Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday, January 31, in the fourth floor training room of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed regulations in the Pesticides and Soil Amendments Program. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, 4th Floor, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Leslie Garner at (785) 296-4623 or fax (785) 368-6668. Handicapped parking is located at the southwest corner of 9th and Kansas Ave., and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

A summary of the proposed regulations in Article 13 and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 4-13-62: Clarifying the ranges and limits of dol-

lar amounts of proposed civil penalties and changing the limit for improperly storing or disposing of pesticide materials from \$1,000 to \$5,000 per incident.

K.A.R. 4-13-63: Clarifying and expanding the detail of the criteria to determine the dollar amounts of proposed civil penalties with no revision to current procedures.

The department does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from this proposed revision. The proposed revision does not make any changes to the procedures currently employed to determine the proposed civil penalty amounts but, rather, it specifies current procedures in administrative regulations. The economic impact on private businesses or individuals found to be in noncompliance with associated laws should not change with the exception of those found to have violated K.S.A. 2-2454(o).

A summary of the proposed regulation in Article 19 and its economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 4-19-1: Revising the current Kansas registration fee for soil amending products from \$60 to \$100 for each product registered. The proposed regulation change is needed to make the fees consistent with the statute.

The department does not anticipate any financial impact upon other government agencies or private individuals. A registering private business may experience a slight positive financial impact due to the discontinuance of the requirement for annual tonnage of sales reports and the associated inspection fee.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The State Board of Education will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 13, in the board room of the State Education Building, 120 S.E. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider regulations concerning the use of seclusion rooms and restraint on students with disabilities. The regulations are numbered 91-40-75, 91-40-76, 91-40-77, 91-40-78 and 91-40-79. The provisions of these regulations were developed by representatives of educational organizations, schools and student advocacy groups after the Senate Education Committee requested that the State Board of Education adopt appropriate guidelines or regulations regarding seclusion rooms and restraint. This request followed hearings on a detailed bill to restrict the use of these activities in schools. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

91-40-75. Provides definitions of terms used in these regulations.

No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, other governmental agencies, school districts, private businesses or individuals.

91-40-76. Limits the use of seclusion rooms for children with disabilities and specifies various information that is to be recorded in a child's IEP if such a room is to be used. A review of the use of the room is required within 45 days, and supervision while a child is in a seclusion room is required.

No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, other governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals. However, school districts will incur costs to provide additional training for staff concerning the appropriate use of seclusion rooms. This training can be combined with training on physical restraint of students with disabilities. About \$60,000 will be required, statewide, to provide the additional training, including the costs of providing substitutes for teachers who participate in the training.

91-40-77. Provides the minimum size and characteristics for a seclusion room. Before July 1, 2008, the IEP team of a child will decide the size of any seclusion room to be used for the child. After that date, each seclusion room must contain a minimum of 36 square feet of floor space and have a ceiling height comparable to other rooms in the building. Any such room also must have comparable heating, cooling, ventilation and lighting as other rooms.

No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, other governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals. However, after July 1, 2008, some rooms currently used for the seclusion of children with disabilities may not meet the minimum size requirement. Thus, a few schools may have to convert other rooms for this purpose, or another building may have to be used to house the program in which these rooms are used. Renovation and relocation costs in these instances are estimated at \$128,000.

91-40-78. Limits the use of physical restraint on children with disabilities to situations in which the child's behavior presents an imminent risk of harm to the child or to another person or the child is involved in an altercation. It prohibits the use of mechanical restraints. It specifies that school employees who apply restraint, except those who intercede in an altercation, must be provided training in an appropriate method of restraint to avoid injury to students.

No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, other governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals. The costs to school districts is estimated at \$100,000. School districts already are providing this training to members of their staff, but this regulation likely will result in training being provided to additional staff members at an additional cost.

91-40-79. Specifies that a report of the use of a seclusion room or physical restraint be prepared and provided to parents.

No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, other governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals. Because schools already are providing to parents the notice called for in this regulation, the costs of this regulation are estimated to be less than \$5,000 annually for all school districts.

All interested persons will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views or arguments, either orally or in writing, in regard to the proposed regulations. In addition, the period of public notice hereby provided constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Such written comments may be submitted to the secretary of the State Board of Education at the address above. The hearing shall be conducted in compliance with the public hearing procedures of the State Board of Education.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received a permit modification request to expand the Deffenbaugh Industries, Inc. Johnson County Landfill currently operating under KDHE Permit 263. The Johnson County Landfill is located at 18181 W. 53rd St., Shawnee, in Parts of Section 1 and the North ½ of Section 12, Township 12 South, Range 23 East plus parts of the West ½ of Section 6 and the Northwest ¼ of Section 7, Township 12 South, Range 24 East. The application indicates that Deffenbaugh Industries, Inc. proposes to expand landfill operations into a 172-acre parcel directly west of the currently permitted facility, with a proposed new 163-acre municipal solid waste disposal area (Phase 6) located partially on the western parcel and partially over the side slopes of existing Phases 1, 2, 3 and 4. This will result in an 867-acre site with 409 total acres permitted for solid waste disposal. The proposed Phase 6 waste disposal area will provide approximately 37.25 million additional cubic yards of disposal capacity, with a service life of about 19 years at projected disposal rates.

The Johnson County Commission and the city of Shawnee have certified that the application described herein is consistent with the county's solid waste management plan and local land use restrictions or zoning. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to approve the proposed Johnson County Landfill expansion. However, a final decision to approve the expansion has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. A copy of the administrative record, which includes the permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit and other information with respect to this permit action, will be available for public review until January 11, during normal business hours, at the following locations:

Anyone wishing to comment on the proposed facility should submit written statements by 5 p.m. January 7 to Charles Bowers, KDHE Southeast District Office, 1500 W. 7th, Chanute, 66720-9701, by fax to (620) 431-1211, or by e-mail to cbowers@kdhe.state.ks.us. Comments postmarked by January 11 and received within one week thereafter also will be considered.

In addition, an informational meeting and public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the public comment period Thursday, January 4, at the Shawnee Civic Center, 13817 Johnson Drive, Shawnee. The informational meeting will be from 6 to 6:45 pm. At the informational meeting, concerned individuals can ask KDHE personnel questions regarding the landfill's operations in an informal setting. At 7 p.m. a public hearing will be held to provide a format for individuals to make formal comments, which will be recorded by KDHE. KDHE will subsequently respond to all formal comments in writing.

After consideration of all the comments received during the public notice period and hearing, KDHE will make a final decision on whether to issue the permit modification. Notice of the decision will be given to the applicant, to anyone who submitted written comments during the comment period, and to those who requested notice of the final permit decision.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a combined Kansas Water Pollution Control/National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general stormwater permit (General Permit No. S-MCST-0701-1) for construction activities disturbing 1.0 or more acres. The draft permit also covers certain nonstormwater discharges related to construction activities such as flushing of water hydrants and potable water lines, street cleaning, runoff of irrigation water and discharges of uncontaminated groundwater. The permit, when finalized, will replace the current general permit for stormwater discharges from construction activities scheduled to expire December 31, 2006.

Major modifications include the removal of references to large construction activity (5 acres or more) as all construction activity of 1 acre or more of soil disturbance now requires authorization to discharge stormwater runoff, clarification on a complete Notice of Intent submittal, redefining the termination criteria for subdivision projects, and various wording changes to clarify permit requirements.

The receiving streams are all waters of the state of Kansas except: waters within one-half stream mile or less from a Critical Water Quality Management Area; an Exceptional State Water; an Outstanding National Resource Water; or a Special Aquatic Life Use Water unless specifically allowed. Projects in these areas may be required to obtain an individual stormwater pollution control permit.

The draft permit requires the permittee to develop, implement and comply with a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan. The draft permit can be viewed on the KDHE Web site at www.kdheks.gov/stormwater/index.html or

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Abengoa Bioenergy has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to construct a new ethanol production facility and increase ethanol truck loadout limits on the existing facility. Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM₁₀), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), sulfur oxides (SO_x), carbon monoxide (CO) and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Abengoa Bioenergy, 1400 Elbridge Payne Road, Suite 212, Chesterfield, Missouri, proposes to own and operate a stationary source located at 523 E. Union Ave., Colwich, Kansas, at which a 100-million-gallon-per-year ethanol production facility is to be constructed, and proposes to increase truck loadout limits at the existing facility at the same location.

A public comment period has been established until noon January 4 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. KBK Industries, Inc. has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

KBK Industries, Inc. owns and operates a fiberglass manufacturing facility located at East Highway 96, Rush Center, Rush County.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business January 9 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or

Permanent Administrative
Regulations**

**Article 5.—CREDIT UNION
DETERIORATING CONDITION**

121-5-1. Definitions. For the purpose of this article, the following definitions shall apply.

(a) "Appropriate state official" means the administrator of the Kansas department of credit unions.

(b) "Call report" means a statement of the financial condition of a credit union.

(c) "Credit union" means a credit union, as defined in K.S.A. 17-2231 and amendments thereto, that serves primarily natural person members.

(d) "FISCU" means federally insured state credit union.

(e) "Investment" means any security, obligation, account, or deposit. This term shall not include any loans to members.

(f)(1) "Member business loan" means any loan, line of credit, or letter of credit, including any unfunded commitments, in which the borrower uses the proceeds for commercial, corporate, other business investment property or venture, or agricultural purposes.

(2) "Member business loan" shall not include any of the following:

(A) Any loan fully secured by a lien on a one-family to four-family dwelling that is the member's primary residence;

(B) any loan fully secured by shares in the credit union making the extension of credit or by deposits in other financial institutions;

(C) any loan or loans to a member or an associated member that, in total, are equal to less than \$50,000;

(D) any loan for which a federal or state agency or its political subdivision fully insures repayment, fully guarantees repayment, or provides an advance commitment to purchase in full; or

(E) any loan granted by a corporate credit union to another credit union. (Authorized by K.S.A. 17-2260; implementing K.S.A. 17-2206(d); effective July 7, 1997; amended, T-121-9-6-06, Sept. 6, 2006; amended Dec. 15, 2006.)

121-5-2. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 17-2206(d); effective July 7, 1997; revoked, T-121-9-6-06, Sept. 6, 2006; revoked Dec. 15, 2006.)

121-5-3. Deteriorating condition. (a) A credit union shall be deemed to be in a "deteriorating condition," as that term is used in K.S.A. 17-2206(d) and amendments thereto, if any of the following conditions is met:

(1) The credit union's net worth category declines from well capitalized, adequately capitalized, or undercapitalized to significantly undercapitalized or to critically undercapitalized within a 12-month period.

(2) The credit union's net worth category declines from significantly undercapitalized to critically undercapitalized within a 12-month period.

(continued)

(3) The credit union's net worth category declines to critically undercapitalized in a manner other than the manner specified in paragraphs (a)(1) and (2).

(b) The following federal regulations, as in effect on November 29, 2002, are hereby adopted by reference:

(1) 12 CFR 702.2, except subsections (b), (c), (h), (i), and (j);

(2) 12 CFR 702.101;

(3) 12 CFR 702.102(a), including table 1. This subsection includes the meanings of the terms "well capitalized," "adequately capitalized," "undercapitalized," "significantly undercapitalized," and "critically undercapitalized";

(4) 12 CFR 702.103;

(5) 12 CFR 702.104, including table 2 but excluding the following text:

(A) In subsection (a), "(as defined in 12 CFR 723.1 or as approved under 12 CFR 723.20)";

(B) in subsection (b), "as defined in 12 CFR 723.1 or as approved under 12 CFR 723.20";

(C) subsection (c); and

(D) in subsection (g), "as defined in 12 CFR 723.1 or as approved under 12 CFR 723.20";

(6) 12 CFR 702.105, including table 3;

(7) 12 CFR 702.106, including table 4;

(8) 12 CFR 702.107, including table 5; and

(9) 12 CFR 702.108(a) and (c)(1). (Authorized by K.S.A. 17-2260; implementing K.S.A. 17-2206; effective, T-121-9-6-06, Sept. 6, 2006; effective Dec. 15, 2006.)

Article 7.—INCIDENTAL POWERS OF CREDIT UNIONS

121-7-1. Incidental powers. An "incidental powers" activity shall mean an activity that is necessary to enable a credit union to carry on effectively the business for which the credit union is incorporated. An activity shall meet the definition of an incidental powers activity if the activity meets the following conditions:

(a) Is convenient or useful in carrying out the mission or business of the credit union in a manner that is consistent with the requirements of the Kansas credit union act;

(b) is the functional equivalent or logical outgrowth of any activity that is part of the mission or business of the credit union; and

(c) involves risks similar in nature to those risks already assumed as part of the business of credit unions. (Authorized by K.S.A. 17-2260; implementing K.S.A. 17-2204(l); effective Dec. 15, 2006.)

Article 8.—CREDIT UNION UNSAFE AND UNSOUND PRACTICES

121-8-1. Unsafe or unsound practice. For the purpose of this article, "unsafe or unsound practice" shall mean any act or conduct by any credit union board member, employee, supervisory committee member, or credit committee member that meets any of the following conditions:

(a) Varies materially from any act or conduct prescribed by statute, regulation, any policy adopted by the credit union board, or any bylaw of the credit union;

(b) jeopardizes or causes the loss of the fidelity bond eligibility of an employee, director, officer, supervisory committee member, or credit committee member;

(c) jeopardizes or causes the loss of the credit union's national credit union administration share insurance; or

(d) is contrary to or inconsistent with generally accepted standards of credit union operations and either results in or creates a substantial likelihood of resulting in an abnormal or unacceptable level of risk or loss to the credit union or a shareholder of the credit union. (Authorized by K.S.A. 17-2260; implementing K.S.A. 17-2206; effective, T-121-9-6-06, Sept. 6, 2006; effective Dec. 15, 2006.)
