended because its last sentence conflicts with the new destination-based sourcing rules codified in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670. Revocation of this regulation should have no additional economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670 is the controlling Kansas law, which has already been implemented.

Revocation of K.A.R. 92-21-16. Place of sale—isolated or occasional sale of motor vehicles or trailers. K.A.R. 92-21-16 discusses "place of sale—isolated or occasional sale of motor vehicles or trailers" under the sales tax act's prior origin-based sourcing rules. This regulation should be repealed because it conflicts with the new destination-based sourcing rules codified in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670. This regulation also is inconsistent with the local use tax on vehicles found at K.S.A. 12-198. Revocation of this regulation should have no additional economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670 is the controlling Kansas law, which has already been implemented.

Revocation of K.A.R. 92-21-17. Application of local sales tax to leases and rentals; place of sale—leases and rentals. K.A.R. 92-21-17 discusses "application of local sales tax to leases and rentals; place of sale—leases and rentals" under the local sales tax act's prior origin-based sourcing rules. This regulation should be repealed because it conflicts with the new destination-based sourcing rules codified in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670. Revocation

of this regulation should have no additional economic impact on Kansas retailers, government agencies or units, or the general public, since K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 79-3670 is the controlling Kansas law, which has already been implemented.

Article 24.—NORTHWEST KANSAS GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT NO. 4

5-24-10. Exemptions for up to 15 acre-feet of groundwater. (a) In any area of the district that is subject to safe yield criteria and is not closed by specific regulation or intensive groundwater use control area order by the chief engineer to new nondomestic, nontemporary permits and term permits for five or fewer years, each application to appropriate groundwater shall be exempt from meeting the safe yield criteria if all the following conditions are met:

(1) The maximum annual quantity of water proposed in the application is 15 acre-feet or less.

(2) The well spacing criteria of K.A.R. 5-24-3 have been met.

(3) An existing water right from the same source of water supply that has a point of diversion located within two miles of the proposed point of diversion has its authorized annual quantity reduced as described in subsection (b).

(4) All issues relating to the possible abandonment of the offsetting water right are resolved by the chief engineer before determining the annual quantity of offset water that is available from the existing water right.

(5) The approval of the application does not authorize an additional quantity of water out of an existing authorized well with a nondomestic permit or water right that would result in a total combined annual quantity of water authorized from that well in excess of 15 acre-feet.

(6) The approval of the application does not authorize an additional quantity of water to be used on a currently authorized nondomestic place of use.

(b) If the water right to be used as the offset for the new appropriation is a water right authorized for irrigation use, the authorized quantity of water needed to offset the new appropriation of not more than 15 acre-feet of water shall be calculated as follows:

(1) Step one.

(A) Multiply the net irrigation requirement for the 50 percent chance rainfall for the county of origin, as specified in K.A.R. 5-5-12, times the maximum number of acres legally irrigated in any one calendar year during the perfection period. For vested rights, the acreage used shall be the maximum acreage legally irrigated in any one calendar year before June 28, 1945.

(B) The calculation made in paragraph (b)(1)(A) shall result in the maximum annual quantity of water that could be changed to another type of beneficial use if the entire water right were changed pursuant to K.A.R. 5-5-9(a)(1).

(2) Step two.

(A) Divide the annual quantity of water desired to be changed to the new beneficial use by the maximum annual quantity of water that could be changed if the entire water right were changed to the new use.

(B) The calculation made in paragraph (b)(2)(A) shall result in the percentage of the entire reduced water right that will be changed to the new use. The remaining percentage of the current water right may be retained by the irrigation water right owner.

(3) Step three.

(A) Multiply the remaining percentage calculated in paragraph (b)(2)(B) times the total currently authorized quantity. The resulting product shall be the annual quantity of water that can be retained by the irrigation water right owner.

(B) The portion of the authorized annual quantity of water not retained by the irrigator as described in paragraph (b)(3)(A) shall be permanently reduced from the authorized annual quantity of the offsetting water right and used to offset the new appropriation.

(c) If the water right to be used as the offset for the new appropriation is an existing water right authorized for nonirrigation use, the total net consumptive use of the offsetting water right after the change and the new appropriation shall not exceed the net consumptive use of the offsetting water right before the change.

(d) The place of use authorized by the offsetting water right shall be reduced in proportion to the reduction in the maximum annual quantity of water as determined in paragraph (b)(1)(B). If the owner of the irrigation water right desires to retain more authorized acres, the directions specified in K.A.R. 5-5-11(b)(2)(B)(ii) shall be followed to determine whether the irrigator may retain more acres in the authorized place of use.

(e) After the use of not more than 15 acre-feet has been approved pursuant to this regulation, no application for change for that water right shall be approved for any quantity of water that would authorize the water to be diverted from a currently authorized point of diversion or to be used on a currently authorized place of use. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a and K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 82a-1028; implementing K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 82a-1028; effective Jan. 10, 2003; amended Dec. 8, 2006.)

LICENSING PROVIDERS OF
COMMUNITY SERVICES

30-63-20. Mandated requirements. (a) In order to be eligible to be licensed as a provider, each applicant shall demonstrate that the applicant either complies with or can comply with all applicable requirements of this article and all applicable requirements of article 64.

(b) For good cause shown by an applicant, or by any person being served or proposed to be served by that applicant, one or more of the specific requirements of this article may be waived by the commissioner, and some other requirement or requirements that may be proposed by the applicant or person may be substituted by the commissioner, if the waiver or substitution would neither jeopardize the health, safety, or well-being of any person or persons served or proposed to be served by the applicant, nor substantially deviate from meeting the intent or purpose of the requirement or requirements being waived.

(c) Attainment of national accreditation by an applicant from an organization that evaluates and accredits providers of mental retardation or developmental disabilities services, or the recommendation of a local CDDO's quality assurance committee, shall be considered by the commissioner in determining compliance by the applicant with any one or more of the requirements of this article. (Authorized by K.S.A. 39-1810 and K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 75-3307b; implementing K.S.A. 39-1806; effective July 1, 1996; amended Oct. 1, 1998; amended Dec. 8, 2006.)

30-63-22. Individual rights and responsibilities.

(a) Each provider shall at all times encourage and assist each person served to understand and exercise the person's individual rights and to assume the responsibilities that accompany these rights.

(b) Each person served shall be guaranteed the same rights afforded to individuals without disabilities. These rights may be limited only by provisions of law or court order, including guardianship, conservatorship, power of attorney or other judicial determination. These rights shall include the following:

- (1) Being free from physical or psychological abuse or neglect, and from financial exploitation;
- (2) having control over the person's own financial resources;
- (3) being able to receive, purchase, have, and use the person's personal property;
- (4) actively and meaningfully making decisions affecting the person's life;
- (5) having privacy;
- (6) being able to associate and communicate publicly or privately with any person or group of people of the person's choice;

(7) being able to practice the religion or faith of the person's choice;

(8) being free from the inappropriate use of a physical or chemical restraint, medication, or isolation as punishment, for the convenience of a provider or agent, in conflict with a physician's orders or as a substitute for treatment, except when physical restraint is in furtherance of the health and safety of the person;

(9) not being required to work without compensation, except when the person is living and being provided services outside of the home of a member of the person's family, and then only for the purposes of the upkeep of the person's own living space and of common living areas and grounds that the person shares with others;

(10) being treated with dignity and respect;

(11) receiving due process; and

(12) having access to the person's own records, including information about how the person's funding is accessed and utilized and what services were billed for on the person's behalf.

(c) Each provider shall train its agents regarding the rights specified in subsection (b). In addition, each provider shall offer training at least annually regarding these rights and effective ways to exercise them to each person served, to the guardian if one has been appointed, and to the person's parent and other individuals from each person's support network. (Authorized by K.S.A. 39-1810; implementing K.S.A. 39-1802 and K.S.A. 39-1806; effective July 1, 1996; amended Oct 1, 1998; amended Dec. 8, 2006.)

Article 64.—DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES—
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY
ORGANIZATIONS (CDDOs)

30-64-24. Case management. (a) Each contracting CDDO shall develop and implement policies and procedures concerning the provision of case management services in the service area, including provisions by which a person choosing to receive case management services may select from among any of the licensed case management providers in the person's CDDO area. The CDDO shall be the only enrolled medicaid provider of case management services and shall impartially and equitably subcontract with any licensed case management provider willing to accept the payment rate based exclusively upon the rate that is established in the subcontract with the CDDO.

(b) Case management shall assist the person and the person's support network to identify, select, obtain, coordinate, and use both paid services and natural supports that are available to enhance the person's independence, integration, and productivity consistent with the person's capabilities and preferences as outlined in the person's person-centered support plan. Case management shall include the following:

- (1) Assessment, including an ongoing process for the identification of the person's needs, the determination of a person's preferred lifestyle, and the resources that are available to the person, through both formal and informal evaluation methods;

(continued)

(2) (A) Support planning, with the participation of the person and the person's support network, including the development or assistance in the development, updating, and reviewing of the person's person-centered support plan and any related service or support plan, building upon assessment information to assist the person in meeting the person's needs and achieving the person's preferred lifestyle; and

(B) providing assistance to the person in being knowledgeable about the types and availability of community services and support options, in receiving information regarding the rights of persons served pursuant to the developmental disabilities reform act and implementing regulations, the content of which shall be approved by the commission, and in obtaining the community services and supports of the person's choice;

(3) support coordination, including the following:

(A) Arranging for and securing supports outlined in the person's person-centered support plan;

(B) developing and accessing natural supports and generic community support systems; and

(C) advocacy, including pursuing means for gaining access to needed services and entitlements, and seeking modification of service systems when necessary to increase the accessibility to those systems by the person;

(4) monitoring and follow-up, including ongoing activities that are necessary to ensure that the person-centered support plan and related supports and services are effectively implemented and adequately addressing the needs of the person; and

(5) assisting transition and portability, including the planning of and arranging for services to follow the person when the person moves between any of the following:

(A) From school to the adult world;

(B) from an institution to community alternatives;

(C) from one kind of service setting to another kind of service setting;

(D) from one provider to another provider; or

(E) from one service area to another service area.

(c)(1) Case management shall be provided by case managers, who shall meet the following requirements:

(A) Be employed by the CDDO as the enrolled medicare provider of case management services, be employed by a subcontractor of the CDDO for those services, or be a subcontractor of the CDDO for those services. Depending upon which of these three circumstances is applicable, the CDDO or the subcontractor shall maintain a separate license from the division of mental health and developmental disabilities to provide case management services pursuant to article 63 of these regulations;

(B) be employed by the agency that is selected by the person being served or by the person's guardian, if one has been appointed to provide case management;

(C) not provide any other direct service except case management to any person receiving any type of direct service from the same agency that employs the case manager;

(D) not be supervised by anyone responsible for the provision or supervision of any type of direct services to any person;

(E) have the following qualifications:

(i) A minimum of six months of full-time experience in the field of developmental disabilities services; and

(ii) a bachelor's degree or additional full-time experience in the field of developmental disabilities services, which may be substituted for the degree at the rate of six months of full-time experience for each missing semester of college; and

(F) have provided to the division of mental health and developmental disabilities, upon the form designated for that purpose, the following:

(i) Information demonstrating that the case manager meets the required qualifications listed in paragraph (c)(1)(E);

(ii) demographic information, including a requirement to update that information to the division whenever the information changes; and

(iii) a statement by the case manager that the person has read, understands and agrees to abide by the division's "rules of conduct for case managers serving people with developmental disabilities," adopted on October 25, 2003, and hereby adopted by reference; and

(iv) proof that the case manager has passed the required assessment established by the division and included in the division's case management-related training.

(2) Each case manager providing case management shall carry a caseload of not more than 30 persons. If a provider employs more than one case manager, then the total number of the cases carried by all of the provider's case managers shall average not more than 30 persons per case manager.

(3) The CDDO may refuse to permit any subcontractor to bill medicare for case management services if the subcontractor's case manager employee is not in compliance with any of the requirements of this regulation with regard to those services. Any subcontractor may appeal a CDDO's refusal to permit a billing by utilizing the dispute resolution procedures required by K.A.R. 30-64-32. Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-190. Casey's General Store retailer incentive promotion. (a) In addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4 and 111-2-6, the Kansas lottery may also offer the following as additional commissions to enhance the sale of all lottery tickets at certain authorized retailer locations:

(a) The sales program will commence at 6:00 a.m. on October 1, 2006, and end at the close of the lottery busi-

ness day, as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on December 31, 2006.

(b) Casey's General store locations (chain number 1617) who are authorized to sell instant and online tickets are eligible to participate based upon an increase in their "base sales total." The "base sales total" is arrived at by computing that retailer's total lottery instant and online ticket sales for March 2006 through May 2006 as compared with instant and online ticket sales during October 2006 through December 2006.

(c) Each retailer in this promotion is eligible to earn additional commissions at one of the following levels:

(1) If sales increase between five percent and 9.99 percent above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an additional one percent sales commission applicable only to the increase.

(2) If sales increase between 10 percent and 14.99 percent above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an additional two percent sales commission applicable only to the increase.

(3) If sales increase between 15 percent and 19.99 percent above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an additional three percent sales commission applicable only to the increase.

(4) If sales increase 20 or more percent above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an additional five percent sales commission applicable only to the increase. The maximum sales increase to which the five percent shall be applied is a 20 percent increase.

(5) A retailer shall only receive the highest additional sales commission for which it qualifies. Additional sales commissions are not cumulative.

(d) Commissions earned pursuant to this program will be addressed in electronic funds transfers after sales increases are determined by the lottery following the end of the promotion. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

COOL CARS DRAWING

111-4-2468. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Cool Cars Drawing," and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery "Cool Cars" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on the dates specified in K.A.R. 111-4-2471. The drawing will be held on March 30, 2007. Rules applicable to the "Cool Cars Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-2468 through 111-4-2473 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-4-2469. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Cool Cars Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery on the date described in K.A.R. 111-4-2471, in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2470.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "Cool Cars" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of the "Cool Cars" instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Cool Cars Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-4-2470. Prize. (a) The first winner drawn in the "Cool Cars Drawing," shall receive his or her choice of four Swartz Motorsports customized golf carts, together with towing trailer, various accessories, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(b) The second winner drawn shall receive his or her choice of the remaining three golf carts, together with towing trailer, various accessories, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(c) The third winner drawn shall receive his or her choice of the remaining two golf carts, together with towing trailer, various accessories, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(d) The fourth winner drawn shall receive the last remaining golf cart, together with towing trailer, various accessories, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(e) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(f) The winner of a prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the day of the drawing or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2472 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-4-2471. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Cool Cars Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Cool Cars" Kansas instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Cool Cars" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for this drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Cool Cars Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Players may deposit entries for the "Cool Cars Drawing" at any Kansas lottery event at which the lottery

has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries.

(6) Entries other than those entered pursuant to subsection (a)(5) herein shall be mailed with proper postage to "Cool Cars Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 5596, Topeka, Kansas 66605-0596. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, March 27, 2007. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Cool Cars Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawing will be conducted by the lottery on March 30, 2007.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one prize.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Cool Cars" tickets which are mailed to the "Cool Cars Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 5596, Topeka, Kansas 66605-0596 with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, March 27, 2007, and non-winning "Cool Cars" tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Cool Cars Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to identify publicly the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-4-2472. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Cool Cars Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Cool Cars Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, March 27, 2007. Following each final mail pickup, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum with all entries deposited at any other receptacle designated by the lottery.

(b) The drawing shall be held at the Kansas lottery headquarters and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the drawing, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(d) At the drawing, the designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove a single entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose

name appears on the entry shall be the winner of one of the grand prizes identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2470, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After four entries have been drawn at the drawing and verified as valid, three more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time to serve as alternate entries for the prize. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. Each winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the drawing to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If a grand prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the grand prize will be awarded to the first alternate entry drawn. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into this drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (e) herein.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Cool Cars" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Cool Cars" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners and alternatives have been selected in the drawing, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-4-2473. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Cool Cars Drawing" drawing shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-4-2474. "Flint Hills Treasures" instant ticket lottery game number 612. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Flint Hills Treasures" commencing on or after October 1, 2006. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2474.

111-5-155. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing" and will accept entries starting October 1, 2006, for the drawing to be conducted November 3, 2006. Five winners shall be selected. Rules applicable to the "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-5-155 through 111-5-159 and K.A.R. 111-6-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-5-156. Prize. The five prize winners selected in the "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-5-155 shall each receive a trip for two people to Las Vegas, Nevada, including the following: round-trip coach air transportation from select airports to Las Vegas, Nevada; transportation to and from the airport and hotel; three nights' lodging at select hotels; \$1,000 spending money; and mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing" prize packages:

(a) Trip packages other than cash are transferable one time, cannot be redeemed for cash, are not refundable, cannot be split into component parts, and cannot be extended. All transfers require authorization from the winner.

(b) Any meals, drinks, gratuities, and taxes that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(c) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(d) Casinos may have age restrictions.

(e) All trips must be completed no later than November 30, 2007. Blackout dates and travel restrictions will apply.

(f) Hotels may require the winner to present a valid credit card at the time of check-in.

(g) All hotels and airlines utilized are in the sole discretion of the Kansas lottery.

(h) The winner of a prize as a result of the said drawings shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 14 days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-5-159 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-5-157. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Beginning at 5:00 a.m. on October 1, 2006, and ending at the close of business as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on October 30, 2006, for every \$5 or more single Kansas Hot Lotto ticket purchased, the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing." For every such purchase made during the time period specified, whether for a single draw or multiple draws, lottery terminals shall automatically dispense an entry blank for said drawings.

(2) The holder of an entry blank must fill in the entry blank in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on an entry blank.

(3) Place one or more completed entry blank(s) for said drawings into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, Kansas 66675-0980. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on the Tuesday before each Friday drawing.

(4) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend said drawing or be present at the time of the drawings to be determined a winner.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in this promotion.

(c) All eligible entries which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on the Tuesday before the drawing shall be entered into the drawing conducted the next following Friday.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)

111-5-159. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Viva Hot Vegas Drawing" entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up on the Tuesday immediately prior to the drawing.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the lottery headquarters' mail room where the envelopes will be opened and the entries contained therein stored in a secure location until immediately prior to the drawing, at which time all entries will be placed into the drawing receptacle or drum.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the said drawing shall contain all eligible entries. The entries shall be thoroughly mixed prior to the entries actually being drawn. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. Security shall mark it in such a way as to identify it as the winning entry for that drawing. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-5-156, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After the number of winning entries are drawn, one at a time, on the date set forth in K.A.R. 111-5-155, and after each entry has been verified as valid by lottery security, three more entries will be drawn on each date, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if an original winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the said drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the information is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and each alternate. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned, and received by, to the lottery within 14 days of the drawing.

(g) If any entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All entries not drawn in the drawing, entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the drawing has been completed, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-20-06, Sept. 11, 2006.)
